Chart 1 - Local authority budget per pupil in Wales, 2003-04




Chart 2 - Regional average budget per pupil in Wales and England, 2003-04




Chart 3a - Historical trend in spend per pupil in Wales and England (amounts at outturn prices) (a)





Chart 3b - Historical trend in spend per pupil in Wales and England (amounts at constant 2002-03 price
