Minority Party Debate: Plaid Cymru
The National Assembly expresses its concern at the delay in dealing with claims for compensation by former miners and their families in Wales following the High Court ruling on the 23 rd January 1998, and calls on the First Minister to make the strongest representations to the UK government to:
Employ more medical and administrative staff to speed up the processing of claims To abolish its clawback of benefit payments from the settled claims immediately, and End its challenge to the pension loss element of compensation claims.

"to do everything within its legal powers to ensure the prompt distribution of the funds already made available for the compensation of former miners and dependents".
