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Item 11 - Debate on a Standing Order 31 proposal from Alun Ffred Jones

NDM2986 Alun Ffred Jones (Caernarfon)

To propose that the National Assembly for Wales, in accordance with Standing Order 31.2:

Supports in principle legislation to bring forward a development order to require retail impact assessments to accompany planning applications for retail developments with floor space of over 1,000sq metres, and for those assessments to be prepared by an independent person agreed by the applicant and the local planning authority.

A statement of legal powers under which the proposed legislation could be made and an indication of the resource implications and other material in amplification of the proposal is as follows:

Statement of legal powers:

The draft subordinate legislation could be made under Section 62 Town and Country Planning Act 1990 as amended by Section 42 Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004.

Resource implications:

There are expected to be few resource implications. These provisions will require a limited degree of additional work for planning authorities, but costs of commissioning assessments will be borne by the applicants.

Background Material:

This legislation enhances the ability of planning authorities to achieve objectives contained within 'Planning Policy Wales', which include: securing competitive retail provision for all communities; and enhancing the vitality, attractiveness and viability of town, district, local and village centres.

The following amendments have been tabled:

In accordance with the revised guidance on the Grouping, Selection and Refusal of Amendments, the Presiding Officer has determined the order in which they will be taken for the purposes of debate. Votes will be taken separately:

Amendment 1. Kirsty Williams (Brecon and Radnor)

Add new point at end of motion

The development order should require the retail impact assessment to take account of the impact on general retailing in town centres, not solely food retailing, and should also include a full assessment on any potential environmental impact.

Amendment 2. Kirsty Williams (Brecon and Radnor)

Add new point at end of motion

The development order should also require general retail and environmental impact assessments when retail developments of over 1000sq metres add a mezzanine floor.
