**The Education (Specified Work and
Registration) (Wales) Regulations
2004**

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations specify work that may be carried out in schools by qualified teachers and persons who satisfy specified requirements. The requirements to be satisfied are specified in Schedule 2.

Schedule 2 to these Regulations now provides for most of those persons who were mentioned in Schedule 2 to the Education (Teachers' Qualifications and Health Standards) (Wales) Regulations 1999 to carry out specified work in schools, in the same circumstances as previously. Paragraph 8 of Schedule 2 to these Regulations provides for other persons to carry out specified work in schools if the conditions mentioned in that paragraph are satisfied. Persons categorised as "student teachers" under the 1999 Regulations (i.e. those awaiting admission to a course of initial training for teachers or deferring its completion) can no longer carry out specified work in the same circumstances as previously but must satisfy the conditions in paragraph 8.

These Regulations also provide for qualified teachers carrying out work specified in regulation 6 in schools to be registered with the General Teaching Council for Wales.

The National Assembly for Wales in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 133, 134, 145 and 210 of the Education Act 2002(a) hereby makes the following Regulations:

Name, commencement and application

1. These Regulations are called the Education (Specified Work and Registration) (Wales) Regulations 2004 and come into force on [.....] 2004.

2. These Regulations apply in relation to Wales.

Revocations, savings and transitional provisions

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2) the Regulations mentioned in Part I of Schedule 1 are revoked to the extent specified in that Schedule.

(2) The savings and transitional provisions mentioned in Part II of Schedule 1 are to have effect.

Interpretation

4. In these Regulations —

“the 1959 Regulations” (“*Rheoliadau 1959*”) means the Schools Regulations 1959(b);

“the 1982 Regulations” (“*Rheoliadau 1982*”) means the Education (Teachers) Regulations 1982(c);

“the 1989 Regulations” (“*Rheoliadau 1989*”) means the Education (Teachers) Regulations 1989(d);

“the 1993 Regulations” (“*Rheoliadau 1993*”) means the Education (Teachers) Regulations 1993(e);

“the 1999 Regulations” (“*Rheoliadau 1999*”) means the Education (Teachers’ Qualifications and Health Standards) (Wales) Regulations 1999(f); and

“the National Assembly” (“*y Cynulliad Cenedlaethol*”) means the National Assembly for Wales.

Requirement to be qualified

5. No person may carry out work specified in regulation 6 in a school unless he or she —

- (a) is a qualified teacher, or
- (b) satisfies the requirements specified in Schedule 2.

Specified work

6. —(1) Each of the following activities is specified work for the purposes of these Regulations —

- (a) planning and preparing lessons and courses for pupils;
- (b) delivering lessons to pupils;
- (c) assessing the development, progress and attainment of pupils; and
- (d) reporting on the development, progress and attainment of pupils.

(2) In paragraph (1)(b) “delivering” includes delivery via distance learning or computer aided techniques.

Requirement to be registered

7. A qualified teacher may carry out work specified in regulation 6 in a school only if he or she is registered under section 3 of the 1998 Act (register maintained by the General Teaching Council)(a).

PART 2
SAVINGS AND GENERAL TRANSITIONAL
PROVISIONS

Probation decisions by the National Assembly

1.—(1) In the case of a person who, on 1st September 1992, had commenced but not completed a period of probation under regulation 14 of, and Schedule 6 to, the 1989 Regulations, regulation 14 and Schedule 6 are to continue to have effect until all their provisions have been complied with.

(2) A teacher who —

- (a) has been determined to be unsuitable for further employment as a qualified teacher pursuant to paragraph 2(c) of Schedule 2 to the 1959 Regulations; or
- (b) received written notice under paragraph 5(2) of Schedule 6 to the 1982 Regulations,

is not to carry out work specified in regulation 6 in a school without the consent of the National Assembly.

Licensed, overseas trained and registered teachers

2.—(1) The 1993 Regulations are to continue to apply as if the Education (Teachers) (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations 1997(a), the 1999 Regulations, the Education (School Teachers' Qualifications) (Wales) Regulations 2004 and these Regulations had not been made for the purposes of —

- (a) permitting the employment as a teacher at a school of an unqualified teacher who was a licensed teacher or an overseas trained teacher as therein defined on 30th November 1997, and duties imposed on persons in connection therewith are to continue to apply; and
- (b) determining whether a person, who on or at any time before 30th November 1997 was a licensed teacher, overseas trained teacher or registered teacher as therein defined, is a qualified teacher.

(2) A person who is employed at a school by virtue of paragraph (1)(a) may carry out work specified in regulation 6 in a school until he or she ceases to be so employed.

Graduate Teachers

3. In the case of a person who before [.....] 2004 was granted an authorisation to teach by virtue of paragraphs 5 to 11 of Schedule 2 to the 1999 Regulations, those paragraphs are to continue to have effect as if these Regulations had not been made, until that person successfully completes or ceases to undertake the training proposed by virtue of those paragraphs.

Registered Teachers

4. In the case of a person who before [.....] 2004 was granted an authorisation to teach by virtue of paragraphs 12 to 18 of Schedule 2 to the 1999 Regulations, those paragraphs are to continue to have effect as if these Regulations had not been made, until that person successfully completes or ceases to undertake the training proposed by virtue of those paragraphs.

