Questions to the First Minister

Questions were answered by the Minister for Assembly Business on behalf of the First Minister.

Meeting between the First Minister and North Wales Council Leaders

Q6 Alun Pugh: In his role as policy co-ordinator for north Wales, will the First Minister make a statement on any plans to meet with north Wales council leaders? (OAQ8998)

The Minister for Assembly Business (Andrew Davies): In his capacity as co-ordinator of the administration's work in north Wales, the First Minister visits regularly and has contact with a wide range of individuals and organisations. He has met with different local authority leaders on several occasions and in many different contexts. Cabinet colleagues are also in regular contact with issues in north Wales that fall within their different responsibilities.

If requested, the First Minister would be happy to meet with the local authority leaders on a collective basis and would put such arrangements in hand in consultation with the Welsh Local Government Association

Andrew Davies: The First Minister has regular meetings with UK Government Ministers in which a wide variety of issues are discussed, including the state of the economy. The position of Corus has recently been a central part of these meetings.

Stephen Byers at the Department of Trade and Industry wrote to colleagues last summer, suggesting the establishment of a ministerial group to support the manufacturing sector. The First Minister or his deputy, Michael German, will attend those meetings with a Minister from the Office of the Secretary of State for Wales, members of the UK Government and devolved administrations.

The first meeting is due to take place in the near future. The agenda is likely to include employment and skills, the image of manufacturing and currency issues.
