(xiii) P-03-196 Sutent	
Petition wording	
'Help extend Paul Popham's life and that of all kidney cancer patients currently denied treatment. Paul Popham is only 63 and lives in Morriston, Swansea. He was diagnosed with kidney cancer on October 27th 2008. The treatment Paul's consultant wants to prescribe for him is Sutent which is not funded by Swansea Local Health Board. This is not an isolated case there are approximately 6200 kidney cancer patients diagnosed per year, 3000 of these patients may need funding for cancer drugs. Those who need Sutent have to appeal to their Local Health Board for funding.	
This is an irrational and cruel situation for cancer patients. Some Local Health Boards accept clinical evidence from senior cancer consultants, but other authorities force desperate, ill patients through a long and complicated exceptional cases/appeals process, then disregard the clinician's opinion and refuse to fund the recommended treatment.	
It is unacceptable and immoral that British kidney cancer patients, who have no other hope, can be denied these drugs and sentenced to premature death. Please sign below to put pressure on the Welsh Assembly Government to give their personal assurance that they will do everything in their power to make these drugs available to these patients today!'
