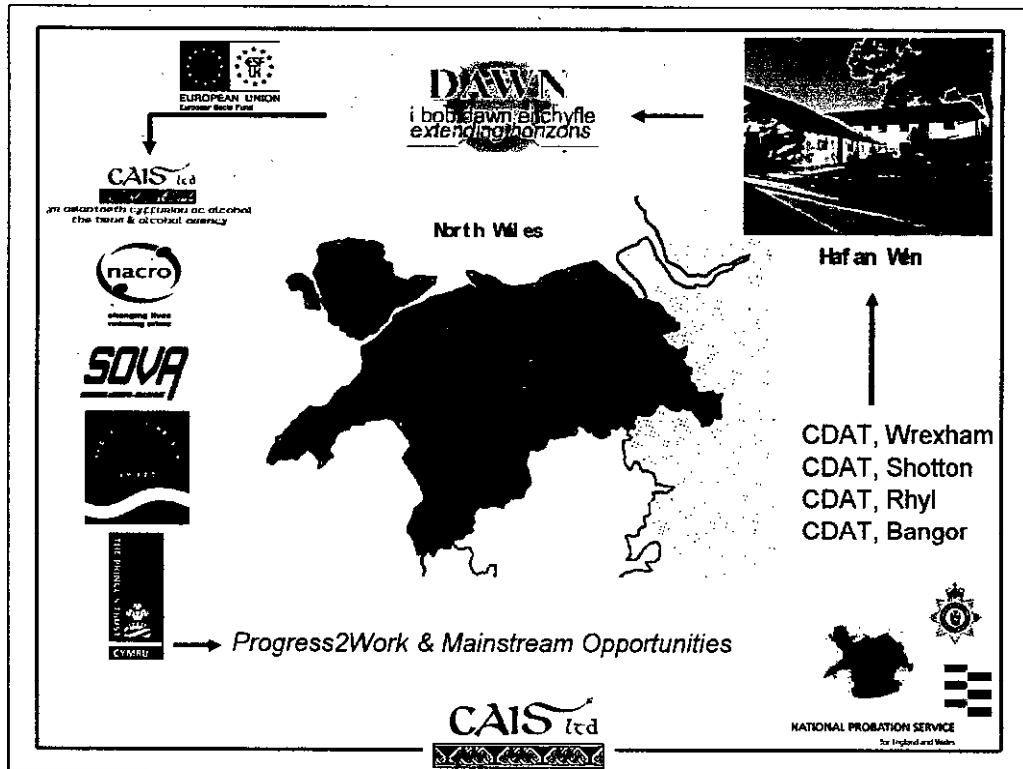

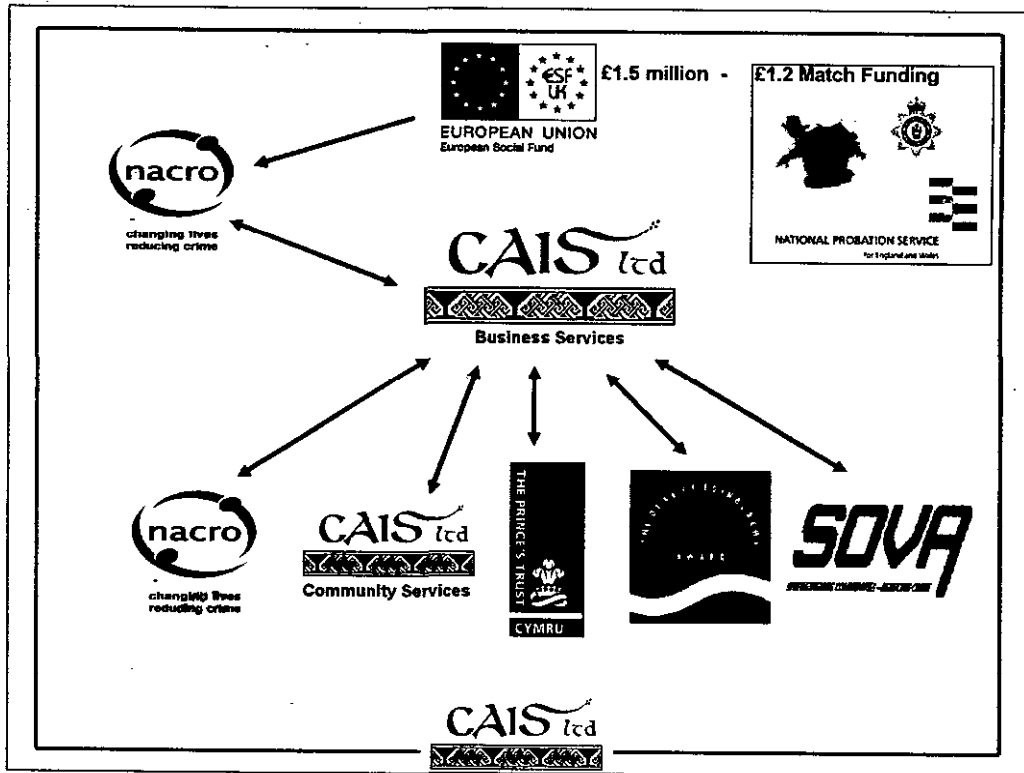


North Wales Community – key statutory partners are involved – Police, Probation, Health & Local Authorities.

