## **Cwestiynau i Brif Weinidog Cymru Questions to the First Minister**

### **Datblygu Cynaliadwy a Chynhwysiant Cymdeithasol Sustainable Development and Social Inclusion**

**C1 Cynog Dafis:** Sut y bydd themâu trawsbynciol datblygu cynaliadwy a chynhwysiant cymdeithasol yn parhau i gael eu cynnwys ym mhrif lif materion y Cynulliad yn y dyfodol? (OAQ9325)

**Prif Weinidog Cymru (Rhodri Morgan):** Bydd hynny'n dibynnu ar faint o wrthdaro a welir rhwng y ddua nod. Er enghraifft, rhoesom hwb lwyddiannus i gais Glas Cymru i redeg y diwydiant dŵr a charffosiaeth yng Nghymru. Gellir ystyried hynny yn gynaliadwy. Fodd bynnag, efallai na fyddai rhai, megis yr undebau llafur yn gweld hynny o fudd o ran cynhwysiant ac allgáu cymdeithasol. Bydd enghreiffftiau o'r fath yn y dyfodol, ond nid wyf innau'n gweld y gwrthdaro hwn yn codi'n rhy aml.

**Cynog Dafis:** Canolbwytiaf yn arbennig ar ddatblygu cynaliadwy. Sut mae Prif Weinidog Cymru yn sicrhau bod gwahanol adrannau o'r Llywodraeth yn cydweithio er mwyn cyflawni'r amcanion? Er enghraifft—a chodais hyn eisioes—yr angen i gydweithio rhwng yr adran datblygu economaidd ar y naill law a'r adran gynllunio ar y llaw arall. Y perygl yw bod penderfyniadau yn yr adran gynllunio yn rhwystr bob amser i gynlluniau penodol yn ymwneud â datblygu cynaliadwy. Yr wyf yn sôn am ynni adnewyddol yn arbennig. Gofynnaf i'r Prif Weinidog ymateb yn benodol ynglŷn â chynllun Bontnewydd ar Wy sydd yn disgwyl penderfyniad. Nid oes gan y cwmni yn yr achos hwnnw syniad pryd y bydd yr ymchwiliad cyhoeddus yn digwydd a phryd y bydd penderfyniad yn cael ei wneud. Mae perygl i'r holl gynllun gael ei golli o achos y gohirio.

**Prif Weinidog Cymru:** Rhoddodd Cynog enghraifft o'r felin goed a'r felin sydd yn defnyddio coed gwastraff a blawd llif i gynhyrchu trydan. Mae honno'n enghraifft

**Q1 Cynog Dafis:** How will the cross-cutting issues of sustainable development and social inclusion continue to be mainstreamed in future Assembly affairs? (OAQ9325)

**The First Minister (Rhodri Morgan):** That will depend on how much conflict one sees between the two aims. For example, we successfully boosted Glas Cymru's application to run the water and sewerage industry in Wales. That could be considered sustainable. However, some, such as the trade unions might not view it as beneficial in terms of social inclusion and exclusion. There will be such examples in future, but I do not see that kind of conflict happening too frequently.

**Cynog Dafis:** I will concentrate on sustainable development in particular. How does the First Minister ensure that different Government departments co-operate in order to achieve these aims? For example—and I have raised this matter previously—the need to co-operate between the economic development department on the one hand and the planning department on the other. The danger is that decisions in the planning department continually hinder specific sustainable development schemes. I am thinking about renewable energy in particular. I ask the First Minister specifically about the Newbridge on Wye scheme, which is awaiting a decision. The company in that case has no idea when the public inquiry will take place and when a decision will be made. There is a danger that the whole scheme will be lost because of the delay.

**The First Minister:** Cynog gave an example of the wood mill and the mill that uses waste wood and sawdust to generate electricity. That is a good example of the possibility of

**Alun Pugh:** Equal opportunities is rightly a cross-cutting theme of the Assembly. The new management team at the National Council for Education and Training for Wales is all white, all male, and comes from a limited range of backgrounds. Do you believe that the management teams of such bodies should look more like the Welsh population and less like the Conservative group?

**The First Minister:** I would not wish that on anybody.

**David Davies** *rose—*

**The Presiding Officer:** Order. I will take a point of order later if you still wish to make it.

**The First Minister:** Alun is making a sociological point rather than a political one, David. I would not wish to stir up any problems of that kind. I think that the point Alun is making is about reflecting the population at large. All of us will have seen the photograph of the new management team. It reflects the pre-existing management teams of the predecessor organisations, which are working out their last two months of existence prior to the National Council for Education and Training for Wales's coming into being on 1 April. There are Transfer of Undertakings (Protection of Employment) Regulations to comply with and you want to limit fears about loss of continuity, institutional churn and minimise the damage that does. You try to keep the existing staff in post if that is suitable. Therefore it is a reflection of where we are today and not the aim that we would like to fulfil, which would fit in with what Alun is saying, of having a

conflict. Those jobs would help to alleviate poverty in mid-Wales. It is a heavy industry—in that sense—and a sustainable one. There are other examples such as windmills that I do not think will have such an impact on sustainability. Since Cynog has cited such a relevant example, I will write to him about the latest situation regarding the application for planning permission.

**Alun Pugh:** Mae cyfle cyfartal yn thema trawsbynciol yn y Cynulliad, ac yn gywir felly. **Prif Weinidog Cymru:** Mae Alun yn gwneud pwynt cymdeithasegol yn hytrach nag un gwleidyddol, David. Ni fyddwn yn dymuno creu problemau o'r math hwnnw. Credaf fod pwynt Alun yn ymwneud ag adlewyrchu'r boblogaeth yn gyffredinol. Bydd pob un ohonom wedi gweld y llun o'r tîm rheoli newydd. Mae'n adlewyrchu timau rheoli blaenorol y sefydliadau a'i rhagflaenodd, sydd yn gweithredu am eu dau fis olaf cyn y daw Cyngor Cenedlaethol Cymru dros Addysg a Hyfforddiant i rym ar 1 Ebrill. Rhaid cydymffurfio â Rheoliadau Trosglwyddo Ymgynheriadau (Diogelu Cyflogaethol) ac yr ydych am leihau pryderon am golli dilyniant, cynnyrch sefydliadol a sicrhau eu bod yn achosi'r niwed lleiaf posibl. Yr ydych yn ceisio cadw'r staff presennol yn eu swyddi os yw hynny'n addas. Felly mae'n adlewyrchiad o lle yr ydym heddiw ac nid y nod y dymunwn ei gyflawni, a fyddai'n cyd-fynd â'r hyn a

senior management team that reflects society at large, in terms of gender and ethnic minority.

‘Putting Wales First’ and ‘Betterwales.com’**

**Q2 Jonathan Morgan:** Will the First Minister make a statement on the interface between the policy documents ‘Putting Wales First’ and ‘Betterwales.com’? (OAQ9330)

**The First Minister:** I refer you to the answer that I gave to David Melding last week.

**Jonathan Morgan:** I draw your attention to chapter nine of ‘Putting Wales First’, which mentions creating a culture of openness in the Assembly. Would you be prepared to extend that culture of openness to the financial support which is being allocated to bring the Football Association Cup to Cardiff, which we all support? Will you tell us why we have not seen the figure that has been made available, and when can we expect such a statement from you or one of your colleagues?

**The First Minister:** I am grateful for that question and for the way in which it was asked. It is a work in progress. I would have liked to be able to announce the details to the Assembly by now. As soon as we are able to conclude the quite tricky three-dimensional negotiations, I will announce it to the Assembly. Time is dragging on, as I am sure Jonathan would agree, but there is no point in making an announcement until you have signed, sealed and delivered a document agreed by the Millennium Stadium plc and Cardiff City and County Council. It is a work in progress and I am grateful that Jonathan has raised the matter. I hope that we will be able to report fairly soon.

**Pauline Jarman:** Given that the employment problem is likely to worsen as a result of the Corus announcement, do you agree that we in Plaid Cymru—The Party of Wales were right to push for an employment strategy for Wales

**C2 Jonathan Morgan:** A wnaiff Prif Weinidog Cymru ddatganiad yngylch y rhyngberthynas rhwng y dogfennau polisi ‘Rhoi Cymru’n Gyntaf’ a ‘Gwellcymru.com’? (OAQ9330)

**Prif Weinidog Cymru:** Fe’ch cyfeiriaf at yr ateb a roddais i David Melding yr wythnos diwethaf.

**Jonathan Morgan:** Tynaf eich sylw at bennod naw ‘Rhoi Cymru’n Gyntaf’, sydd yn crybwyl creu diwylliant agored yn y Cynulliad. A fyddch yn barod i ehangu'r diwylliant agored hwnnw i'r cymorth ariannol a ddyrennir er mwyn dod â Chwpan y Gymdeithas Bêl-droed i Gymru, yr ydym oll yn ei gefnogi? A ddywedwch wrthym pam nad ydym wedi gweld y ffigwr a bennwyd, a phryd y gallwn ddisgwyl datganiad o'r fath gennych chi neu gan un o'ch cyd-Aelodau?

**Prif Weinidog Cymru:** Yr wyf yn ddiolchgar am y cwestiwn hwnnw ac am y ffordd y'i gofynnwyd. Mae'r gwaith yn mynd rhagddo ar hyn o bryd. Byddwn wedi dymuno cyhoeddi'r manylion i'r Cynulliad erbyn hyn. Cyn gynted ag y gallwn derfynu'r negodiadau tri dimensiwn gweddol gymhleth, fe'i cyhoeddaf i'r Cynulliad. Mae amser yn llusgo ymlaen, fel y cytuna Jonathan mae'n siŵr, ond nid oes diben gwneud cyhoeddiad hyd nes eich bod wedi rhoi sêl eich bendith ar ddogfen y cytunwyd arni gan Stadiwm y Mileniwm ccc a Chyngor Dinas a Sir Caerdydd a'i chyflwyno. Mae'r gwaith yn mynd rhagddo ar hyn o bryd ac yr wyf yn ddiolchgar bod Jonathan wedi codi'r mater. Gobeithio y gallwn gyflwyno adroddiad yn weddol fuan.

**Pauline Jarman:** Gan ystyried bod y broblem gyflogaeth yn debygol o waethyg o ganlyniad i gyhoeddiad Corus, a gytunwch ein bod ni ym Mhlaid Cymru—The Party of Wales yn iawn i bwys o am strategaeth

to be included in ‘Betterwales.com’? Will you explain why it has been postponed even though it was supposed to be ready before Christmas?

**The First Minister:** We have missed that Christmas deadline. I am not sure what ‘Betterwales.com’ has to do with the Corus announcement, unless the Corus announcement is seen as symptomatic rather than as a cataclysmic event on its own. ‘Betterwales.com’ is a medium-term and long-term strategic document. However big they are, it is difficult to take on board major events like the announcement of 3,800 job losses that Corus made last week. Corus claims that it is only 2,800 job losses but we would say that it is 3,800. A strategy and an event are not the same thing. That is the problem that Pauline’s question is almost unfairly putting those together. I entirely agree with her on the basic point.

**The Leader of the Welsh Conservatives (Nick Bourne):** As leader of that august body kindly trailed by Alun Pugh, I ask the First Minister whether, in view of the commitment in ‘Putting Wales First’ to freedom of information, he could comment on the widely-held concern regarding an alleged letter sent by the Minister for Health and Social Services to health bosses asking them to develop positive news stories and avoid leaking bad ones. Is this not just a tactic to avoid concentration on the growing waiting lists problem, which is already blamed on the media?

**The First Minister:** Jane will probably be able to write to you regarding the detail of the issue that you have raised. Broadly speaking, we would all want balanced media coverage that gives equal attention to good and bad news stories about the health service and any other public service. Getting that balance right would be the broad thrust of what Jane said. I am sure that Jane will write to you to

**The First Minister:** I have no objections to a debate on this document.

**Nick Bourne:** Why do we not have one, then?

**The First Minister:** That is a matter for the Business Committee.

**The First Minister:** As I have made clear in

### **C3 Glyn Davies:** A wnaiff Prif Weinidog Cymru ddatganiad ynghylch codi ymwybyddiaeth o Gymru dramor? (OAQ9339)

**Prif Weinidog Cymru:** Fel yr eglurais mewn

response to several similar questions recently—mostly from you, Glyn—raising the profile of Wales abroad is a key Cabinet priority. The Assembly is working with other public sector bodies to develop a co-ordinated approach at an all-Wales level to enhance our international profile. That includes developing a package of quality promotional material, including a CD-ROM and website, and the identification of overseas events to promote Wales. The establishment of the Assembly office in Brussels, an increasing number of visits to Wales by high-profile overseas politicians and officials, our trade missions programme, and the opportunities provided by our increased participation in international affairs—in Europe and elsewhere—will further increase Wales's profile internationally. This leaves to one side the question raised earlier by Jonathan Morgan, who is not in the Chamber at present, about the FA Cup and the other events announced in the package of agreement between the Millennium Stadium and the Football League and the Football Association.

**Glyn Davies:** Thank you for that most comprehensive answer. On a slightly tangential point, some people—including me—disagreed with the decision to bring the internationalisation function within the civil service to the Assembly. Not unreasonably, the Economic Development Committee Chairman agreed that that should be reviewed after an unspecified period. However, when I asked the Deputy First Minister and Minister for Economic Development about this, he drew himself up to his full height, gave me a dusty answer and refused to make any comment. Will you give us an idea of when you believe this review should take place?

**The First Minister:** Far be it for me to intervene in any spat or spatette in the Economic Development Committee. If such events occur that is a matter for the Chair of the Economic Development Committee to sort out. I am not sure whether arrangements within the official empire of the administration as to which civil servants sit in which part of the administration, and which

They should enjoy the football and also Wales. That must be part of the message. We must advertise that in the Millennium Stadium and the surrounding area.

**The First Minister:** We have not been able to do a full computerised check on this. However, from a manual check of the records that are available, I estimate that the average time taken to reply to Assembly Members' correspondence is 18 working days, with the majority of correspondence being answered within 20 days.

**Peter Rogers:** I wrote letters to a Cabinet Minister on 24 November, 4 December, 5 December and 17 January and received a reply on 1 February. Do you agree that it is unacceptable for Members to wait months to receive replies to letters and to chase Ministers and civil servants with phone calls to find out what exactly has happened in constituent stages? What will you do about this?

**The First Minister:** I agree with Peter. It is acceptable only where there are special circumstances, where information is not available. If that occurred, Peter should have received an indication of why the reply was held up and when we expected that information to become available. That is the only circumstance in which delay is acceptable. If there were no exceptional factors, I am happy to apologise. I am unhappy to be in the position of having to do so, but I am prepared to offer an apology to Peter if he has received an unacceptable level of service.

companies, it is not always possible to involve the community before companies commit inward investment to Wales. I am pleased that we have had a great deal of such investment in north-east Wales, such as the announcement of additional jobs in the Toyota engine plant in order to increase production. Other investments include Paramount Foods, Dailyce Chestergate, Mainetti UK Limited, Deeside Industrial Park and General Domestic Appliances Limited near Alison's constituency. However, there has not been a great deal of community involvement because of the commercial confidentiality of the investment.

**Alison Halford:** Will the First Minister join me in welcoming the recent announcement by Ford and Vauxhall's proposals for Ellesmere Port? It illustrates what can be gained through inclusiveness and community consultation. Is it not regrettable that such practices were not followed by Corus in Shotton?

