Questions to the First Minister

Tobacco Control Measures

Q11 David Lloyd: Will the First Minister make a statement on recent discussions he has had regarding tobacco control measures? OAQ(3)2568(FM)

The First Minister (Carwyn Jones): I have not taken part in discussions on tobacco control measures to date. Reducing smoking is a priority for the Assembly Government. The Minister for Health and Social Services is setting up a stakeholder group to develop a tobacco strategy for Wales, which will develop proposals on this important issue.

The First Minister: The Arbed strategic energy performance investment programme is a joint housing, regeneration and energy efficiency initiative, which invests in the energy performance of homes and which, in turn, will generate green jobs and drive innovation. The initial phase will see over £30 million of strategic capital investment funds invested in projects across Wales's strategic regeneration areas.
