In addition to his written report, the Minister provided a further update on Avian Influenza and advised the Committee on the latest position regarding the future of the Institute for Grassland and Environmental Research.

Action points

The Minister agreed to provide a note confirming the holding time for imported poultry and the number of inspection visits carried out by the State Veterinary Service during this holding period.

The Minister agreed to circulate advice on the requirements for the reporting and treatment of sheep scab.

The Minister agreed to bring a paper to the Committee at the first meeting of the autumn term on the report on Badger Found Dead Survey.

7.1 The Committee noted the Minister's paper. The Committee would take evidence from a number of interested parties on the proposals as set out in Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs'

consultation at its 24 May meeting.

Item 8: Subordinate legislation

Avian Influenza (Vaccination)(Wales) Regulations 2006

Paper: EPC (2) 07-06(p6)

The Committee considered the Avian Influenza (Vaccination)(Wales) Regulations 2006.

Members sought clarification on:

- the procedure for agreeing emergency and preventative vaccination;
- the current Welsh Assembly Government policy on preventative vaccination;
- the vaccination of rare and endangered species of captive birds in UK zoos; and
- the private purchasing of vaccine.

In response the Minister made the following points:

- If a decision were made by the Assembly to introduce emergency and preventative vaccination, representations would need to be made by to the European Commission by the UK Government, as the Member State.
- At present vaccination was not considered the most effective defence against avian influenza and did not form part of the UK avian influenza control strategy.
- The decision to vaccinate rare and endangered species of captive birds had been made by the Animal Disease Policy Group on which the Welsh Assembly Government had representation.
- The vaccines against avian influenza did not have marketing authorisation and were therefore not available for private purchasing. 2.3 million doses of vaccine had been purchased at a UK level for the vaccination of birds in zoos.

The Committee recommended approval of the Avian Influenza (Vaccination)(Wales) Regulations 2006 without amendment. Its report would be laid before the Assembly shortly.

The Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy (BSE) Compensation (Wales) Regulations 2006 Paper: EPC (2) 07-06(p7)

The Committee considered The Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy (BSE) Compensation (Wales) Regulations 2006.

Some Members expressed concern regarding the proposed tabular compensation system based on average market prices was fundamentally unfair since animals of poorer quality would be overcompensated and those of a higher quality under-compensated.

The Committee recommended approval of the legislation without amendment. Its report would be laid

before the Assembly shortly.

The Transmissible Spongiform Encephalopathies (TSE) (Sheep and Goats) Compensation (Wales) Regulations 2006

The Committee considered The Transmissible Spongiform Encephalopathies (TSE) (Sheep and Goats) Compensation (Wales) Regulations 2006 and recommended approval without amendment. Its report would be laid before the Assembly shortly.

Members raised the same concern regarding the proposed tabular compensation system as in its previous discussion.