**The First Minister:** I agree. Let us set aside Corus and look at what has happened recently in motor manufacturing. Yesterday's decision by Ford in Wales involved £240 million of investment and more than 600 well-paid, highly-skilled jobs. Undoubtedly there is an impact on north Wales, not only from Toyota's decision—which is actually located in the north—but also Vauxhall's decision at Ellesmere Port, because many people in north-east Wales work there. That is also the customer base for Corus. Corus has said that it is only interested in the financial community and the stock exchange and that it does not want to consult with the trade unions or local authorities. However, Ford consulted closely with the appropriate trade unions and local authorities in the State of Ohio, where jobs were being lost on the B6 contract for the Jaguar, as well as in Wales where we will gain 600 jobs. That is a lesson for Corus on how this should be done.

**The First Minister:** There has been an almost continuous round of meetings since Thursday afternoon, the afternoon of Corus's announcement. We gathered representatives of the local authorities and the trade unions here in the Assembly. Flintshire was represented, because of Shotton's involvement, by Alex Aldridge, the leader of Flintshire County Council, and Philip McGreevy, its chief executive. The same is true for the affected areas of south Wales. Further meetings have been held since at ministerial level, as well as further meetings with local authorities and agencies such as the Welsh Development Agency and the training and enterprise councils. I am sure that the round of meetings will continue until we have defined the shape of the package that will be required by the time the moratorium on Corus's announcement being put into effect comes to an end, in about eight or nine days' time.

An independent Children's Commissioner for Wales has been appointed and the Bill is currently before the House of Commons. It will reach its report stage on Thursday before going before the House of Lords. Many measures are being taken in the Bill to extend the powers of the

**Prif Weinidog Cymru:** Ni wn a oedd Rhodri yn gwrando ar fy ateb. Dywed imi anwybyddu targedau economaidd a minnau wedi dweud, ymhlih y bedair enghraifft, ein bod wedi sicrhau arian Amcan 1. Onid yw hynny'n hollol berthnasol ac yn ganolog i ddatblygu economaidd? **Rhodri Glyn Thomas:** It is revealing that the First Minister chooses to ignore economic targets in the light of the Economic Development Committee's decision not to confirm the validity of those targets at its meeting last week, and in the light of the failure of his Government and the Westminster Government to do anything to prevent the obliteration of the steel industry in the wake of Corus's decision. How can the First Minister endorse figures that talk about raising gross domestic product per capita to 90 per cent of the British average and talk about creating 135,000 additional jobs in Wales? Are these figures not completely selective and unrealistic?

**The First Minister:** I do not know whether Rhodri was listening to my answer. He says that I ignored economic targets after I said, as one of the four examples, that we secured the money for Objective 1. Is that not completely relevant and central to economic development? If Rhodri does not think that Objective 1 is important to economic development, things have gone adrift on Plaid Cymru's backbenches. I am not sure what he is talking about as regards my choice of priorities.

Concerning what happened with Corus, it appears that there are more obstacles for us to overcome, but after Ford's announcement yesterday, perhaps that will be slightly easier. However you cannot compare large announcements, or massive ones, of the loss of more than 4,000 jobs by Corus last week, to these long-term targets. Every day and every week, somewhere in Wales, factories close and others open. The balance between the positive and negative elements tells us whether we will have growth and whether we will reach the target of 90 per cent. I am certain that had we set a target of 85 per cent Plaid Cymru would complain that that was not ambitious enough.

**Alun Cairns:** ‘Betterwales.com’ sets specific GDP targets as does the national economic development strategy, which was condemned by the Economic Development Committee two weeks ago. What specific changes in policy are you planning to introduce to achieve these growth targets?

**The First Minister:** It would be better if we reconsidered the issue after the strategy has been out for consultation. That is the purpose of having a draft document that can be sent out for consultation. Everyone’s views can then be considered, including those of Economic Development Committee members.

**The First Minister:** My colleagues and I have frequent discussions with UK Government Ministers on powers for the Assembly in current and forthcoming Bills.

**Prif Weinidog Cymru:** Bydd fy nghydweithwyr a minnau yn cael trafodaethau mynchy â Gweinidogion Llywodraeth y DU ar bwerau ar gyfer y Cynulliad mewn Mesurau cyfredol a rhai arfaethedig.

**Peter Black:** As you know, the partnership agreement made a commitment to review the Assembly and to report after the elections in 2003. When will you set up that review? How will you ensure, in particular, that the UK Government has an input into that?

government. That is where we fit in. We do not consider ourselves a region, but we fit into the regional, nation states and European tiers of Government. A few months would be required for consultation with the British Government and then it would form part of the UK's contribution to the inter-governmental conference on the 'charter of competencies', as the British call it, or the 'constitution for Europe' as the Germans call it.

**Jocelyn Davies:** My concern is to ensure that we are not losing any powers. Will you explain why the Local Government Act 2000 confers certain powers for local government on the Secretary of State for Wales rather than this Assembly? Post-devolution, do you not find this unacceptable?

**The First Minister:** Without the details, Jocelyn, I find it difficult to comment. I would be grateful if you wrote to me to specify those powers that you believe the Assembly should have, but which have been conferred on the Secretary of State for Wales.

**William Graham:** Would the First Minister confirm that we must extend to the people of Wales a greater understanding of the present functions and responsibilities of this Assembly before they see the need for additional powers?

**The First Minister:** Yes, I agree. Nobody is currently committed to greater powers for the Assembly. We are committed to setting up an independent commission, which would work either side of the next election, so that it commenced its work before the next Assembly elections. It would complete its work after the elections. Its report would then be considered by the Assembly. However, we cannot change our powers. That is a matter of using persuasion, if we so choose, and to do that we must have the backing of the people of Wales. Therefore, your point is relevant. Without the backing of the people of Wales, I am sure that the British Government would

**Q8 Delyth Evans:** What is the First Minister doing to promote policy and research links with Welsh universities? (OAQ9336)

**The First Minister:** Senior Assembly officials meet regularly with higher education institutions in Wales with the aim of enhancing the Assembly's ability to form 'made in Wales' policies and helping academic institutions in Wales to develop their capacity to contribute to the policy-making process.

As part of this process, the Assembly is organising a series of joint seminars between academics and Assembly officials based on the themes of 'Betterwales.com'. Seminars on building a stronger economy and health and wellbeing have already taken place—one in Aberystwyth and one in Cardiff—and further seminars are planned in the near future.

**Delyth Evans:** Given that the resources to develop policy within the Assembly are relatively limited, do you agree that the relationship with the universities is essential and that we must ensure that it is strong and fruitful so that the research work and the best ideas that come out of the universities can feed, in a dynamic way, into the policy process in the Assembly?

**The First Minister:** I agree totally because Wales is a small country with a population of 3 million and six or seven higher education institutions. They have research resources that will be strengthened if they are tested in the real world, namely in government. If

**The First Minister:** We are wandering some distance away from the issue of policy development seminars. However, there is an extent to which—if you are referring to research capabilities and research funding—that must be so. Welsh universities would be pleased if we were to fund practically oriented research that is of real policy interest to us rather than to buy it in from outside.

there is ability on the health, economic or scientific side—where that is relevant—I think that we can use it to compensate for any weaknesses that we may have in terms of our ability to create separate policies, if needs be, within the civil service that is working for us.

**Elin Jones:** It is evident from your answers, First Minister, that you recognise that the National Assembly's expectations of the higher education sector are high, particularly in terms of economic development and lifelong learning. However, do you accept that the financial settlement that the higher education sector has received from your Government this year is insufficient, puts this contribution at risk and places Wales's universities under a considerable disadvantage compared with universities in Scotland and England?

**The First Minister:** I do not accept that there is any relationship between the financial settlement for universities, the arrangements that we make and the relationship that we are trying to strengthen between higher education institutions in Wales, our civil service and the political side in order to focus our ability as a nation—the 3 million of us—to develop policies that have been adapted to our unique circumstances in Wales.

You will probably be aware, Lorraine, that the Assembly has the ability to propose amendments to identified Bills going through Parliament under Standing Order No. 31.9.

**Lorraine Barrett:** Thank you for that clarification. Will you join me in welcoming the progress of the Children's Commissioner for Wales Bill, which has demonstrated real partnership working between the Assembly and Westminster and in condemning the Conservative Members of Parliament who tried to stop the second reading and who referred to Conservative Assembly Members' views as being unimportant?

**The First Minister:** What a Member of another body said was far more insulting than what Alun Pugh said around 30 minutes ago in terms of the attitude expressed towards the Conservative Assembly Members. However, that is by the by because some Westminster Conservative Party members would never

On the Bill's progress, you are right about the Children's Commissioner for Wales Bill, but you must also remember the other Bills that include sections of relevance to Wales, namely those on health and social care, housing and special educational needs. The number of Bills in the Queen's Speech last November was relatively small because of the expectation of a shortened session, and because the previous session was an extra long one. However, almost a third of the Bills announced in the Queen's Speech last November—five out of 16—will give powers to the Assembly. That was a far better result than that of the previous, 13-month session, in which there were 13 Acts in that character, out of 44 Acts in total.

We continue to develop trade links with the USA through WalesTrade International and its international business opportunities and through Trade Partners UK, the UK Government's international trade arm. You will know that there are seven small Welsh Development Agency offices across the USA that actively promote links between Wales and North America, as does the Wales Tourist Board. I will meet the President—the President of the Wales North America Business Council, I should add—next month, and I will visit California later

**Phil Williams:** Bearing in mind that Ford's decision about 30 years ago to establish an engine factory in Bridgend was strongly influenced by a senior executive at Ford with strong Welsh connections, what plans do you have to emulate the method used in Ireland and establish network contacts with the millions of people in the US with Welsh connections as a means of not only raising Wales's profile but of encouraging appropriate investment?

**The First Minister:** That is important. Unlike Scotland and Ireland, we did not experience highland clearances or a potato famine and, therefore, the number of people who left Wales for the US during the nineteenth century was nowhere near the millions that left those countries. Germany, Sweden and other countries also exported their population in vast numbers, while Wales grew economically at a rate similar to the United States during most of the nineteenth century. We do not have the expatriate community that those other countries have. However, we have influence that must be used. As regards Ford, I am pleased that there are still influential Welsh expatriates in senior positions on the fifth floor of Ford's headquarters in Dearborn, Michigan. The performance Bridgend Ford plant's workforce in making the Jaguar engine, was a factor that persuaded Jaguar, now that it is a subsidiary of Ford, to give work to that plant. In doing so it was saying that the Premier Automotive Group—the Ford vehicles that do not carry the Ford badge, such as Jaguar, the Lincoln Continental, Aston Martin, Land Rover and others—wants to buy its engines from Ford because the workforce at Bridgend did such a superb job on the Jaguar engines that it is already making.

## Datganiad ar Brosiect Injan V Ford Pen-y-Bont ar Ogwr Statement on the Ford Bridgend V Engine Project

**The First Minister:** There is almost a seamless web of continuity here today. Phil raised some interesting issues, which I may not repeat in this statement. He mentioned Ford's original decision, which was taken in the late 1970s. That in turn, followed on from a decision taken in the late 1960s, when I was a junior civil servant in the former Welsh Office, to establish a large industrial estate at Waterton. That estate remained empty for 10 years, until Ford's decision in 1976-77 to take up part of that site.

Were it not for the decision in 1966 to establish the industrial site and Ford's decision in 1976 to build a factory on that site, and for Jim Callaghan, Henry Ford II or III—whichever it was at the time—and Red Poling, the head of Ford in Europe, yesterday's decision would not have been made. It was with great pleasure that the Deputy First Minister and Minister for Economic Development, the Minister for Assembly Business—who worked for Ford at Bridgend for five years—and I attended the formal announcement of Ford's proposal to invest about £240 million in the Bridgend engine plant to produce V6 and V8 Euro Tech engines for use in Jaguar and other Premier Automotive Group vehicles.

This investment will create over 600 new, top quality, well-paid and highly-skilled jobs and introduce an innovative flexible manufacturing line that will be the first of its type. Production of the new engine range should commence towards the end of 2002 and will take the total annual production at the plant to over 1 million engines per year. I am delighted that the National Assembly has been able to play an instrumental role in this decision through its offer of regional selective assistance of £16 million. This is a major boost for the Welsh economy and, coming so soon after the launch of Toyota's new engine assembly line in Deeside, as part of a new £100 million investment by that company in that plant, it shows how strong Wales has now become in automotive engine manufacturing.

It is an example of how management and trade unions can work together in partnership to bring quality and efficiency into production, and gain new investment against world-wide competition—in this case, from Cleveland, Ohio. This is an exemplary illustration of successful partnership working and demonstrates the considerable advantages that can be gained from joint working. It is in stark contrast to how Corus handled recent events, where it refused to work in partnership with the Assembly, the UK Government and, above all, its own workforce and their representatives. It also highlights the benefits that can be gained from close liaison with the public sector and is a fine example of the Team Wales approach. The WDA has worked closely with the Bridgend management in its bid for the investment and TEC South East Wales is also prepared to offer substantial support for training.

The WDA's role is also of strategic long-term interest. It is proposing to develop, next door to the Ford engine plant, a new 130 acre business park on the Brocastle site that adjoins the Ford plant, along the golden mile stretch of the old A48. It is expected that this could create a further 1,000 jobs over the next five years. The site is expected to attract a wide range of companies through its proximity to the engine plant, which will also make it of particular interest to automotive suppliers, as well as to the wider engineering industry. Initial talks are already being held between the agency and several companies that may be interested in the site.

Yesterday's announcement showed a colossal vote of confidence by Ford in the Welsh economy and in the British motor manufacturing industry, and is confirmation that the people of Wales have much to offer blue chip international companies. When the Bridgend plant was opened in 1980, it was widely saluted as the start of a comeback for the manufacturing industry after a difficult time for the Welsh and British economy in

**Janet Davies:** On behalf of Plaid Cymru—The Party of Wales, and as a regional Assembly Member for the area, I welcome the First Minister's statement and Ford's decision to invest £240 million in Bridgend. The 600 new jobs will be welcome, especially in light of the recent series of losses in manufacturing in Wales. According to Ford's representative on the radio this morning, the decision to invest in the Bridgend plant was taken in anticipation of the United Kingdom joining the euro zone. Was this explained to the First Minister? Accepting that you cannot tell us when we will join the euro zone, are you committed to joining it, and will you clarify the Assembly's role in conjunction with its offer of regional selective assistance of £16 million, in securing this investment?

**The First Minister:** The euro issue is relevant to many recent decisions. These include the decision by Vauxhall yesterday in relation to Ellesmere Port, Nissan's decision to increase car production at Sunderland by 30 per cent, and Toyota's decision to increase engine production in Wales, as well as car production in Burnaston near Derby, by 30 per cent. All of these announcements have come since December 5—the day that Corus announced its decision to review its operations and its restructuring proposals, which eventually resulted in that dreadful announcement last Thursday.

