**The Planning (National Security Directions and Appointed Representatives)
(Wales) Regulations 2006**

The purpose of these Regulations is to make provisions relating to the handling of town and country planning matters when national security issues are involved. They were made using the Executive procedure on 23 May 2006 and came into force on 7 June 2006.

Standing Order 11.7

The following points have been identified for reporting under Standing Order 11.7 –

The Welsh text of regulation 1(2) commences with the expression "Yn ddarostyngedig i reoliad 3" [Subject to regulation 3] There is no corresponding expression in the English text. [Standing Order 11.7(vi)]

Regulation 6(7) contains a cross-reference to paragraph (4)(a)(i). There is no sub-paragraph (i) to paragraph (4)(a). [Standing Order 11.7(v)]

Regulation 8(5) contains a cross-reference to regulation 11 in the English text, but to regulation 14 in the Welsh text. The context indicates that the English is correct. [Standing Order 11.7(vi)]

Observations

The primary legislation to which these Regulations relate gives powers to the Assembly's Counsel General. There is currently no Counsel General who can exercise those powers although the current Government of Wales Bill provides for such an office.

Two typographical errors suitable for correction on publication have also been drawn to the attention of the drafting lawyers.