Drug and Alcohol Misuse is a related issue to all major strategic thinking and planning.

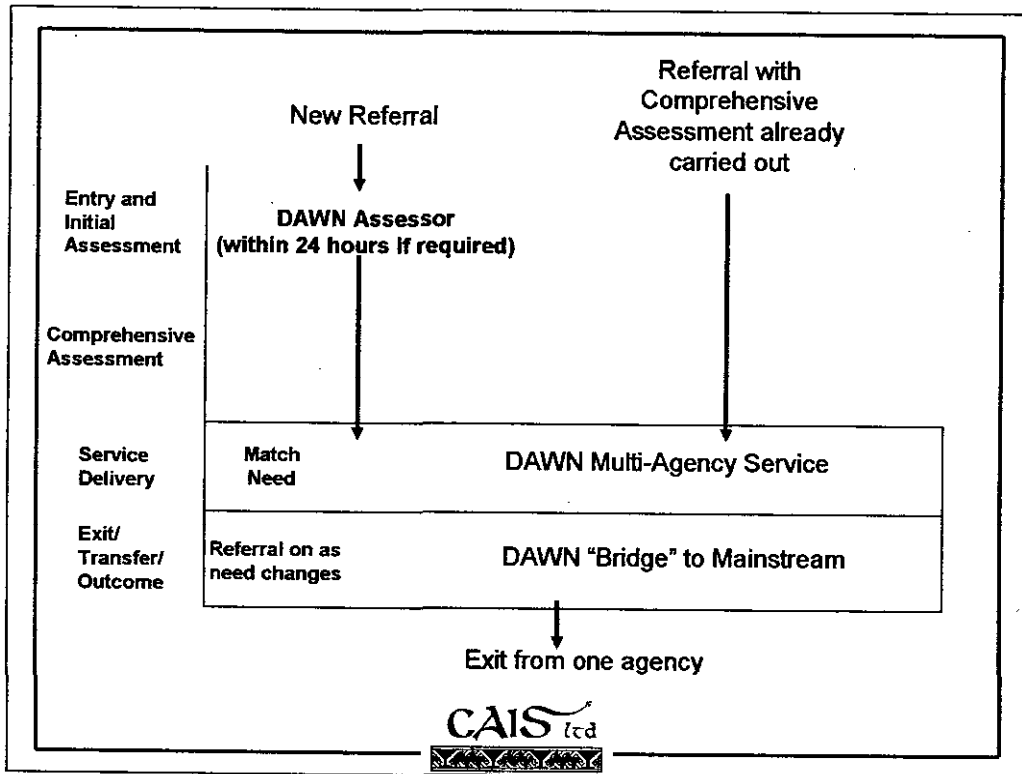
Health Related, Social Related and Offending Related Strategies.

### Making It Happen

- Contractual Arrangements between partners
- NACRO as Lead Agency
- CAIS Business Services as Contracted Agency to deliver Monitoring Information and Financial Management
- Key Agencies delivering the service



### Client DAWN Pathway

- Assessment team available on rota to provide assessment within 24 hours, if client requires this.
- Because of DAWN client need can be more accurately matched with appropriate service
- Transfer of client between agencies can be done with reduced risk of losing the client
- Client exiting from DAWN and Case Closure is from one agency and therefore Outcome can be monitored at the point of exit

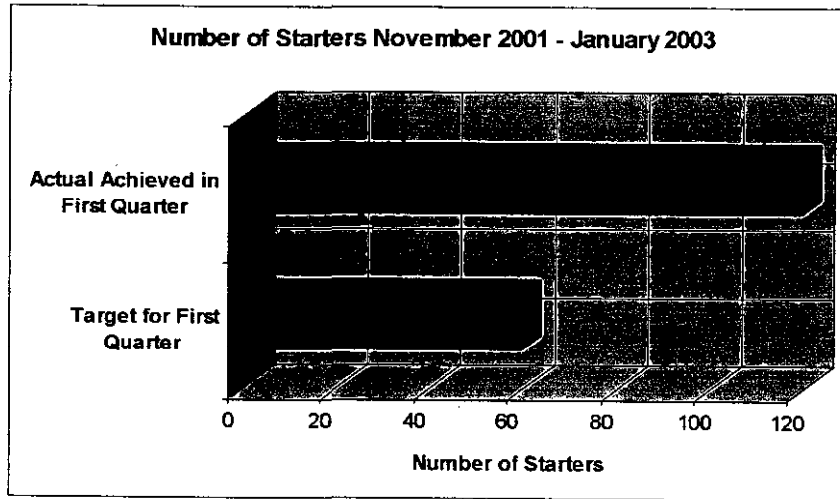