The euro issue for them was that they did not want to see joining the euro excluded during the course of the next Parliament. I will put it no higher than that. If the Government had told them that there was no chance of Britain joining the euro during the course of the next Parliament, I believe that all those investments would have gone elsewhere. They would not have come to Wales. That is the significance of the euro decision. Joining the euro is subject to a referendum. It is

**The First Minister:** I would not say that it is all down to them, but it is 90 per cent down to them. It stopped all the production lines and got everybody who was on the current shift into a room so that they could hear the news for themselves. It used both the stick and the carrot. They were given the decision and told that it would possibly lead to well-paid jobs for their friends. Ford jobs tend to be at the top of the tree; the average pay is certainly higher than that in Corus. They were told that, if they wanted their mates to have jobs with Ford, they would have to produce, and they have.

**Alun Cairns:** The Welsh Conservative Party welcomes the news. Attracting the V6 and V8 engines contract is a tribute to the Bridgend workforce, particularly after failing to gain the I4 and I5 engines contract not so many months ago. Having witnessed the productivity of that workforce during a recent visit, I endorse many of your comments.

You mentioned the partnership that was formed. I am sure that that was a contributory factor, but I cannot help recalling the words of David Jenkins at last week's Economic Development Committee meeting, when he commented that the true partnerships in his experience were formed in the 1980s during the period of the last Conservative Government. [Interruption.] Those were his words, not mine.

I do not want the First Minister to lose perspective following yesterday's announcement. In the last 10 days, 5,000 job losses have been announced in this Chamber. Whereas 600 are welcome, there is a vast difference between the two figures.

**The First Minister:** I could not agree more. I do not have a roseate glow in front of my eyes that causes me to forget the difference between 600 well-paid jobs at Ford and 3,800 job losses at Corus, and the others at Dewhirst and Dairy Crest announced since January. Nid wyf am i'r Prif Weinidog golli perspectif yn dilyn cyhoeddiad ddoe. Yn ystod y 10 diwrnod diwethaf, cyhoeddwyd 5,000 o golledion swyddi yn y Siambr hon. Tra croesewir 600, mae gwahaniaeth mawr rhwng y ddau ffigwr.

**Prif Weinidog Cymru:** Cytunaf yn llwyr. Nid oes gennyf olwg gwridog ar hyn sydd yn peri imi anghofio'r gwahaniaeth rhwng 600 o swyddi â chyflwyn uchel yn Ford a 3,800 o golledion swyddi yn Corus, a'r lleill yn Dewhirst a Dairy Crest a gyhoeddwyd ers mis Ionawr. Yr oedd y pedair wythnos rhwng

from the Christmas and new year break and the Ford decision were appalling in terms of job losses. On the other hand, there was an exceptionally good period in November and December, when we had almost no bad news and a heavy concentration of new inward investment announcements. I do not know why such announcements tend to come in flows, where we have much good news and no bad news and then vice versa. We need to do much work to ensure that new jobs come in to Wales at the level of the Ford plant announcement before we will have counteracted the effects of the jobs lost in the announcements made by Corus last Thursday morning.

**Tom Middlehurst:** I also welcome the Ford decision. The confidence that Ford has demonstrated in the Welsh workforce is also reflected in Deeside. I was present at the launch of the new Toyota engine last Thursday. Unfortunately, that event was overshadowed by the Corus announcement. Nevertheless, it cannot diminish the confidence that Toyota has demonstrated in workers in north-east Wales by being prepared to invest so heavily in the Deeside plant. Do you agree that the Deeside Industrial Park is an important industrial base, serving north Wales and that the daily migration of workers both ways across the border is an important recognition of the economic engine that exists cross border in north-east Wales and north-west England? Do you also agree that it is important that the Assembly continues to service the development of that relationship for the mutual benefit of all?

**The First Minister:** That connection is interesting. At the time when Corus was making its devastating announcement, you and Mike German were pressing the button to get the Toyota engine assembly line moving in Deeside. Toyota and Optical Fibres are the largest companies in the Deeside Industrial Park, and Toyota recently announced that it will soon employ a total of 520 people.

Tom mentioned the Merseyside-Deeside-Wrexham industrial belt. There was no motor manufacturing tradition in that area in the 1950s, as the industry was located in the Midlands, Dagenham and Luton. As a result of Jaguar investing at Halewood in north Merseyside, Vauxhall investing at Ellesmere Port—I believe that people from north-east Wales work at both plants, although it is easier to travel to Ellesmere Port than to Speke—and the Toyota investment at Deeside, the Merseyside-Deeside belt will be of huge significance to the motor manufacturing industry by 2003. It could even be as significant as the West Midlands. That is an amazing transformation over 30 to 40 years.

**David Davies:** Like all Members, I welcome this announcement, and I am sure that there is no-one anywhere who does not welcome it. It is, therefore, surprising that we should spend so much time discussing it. Has the First Minister received an e-mail from Mike German, as Ministers seem to like sending e-mails at the moment, telling him to develop a programme of positive news stories? Perhaps he has been urged to give good news stories the hard sell and control any leaks of bad news stories. This is no more than an attempt to put a glossy spin on a black week for industry in Wales. We should get on with the serious business of discussing the thousands of job losses, rather than patting ourselves on the back because a few hundred jobs have been created, although this is welcome news.

**The First Minister:** If David would like to see Dr Brian Gibbons or Dr Dai Lloyd after Plenary, I am sure that he could be treated for the condition from which he suffers of having an aversion to good news about Wales. Your views will not be shared in Bridgend or within a 20-mile radius of the town. People in that area will regard this, and the Assembly's involvement in it, as being completely appropriate to be considered in Plenary, in the same way as it would if 600 jobs were lost at the Ford engine plant in Bridgend. **The First Minister:** I would. We cannot make it a condition of investing in Wales. However, you could commend it as a method and show where it has proven to be successful. The decision regarding the plant which lost jobs yesterday in Cleveland, Ohio was provisionally made by Ford in November. However, they then agreed with the United Auto Workers in America that if there was a decision to disinvest in Cleveland, Ohio in order to invest in Bridgend, the plant in Cleveland, Ohio would be given 90 days before the decision was set in concrete to enable it to table counter proposals. The management and trade unions in Cleveland, Ohio tabled counter proposals, but they were not good enough to match what was on offer in Bridgend. However, that demonstrates social partnership by global multinationals, which happens sometimes as a result of law, sometimes as a result of the choice of work with the trade unions, and sometimes with the local community. Ford gave Corus an object lesson in how to do it on both sides of the Atlantic, for the winning and losing plant.

**Peter Black:** As one of the Assembly Members who represents Bridgend, I make clear that this announcement is welcome in that area, contrary to what David Davies previously said. Any good news such as this is welcome. It is important that we celebrate our successes although we are also mindful of the tragedy facing many communities as a result of Corus's announcement.

I wanted to endorse the previous comments about how welcome this is in terms of the partnership working which has led to this success; the contrast which you made in how that works for Bridgend and Ford and how it

**The Deputy First Minister and Minister for Economic Development (Michael German):** Last Thursday we had the dreadful announcement from Corus of the loss of steel jobs throughout Wales and England. The initial response of the Assembly has rightly been one of indignation. This major business, built in Wales refused to work in partnership with Government in any part of the United Kingdom. The contrast with others, such as Ford and other major companies, that have recently demonstrated their faith in the Welsh and UK economy, could not be starker.

I do not want anything I say now to be construed as us giving up the fight to save the 10,000 or so jobs which might be lost as a consequence of the decision Corus so short-sightedly announced last Thursday. Corus has agreed to ‘stop the clock’ until a meeting with the unions on 14 February. I know that the unions will be using this time to best effect to find ways of persuading Corus to think again in a proper, strategic, long-term way. We will do whatever we can to help them in this campaign and I know that almost all in the Assembly wish the unions well in

The UK Government and the Assembly will give soundly based proposals from the unions a fair wind. However, we would not be exercising prudent government if we were not also preparing for the worst, bearing in mind Corus's track record and lack of engagement. For many months the Assembly has been putting in place the processes to respond if Corus continued dramatically to favour its overseas operations while seeking to downsize its UK plants. These processes are now in top gear.

An all-Wales steel taskforce has been in place since the last round of large-scale Corus redundancies in July. This will meet again on Friday to take stock of the current situation and to consider, on a contingency basis, a strategy for managing any response to major job losses in Wales. This strategy and its related action plan were informed by the meeting I called yesterday afternoon with all the key agencies, local authorities and academics.

This was a constructive meeting that considered a wide range of options on the possible ways forward. We agreed that our approach should be to focus any help and support on steel communities, and not solely on Corus personnel who may be affected directly by job losses. We also agreed that any package should be a combination of economic and social programmes, which should also bear in mind the effects of other major recent closures. We again agreed that it was necessary for any response to be more than simply a list of disconnected projects, and that we needed a strategic framework for the areas affected to maximise the benefits of the Team Wales effort that would swing into action, if it were clear that we really were facing the worst case scenario.

Therefore, yesterday afternoon, we agreed Felly, cytunwyd brynhawn ddoe, ar

First, we would ensure that the best services possible are available immediately to meet any redeployment and short-term retraining needs of those who might be affected, not only those who are directly employed by Corus, but also any employees of displaced contractors and suppliers.

The Employment Service and TECs are already working with their partners to develop a package of rapid response measures to assist all those affected by the redundancies. Each Corus plant has an on-site job shop, the latest being established at Bryngwyn this week. The range of measures available will include information on local vacancies, advice on job search activities and curriculum vitae preparation, interview techniques and access to retraining and upskilling programmes specifically tailored to each person's requirements to enable him or her to access new jobs through Assembly-funded training programmes managed by TECs. The careers companies, which will become Careers Wales from April, will also be involved by providing guidance and advice on career options.

Some communities already experience higher than average unemployment, and tragic situations such as these proposed redundancies make matters worse. It is ironic, however, that vacancies exist and remain unfilled for all sorts of reasons. I have asked the Employment Service to work closely with the TECs to ensure that the skills and experience of those being laid off are marketed to local employers. Some are already expressing an interest, including those who will have significant recruitment needs over the next year or so. Upskilling will play an important role in helping people make the transition from working in steel production to other sectors, but we must also introduce an element of creativity in dealing with the barriers that could prevent people accessing alternative employment. Issues such as poor transport facilities and a lack of

We would then deploy the imaginative and ambitious property, land reclamation, town and community redevelopment measures that our agencies are so proficient at undertaking.

Given the moratorium until 14 February, it would not be appropriate to announce a specific set of projects today. That would undermine the efforts of the workers to change the mind of Corus's senior management and would not make sense. It is also important that projects are well planned and add to the overall economic strategies at a local and regional level. For that reason we are also commissioning impact research studies, which should be available within a few weeks, to inform the choices that will be made in the medium term. We need an agreed and highly effective Team Wales approach, with a Wales-wide strategic

I assure you that that is important to us, and we are continuing to give active consideration to whatever help we can give.

I note what you said about the euro, and my views on the euro are the same as they have always been. I expect that you and I, and all

**Tom Middlehurst:** Cyfeiriai yn gynharach at fy ymweliad â Toyota ddydd Iau diwethaf. Clywsom y datganiad ofnadwy a ddinistriodd gymunedau dur ledled Cymru ar y diwrnod hwnnw. Treuliais yr ychydig ddyddiau diwethaf yn ceisio dirnad canlyniadau'r newyddion hwnnw. Ceir dicter amlwg yn y cymunedau dur ledled Cymru, ac yn fy etholaeth i yn arbennig. Mynegir y dicter hwn yn helaeth mewn iaith egwyddorol ac anegwyddorol.

proposals. Through the moratorium they have an opportunity that was hitherto denied to them. We should welcome, as I do, the declaration of international solidarity from trade unions in Holland in the face of unbridled international capitalism. Now we must prepare for 'plan B' if the strong pressure now being exerted by trade unions and the industry fails.

Do you agree that the casualties of Corus's decisions, wherever the axe may fall, must be treated fairly and equitably, and that every effort will be made to put a support package into place that would reflect what was available previously under ISERB? Will you consider, in other words, a sum of ISERBs to deal with a mass redundancy if the worst comes to the worst? The magnitude of this announcement has sent communities reeling. The first hurt will be felt by those given their notices first. The Corus announcement was accompanied by a programme and a timetable. Will you assure me that that will be taken into account in prioritising the programme of action that we put into place? I am acutely conscious that Shotton is early in that programme of savage cuts. There is a young workforce in Shotton, which is a disadvantage and an advantage. It is an advantage in that mainly young men—and they are men—will have an opportunity to perhaps find work and take their skills elsewhere. It is a disadvantage in that they carry considerable financial burdens. The trade unions are looking for measures that will assist those people to make a transition from redundancy to new work opportunities. I hope that you will consider those issues seriously.

**Michael German:** I can give you an absolute assurance on behalf of the National Assembly for Wales and the Cabinet that we are putting our full weight into supporting the trade unions in their campaign to reverse Corus's

decisions. We will support them, as I said earlier in reply to Phil's question, in whatever they might want to do to progress their purchase by workers of certain plants in Wales. You refer to plan B. Everyone must be treated fairly and equitably, as well as quickly. You referred to a sum of ISERB's, that is the support that people want for themselves and their families while they are in training. We must address that issue head on, because if the skills do not match the skills that are needed in other industries, people will need to retrain, and will have family commitments that they have to maintain.

What is shocking, and we ought to recognise this, is that the steel workforce in Wales is young. There are not many people over the age of 50 still working in our steelworks in Wales. The average age is between 35 and 45 years old. They are people with young families, whose children are in school and for whom the first essential question is about their home and family. I can understand that. The action that we are about to take and the timetable that we have put in place must recognise that. I also recognise the timetable. Hidden behind the detail of Corus's announcement last week was a staged timetable. For many plants, this will not happen next year or the year after, but will be put into train rapidly. In Shotton, for example, there are 200 workers whose notice comes out at the end of February. Yet, on 1 March, according to their timetable, everyone else who will be made redundant will receive their notice. The process goes on almost inexorably. We must recognise that the redundancies already announced must be rolled into redundancies that are about to be announced if the unions fail in their objectives. You have my absolute assurance that the four pillars of help that I announced earlier will be in place and will be ready as soon as the buttons have to be pushed. I sincerely hope, however, that we will not have to push those buttons.

**Alun Cairns:** The Minister's comments in relation to the euro a little earlier were quite outrageous. It is widely accepted that Corus management has been critical of the

**Alun Cairns:** I will now move on to the Minister's statement. He stated that the Government is preparing for the worst and that yesterday afternoon, it agreed a broad outline of contingency plans. Is that not rather late? You agree on a contingency plan after the announcements were made. The First Minister demonstrated on a television programme last week that he had no contingency plan. You are now scraping together soft policies and spin. The people of Wales demand action immediately. They do not want a contingency plan for the long-term future. They need an economic development strategy with specific policies, not broad questions asking people what you should do. I do not know why you do not send out a blank piece of paper saying that you are in Government, but you are looking for ideas and what can people offer.

**Michael German:** The blank piece of paper is the Conservative party manifesto, is it not? First, Alun, if you want to know what the situation is in respect of currency, listen to what Ian McAllister said yesterday and reflect upon it quietly at home where you can come to a sensible decision. You have chosen to misrepresent the use of the word contingency. I regret that. The reason for the word contingency is that it is a contingency against the workers and their work not being successful. I wonder whether you support what the trade unions are saying? If you do, you will want me to put the word contingency in this document and not take it out. I would be grateful if the Conservative party could tell us whether it supports this

**Peter Law:** I regret that it has been necessary to trivialise this debate because of the wild banter from the Muppet show on the Conservative side of the Chamber. This is a serious subject for these affected communities and we should all concentrate on it.

