Debate on Waste Wales Strategy

NDM780 - To propose that the National Assembly:

1. Welcomes the consultation paper "Managing Waste Sustainably", which was placed on the Intranet on 4 July 2001 and which can be located at:- http://assembly/aegis/Subject%20Index/Environment/Wales%20Waste%20Strategy.htm; and

2. Agrees that the Minister for Environment will issue a new waste strategy for Wales to replace within Wales the current joint Wales and England waste strategy set out in "Waste Strategy 2000", which was laid in Table Office on 8 October 2001, and to take into account comments and considerations since the publication of "Managing Waste Sustainably".

The following amendments have been tabled:

Amendment 1 - Jocelyn Davies (South Wales East)

Add as new paragraph at end of motion:

' Agrees that the ultimate target of the new waste strategy should be zero landfill.'

Amendment 2 - Jocelyn Davies (South Wales East)

Add as new paragraph at end of motion:

'Agrees that within the new waste strategy incineration be permitted only as a last resort, and after the most thorough health impact assessments have been undertaken; and regrets the haste with which some local authority's are rushing to develop incineration as a way of reducing their use of landfill.

Amendment 3 - Jocelyn Davies (South Wales East)

Add as new paragraph at end of motion

'Calls on the Minister for the Environment to undertake an urgent review of the current developments proposing to use incineration as a means of waste disposal, notably at Crumlyn Burrows and at Wrexham, with a view to revoking planning permissions to prevent unsustainable development if necessary '

Amendment 4 - Jocelyn Davies (South Wales East)

Add as new paragraph at end of motion

'Acknowledges the immensity of the shift in waste disposal practices that will be required if Wales is to comply with the Landfill Directive and the huge level of sustained funding that will be required to bring that shift about'

Amendment 5 - Jocelyn Davies (South Wales East)

Add as new paragraph at end of motion

Calls on the Minster for the Environment to :-

a. Secure substantial additional funding for the Waste Strategy in next years and subsequent budgets

- b. Negotiate with Westminster Government as a matter of urgency a simpler more effective Primary Legislation framework for the regulations of waste disposal
- c. Negotiate with the Westminster Government the transfer of all funds raised from the Landfill Tax in Wales to the National Assembly budget with a view to the Assembly using all landfill tax revenues to promote sustainable waste disposal.

Amendment 6 - Jocelyn Davies (South Wales East)

Add as new paragraph at end of motion:

'Calls on the Minister for the Environment to ensure that the new Waste Strategy is fully coordinated with other Government of Wales strategies and plans, notably the new planing policy framework, and is fully compliant with the Sustainable Development Scheme.'
