#### ADRODDIAD GAN Y PWYLLGOR DEDDFAU LEGISLATION COMMITTEE REPORT

The Feeding Stuffs (Sampling and Analysis) (Amendment) (Wales) Regulations 2001

## **Background**

These Regulations amend the Feeding Stuffs (Sampling and Analysis) Regulations 1999 and implement Commission Directive 2000/45/EC establishing Community methods of analysis for the determination of vitamins A and E, and tryptophan in feeding stuffs, and in the cases of Vitamins A and E, in premixtures.

Minor and consequential amendments are made to the Feeding Stuffs Regulations 2000, the Feeding Stuffs (Establishments and Intermediaries) Regulations 1999 and the Feeding Stuffs (Enforcement) Regulations 1999.

The relevant Commission Directive 2000/45/EC stated that these methods of analysis should be applied from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2000.

England has made a similar Regulation on 26<sup>th</sup> February 2001 and it came into force on 20<sup>th</sup> March 2001.

#### **Standing Order 11.5**

The Committee considers the following matters to be defective under Standing Order 11.5, in that they amount to defective drafting. These defects are capable of correction by means of a Memorandum of Corrections. Thus if the necessary corrections are made, whether by means of a Memorandum of Corrections or otherwise, there will be no matters in respect of which the Committee needs to invite the National Assembly to pay special attention.

# Regulation 2

'(Diwygio)' has been incorrectly inserted in the title of the Feeding Stuffs (Sampling and Analysis) Regulations 1999 in the Welsh text.

### **Regulation 5**

This Regulation requires revision as it refers to the omission of incorrect regulations within the Feeding Stuffs Regulations 2001 (2001/343). It is understood that the 2000 Regulations have not been published to date.