**Alun Cairns:** It needs action.

**Peter Law:** I have seen your type of action before. I fully agree with the Minister on his strategy this afternoon, and I welcome his commitment to fight. We must do that at present. I hope that after 14 February the Minister for Assembly Business will arrange an early opportunity for a debate on the outcome of those discussions. That is vital. Without a shadow of a doubt, there must be a contingency plan. Nobody is accepting any closures at present. In an isolated area such as Ebbw Vale—which I represent—a taskforce has been in place since 1975. Despite good work by the Government, the Welsh Development Agency and local authorities, we have never achieved the amount of jobs that we once had. Diversification is welcome, but large companies are needed. Few, sadly, have come to Ebbw Vale in 25 years. That calls for a radical approach. Does the Minister agree? Bearing in mind the high value of these Corus jobs to a depressed community, would he be prepared, when appropriate, to meet with Corus and the trade unions to discuss providing some financial resources to retain these quality jobs at a plant with a full order book and a skilled and loyal workforce? The loss of such a plant would be a terrible psychological blow and an economic disaster to an already poor community.

I am happy to meet with union representatives and the company management. One of the examples to which we can look—and I know that this Assembly will always do that—is Tower Colliery. On the other end of the heads of the Valleys, we saw a company that management said was unprofitable. The workers bought it out and turned it around. That is an example of a successful company working hard and expanding daily against the odds. We must leave no stone unturned in this task of looking at alternative arrangements, to retain those vital skills of one of the most productive workforces in the world and the most productive workforce in Europe.

**William Graham:** Will the Minister give an absolute commitment that nationalisation will not form any part of your plans for the future? That is a blind alley and it is about time that this shibboleth was nailed to the wall. It is an unquestioned economic judgment, that the nationalisation of steel was an unmitigated disaster. After 14 privately-owned firms were nationalised, a bloated dinosaur with 152,000 employees was created. It was then necessary for the Labour Government to undertake major reductions in steel production. Those reductions hit our communities in Wales as hard as those that are planned now. During the slim down of the 1980s there was a considerable economic downturn in south-east Wales. The people of south-east Wales rose to that challenge and created what can only be described as a success. Among steel men you will hear the name of Ian McGregor. He is not exactly a folk hero in south-east Wales, but steel men recognise that his expertise was able to make the British Steel Corporation a highly-competitive, well-funded, world-beating

company. It exported Welsh steel and expertise. It created a modernised and well-funded industry with a well-equipped, skilled and dedicated workforce. Does the Minister agree that nationalisation should not form any part of your plans? It does not ensure job security—quite the reverse. What more of an example do we need than the socialist paradise of the former Soviet Union?

**Michael German:** Neither the National Assembly nor I have powers to nationalise and therefore it is unlikely to feature strongly in any proposals that I will bring before the Assembly. However, I do not believe that nationalisation is a contender. That is not for any emotional or philosophical reason, but because of the problems of financing it. We estimate that it would probably cost over £3 billion to purchase the company. However, Peter Law and others quite properly raised the issue of the workforce having the opportunity to take over a company and run it for itself, in the way that Tower Colliery's workforce did. That is an acceptable approach, and the National Assembly can support it in every way possible.

**The Presiding Officer:** A further statement on steel will follow. I will take two more questions on this statement. Any Members whom I have not been able to call to ask questions on this statement, I will call on the following statement. I am sure their questions will be equally relevant, as the answers will certainly be.

**Ron Davies:** I support the strategy that you are following Mike, which I consider to be hoping for the best but preparing for the worst. If we are faced with the worst option, do you accept that we will face a bill running into tens if not hundreds of millions of pounds? It will place unprecedented and extreme pressure on the budgets of the local authorities involved, bodies such as the Welsh Development Agency and the TECs, and on the National Assembly's own programmes. Bearing in mind that two thirds of Wales qualifies for Objective 1 status and that it is among the poorest parts of Europe, with less than 75 per cent of the European average of gross domestic product per capita,

**Michael German:** Pressure on the budgets and whether additional costs should be claimed from the UK Government are matters that the Minister for Finance, Local Government and Communities will deal with in the statement that follows. If she fails to address the points that you have raised, you could take them up with her afterwards.

**Rod Richards:** I would be grateful if the Deputy First Minister would take out his blank sheet of paper. It would match the blank look on his face and the blankness of the ideas that we have heard so far. On his blank sheet of paper perhaps he would like to write the following: speak to the Chancellor about the proposed energy tax; speak to the Chancellor about bringing down fuel tax; speak to his own Government about getting rid of the working time Directive; speak to his own Government about unravelling all of the red tape that this Government has imposed on businesses; and finally, end the uncertainty over the euro. He may describe those of us who do not approve of joining the euro as extremists. I find that word offensive. If this Government were to end the uncertainty, I am sure business in this country would flourish as a consequence.

**Michael German:** I note your bid to get back into the Conservative Party in the National Assembly. I would urge caution in this matter because this is an issue of great seriousness. The National Assembly must take hard action, if we have no option after 14 February. I have no qualms whatsoever about

### **The Minister for Finance, Local Government and Communities (Edwina Hart):**

**(Edwina Hart):** The First Minister, the Secretary of State for Wales and I had a positive and constructive series of discussions in London yesterday with the Prime Minister, Andrew Smith, Stephen Byers, David Blunkett and Tessa Jowell on the overall shape and possible component parts of a remedial package. There was a most encouraging recognition of the seriousness of the current situation for Wales, but a strong resolve to support the trade unions' strategy of engaging with Corus to find alternatives to last week's appalling decisions.

It is vital that the company engages with the unions during the remainder of the 14-day consultation period—having failed to do so up to this point—as no genuine and viable options for saving jobs should be excluded. I am aware from my discussions today with Tom Middlehurst, Peter Law and other Assembly Members, that the unions are actively engaged at plant level—as in my own constituency—to look at every possible means, including workers buy-outs, to try to protect their jobs. As an Assembly, we must ensure that we give them maximum support.

Against this background, the trade unions have asked that no package of measures be finalised and announced until they have had the opportunity to put their case. The First Minister received a letter asking for that intention to be made known to Assembly Members. I intend to fully respect their wishes. Assembly Ministers will visit the plants affected to lend their support to the unions' approach. It is essential that we are seen to support the unions in what is a difficult time for them and their members. The Assembly should be in no doubt that we

are working on detailed contingency plans in the event that unions' efforts prove unsuccessful. These have been alluded to by the Deputy First Minister and Minister for Economic Development in all the discussions that he undertook yesterday to get those component parts together.

It will be a package tailored to meet the immediate needs of the people—because, first and foremost, the Corus announcement is a human tragedy—but also to meet the regeneration and economic development needs of each area of Wales affected by the announcement. The needs are different in each area. We must recognise those differences and have a strategy to deal with them. To this end, we are working in close consultation with the local authorities, the Welsh Development Agency, training and enterprise councils, the Employment Service and others. I stress again that I shall not be drawn this afternoon on the details of the proposed package. That would be premature and undermine the efforts to save jobs. Work is ongoing. We have already had helpful indications of what can be done. Commissioner Barnier has announced that he is prepared to refocus structural funds programmes within existing boundaries in Wales to address the situation should the job losses be confirmed.

I will return to London on 8 February for further discussions with ministerial colleagues in Whitehall, and I shall report again to the Assembly at the earliest opportunity thereafter.

**Dafydd Wigley:** I thank Edwina for that statement, but there are several questions that arise from it, including some that were put to Mike German, which he deftly passed on for Edwina to answer. First, if Edwina, this Government and the Westminster Government are seriously considering the alternative of an employee and trade union management buy-out—a Tower colliery-type solution, to which Mike German referred—or any such proposal within a 14-day programme, will she confirm that indications are being given to the trade unions of the

Whichever option will be followed, it will cost hundreds of millions of pounds to solve this problem. **Edwina Hart:** I am in the middle of a series of meetings and negotiations. I am too long in the tooth as a former trade union official to start talking about the deal that will be made. We must recognise that this is about negotiation and about getting the clear

picture. We must also recognise that the job losses in Wales are great but that there has also been equity. If a job goes in Teeside, it is as devastating to the individual as a job lost in Ebbw Vale. These issues of equity and also how the situation is different in Wales must be addressed. Funds are a key area in terms of what would be required if the worst came to the worst and I am discussing this.

On your first point, the unions are aware of our position and that of the UK Government. There were discussions on what could have been done for Corus as a company prior to the announcement. We would be prepared to offer trade unions what we would have been prepared to offer Corus if they were looking at any buy-out arrangements. We must also recognise that it is for the unions themselves to decide what are viable options. No trade union would want to lead its workers in an unsustainable situation. When they come to us with a proposal we will be able to tell them how we can assist. We can assist them in the interim if they need technical help and advice through the WDA, for example. The Deputy First Minister has made clear the type of help that he is prepared to give in that area. We must also look at viable options at the end of it. The viability issue will be key in this.

I cannot comment on the speculation about nationalisation and our national need for steel, Dafydd, as that would be inappropriate. That is a matter for the Westminster Government and we must take it in that context. I can only assure you that, as Ron Davies mentioned, we must prepare for the worst. I hope that I will not have to put this package into operation in any shape or form and I am sure that we all agree on that. In preparing for the worst, every issue is up for grabs in terms of what is needed to regain sustainable development in some of these communities if these plants close.

**John Griffiths:** I also welcome the constructive discussions with UK Ministers. I strongly support the trade union's initiatives

and urge Corus to finally engage with the unions. If the worst occurs, do you agree that the need for new UK Government money will be great, given that around 2,000 jobs will be lost at Llanwern, including those of contractors and managers, in addition to last year's 450 jobs, 350 of which are yet to go? The lowest estimate of dependent jobs is 1:1, giving an overall figure approaching 5,000. The average disposable income involved is £20,000 per annum, which means that it would be a huge blow for the local economy and that the effects will spread far and wide into the Gwent Valleys and surrounding area. Throughout Wales, 750 suppliers provide £339 million worth of supplies and services to Corus, sometimes representing 50 per cent or more of its total turnover. In Newport East, the large Ringland council estate exists cheek by jowl with Llanwern and relies heavily on it for employment. It was already included in the 100 most deprived wards in Wales before this closure, which will lead to further deprivation.

Do you further agree that the Assembly's response to the situation in the worst affected areas will be a litmus test of devolution, by far the greatest test for the Assembly to date? There are considerable difficulties for a fledgling institution to try to respond to such a grave situation. Our constituents sometimes question what the Assembly has done. We know that it is the bread and butter issues that count with the people—primarily the economy and jobs. The people of Newport East, and its surrounding areas, as well as those of the other badly hit areas, want to know that the Assembly is with them in their fight to recover from the desperate situation that Corus has created. Do you agree that by our actions we must clearly and powerfully demonstrate that we will provide all the support, resources and commitment that these communities have every right to expect and demand?

**Edwina Hart:** When you consider the roll-call of job losses across Wales and England, you realise that these housing estates have

Ledled Cymru, rhydd 750 o gyflenwyr werth £339 miliwn o gyflenwadau a gwasanaethau i Corus, sydd ar adegau yn cynrychioli 50 y cant neu fwy o gyfanswm ei drosiant. Yn Nwyrain Casnewydd, mae ystad tai cyngor fawr Ringland yn bodoli foch ym moch â Llanwern a dibynna'n drwm arno am gyflogaeth. Cafodd ei chynnwys eisoes yn y 100 o wardiau mwyaf diffreintiedig yng Nghymru cyn i'r gwaith hwn gau, a fydd yn arwain at ragor o amddifadedd.

A gytunwch ymhellach y bydd ymateb y Cynulliad i'r sefyllfa yn yr ardaloedd yr effeithir arnynt waethaf yn brawf litmws o ddatganoli, sef prawf mwyaf y Cynulliad hyd yma o bell ffordd? close links with these large businesses, and what their closure will mean in terms of human tragedy. In the final analysis, the Assembly will be judged on what it can do. The UK Government will also be judged on the package that it will provide.

One feels a little like Don Quixote in the Assembly, tilting at the windmills of global capitalism. The realisation is that, in terms of what nation states are in the context of international companies, there is little room for manoeuvre if you consider how international business works. That is the most frustrating thing for us as politicians. You want to go in a certain direction, but the world has moved on since the day when you could send in gunboats to deal with certain issues. We will be judged by our commitments not just to the short-term solutions, which are important in terms of individuals and their training needs, but to the long-term solutions in terms of what we do to regenerate those communities by attracting new investment. The Assembly is in a difficult position at the moment as the trade unions try to get packages together. We want to be as supportive and upbeat as possible, but in our heart of hearts we know how difficult it is. We have to start talking about plan B. In some ways, we do not want to discuss plan B, but we have to get the deal right.

**Nick Bourne:** First, what surprises us greatly—and it is no reflection on the Finance Minister's abilities—is that, following the meeting yesterday between the First Minister and the Prime Minister, the First Minister did not inform us of what happened regarding the most important issue to face the Assembly for a long time. It is a matter of great surprise to us that he is not presenting this statement nor saying something about the other story in *The Western Mail* that only he can refute first hand.

We welcome any progress that can be made in reversing these decisions, but at the same time, I am sure that you would wish to join me in recognising that, while Edwina was tilting at international capitalism, we were welcoming jobs created by international

If that is the case, I trust that action will be forthcoming. I am surprised that that has not been investigated. Fifthly, I would like an answer to a question that William Graham asked to the Deputy First Minister some time ago on the dumping of cheap steel in Wales and the UK, which I think, unsurprisingly, has not been answered so far. Clearly, that is a serious issue at a time when Welsh jobs are under threat.

However, above all, the underlying impression during this crisis—and it is a crisis for Welsh jobs, I agree with the First Minister on that, at least—is not knowing who is in charge of it in Westminster and here. Is it the First Minister, the Secretary of State for Wales, the Secretary of State for Trade and Industry or the Prime Minister? In this Assembly, are you taking the lead or is the Deputy First Minister or the First Minister? We need to know who is putting this package together. We hope for the best in this consultation period, but clearly, as has been said, we have to be prepared for the worst. Who is taking the lead on this? Is it the First Minister?

**Edwina Hart:** I can tell you one thing, I am not the understudy, and I think that I am the Oscar winner and not the First Minister. The decision to make this statement today—although I do not know why I should dignify your question with an answer—was mine because it was on a financial package. It is important to recognise that this is a collective administration. The Deputy First Minister was engaged in discussion yesterday with the Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning

on all aspects of training and what could be done in Wales. The First Minister and I represented the Assembly in a series of national meetings yesterday. We were delighted that the Secretary of State for Wales could join us because of his role and the fact that he is a member of the UK Cabinet, so that he could add weight to the discussions. That is the reality of Government. You might not like it, Nick, but that is the reality.

Your asking a question about whether Corus is acting illegally is rather rich when you consider the employment law framework that the Conservatives left behind, which made it much easier and cheaper for UK companies to bow out for the rest of Europe. I have not heard you speak before on the importance of ensuring more rights for the workers. There was even a Conservative contribution on how you do not want European directives. Therefore, we can put the point on Corus acting illegally firmly in its place and put the lid back on the box.

