LEGISLATION COMMITTEE REPORT DRAFT

The Local Government (Best Value Performance Indicators) (Wales) Order 2002

This Order prescribes indicators by reference to which the performance of county councils, county borough councils and national park authorities (as best value authorities), in exercising their functions, will be measured.

Standing Order 11.5

No points have been identified as matters which the Committee needs to draw to the special attention of the Assembly.

General Observations

Explanatory Note – third paragraph

This is a little misleading in stating that the performance indicators are "detailed" in article 4.

Explanatory Note – final paragraph

It would be helpful to indicate by whom the guidance is to be published.

Article 4

It is queried whether "listed" should be omitted.

Schedules - guidance

As explained in the explanatory note, the detail for each indicator which was given in the 2001 Order is being replaced by guidance.

It will thus be necessary to recognise, in the application of this Order, that this is now

merely guidance and does not have the legislative force it previously had. This may be

particularly relevant in relation to Schedule 6 which uses terms such as "traffic sensitive

road" and "dangerous damage" which it is assumed will be dependent upon the guidance

for interpretation. The same may also apply in relation to the categorisation of "violent"

offences and "vehicle" crimes in Schedule 12.

Schedule 1-1.4

This would have been simpler if the bracketed reference to "(percentage)" had been

deleted and "percentage" substituted for "proportion".

Schedule 4

It would have been desirable for the definition of "dwelling" to have been in the main text

rather than in a note.

Schedule 9 - 9.3

'flwyddyn' is mis-spelt.

Schedule 11 - 11.1

"communication" should be "communicated".
