The report notes that the development of digital media: the Internet, digital broadcasting and video games still constitutes a major challenge for the European Union's audiovisual policy, particularly in relation to the protection of children. The report provides details about the regulatory system in place in Members States and Accession Countries.  The Commission intends to follow up this report, and other consultations in this field, by proposing an update of the Recommendation during the first half of 2004. This may cover issues like media literacy, the right of reply, and measures against discrimination or incitement to hatred on the grounds of race, sex or nationality in all online media.