Importing cheap steel has bothered the trade unions and I will try to find more up-to-date information about inquiries on that, and will let you know. However, we are discussing what deal will be available, and, as you will recall, the original package containing the proposed measure offered to Corus consisted of improving the business environment, reductions in business rates, training aids alongside research and development and environmental protection. There were also projects involving surplus land transactions. We need to have ongoing discussion on these subjects. I envisage that the issues that were originally a matter for Corus, would now be a matter for us to consider with the Corus trade unions, if they were interested in doing anything to protect jobs. It would be unfair to offer assistance to one side and not to the other.

In Westminster, we have links with the Department for Education and Employment on the Employment Service strands and we are looking at how it can deliver on that and what resources would be deliverable in Wales. Some matters are not devolved to us

and we must therefore consider and discuss them with UK Ministries. It is a case of bringing a contingency package together across those various strands. It is difficult to discuss creating a package until you know what you will face. We have seen that happening with Corus all the time. It has upped the ante at certain stages. We all thought that Port Talbot was going to close, and then Corus suddenly came in with its normal salami slicing and everybody thought it is not as bad as we thought it would be, but it is pretty bad. You cannot make contingency plans on the basis of what that company will do when you do not know what it will do. We have tackled this correctly. We are now giving the trade unions time to discuss and we are creating a package that will be available if those discussions fail. We will keep our fingers crossed that following the involvement of the trade unions, at least some people will keep their jobs.

**Peter Law:** First, I clarify a point that I made to the Deputy First Minister for Economic Development earlier. I was not focusing on a workers buy-out for Ebbw Vale. I was talking about financial incentives being made available to the company to help to keep overheads down. However, either way, I am pleased that that option is being considered. I will tell you the logic behind that. You could spend tens of millions in a community to develop industrial sites and build advance factories. We have had that, and I welcome that if that is the contingency; it is necessary. However, my people would say that they would rather put the money into the plant and keep those 780 jobs and be assured that those jobs will be in place for a minimum of 10 years or so. Those jobs are well paid and that is important to our economy.

I support what the Minister said, which will meet with the general approval of the people of Wales. Her positive approach is appreciated. I know that she agrees that we must work with the trade unions and wait to see the outcome of their discussions as workforce representatives. However, if a contingency plan has to be employed, it is reasonable, bearing in mind what the Prime

Nid oeddwn yn canolbwyntio ar y gweithwyr yn prynu gwaith Glynebwy. Siaradwn am roi cymhellion ariannol i'r cwmni i'w helpu i gadw ei gostau cyffredinol i lawr. Minister said recently, to expect some extra funding from Whitehall to help with community costs. It is reasonable for this Assembly to consider that. I know that she will pursue that strongly on our behalf, as she has already made clear.

I thank the Welsh press for the positive support that it has given Corus workers, particularly *The Welsh Mirror* editorials that supported Ebbw Vale. Will you deplore the junketing of the Corus senior management at the weekend? I consider that insensitive and it is in contrast to the mortgage and debt counselling that occurred in Ebbw Vale to help our people—the dedicated, but alarmed and worried workers of the Ebbw Vale steelworks facing the consequences of last Thursday's announcement. We read today that those people could face the prospect of their jobs being stolen by the Dutch Corus plant. That, if true, is unforgivable. As I understand, the one line cannot be absorbed into Trostre, and that workforce, in fairness to it, is asking how it is supposed to meet a capacity increase of over 50 per cent. That would be even worse. Do you agree that that, if true, is deplorable bearing in mind the support that communities throughout Wales wish to give the Ebbw Vale workers to ensure that these important works remain open in the Valleys?

**Edwina Hart:** I understand that Corus had a hospitality box at the match on Saturday, and I am sure that if I were a member of the Ebbw Vale Corus workforce, I would be concerned that Corus could enjoy such an event when it had to make such swingeing, devastating job cuts in Wales. Peter put across the community's position well, and that is essential. We should never forget that we are talking about debt counselling and people's futures. We need only consider the fact that Ebbw Vale did not recover from the last closures. We must consider the deprivation index in Blaenau Gwent, surrounding Ebbw Vale, and how deprivation will be even more prevalent when those jobs go. We must recognise the full extent of the problems that will occur in Blaenau Gwent as a result of this closure. I was told last week

He was referring to the wholly orchestrated process over the past few weeks of putting all the blame on Corus—and we have heard that again here today—to protect the real villain, namely the United Kingdom Labour Government. We heard Mike German and Peter Black join in that chorus today.

Does Edwina agree with the editorial of *The Guardian*—one of the papers most supportive of Labour apart from the *Welsh Mirror*, which Peter Law praised—on Friday, which stated,

In the discussions in which she participated, did Edwina Hart, on behalf of the Assembly, the people of Wales and the steel communities, press for that ‘root change’? As it is clear that the great villain in this case is the United Kingdom Government, including the Treasury, will she and the rest of the Government of Wales press the Treasury to ensure that a package that matches the financial need is provided, and that that funding is additional? Dafydd Wigley asked that question and Ron Davies has mentioned it, but we have not received any kind of pledge to that end. David Hanson in Parliament yesterday also refused to give a

commitment that additional money would be available from the Treasury for this serious crisis.

We still live in hope that the trade unions will be successful in their endeavours, but if those endeavours are to succeed, that means adequate financial assistance. It also means creating a climate for a manufacturing industry that will enable that business to succeed as well. Major questions remain.

As regards refocusing European structural funding, can Edwina suggest which area of Wales should lose funding so that Blaenau Gwent might gain from it? Blaenau Gwent definitely needs additional assistance, but which area should lose funding? I remind Edwina of the blows throughout Wales during the past few weeks in the manufacturing sector.

Has Edwina Hart gauged what the true financial needs will be, and has this administration done so? I have heard the figure of £100 million. That is too little. Ron Davies mentioned hundreds of millions of pounds. Has the administration of Wales gauged what will be necessary if the worst comes to the worst? It is right that we should know that.

Is Edwina Hart, along with the rest of the Government of Wales, willing to put Wales first? 'Putting Wales First' is its phrase. Is it willing to do that? Of course we are concerned about workers in England and so on, but the business of the Assembly is to concentrate on the needs of Wales in this situation and to fight our corner. Does she accept that the Assembly's responsibility in this situation is to be a voice for Wales and to lead the nation in the campaign for justice? We need justice, not charity. Is the Assembly administration prepared to show clearly that it is willing to do that and put the good of its country before the good of its party?

We must get this into perspective.

On Will Hutton, I am not sure about his politics these days. When I read his articles I sometimes wonder whether he is on the right or the left. As for *The Guardian*, sometimes I agree with its views and sometimes I do not. Sometimes I can do the crossword and sometimes I cannot. That is my general attitude towards opinions expressed in the press.

We must be clear. I can only give a commitment on the Assembly's package to which I can commit the Assembly. I cannot and I will not give a commitment on what the UK Treasury or the Prime Minister will do. I can only give a commitment to negotiate as best as I can, within that framework, to get what we can and to make all the arguments possible to ensure that we get the best deal. There is recognition that we need extra resources. That is important. It would not be helpful for me to be drawn on the nature and content of the discussions that I may or may not have had yesterday. Nothing irritates Whitehall departments more than them thinking that a matter is being discussed that has not been discussed with them first. My job is to try to get what I can and not to be drawn into some of the issues that have been raised today.

We are talking about justice. However, we can only ask for money because we have this devolution settlement. If we had what you wanted, Cynog, we could not go to the UK Treasury. We could not ask the Government in Whitehall for anything, because it would not be part and parcel of our Government. You support Europe, so do I. You support the expansion of the European Union, so do I. However, by implication, globalisation will affect Welsh manufacturing jobs. That causes

I will, of course, discuss any changes that need to be made with the Business Committee and party business managers. With that proviso, I present this week's statement to you.

Finally, on the advice of the Business Committee, the Deputy Presiding Officer has determined, in accordance with Standing Order No. 22.5, that the following items of subordinate legislation need not be referred to a Subject Committee: the Plastic Materials and Articles in Contact with Food (Amendment) (Wales) Regulations 2001, the Homeless Persons (Priority Need) (Wales) Order 2001 and the Community Charges, Council Tax and Non-Domestic Rating (Enforcement) (Magistrates' Courts) (Wales) Regulations 2001. As usual, I will arrange for the business statement to be posted on the internet and intranet.

We have made a commitment that we will make statements to the Assembly in Plenary before we make statements outside this Chamber. We abide by that. We could not have tabled a motion for debate within the normal timetable. However, we hope to have a full debate once the moratorium has ended and we know how the situation in the steel industry has been resolved. I give you that commitment.

**Jocelyn Davies:** The Plaid Cymru group understands the Conservative group's preference for a full debate rather than statements. However, I accepted the Minister for Assembly Business's explanation to the Business Committee this morning and I am glad that he has repeated his assurance that we will soon have a full and proper debate on the steel industry, based on an amendable Government motion.

*<http://www.legislation.hmso.gov.uk/si/si2000/20001059.htm>) to the Assembly First Minister, save those which by law cannot be so delegated.*

*Nothing in this resolution will have the effect of either reducing the pre-eminence of the authority of the full Assembly, or reducing the role of Assembly Committees in reviewing the effectiveness of policies and in developing new policies, as described in Standing Order No. 9.7(i), in contributing to the development of the Assembly's policies.*

**Alun Pugh:** I will vote in favour of these regulations. However, we all need to be aware that there is no such thing as good radiation. Exposure to radiation is justified where there are clear medical benefits and I am glad to see that these safeguards are retained in the regulations. However, the act of eating seafood or going for a walk on a north Wales beach should not result in someone being exposed to radiation, be it from technetium or from any other toxic and radioactive metal that has been dumped into the Irish Sea by British Nuclear Fuels Limited. These regulations are good and I will support them. However, we still need tighter regulations on dumping waste.

**The Minister for Health and Social Services (Jane Hutt):** It is important to note that these regulations cover different matters to the discharges to which Alun Pugh referred, which are covered by the Environment Agency Wales. It is important today that we seek agreement to ensure that we delegate functions in the interests of efficiency and safety to the Assembly in relation to these important Ionising Radiation (Medical Exposure) Regulations 2000.

**The Minister for Finance, Local Government and Communities (Edwina Hart):** I propose that

*in accordance with Standing Order No. 19.9, approves the Local Government Finance Report for the financial year 2001-02, distributed to Members by e-mail and laid in the Table Office on 30 January 2001 by the Assembly Minister for Finance, Local Government and Communities; and*

*in accordance with Standing Order No. 19.8, approves the Special Grant Report (No.2 (Wales) 2001, distributed to Members by e-mail and laid in the Table Office on 30 January 2001 by the Assembly Minister for Finance, Local Government and Communities to enable payment to relevant local authorities of transitional grant to moderate the impact on those authorities of the new standard spending assessment formula.*

Last November, the Assembly approved my provisional proposals for next year's local government settlement as the basis for consultation. I now ask the Assembly to approve the local government finance report for the next financial year and to approve an Order for the special grant. I ask for the Assembly's approval in the confident knowledge that the responses to the consultation have been overwhelmingly positive.

There is wide recognition that this year's settlement represents a positive transformation in the financing of local government. I look forward to local authorities being able to achieve sustainable improvements in the wide range of services needed in local communities in every part of Wales; better education, better social care, better support for the local economy and the environment. This settlement provides for

Fis Tachwedd diwethaf, cymeradwyodd y Cynulliad fy nghynigion dros dro ar gyfer setliad llywodraeth leol y flwyddyn nesaf fel sail ar gyfer ymgynghori. Gofynnaf yn awr i'r Cynulliad gymeradwyo'r adroddiad cyllid llywodraeth leol ar gyfer y flwyddyn ariannol nesaf ac i gymeradwyo Gorchymyn ar gyfer y grant arbennig. Gofynnaf am gymeradwyaeth y Cynulliad gan wybod gyda sicrwydd y bu'r ymatebion i'r ymgynghoriad yn gadarnhaol dros ben.

Cydnabyddir yn eang bod setliad eleni wedi trawsnewid y ffordd yr ariennir llywodraeth leol mewn modd cadarnhaol. substantial real growth in local services for the first time in a quarter of a century. The new distribution formula will achieve a rational and predictable allocation of money to local authorities for the first time in the history of the reorganised local authorities. The new regime of policy agreements and best value will ensure that the resources we provide are used efficiently to respond to the needs of local people and to achieve goals that have been agreed by the Assembly and local government.

I know that all Members will have been fascinated by the report's detail. For legal reasons it reads like the most obscure branch of statistical and mathematical theory. However, behind the language of algebra and weighted variables, real achievements are being shared between the Assembly and Welsh local government, such as enhanced service provision, redistribution in response to local needs and local choices in a framework of national goals. Together, we are pioneering an approach that is new to Wales and unique in the United Kingdom.

Local government will receive an 8 per cent increase in grant support for spending on local services in the next financial year. On any sensible estimate of cost inflation, this represents 4-5 per cent real growth. On 30 January, I announced that the block support is to increase by £186 million, including the increases in revenue support grant, redistributed non-domestic rates and, in the case of three authorities, transitional grant. The total revenue settlement is just under £3.3 billion. In addition about 2.5 per cent of the support to local authorities will be in the form of specific grants.

This settlement is different from the provisional proposals of last autumn. I have listened to Assembly Members, the Local Government and Housing Committee and local authorities. The settlement and the distribution have changed at the margin in response to new data. The sum of £3 million has been added to reflect the extra costs of the new arrangements for long-term care of the elderly. A further £2 million has been added to the total for headteachers' early

Redistribution is never easy and, in this case, I fully acknowledge the support and responsible attitude of the WLGA in getting us through the transition. As I reported in the autumn, there are data gaps, which have prevented us from implementing all the recommendations for the new formula. Many respondents to the consultation reminded us of the need to fill those gaps. Work is ongoing, and as the data becomes available we will incorporate it into the formula.

The effect of the new formula has been directed entirely at the variation in projected council tax increases. The settlement allows for every local authority, if it chooses, to increase its budget by 5.9 per cent even without specific grants. In order to achieve this assumed standard budget increase, council tax changes will vary between minus 11 per cent and plus 9 per cent. The stability that I am aiming for will be achieved after just one year of the new formula, after which I anticipate that 21 of the 22 local authorities will broadly be able to achieve the same rate of growth of expenditure for the same rate of growth of council tax. In order to achieve this stability I have agreed to invest £4 million in a transitional grant for next year. This will be distributed to only three local authorities and will ensure that, as I was requested to ensure by the WLGA, in transition, no local authority need increase its council tax by more than 9 per cent. I ask the Assembly to give specific approval to the Order that provides for this transitional grant.

The partnership agreement's reference to council tax has been much misrepresented. We said that, in implementing the new formula, we would ensure that every local authority could maintain its existing services in the context of an average 3 per cent increase in council tax. We have more than delivered on that commitment. However, we

also said that local authorities should set their own council tax levels, not the Assembly. We recognised that implementing the new formula would result in different increases in different local authorities. It is mischievous if any Assembly Member, or any political party in local government, has claimed that their local council tax should be 3 per cent. That was never my commitment, or the commitment of any part of this Chamber. When local authorities set their council tax levels, in a responsible and accountable manner—justifying their balance of tax and expenditure to their local electorate—those local authorities will have my support and, I hope, the support of every Assembly Member.

