#### NDM3191 Jane Hutt (Vale of Glamorgan)

To propose that the National Assembly for Wales, acting under section 62(1) (b) of the Government of Wales Act 1998, resolves to delegate the following functions of the National Assembly contained within the Children Act 2004 to the Assembly First Minister, save those which by law cannot be so delegated:

Section 26 subsections (1) - (4), Section 29 subsections (1)(a), (2), (5), (6), (7), (8), (10), (11) and (12), Section 31 subsections (2) and (4) and (5), Section 32 subsections (2) - (3), Section 34 subsection (1), Section 46, Section 49 subsection (1).

Nothing in the motion will have the effect of reducing the pre-eminence of the authority of the full Assembly or of reducing the role of the Assembly Committees in the exercise of the above functions.

This delegation will be made in the knowledge that those functions will, as appropriate, be further delegated to the appropriate Assembly Minister and to staff.

#### **Amendment 1 - Jocelyn Davies (South Wales East)**

Add as new points at end of motion:

- Regrets the failure of the Welsh Assembly Government to:
- a) meet its hospital waiting times targets;
- b) abolish homecare charges for disabled people;
- c) provide free breakfasts to all primary school children;
- d) ensure that everyone can have access to an NHS dentist;

- e) increase the number of students in Further Education since 2003; and f) suspend Right to Buy in areas of housing pressure. • Expresses concern that: a) the failure to devolve powers for policing has resulted in a Westminster imposed restructuring of police forces; b) the financial shortfall within the NHS will result in cuts to health services and will detrimentally affect the recruitment and retention of health professionals; c) no coherent economic strategy has been developed to improve the economy in West Wales and the Valleys; d) the First Minister's report does not include the annual report of the sustainable development scheme; e) insufficient progress has been made in removing the most vulnerable from fuel poverty by 2010; and f) a quarter of children are experiencing child poverty. • Welcomes Assembly resolutions, and decisions to:
- a) establish an inquiry into ambulance services;
- b) assist pensioners whose council tax band had increased by more than one band;
- c) increase provision for the small school fund;
- d) increase funding for rail services;
- e) increase funding for universities;
- f) ensure that Welsh university students studying in Wales will not pay top-up-fees; and
- g) establish a committee to scrutinise the funding of schools.

#### **Amendment 2 - Kirsty Williams (Brecon and Radnorshire)**

Add new point at end of motion:

Regrets the ditching of the Assembly Government's promise to scrap home care charges for disabled people.

#### **Amendment 3 - Kirsty Williams (Brecon and Radnorshire)**

Add new point at end of motion:

Notes the shambolic manner of the merging of certain ASPBs with the Assembly Government.

#### **Amendment 4 - Kirsty Williams (Brecon and Radnorshire)**

Add new point at end of motion:

Welcomes the reduction in waiting times over 12 months but notes that the length of waiting times for many patients are still unacceptably long.

#### **Amendment 5 - Kirsty Williams (Brecon and Radnorshire)**

Add new point at end of motion:

Notes the paucity of policies contained in the First Minister's programme of government when two of his top five 'most notable achievements' have happened through the actions of others.

#### **Amendment 6 - Kirsty Williams (Brecon and Radnorshire)**

Calls on the Welsh Assembly Government to give greater priority to infrastructure (particularly transport) projects in the next round of European structural funding.
