Item 1: Minutes of the previous meeting and matters arising: LEG-02-2001(min)

1.1 The Committee agreed the minutes of the meeting held on 30th January 2001.

Item 2: Chair's Report

2.1 The Chair reminded members that when they had considered **The Education (Education Standards Grants) (Wales) Regulations (LC153)** in the previous meeting a question was raised as to whether these regulations need to be made on an annual basis. The Legal Adviser informed members that although there is no provision, either in the enabling legislation or in the Regulations themselves, which limited the duration of the Regulations to one year, the practice in the last three years has been for the Regulations to be remade annually due to changes in the grant system.

Item 3: Assembly Orders for Consideration

LC156: The Local Education Authority (Behaviour Support Plans) (Amendment) (Wales) Regulations 2001

- 3.1 Mr Turnbull presented his report to the Committee.
- 3.2 The Committee agreed that it did not need to invite the Assembly to pay special attention to the regulations on any grounds specified in Standing Order 11.5. However, the Committee did make some general observations which they felt should be recorded in their Report.

LC157: The National Health Service (Professions Supplementary to Medicine) Amendment (Wales) Regulations 2001

LC159:The Education (Pupil Registration) (Amendment) (Wales) Regulations 2001 3.10 Mr Davies presented his report to the Committee.

LC160:The Tir Mynydd (Wales) Regulations 2001

- 3.13 Mr Davies presented his report to the Committee.
- 3.14 Having considered the Legal Adviser's report, Members agreed that there were matters to raise under Standing Order 11.5. However as these matters were drafting errors which were appropriate for correction, it was agreed that they should be amended under SO22.13 by a Memorandum of Corrections. The Committee's report would indicate that it was subject to these particular errors being corrected in this way, by laying before the Assembly a Memorandum of Corrections. There were also a number of general observations in respect of typographical and grammatical errors and minor drafting improvements that the Committee felt should be recorded in their Report.

LC161:The Highways Noise Payments (Movable Homes) (Wales) Regulations 2001 3.16 Mr Turnbull presented his report to the Committee.

- 3.17 The Committee agreed that it did not need to invite the Assembly to pay special attention to the regulations on any grounds specified in Standing Order 11.5. However, the Committee did make a number of general observations which they felt should be recorded in their Report.