Over the last few months, I have visited local authorities throughout Wales, and have so far visited about half the total number. The response to this settlement has been consistently positive. The picture they have painted is of the Assembly now providing a light at the end of a dark tunnel. Time and again, I am told of the anguish of the last years of the Tory administration. Council leaders from areas as diverse as Bridgend and Gwynedd recalled the years following 1993, when millions of pounds were cut from local authority budgets. They all recognise this as a good settlement. The statisticians tell me that, between 1993 and 1998, local authorities just managed to protect the value of education expenditure. However, there was a 10 per cent real cut in all other services; cuts in children's services, cuts in care of the elderly, cuts in leisure and cultural services, cuts in street cleaning and road maintenance, and cuts in capital expenditure. The memory of those who previously governed Wales is not fading and the scars in our communities remain, as Peter Law often alludes to in this Chamber.

Almost all council leaders told me of the irresponsibility of the Tory Government in re-organising local government, as it did not provide a financial framework to fit the new authorities. The leader of Neath Port Talbot

**The Deputy Presiding Officer:** Order. The Minister will not give way. Calm down, David, and let her finish her speech.

**Edwina Hart:** When you are asked what difference this Assembly is making, it is more relevant to ask what difference the administration is making. Compare the growth and stability of this year's local government settlement with those dark Tory years and just compare our partnership with local government with the days when it was a battleground.

To move on, we all agree on the importance of the police service. The Assembly is responsible for police standard spending assessments, while the Home Office supports the police through police grant. The Assembly support to police authorities will ensure that the police service shares the same sort of real growth as other local services in Wales. The Assembly has a real interest in ensuring that local authorities use the large and increasing amounts of money that we provide to them efficiently and effectively. We must ensure that policies developed in local areas, in response to local needs, are complementary to our goals. Each local authority will agree targets of what they intend to achieve in education, social care, transport and the environment. I have provided a potential £10 million in extra grants next year, in anticipation that all local authorities will successfully make their agreements with the Assembly. There is a projection of a further grant in 2003-04 for authorities that achieve the targets agreed.

In addition to introducing the policy agreement approach, we must consider the best value requirements. I have announced about 80 performance indicators in this area. I am keen that we can, through policy agreements and best value checks, give real confidence to people about how money is spent. Hypothecation, in my opinion, is a thing of the past. I hope that that message hits home.

I want to continue the improvement in our relationship with local government by ensuring that the settlement announcement is, in future, made earlier in the financial year, and by seeking to tie in announcements on special grants with announcements on the general block. To achieve this, we will require earlier submission of data from local authorities, but we will allow them to undertake more considered financial planning.

The Assembly can take pride in this settlement and the development of a mature relationship with local government. The settlement will lead to real growth in local services, sustainable growth over three years, an end to large scale imposed council tax increases, a stable and rational formula, robust agreements between the Assembly and local government, and incentives to achieve the continuous improvements in performance that we require from local government. This is a good settlement and I commend it to the National Assembly

**Janet Ryder:** I declare an interest as a member of a town council.

The revenue support grant under discussion today was announced to the press before it appeared on the internet or intranet. A press release announcing the settlement as a done deal appeared on the internet hours before the final documents. This settlement, in its final form, has not been discussed by the Local Government and Housing Committee. There has been no provision for other parties to amend the motion, which would allow them to increase areas of spending if they so

This is a major section of the Assembly's budget. I accept the Minister's points that this settlement provides more money for local government, and it will allow for an increase in spending on frontline services. However, all councils will need substantial increases for a number of years to repair the damage caused by years of inflation when they received below inflation increases. There was no clear table on the internet showing the overall amount that each county would receive. Last year, this was clearly shown as part of the report, and I ask the Minister to ensure that it is included in future.

A transitional grant has been awarded to enable counties to adjust to the new funding formula. However, only three counties will receive that grant. Other councils face similar increases, but will not receive any relief. Some councils think that an overall transitional grant of £17 million would have been fairer, to provide the necessary scale of relief. Will the Minister explain why some counties have received the transitional grant while others have not?

There is a contradiction in this budget. In November, I pointed out that there has been a substantial increase in the use of specific grants, some of which were announced late. That has caused problems to councils seeking to set their own budgets. Specific grants could be perceived as a form of hypothecation. However, the Minister says that she is committed to allowing councils the freedom to spend and allocate their money as they see fit. In her press statement on 30 January she said

'I want to make it absolutely clear that revenue settlement resources are not earmarked by the Assembly for any particular purpose; local authorities are best placed to gauge what local council tax payers are able

to pay and to determine spending priorities.'

That surely is in stark contrast to the letter issued by Jane Davidson in December, which appeared to tell schools in minute detail exactly how much 'new' money they could expect to receive. The effect on local authorities was profound, with many of them feeling that they had been told, once again, how to allocate their budgets. It seemed to them to be yet another form of hypothecation.

If local government is denied the freedom to decide how to spend its money, it becomes nothing more than an agency through which money is passed on to other bodies. Plaid Cymru believes that local government is elected to govern locally. To do that, it must have the freedom to allocate its budget, as it judges appropriate for its area. The Assembly does not like to be told by Westminster how to allocate its budgets, and we should give the same freedom to local government.

There is concern about differing levels of spending on services in different local authority areas, on education in particular. Perhaps the answer is to ensure clarity, so that people can see how much money their local authority is allocating to different services. However, the Assembly must also produce clear budgets, to show that any new money announced by Westminster is clearly identifiable in our budget.

Another area of concern is the provision of services to groups such as people with learning disabilities. The all-Wales strategy was introduced to overcome such a perceived problem. This hypothecated money was intended to provide services to a vulnerable group. With the demise of that strategy, there has been a consequential demise in services. This area of concern will need special attention as policy agreements are reached.

I return to the settlement's presentation. We must ask why we are having this debate today. This is not the revenue support grant

Last week, Nick Bourne, I think, raised a point of order relating to the announcement to the press of the health strategy, before it was made available to Assembly Members. Today's debate is being held to give political legitimacy to a fait accompli.

Therefore, we have a motion that cannot be amended as it is a finance motion, and a settlement that has changed since it was last debated, which has been announced to the press as a certainty before the Assembly is allowed to discuss it. What will happen next year? The partnership agreement contained a pledge to keep the council tax increase to 5 per cent. I suppose that we will have to wait for the press release.

**Lorraine Barrett:** I have been asked by the Vale of Glamorgan Council, which is Conservative led and supported by Plaid Cymru, to ask the Minister for Finance to allocate transitional grants to the council. At this point, I will make a political observation. It is astounding when Conservatives accuse Labour of a poor settlement. I apologise for repeating some of what Edwina said, but I did not know what she would say. What did Mrs Thatcher or Mr Hague as Secretary of State for Wales do for local government or public services in Wales? Nothing, as I recall, other than try to demolish them.

Everyone agreed that the inadequacies of the previous standard spending assessment formula had to be redressed. For the first time we have had a government, the Government of Wales, working with local government to come up with a fairer formula. No formula can be perfect, and I would love to be able to say to the people of Cardiff South and Penarth, that they will never have to pay any more council tax. I would love the Minister for Finance to say to me, 'Here you are

There are pockets of deprivation in the Vale of Glamorgan. The only part of it which I represent is in Penarth where there are areas with economic and social problems. One such area is the town council ward of St Augustine's, which is subsumed into the more affluent Vale council ward of Alexandra. The Tories on the Vale of Glamorgan Council tried to stop the Local Government Boundary Commission for Wales dividing this ward into two, so that the true deprivation levels in St Augustine's can be properly measured. The words 'crocodile tears' come to mind. These funding proposals have been welcomed by the Welsh Local Government Association and the Vale of Glamorgan Council will be able to increase its expenditure on existing services by 5.9 per cent and will receive further funding for new services.

The settlement will allow for growth in education, social services and many other essential services. However, I remain concerned about the viability of the Vale of Glamorgan Council because local government reorganisation in 1996—again this was alluded to by the Minister for Finance—was done hurriedly and on the cheap. Many of us said then that 22 district councils would not be able to deliver full and proper education or social services provision.

Finally, while I will do all that I can to get the best settlement possible for those whom I represent, I still have to be able to look my colleague Peter Law in the eye, when he tells me that his constituents live in deprivation surrounded by deprivation. What hope do they have now? For goodness' sake, let us all get behind these proposals to deliver the best services for Wales. It is the best settlement that Wales has ever had.

**William Graham:** I declare an interest as a member of Newport County Borough Council. Although we acknowledge that this is an important settlement for local government in Wales, and, as always, we

have had a competent presentation by Edwina, it is still disappointing news for council tax payers in all Welsh local authorities.

The main flaws in this financial settlement, which we have brought to the attention of the Assembly on many occasions, may be summarised as follows. The formula continues to allow inefficient local authorities that provide services at high cost to receive grants to pay for their inefficiencies. The formula incorporates an increased reliance upon deprivation indicators that predominantly relate to our urban communities and it fails to reflect the sparsity and rurality of so many of our communities in Wales.

The Welsh Conservatives welcome the rejection of hypothecation and the freedom given to local authorities to determine their expenditure priorities for principal service provision. However, this freedom requires total transparency at local government level, so that everyone can clearly see who decides how much of their money is being spent and on which services emphasis is being placed.

Last week, the Minister announced that extra money was available for councils to spend on an early retirement scheme for headteachers and to reduce the pressures on elderly people to sell their homes to pay for care. However, unless this extra money is ringfenced, councils may spend it on different services and we may find that it will yet again be absorbed to pay for the inefficiencies of some high-spending local authorities. You need look no further than my local council, Newport County Borough Council, where vital education and social services were supposedly underspent by £1 million and £600,000 respectively, and where £1.5 million was transferred to Newport Housing Trust. Those figures attracted the interest of the district auditor. How many more council officials have to come to the Assembly to account for district auditor reports concerning their lack of integrity, openness and propriety?

What example can the Assembly provide for Wales? Last October, in its partnership agreement, the Labour/Liberal Democrat administration committed itself to providing the funding to allow local authorities to maintain their service provision levels and keep their council tax increases to, allegedly, an average increase of 3 per cent. As council after council indicates that it will levy council tax increases well above that figure, extra money suddenly becomes available. Why are the people of Wales subjected to their services being maintained at their current level? Why suggest, however vaguely, a figure of 3 per cent, when, in reality, additional money is required to fund service improvements?

**Peter Black:** I cannot believe that a man of your education cannot understand the meaning of the word 'average'. Clearly, if we aim for an average increase of 3 per cent, some councils will levy a higher council tax while others will levy a lower council tax. Do you not accept that the document referred to an average of 3 per cent, and that was the inevitable outcome?

**William Graham:** If you spin a number long enough, people will come to respect it. In this case, we know that it is not true.

Why are people in rural Wales being penalised by a formula for determining local government funding that incorporates an increased reliance on deprivation indicators that are predominantly related to our urban communities and fail to reflect the sparsity and rurality of many of our communities in Wales? We know that it costs more to provide a service in a sparsely populated rural area than to provide the same service in a densely populated urban area. We all know that, in real terms, the value of farm workers' incomes is falling. We are disturbed that this settlement fails to take full and proper account of these issues.

**Brian Gibbons:** In view of your statement that rural Wales has been hammered by this settlement, can you explain why the majority of council tax cuts will probably be in rural Wales, whereas in my constituency, Aberavon, and in Rhondda, Merthyr Tydfil and Rhymney and Blaenau Gwent they face the opposite situation?

**William Graham:** Brian well knows that that is to do with how figures are worked out.

**Brian Gibbons:** Yes, but you cannot say that it is an increase.

**William Graham:** It is up to individual local authorities to come up with their final figures, which have yet to be announced.

The scrutiny of local government expenditure and its quality of service provision is now contained within Best Value. This

‘requires authorities to deliver services by the most economic, efficient and effective means’.

That is a quotation from a letter that I received from the Minister for Finance, Local Government and Communities. Although it is dated 31 January, it was delivered to my office five days later, and not via the internal mail system. It had been delivered back to this building by the Post Office. At least the Minister followed Best Value practice by sending it by second class mail.

After four years under a Labour Government, the average household is paying £200 more per annum in council tax. This is the ultimate stealth tax, and although it is levied by Gordon Brown, the National Assembly for Wales has to take the blame.

Best Value requires councils to be monitored against almost 150 specific performance indicators, at a total estimated cost to UK taxpayers of £600 million a year. In replacing compulsory competitive tendering, Best Value offers no guarantee of competition,

I will comment quickly on the issue raised by Lorraine Barrett. The figures for council tax increases bear remarkable comparison. In 1995-96, there was an increase of 10.5 per cent, 10.4 per cent in 1996-97, 10.2 per cent in 1997-98, 10.4 per cent in 1998-99 and 10.9 per cent in 1999-2000. You must also remember that gross domestic product per capita has increased during that period.

This settlement is bad news for council tax payers in Wales. They will be grateful for the extra money that the Minister has found to keep their council tax increase to an average of only 6 per cent. However, they will not be grateful for an administration that continues to find funds to prop up inefficient local authorities. Even if there is now an uncertainty over the date of council elections, people will not forgive excessive demands for rates throughout Wales.

**Peter Black:** We must accept that what we have in front of us today is the most generous settlement for many years. It allows local government to put behind it difficult years in terms of funding. Edwina referred earlier to the problems between 1993 and 1998 when there was a real cut in central services, in particular social services, street cleaning and road maintenance. The consequences of those cuts and the backlog of work that built up as a result are still with us and will take many years to put right. I was a councillor during that period, and I declare an interest as a member of the City and County of Swansea.

However, without exception, every council now has substantial extra resources to spend and, due to the judicious use of a fully funded transitional grant, they need not have an increase of more than 9 per cent if that is their wish. This compares favourably with previous years. Last year, the average council tax increase across Wales was 11.1 per cent, with rises ranging from 23.1 per cent at their highest to 5.8 per cent at their lowest. The previous year, the average increase was 8.5 per cent and the year before that it was 11.9 per cent.

You and other speakers have been critical of previous Conservative Governments. Do you accept that any increase in resources has been paid for by massive increases by the Labour Government since it came to power over the last three years? It is local council tax payers who have paid for any increase over the last three years.

The present settlement is a major improvement on that trend. This is the Liberal Democrat Labour partnership government in action: lower council taxes and more money for services. We must wait

**Peter Black:** Yr wyf yn sôn am y setliad presennol a'r llywodraeth bartneriaeth sydd gennym ar hyn o bryd. Nid wyf mewn sefyllfa i roi sylwadau ar Lywodraeth flaenorol nad oeddwn yn rhan ohoni. to see what councils do with this money and with their council tax. However, we in Wales are bucking a trend and are showing that we can do our own thing despite the Treasury wanting us to aim at an average of 10 per cent for next year. Transitional grants are an important part of this settlement, but they must be sustainable. We cannot return to the days before the change in the formula when damping was an institutional part of the settlement year on year. It distorts the proper distribution of resources and leads to the sort of top-slicing that we are trying to avoid. I am surprised, therefore, that Janet Ryder, speaking for Plaid Cymru, wants us to go down this road.

William Graham alleged that the formula on which this settlement is based does not take account of rurality. If he were to read the document on which the change in the funding formula was made, he would know that this was not so and that rural councils such as Powys gain money in this formula because of its needs from being so sparsely populated. This formula tries to distribute money according to need, giving resources to those councils that have the greatest need, but taking the rural factors into account as well. On balance, that is what it achieves, although, as Edwina has previously said, there are gaps in the statistics, which need to be addressed in the coming years. Like Edwina, I am pleased that this partnership government can deliver such a good settlement with sustainable benefits for all the people of Wales. These are benefits on which we can build in the next three years as we strengthen our partnership with local councils.

