Purpose

Timing

Background

- 3. The draft report looks at the range of activities which contribute to bureaucratic burdens on schools. It concludes:
- All areas examined are necessary for school improvement
- The systems in many areas are unduly burdensome
- No area of activity can be removed but systems need to be better managed
- The totality of burdens needs to be reduced the recommendations and proposed action in each area of activity takes this forward
- New burdens placed on schools should not add to the overall level but should be counterbalanced by removal or streamlining of existing burdens.
- The report goes beyond the immediate responsibilities of the Assembly. It encompasses
 matters which are the responsibility of Estyn, ACCAC and local authorities. It has the
 support of those bodies expressed in the case of local authorities by WLGA and
 ADEW.
- 2. The report to plenary will include an executive summary.

Compliance

3. The Assembly has a duty under Section 10 of the Education Act 1996, to promote the education of people in Wales. Sections 40 and 85 of the Government of Wales Act to

	cilitate the exercise of that function. These powers are delegated to the Minister for ducation and Lifelong Learning.