SCHEDULE 2

Regulation 5

THE REQUIREMENTS TO BE SATISFIED BY PERSONS WHO ARE NOT QUALIFIED TEACHERS IN ORDER TO CARRY OUT THE WORK SPECIFIED IN REGULATION 6

Interpretation

1. In this Schedule —

“employment-based teacher training scheme” (*“cynllun hyfforddiant athrawon ar sail cyflogaeth”*) means the scheme established by the National Assembly under [regulation 12 of the Education (School Teachers’ Qualifications) (Wales) Regulations 2004];

“graduate teacher” (*“athro graddedig”*) means a person who has been granted an authorisation to teach in accordance with paragraphs 5 to 11 of Schedule 2 to the 1999 Regulations before [.....] 2004; and

“registered teacher” (*“athro cofrestredig”*) means a person who has been granted an authorisation to teach in accordance with paragraphs 12 to 18 of Schedule 2 to the 1999 Regulations before [.....] 2004.

Existing unqualified teachers in nursery classes and at nursery schools

2.—(1) This paragraph applies in the case of —

- (a) an assistant teacher at a nursery school, or
- (b) a teacher of a nursery class,

who was permitted to be employed as a teacher by paragraph 4 of Schedule 4 of the 1982 Regulations and who was so employed immediately before 1st September 1989.

(2) Such a person may carry out work specified in regulation 6 in a school, in the same capacity as he or she was employed before 1st September 1989.

Instructors with special qualifications or experience

3.—(1) This paragraph applies in the case of a person who is not a qualified teacher appointed, or proposed to be appointed, to give instruction in any art or skill or in any subject or group of subjects (including any form of

vocational training), where special qualifications or experience or both are required in order to carry out the work specified in regulation 6.

(2) A person mentioned in sub-paragraph (1) may carry out work specified in regulation 6 in a school if at the time of appointment —

- (a) the local education authority (in the case of a school which has no delegated budget or a pupil referral unit), the governing body acting with the consent of the local education authority (in the case of a school which has a delegated budget), or the governing body (in the case of a special school not maintained by a local education authority), as the case may be, are satisfied as to the person's qualifications or experience or both; and
- (b) no suitable qualified teacher, graduate teacher, registered teacher or teacher on the employment-based teacher training scheme is available for such appointment or to give such instruction.

(3) A person appointed pursuant to sub-paragraphs (1) and (2) may carry out work specified in regulation 6 in a school, subject to sub-paragraph (4), only for such period of time as no suitable qualified teacher, graduate teacher, registered teacher or teacher on the employment-based teacher training scheme is available for appointment or to give instruction.

(4) Sub-paragraph (3) does not apply in the case of such a person appointed before 8th April 1982 where —

- (a) the appointment was for a specified period, if and so long as that period has not expired; or
- (b) the appointment was for an unspecified period, if it was not otherwise expressed to be temporary only.

Overseas Trained Teachers

4.—(1) Subject to sub-paragraph (2), a person who is not a qualified teacher may carry out work specified in regulation 6 in a school (other than a pupil referral unit) if that person has successfully completed a programme of professional training for teachers in any country outside the United Kingdom and which is recognised as such a programme of training by the competent authority in that country.

(2) Sub-paragraph (1) is not to apply in the case of a person mentioned in that sub-paragraph after the expiry of a period of two years commencing on whichever is the earlier of —

- (a) the day on which he or she first carries out work specified in regulation 6 in a school by virtue of sub-paragraph (1), or

- (b) the day on which he or she was first employed as a teacher in a school by virtue of paragraph 4 of Schedule 2 to the 1999 Regulations.

Graduate teachers

5.—(1) This paragraph applies in the case of a person who has been granted an authorisation to teach in accordance with paragraphs 5 to 11 of Schedule 2 to the 1999 Regulations before [.....] 2004.

(2) Such a person may carry out work specified in regulation 6 in a school until that person successfully completes or ceases to undertake the training proposed by virtue of those paragraphs.

Registered teachers

6.—(1) This paragraph applies in the case of a person who has been granted an authorisation to teach in accordance with paragraphs 12 to 18 of Schedule 2 to the 1999 Regulations before [.....] 2004.

(2) Such a person may carry out work specified in regulation 6 in a school until that person successfully completes or ceases to undertake the training proposed by virtue of those paragraphs.

Employment-based teacher training scheme

7.—(1) This paragraph applies in the case of a person who is undertaking training for the purposes of the employment-based teacher training scheme.

(2) Such a person may carry out work specified in regulation 6 in a school until that person successfully completes or ceases to undertake that training.

Other persons who may carry out specified work

8.—(1) This paragraph applies in the case of a person who is not a qualified teacher and who is not mentioned in paragraphs 2 to 7 of this Schedule.

(2) Such a person may carry out work specified in regulation 6 in a school only if the following conditions are satisfied —

- (a) he or she carries out work specified in regulation 6 in order to assist or support the work of a qualified teacher or a nominated teacher in the school;
- (b) he or she is subject to the direction and supervision of such a qualified teacher or nominated teacher in accordance with arrangements made by the head teacher of the school; and
- (c) the head teacher is satisfied that he or she has the skills, expertise and experience required to carry out work specified in regulation 6.

(3) A head teacher may nominate as a nominated teacher for the purpose of sub-paragraph (2) a person who is mentioned in paragraph 3, 4, 5, 6 or 7 of this Schedule if the head teacher considers the nomination appropriate in the circumstances.]

(4) In determining whether the person mentioned in sub-paragraph (1) has the skills, expertise and experience required to carry out work specified in regulation 6 in a school, the head teacher may have regard to —

- (a) such standards for higher-level teaching assistants, or guidance concerning school support staff, as may be published from time to time by the National Assembly; and
- (b) such guidance as to contractual matters relating to school support staff as may be published from time to time by any local education authority or other employer.
