Why?

The National Assembly for Wales's Education and Lifelong Learning Committee is carrying out a policy review of special educational needs. We have completed the first stage of this review, focusing on early identification and intervention, and published a report in November 2004. We are now proceeding to the second stage, examining the statutory assessment framework for special educational needs; more commonly known as the statementing process.
