\varnothing The Inspection of the Careers and Related Services (Wales) Regulations 2006
These Regulations prescribe the arrangements for the inspection of careers and related services in Wales under the new powers given to the Chief Inspector for Education and Training in Wales in the Education Act 2005 (the Act). The Act and associated Regulations will bring the inspection of careers services and related services in line with all other Education and Training in Wales that comes within the Chief Inspector's remit.

Ø The Education (Assisted Places) (Amendment) (Wales) Regulations 2006

The Education (Schools) Act 1997 provides for the progressive phasing out of the Assisted Places Scheme (APS) and imposes a duty on the National Assembly for Wales to continue to remit the whole or part of the tuition fees and other incidental expenses, which parents are required to meet in connection with their child's participation in the APS.

These Regulations uplift by 2.4%, in line with inflation (October 2005 Retail; Price Index), the tables used to calculate the amount that parents of children continuing to hold assisted places at former participating independent schools have to contribute to tuition fees during the academic year 2005/2006, having regard to their relevant income. The Regulations also uprate by 2.4% the dependants allowance used to calculate relevant income from £1,575 to £1,625.

Ø The Education (Assisted Places) (Incidental Expenses) (Amendment) (Wales) Regulations 2006

The Education (Schools) Act 1997 provides for the progressive phasing out of the Assisted Places Scheme (APS) and imposes a duty on the National Assembly for Wales to continue to remit the whole or part of the tuition fees and other incidental expenses, which parents are required to meet in connection with their child's participation in the APS.

These Regulations uplift by 2.4%, in line with inflation (October 2005 Retail Price Index), the tables used to calculate parents' eligibility to receive uniform grant and travel grant available under the scheme during the academic year 2006/07.

• Motion to approve The Town and Country Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) (Amendment) (Wales) Regulations 2006 (15 mins)

These Regulations implement the requirements of Article 3 of the 'Public Participation' Directive 2003/35/EC. They amend the Town and Country Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment)

(England and Wales) Regulations 1999 and update some Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA)-related definitions in the Town and Country Planning (General Development Procedure) Order 1995.

Motion to approve The Independent Review of Determinations (Adoption)
 (Wales) Regulations 2006 (15 mins)

These Regulations establish independent review arrangements to review adoption agency decisions where it is minded:

- not to approve prospective adopters as suitable to become adoptive parents;
- to revoke approval to prospective adopters who are no longer considered suitable as adoptive parents;
- not to proceed with an application for disclosure of information;
- to disclose information about a person where consent to disclosure has been withheld; and
- not to disclose information about a person where consent has been given consent to disclosure.
- Motion to approve The Common Agricultural Policy Single Payment Scheme (Setaside) (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2006 (15 mins)

These Regulations amend the Common Agricultural Policy Single Payment Scheme (Setaside) (Wales) Regulations 2005 by:

- adding further exemptions from the requirement to establish green cover (e.g. grass) by the commencement of the green cover season;
- adding a provision allowing farmers at any time on or after 1 May each year to

cultivate organic land set aside from production for the purpose of controlling weeds;

- removing the restriction on grazing after the set-aside period where the green cover has been replaced;
- setting new management conditions for the application of pesticides and herbicides on set-aside land;
- updating references to European Commission Regulations 795/2004 and 1973/2004 and European Council Regulation 1782/2003 to reflect the amendments that have been made to these Regulations, since the coming into force of The Common Agricultural Policy Single Payment Scheme (Set-aside) (Wales) Regulations 2005 on 15 January 2005; and
- substituting "9 February" for "31 January" as the last date each year for collectors or processors of raw materials produced on set-aside land for non-food purposes to notify the Welsh Assembly Government of quantities received.

 - Ø The Cereal Seed (Wales) and Fodder Plant Seed (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2006

These Regulations transpose Council Directive 2006/55/EC, which was published on 12 June 2006 and increases maximum size of cereal seed lots for species other than maize from 25 to 30 tonnes. In addition, these Regulations amend the Cereal Seed (Wales) Regulations 2005 and the Fodder Plant Seed (Wales) Regulations 2005 in line with Council Directive 2006/55/EC.

Ø The Meat (Official Controls Charges) (Wales) Regulations 2006

These Regulations implement in Wales provisions of EC Regulation 882/2004 on Official Food and Feed Controls that relate to the requirements to charge for meat hygiene official controls at approved meat establishments. These Regulations will require the Food Standards Agency to charge the operators of approved meat premises in Wales in order to recover the costs incurred by the Meat Hygiene Service (MHS), an Executive Agency of the FSA. These costs are incurred by the MHS in carrying out official controls at such premises for the purpose of checking compliance with applicable meat hygiene requirements.

• Motion to approve The Care Standards Act 2000 And The Children Act 1989 (Regulatory Reform And Complaints) (Wales) Regulations 2006 (15 mins)

These Regulations will bring the existing Regulations on services regulated by the Care Standards Inspectorate for Wales (CSIW) into line with two recent developments – the reform of regulatory practice and the new framework on handling complaints in local authority social services.

• Motion to approve The Countryside And Rights Of Way Act 2000 (Commencement No. 9 And Saving) (Wales) Order 2006 (15 mins)

This Order brings into force certain provisions of the Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000. The provisions require local highway authorities to have regard to the needs of persons with

	mobility problems when erecting stiles and gates across footpaths and bridleways. The Order also commences some technical provisions within the Act and clarifies the effect of provisions contained within two previous Commencement Orders.
	 Motion to approve The National Assembly for Wales (Returning Officers' Charges) Order 2006 (15 mins)
	This Order relates to the Assembly's power to make an Order in preparation for the next Assembly elections in 2007. Part I and II of the Schedule sets a maximum level for charges, expenses and fees, which Returning Officers can recover from the National Assembly for Wales, in respect of elections costs. Part III provides for the expenses a Returning Officer can claim for, which do not have maximum levels specified. This revokes The National Assembly for Wales (Returning Officers' Charges) Order 2002 and The National Assembly for Wales (Returning Officers' Charges) (Amendment) Order 2003.
