Q14 Mark Isherwood: Will the First Minister make a statement on economic growth in Wales? (OAQ39039)

The First Minister: Economic growth in Wales, as reflected in gross value added per head, kept pace with the UK average between 1999 and 2002, following a period of relative decline during the 1990s. The Office for National Statistics are due to publish 2003 GVA estimates in December this year.

Potential Redeployment of Welsh Soldiers in Central Iraq

Q15 Alun Ffred Jones: Has the First Minister made any representations to his colleagues at Westminster regarding the potential redeployment of Welsh soldiers in central Iraq? (OAQ39044)

The First Minister: I have had no specific discussions on this matter with Westminster colleagues. Assembly Members will be aware that the Black Watch battle group now deployed in central Iraq includes a squadron of the Queen's Dragoon Guards, which recruits very strongly in Wales. Our fond wishes go to them and to all other Welsh soldiers, both in that battle group and in their deployments in Iraq in their important task.