**Janet Davies:** I do not believe that anybody can fail to welcome an increase for local government spending that is above inflation. Nevertheless, that must be put into context, particularly in the field of housing. There have been cuts year on year since 1997 for local authority housing and we are only now getting back to how it was in 1996-97. I will flag up two problems for local government spending. One is the loss of business rates, which is bound to happen after the events of

I turn to the press release that the Minister issued on 30 January. I note that an extra £2 million specific grant has been given for headteachers' early retirement. I presume that this is related to accurate information, and is not a finger in the wind calculation. It may well be a priority for the Cabinet and the Finance Minister for extra education spending. It has certainly not been discussed by the Local Government and Housing Committee or the Education and Lifelong Learning Committee. I wonder whether parents and teachers in general, or even the Assembly Committees, regard it as such high priority as to receive specific funding.

However, as the Minister made clear, local authorities are free to spend money as they choose, and while they are often criticised for using money other than as central Government advises, perhaps this time their common sense will recognise greater educational needs, such as repair of school buildings.

Turning to the repair and renovation needs of local authority housing, extra money has been put in the budget with a £15 million increase over the present year. Much of it is described as general capital funding, although I assume that means approval to borrow, not real money from the Assembly for housing authorities. It is clearly inadequate, or the pressure to bring in private funding—an expensive option in the long term—would not exist. Private finance initiatives are the early twenty-first century version of shortsightedness in social housing. The mid twentieth century version was factory-built housing that needed huge investment after 20 years. That is causing many of the financial difficulties that we now face.

I want to raise the issue of town and community councils. I declare an interest as a Llanharry community councillor. They are outside the settlement although they are part of Welsh local government. Many—but not

I have been critical, but I recognise the difficulty that the Finance Minister has in dealing with a block grant based on an unfair formula. I recognise her difficulties in dealing with her two roles as Minister for Finance and Minister for Local Government. I also recognise that her difficulties are of her own party's making, and that it takes Wales for granted. Minister, you said earlier that you did not know whether Will Hutton is on the left or right of politics. Many of us feel like that about New Labour.

**Janice Gregory:** I do not think that I will respond to that last comment. However, I say to Janet, I do not know about taking Wales for granted. Every local council leader has said that this is the best local government settlement for a generation. I do not know how that fits in with taking Wales for granted. Perhaps Janet will tell me later.

**David Davies:** Will the Member give way?

**Janice Gregory:** No I will not.

**David Davies:** It is factually incorrect.

**Janice Gregory:** It is not factually incorrect. I am not going to argue with you, David Davies. I do not want to repeat what other people have said this afternoon, but we all know that there has been much debate and speculation about this latest local government settlement, not least in my own county borough of Bridgend. However, now that the dust has settled to a certain extent, I am pleased to note that this is a good local government settlement. I am glad to see that the Welsh Local Government Association has agreed so. In a press release that it issued earlier this week, it mentioned three things. First, that it allowed a real increase on

Fourthly, that this settlement delivers an overall spending increase of over 6 per cent for councillors. We could all argue about the figures but this is what the Welsh Local Government Association is saying in black and white.

We all know what has happened. There was a need for a review of the old standard spending assessment formula. In 1996 all the local authorities wanted it, the WLGA demanded it, and they had it. Unfortunately there are winners and losers. The most obvious mismatches of the old formula were in the north of the industrialised south Wales valleys. We heard the old chestnut again from the Conservatives. William Graham referred to inefficient, spendthrift councils when discussing the four local authorities that I regard as the most deprived in Wales. There is no ward in my constituency that can compare with the deprivation in parts of Blaenau Gwent, Rhondda Cynon Taff—part of which is in my constituency—Merthyr Tydfil and Neath Port Talbot. I cannot compare the deprivation in the Ogmore constituency to parts of those constituencies.

**Janet Ryder:** One of the badly-hit councils is Flintshire County Council, which will suffer job losses because of Corus. You cannot simply say that this is a rural issue. You must look at the transitional grant formula.

**Janice Gregory:** I understand what Janet is saying, but the Corus job losses came after the decision on the SSA formula. I do not want to labour on about the deprivation that is suffered in these areas, but it is difficult to understand why so many people want to rake up the issue of spendthrift authorities again.

I have spoken to the Finance Minister and I explained the problems that Bridgend would suffer under the new formula. I am grateful that she agreed to meet the leader and officials of Bridgend County Borough Council last Tuesday. The final figures had been established before they came to the National Assembly. I am sorry that Bridgend County Borough Council did not wait for the figures before it announced publicly in a local newspaper that there would be cuts of £2.6 million, which frightened most people in the area. The leader and officials of the Council were told, when they came to the Assembly, that the Finance Minister, because of new data that had come in, had found an extra £1.1 million for Bridgend County Borough Council. I thank the Finance Minister for that, and I am sure that Bridgend council would like to thank her. I make it clear that the money was there before the meeting on Tuesday night.

**Janice Gregory:** I will not give way. I am about to conclude because I have had my five minutes. I say to the Finance Minister that all local authorities will welcome the settlement being announced earlier than ever before.

**David Davies:** I apologise for trying to interrupt the Minister earlier. I had assumed foolishly that she was in sufficient command of her brief to deviate from her statement for a minute or two. I should have known better.

Let her come to the partnership committee or the local government committees, and hear what even Labour councillors say about this settlement behind closed doors.

**Janice Gregory** *rose—*

**David Davies:** I am not prepared to give way; I only have a few minutes.

I say to her that if she had attended the meetings that I attended, and which the Minister attended, she would know that even her own local government leaders have been critical of this report. Do not talk to me either about the Welsh Local Government Association, the mouthpiece of the Labour Party in Wales. In the previous financial year, the WLGA's members tried to vote down the report. Harry Jones came in and whipped the Labour members and told them that they had to support it. They did. This year Harry Jones and Noel Crowley managed to stitch up the WLGA, putting in their own man, Sandy Blair, as its chief executive, after an interview where four of the seven councillors who interviewed him came from England. It is not so much the Welsh as the English Local Government Association. So much for devolution.

We heard about 'data gaps'. Even the Minister and the Liberal Democrats' local government spokesman mentioned them. They are not data gaps; the whole report is fundamentally flawed. Last year we were promised a formula that would protect rural areas. When that report came out we saw that the amount of weighting given to sparsity had been greatly decreased. So much for looking

**Tom Middlehurst rose—**

**David Davies:** I will give way in a minute.

Instead of examining the geographical distance between settlements, the report calculated the distance as the crow flies. Are the people of Monmouthshire going to sprout wings to get from one isolated settlement to another? That is the idea behind this report. It underplays rurality.

**Tom Middlehurst:** Do you recall the decision taken by the former Welsh Office, in agreement with the Welsh Local Government Association, that there should be a fundamental review of the distribution formula? That was taken in 1996. I give some credit to the then Secretary of State for Wales for recognising that there were serious flaws in the existing formula. Do you agree that William Hague agreed to a fundamental review of that formula?

**David Davies:** If William Hague, who was an excellent Secretary of State for Wales, was still Secretary of State we would not have a formula full of what the Minister laughingly calls ‘data gaps’.

I mentioned rurality. What about the fact that the new formula does not consider the age of inhabitants? It does not consider the average incomes, which have fallen in rural areas. As William Graham pointed out, it does not examine the relative efficiencies of different local authorities. It does not begin to explain why it costs £34.38 per household to deal with refuse collection in Neath Port Talbot, in Blaenau Gwent it costs £27.03 per household, whereas it costs about £22 per household in rural Monmouthshire, where it should cost more to collect rubbish. Is it not time that, instead of penalising the hard-pressed council tax payers of Monmouthshire, Powys and other local authorities, we asked these Labour-run rotten boroughs in the Valleys why they are unable to keep their books in order in successive years?

We will vote against this whitewash of a report today. In the previous report we actually had the figures showing the standard spending assessments for each local authority area, but this time the so-called open Government of Wales is not prepared to do that. The Minister would not take the intervention; I ask her now, will she allow all local authorities to spend at the SSA, the supposed minimum that each local authority needs? Last year, as she knows, that did not happen.

Finally I say to the Plaid Cymru Members, and some of the Liberal Democrat Members, remember your obligations to your constituents. To the regional Members for South Wales East, I say that I have stood on public platforms with the Deputy First Minister who has shed crocodile tears over what has happened in Monmouth. Where is he now? Why is he not present in the Chamber to vote against this settlement? I will take one more intervention.

**Kirsty Williams:** Thank you for reminding Members about their responsibilities to their constituents. I am sure that all Members present will think carefully about that. Does that include your Members who represent South Wales Central, who will be looking to ensure that the needs of the severely-deprived areas that they represent in the Valleys will also be addressed today, David? Or will your party only be looking to the needs of one particular county?

**David Davies:** I can assure you that Conservative Party Members will always put their obligations to their constituents first and foremost. I look forward to the Members of all parties doing the same and joining us in rejecting this outrageous settlement today.

**Pauline Jarman:** Datganaf fuddiant fel arweinydd Cyngor Bwrdeistref Rhondda

Borough Council. I want to discuss three issues. Firstly, the Vale of Glamorgan is part of the constituency that I represent in this Assembly. I have been approached by Jeffrey James, the leader of the Vale of Glamorgan Council about the authority being allocated transitional relief. [ASSEMBLY MEMBERS: 'Not Jeffrey Jones?'] No. Jeffrey James, not Jones. The other Jeffrey has already had transitional relief.

Councillor James wrote to tell me that because of changes to the standard spending assessment formula the council tax payers of the Vale, not the National Assembly for Wales, would provide money for additional service development. I ask on his behalf if the Minister will consider the Vale's request, even at this late stage, for inclusion in the transitional grant arrangements.

My second point relates to the billing and collection of council tax following the claim at the time of local government reorganisation that unitary authorities will be more accountable in their spending and performance than the previous county and district structure—one council, one council tax bill is what we were told. However, the bottom line on the council tax bill, which is what matters most to council tax payers, is that that is not the case. It is distorted by the fact that the local authority is a billing authority, which means that it not only collects council tax for its own services but for the police authority and community council services. Where the precept has been received from a major precepting authority like the police or a community council, it has a duty to bill and collect on their behalf. This throws the accountability aspect of billing for council tax into disarray.

The present regulations for billing can only be changed by statutes. It is tied up under the Council Tax (Demand Notice) (Wales) Regulations on a prescribed form. It is important to understand that the council tax bill does not just pay for local authority services but for police and community council services. The Minister should consider whether she has the authority to re-examine that regulation to see whether

Cynon Taf. Hoffwn drafod tri mater. Yn gyntaf, mae Bro Morgannwg yn rhan o'r etholaeth a gynrychiolaf yn y Cynulliad hwn. Mae Jeffrey James, Arweinydd Cyngor Bro Morgannwg wedi cysylltu â mi i drafod y posibilrwydd o'r awdurdod yn cael cymorth trosiannol. [AELODAU'R CYNULLIAD: Onid Jeffrey Jones?] Nage, Jeffrey James, nid Jones. Mae'r Jeffrey arall eisoes wedi cael cymorth trosiannol.

Ysgrifennodd y Cynghorydd James i'm hysbysu mai talwyr y dreth gyngor yn y Fro, nid Cynulliad Cenedlaethol Cymru, a fyddai'n darparu arian ar gyfer datblygu gwasanaethau ychwanegol, oherwydd y newidiadau i'r fformwla asesiad gwariant safonol. Gofynnaf, ar ei ran ef a fydd y Gweinidog yn ystyried cais cyngor y Fro, hyd yn oed mor hwyr â hyn, am gael ei gynnwys yn y trefniadau ar gyfer grantiau trosiannol.

Mae fy ail bwynt yn ymwneud â bilio a chasglu'r dreth gyngor yn dilyn yr honiad a wnaethpwyd ar adeg ad-drefnu llywodraeth leol y bydd awdurdodau unedol yn fwy atebol o ran eu gwariant a'u perfformiad na'r hen strwythur sir a dosbarth—un cyngor, un bil treth gyngor a ddywedwyd wrthym. Fodd bynnag, y gwir amdani o ran llinell waelod y dreth gyngor, sef yr hyn sydd o'r pwys mwyaf i dalwyr y dreth gyngor, yw nad yw hynny'n gywir. Ni ellir newid y rheoliadau newydd ar filio ond drwy statudau. Fe'i rheolwyd gan Reoliadau Treth Gyngor (Hysbysiad Tâl) (Cymru) ar ffurflen ddynodedig. Mae'n bwysig deall bod bil y dreth gyngor yn talu nid yn unig am wasanaethau awdurdodau lleol ond am yr heddlu a gwasanaethau cynghorau cymuned. council tax by local government can be separated from those other precepting authorities. The council tax should be properly understood and not be distorted by the spending of others.

Thirdly, the announcement of the settlement, the late announcement of grants affect the budget-setting programme of local authorities throughout Wales. It is not exclusive to one more than the other. The supplementary credit approval on housing will not be announced until the end of February. The general capital announcement was made on 30 January, the transport grants, which used to be announced in mid December were announced on 11 January this year and the performance incentive grant will not be announced until May 2001.

I remind Members that the lead-in time for major capital projects can be considerable and there are staffing level issues associated with progressing them within timescales: you may have to recruit or reduce staffing numbers depending on your capital resources. This can have a major impact on your revenue budget. Can the Minister, therefore, confirm that the local government settlement for 2002-03 will be announced before the summer recess this year and that it will follow proper scrutiny of the draft proposals by the National Assembly? Is that programme and timetable available yet bearing in mind that we have about 13 weeks recess following the July date?

I remind Members who think that the Welsh Local Government Association is autonomous in its dealings with this Assembly that it is a loose association of local government in Wales. It does not mean that every local authority in Wales sacrifices its sovereignty to the WLGA. It is the unitary authorities throughout Wales that do the business and are accountable for local government services. Those authorities will now have to use the budgets announced today to provide the best possible services for local people.

Yn drydydd, mae cyhoeddi'r setliad, cyhoeddi grantiau yn hwyr yn effeithio ar raglen pennu cyllideb awdurdodau lleol ledled Cymru. Nid yw'n berthnasol i'r naill yn fwy na'r llall. Ni chaiff y caniatâd credyd atodol ar gyfer tai ei gyhoeddi tan ddiwedd Chwefror. Gwnaethpwyd y cyhoeddiad cyfalaf cyffredinol ar 30 Ionawr, cyhoeddwyd y grantiau cludo yr arferid eu cyhoeddi ganol Rhagfyr ar 11 Ionawr eleni ac ni chyhoeddir y grant cymhelliad perfformiad tan Fai 2001.

Atgoffaf yr Aelodau fod angen cyfnod rhagbaratoawl hir o bosibl ar brosiectau cyfalaf mawr a bod materion o ran lefelau staffio yn gysylltiedig â datblygu prosiectau o'r fath o fewn amserlen: efallai bod angen recriwtio staff neu leihau nifer y staff gan ddibynnu ar eich adnoddau cyfalaf. Ni olyga fod pob awdurdod lleol yng Nghymru yn ildio ei unbeniaeth i CLILC. Yr awdurdodau unedol ledled Cymru sydd yn cyflawni pethau ac sydd yn atebol dros wasanaethau llywodraeth leol. I take issue with the presumption that all leaders in Wales supported this settlement. That is not the case. Although I will not identify individuals, they cross parties. Many leaders in Wales wanted the Assembly to hand over the settlement that Gordon Brown announced in the comprehensive spending review. This settlement falls somewhat short of that.

