EEAC Work Programme - European Strategic Priorities for 2010

Overview

This paper has been prepared as an update to the paper on Developing EEAC Strategic Priorities for 2010 that was discussed on 20 April, taking account of developments to the European Commission's Work Programme since 31 March 2010. The purpose is to inform the Committee's forward work programme.

Action for the Committee:

To consider the paper with a view to **agreeing**:

- the continuation of an inquiry framed around the key strategic issues identified in Table 1: Europe 2020, EU Budget, tackling the economic crisis, future of Cohesion Policy (section B below);
- 2. selection of one or more issues listed in Table 2 for more detailed follow up;
- 3. referral of issues listed in Table 3 to other Assembly Committees for their consideration.

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A. Introduction

The European Commission published its annual Work Programme for 2010¹ on 31 March 2010, and it has been discussed with the European Council, European Parliament and the Committee of the Regions.

The Commission has already published a number of legislative and non-legislative proposals included in the 2010 Work Programme, and has also been providing details on its website (as they become available) of initiatives planned for introduction during 2010, including anticipated timeframes.

B. Key strategic issues for EEAC to follow during 2010

A number of key strategic issues were identified in the Commission Work Programme for the Committee to consider as the basis of its work for the remainder of this Assembly.

During discussion of these issues on 20 April Members requested that the theme 'tackling the economic and financial crisis', focusing on financial supervision and controls in the financial/banking sector across the EU, should be a key strategic priority for the Committee to follow during 2010 and into 2011 because of the potential implications that developments in this area may have in Wales. This has been added to the revised list in **Table 1**.

There is a **high degree of cross-over** between the key strategic issues in Table 1, in particular in terms of the future priorities of the EU, the availability of funding (contingent on how the EU economy recovers from the financial crisis), and the resources that are made available for concerted EU action through the future EU Budget.

The Committee may wish, therefore, to continue an ongoing inquiry on these issues alongside its inquiry into the future of EU Cohesion Policy This gives the Committee flexibility to respond quickly to any new developments at EU level, whilst retaining the option for detailed inquiry into specific key issues as necessary (e.g. focusing on one or more of the Europe 2020 "flagship initiatives" as they are published).