Unlike Flintshire County Council, the district auditor's management letter for Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council was extremely complimentary. I resent the claim in an internal Labour newsletter that Labour Ministers and other Labour Assembly Members are plotting to undermine the Plaid Cymru administration in Rhondda Cynon Taff because of its success. One Assembly Member headed a working group entitled 'Taking the Credit'. The movers and shakers of the Labour Party need not think that the Plaid Cymru administration is either for moving or shaking.

In the same internal newsletter, I am told that, unfortunately, Edwina Hart met with Labour opposition councillors from Caerphilly County Borough Council and Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council and at that meeting agreed the date of the next local government elections. I am further told that Lynne Neagle chaired that meeting. Would both Members like the opportunity to deny that claim?

**Huw Lewis:** Point of order. I think that it is under Standing Order No. 7.9. I will not provide an alibi for Lynne Neagle, although I would probably be in the best position to do so. I want to ask whether this Member is speaking as a Member of the National Assembly for Wales or as the leader of Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council? In which chamber are we at the moment?

**The Deputy Presiding Officer:** In this Chamber, Pauline Jarman speaks as a Member of the National Assembly. However, I must call Pauline's comments to an end, as they have already lasted six and a half minutes. You can have 10 seconds to wind up, Pauline.

**David Melding:** I must conclude, sadly, that this is a bad settlement for the Vale of Glamorgan. It is bad for the people of Barry, Cowbridge, Llantwit Major and Penarth, and for all the people of the rural Vale. If the Vale budget was set at the Assembly assumptions, council tax would rise by 8.5 per cent. That is a high increase and, as my colleague Glyn Davies alluded to earlier, it is in addition to earlier increases in years gone by. However, under the new formula, which is prejudicial against the Vale of Glamorgan, there will be a spending gap of nearly £3 million. It is not fair to hit the people of the Vale of Glamorgan with that kind of gap in potential spending. Such a settlement undermines the right of all people in Wales to have public services of a similar standard. Many people have referred to poorer communities—or those that are in some form of social deprivation, as we must now say—and have used them as a stick to beat the more affluent areas.

**Brian Gibbons rose—**

**David Melding:** I will not give way as we are running out of time.

Those deprived communities have a good case for increased central government expenditure. In the past I have raised arguments in Regional Committee meetings on programmes such as Communities First, because they were not designed well enough at the time to meet the needs of deprived communities. Some, for instance, had a limit of only five projects. That has now been changed as a result of a suggestion made by myself and others. It is, therefore, fair for these communities to consider the settlement that they receive. However, why is the bill placed on the taxpayers of the Vale of Glamorgan, when it could be paid by the

country's taxpayers via income tax, which is a much more progressive and accountable form of taxation?

**Kirsty Williams** rose—

**David Melding:** I said that I will not give way. That is clearly how these central objectives should be met. They should not be met through the local taxpayer, which undermines the accountability of local government. The people of the Vale of Glamorgan get poor services in some areas. For instance, road maintenance and road building in the Vale is underdeveloped because of the settlement that we had in 1996. I am no fan of local government reorganisation. Some critical points about that are valid. However, we must deal with the current system. The Vale does not have the required level of expenditure to maintain roads at best standard. A joint report on social services was severe. One of its many points—I am not saying that this was the most important point—was that more resources had to be spent on social services and the Vale was still struggling with a poor settlement after the 1996 reorganisation. Do not come to the Chamber with a convenient assumption that because it is the Vale of Glamorgan it can afford whatever system with which it is left.

To give you an illustration of what would happen if the Vale did spend up to its standard spending assessment, the council tax in the Vale would increase by an average of over 20 per cent. That is only to take us up to the level of service that the people can expect throughout Wales from their local councils. The Vale will not receive any transitional grant. I challenge the Minister to reconsider this because, at the moment, the settlement that the Vale of Glamorgan will get is the worst settlement of any local authority in Wales. It is not good enough. If it stands in its present form it will be another example of Labour failing the Vale of Glamorgan.

**David Lloyd:** Datganaf fuddiant fel aelod o Gyngor Dinas a Sir Abertawe.

**David Melding:** Dywedais na fyddaf yn ildio. Dyna yn union sut y dylid bodloni'r amcanion canolog hyn. Nid y trethdalwr lleol ddylai dalu amdanynt, sydd yn tanseilio atebolwydd llywodraeth leol. Caiff pobl Bro Morgannwg wasanaethau gwael mewn rhai ardaloedd. **David Lloyd:** I declare an interest as a member of Swansea City and County Council.

Mae'r trefniadau ynghylch y cymhorthdal trosiannol yn annigonnol. Cynigiwyd y cymhorthdal i dri chyngor yn unig, er bod gan un arall yr un lefel o amddifaddedd. Mae angen cymhorthdal trosiannol ar nifer o awdurdodau lleol. Mae arweinydd Cyngor Bro Morgannwg wedi bod yn brysur yn gohebu â nifer ohonom, ac mae'n cyflwyno ei achos yn ddigon teg.

Nid yw'r setliad yn bodloni anghenion gwasanaethau craidd, megis addysg. Mae pwysau ar bob awdurdod lleol i gynyddu gwariant ar feysydd megis addysg a gwasanaethau cymdeithasol. **Peter Law:** This is an excellent settlement, as the Minister said today. Eight per cent overall, 5.9 per cent increase in revenue budget, hypothecation abolished, which we never really had when compared with

The transitional grant arrangements are insufficient. The grants were offered to only three councils, although another one has the same level of deprivation. Transitional grants are needed by several local authorities. The leader of the Vale of Glamorgan Council has been busy corresponding with a number of us, and he presents a fair case.

The settlement does not meet the needs of core services, such as education. There is pressure on every local authority to increase expenditure on sectors such as education and social services. The taxpayer will have to shoulder the burden in a number of councils. More local authorities need transitional grants to improve services without placing too great a burden on the taxpayer. We also need to see where this money goes in the education sector.

This Government sets targets for local authorities but does not provide the funding needed to implement those improvements. For example, the waste strategy is one that places expectations on local authorities but no funding has been earmarked to promote recycling within the 2001-02 budget. What is the point of giving five-year targets to councils if they are not funded throughout that five-year period? It is important to talk to local authorities so that the concept of partnership between the Assembly and local government is a real entity and more than empty talk.

**Peter Law:** Anfonais e-bost at y Llywydd awr a hanner yn ôl.

**Peter Law:** Mae hyn yn setliad gwych, fel y dywedodd y Gweinidog heddiw. Wyth y cant yn gyffredinol, cynnydd o 5.9 y cant yn y gyllideb refeniw, diddymu pridiannu, nad oedd gennym mewn gwirionedd o'i gymharu

England. We have these targets and outcomes with policy agreements. That is working in partnership and working with the Welsh Local Government Association. The Tory group would never understand that because partnership was never part of its vocabulary. It was interesting to hear some of Plaid Cymru's comments. It ought to know better. Janet—who is normally astute—knows why a transitional grant is not available in a number of places. It is because we have addressed a great deal of that through the new formula. That is why the increase is minus 9 per cent in Ynys Môn. No-one has mentioned that. That is the result of this new formula. Remember that, because some of us, in places such as Blaenau Gwent are still carrying the large burdens.

The Tories should know better. William Graham may adopt his Pontius Pilot approach, but Kirsty Williams is correct. The Tories are representatives of all the people in South Wales East, or South Wales West, or wherever their regional constituencies are. They are supposed to represent deprived areas also. They do not understand that because they have a rag-bag group made up mostly of people elected through a list system who do not understand from where they come, what they are going to do or what they are supposed to do. They voted against the damping scheme last year. Do not forget that. We do not forget because Blaenau Gwent, like Merthyr and Rhondda Cynon Taff had big council tax burdens as a result. You are supposed to represent us. William Graham should hang his head in shame. Somewhere along the line, he is supposed to represent Blaenau Gwent, but he does not recognise that. He is guilty of having no compassion or understanding and he has given no help and is generally of no use to Blaenau Gwent. That is how Blaenau Gwent views the Conservatives. When you hear about Blaenau Gwent, remember this about high-spending councils. Blaenau Gwent County Borough Council runs its own cinema because if it did not run it, there would not be one. That is how bad it is. It runs a training centre that serves the whole of the heads of the Valleys from Swansea to Abergavenny. Yes, David Davies, Blaenau Gwent runs the one remaining training centre. It also runs the

Mae'n euog o fod yn ddidrugaredd ac am beidio â deall ac ni roddodd unrhyw gymorth ac nid yw o ddefnydd i Flaenau Gwent yn gyffredinol. Dyna yw barn Blaenau Gwent am y Ceidwadwyr. Pan glywch am Flaenau Gwent, cofiwch hyn am y cynghorau sydd â gwariant uchel. Mae Cyngor Bwrdeistref Sirol Blaenau Gwent yn rhedeg ei sinema ei hun oherwydd pe na byddai'n ei rhedeg, ni fyddai sinema'n bodoli. Dyna yw difrifoldeb y sefyllfa. Bryn Bach Country Park. It now does that on its own because unfortunately, the Plaid Cymru controlled Caerphilly County Borough Council pulled out of running the park. That is why Blaenau Gwent has difficulties.

This formula is not ideal. [ASSEMBLY MEMBERS: 'Oh.'] It is not ideal for us because we face a 9 per cent increase in council tax because we have problems. The Tories re-organised local government. Remember that also. However, the Minister is addressing the formula because there are difficulties as far as the standard spending assessment per capita is concerned. She has said today that she will address that. That is what I meant when I said that the formula is not ideal for us in Blaenau Gwent. However, we will not whinge, because we know that this formula is in the interest of council tax payers and for Wales as a whole. I support it fully. It has the approval of the Welsh Local Government Association, which includes Monmouthshire County Council and its leader, David. I am positive that the Minister's work has gone a long way to making council tax levels much lower in the future and has secured the end of the transitional grant. I am grateful for the transitional arrangement that she has proposed for Blaenau Gwent, which helps poor people. I feel like an orderly on a battleground today after the weekend's experiences and dealing with this also. You will understand the problems in Blaenau Gwent.

**The Minister for Finance, Local Government and Communities (Edwina Hart):** First, I will deal with the general points that have been made. I am aware of the Vale of Glamorgan Council issue. I accepted a petition from its leader with many signatures on it, indicating its concern. I am considering the position regarding the transitional grant, which is to help eligible authorities limit their council tax increases. Unfortunately, that does not apply to the Vale of Glamorgan Council. The Welsh Local Government Association asked me to provide additional resources to moderate some of the

impact and I have tried to do that. They are genuine additional resources and have not been top-sliced from elsewhere.

Points were made about changes to the provisional settlement. The main changes arose from the re-calculations of the amount to transfer to the settlement in respect of the responsibility for adult education, which is £8 million less, and the additional amounts to support reductions in pressure on people to sell their homes to pay for care services and to support an early retirement scheme for all teachers, which is £2 million and £3 million respectively. I note your comments regarding early retirement schemes, Janet, but that was based on the information that we received during the consultation process. Pressure was brought to bear for us to take action on that issue.

I will consider the timetable issues that Pauline raised. I will do that with the Welsh Local Government Association during 2002-03. Local government is aware that specific grants are subject to separate legislative administrative arrangements in the general revenue settlement. There has always been a difference in timetables, but I am considering how we can deal with that in a more regulated approach.

Hypothecation has also been raised today. There will not be hypothecation. The emphasis must be on outcomes and not on financial inputs. That is what the policy agreement is about. I am not blind to people's aspirations and expectations. However, in terms of the general settlement, there will be no hypothecation. I have made it clear, as my Cabinet colleagues are aware, that this is the administration's line. It is important that we recognise that this is the way forward. The grant's terms are 2 per cent of £3.5 billion, which is a small amount in terms of specific grant and what we must do. Some of the amounts in the settlement are for new duties and new initiatives. They are not earmarked or ring-fenced. The Welsh Local Government Association asked for transparency, which it has received. If councils wish to have greater decision-making flexibility, they must accept that it means taking difficult decisions about

Gofynnodd Cymdeithas Llywodraeth Leol Cymru am eglurder, a chafodd hynny. Os dymuna'r cynghorau gael mwy o hyblygrwydd i wneud penderfyniadau, rhaid iddynt dderbyn bod

spending priorities, because they are accountable to the people whom they serve. We recognise that how local government spends its money is a matter for local government.

I apologise, Janet, because it has never been my intention, to inform the press before the Assembly and I have never done so. I have, during this Plenary, made the necessary inquiries as to why this happened, and have been told that it was because the system was down in this building. I can only apologise and assure Members that my department will ensure that it will not happen again. It is not in my nature to inform the press before Assembly Members, and I think that you will find that that has never happened before. That is a matter of concern.

When you mentioned whether I should increase the settlement or should do something else, Janet, it reflected a spend spend mentality with which I cannot live. At the end of the day, I must ensure a balanced budget and provide a good settlement to local government, which is balanced against the needs of health and education and all of our other economic priorities that have become apparent since the recent announcements of job losses at Corus and other companies.

I do not accept your point, William, about inefficient local authorities. I think that Peter answered the point well. Some local authority areas are very poor. Their geography and the nature of the service that they must provide causes difficulty; they are not inefficient. We should consider ourselves lucky that not all local authority areas face the same difficulties.

I was pleased to hear the announcement about Bridgend, Janice, and it is important that we consider the positive responses. I was surprised to see the positive nature of the e-mail from the WLGA indicating its pleasure at this announcement. I am relieved that it has understood that we are trying to do our best by local government, in partnership.

Fe'm synnwyd gan natur gadarnhaol yr e-bost gan Gymdeithas Llywodraeth Leol Cymru yn nodi eu boddhad â'r cyhoeddiad hwn. Yr wyf yn falch ei fod wedi deall ein bod yn ceisio gwneud ein gorau dros lywodraeth leol, mewn

partneriaeth.

I am sorry that you would prefer William Hague, as you seemed to indicate in your contribution, to be Secretary of State for Wales rather than your leader, David. However, I thought that you were a party loyalist in that respect. It would have been nice if you had thanked me for the transitional grant that Monmouthshire has received. As to the rest of your points, David, I will move swiftly on to more serious issues, such as those raised by Pauline Jarman about billing and collection. That is a statutory issue, and I appreciate your points about transparency, to help people understand the role of their local authority. That is something that I will consider.

We must recognise that this settlement is about giving local government the tools with which they can work. It is not for me to tell local government what to do and what to deliver. I have offered a partnership agreement and it is important that it has an opportunity to flow through. This is year one of the settlement. We must look at what will happen in years two and three, for which there is also a good settlement. We will see an averaging out in terms of council tax, and it is important that we also recognise that this is an entire financial package, not only for one year. I am concerned, like everyone else, about council tax increases. I can only repeat the word ‘average’, which has been used frequently in this context. I have provided sufficient funds to allow local authorities to ensure growth in services and to keep their council tax within certain parameters. However, I will have no hesitation in using my powers if I see any authority stepping out of line. I commend the motion to the Assembly.
