**Cwestiynau ar Gymunedau i'r Gweinidog dros Gyllid, Llywodraeth Leol a Chymunedau
Questions on Communities to the Minister for Finance, Local Government and Communities**

**Diogelu Hawliau Tenantiaid
Protecting Tenants' Rights**

Q1 Janet Davies: What is being done to protect the rights of tenants in the private rented sector? (OAQ10146)

The Minister for Finance, Local Government and Communities (Edwina Hart): The Assembly is committed to introducing a national mandatory licensing scheme for houses in multiple occupation, which will improve the condition and safety of homes for tenants. We are also considering the most suitable arrangements for discretionary licensing of other privately rented homes. As soon as primary legislation is available in the private sector, tenants who have a regulated tenancy and have had a fair rent registered on the property by the rent officer will have future rent increases capped at the level calculated under the Rent Acts (Maximum Fair Rent) Order 1999. The Assembly is also currently considering a proposal from the Cardiff Bond Board to grant fund the development of a custodial bond scheme whereby landlords and tenants agree to lodge a deposit independently with the board prior to finding accommodation.

Janet Davies: How long will it be before the bond scheme is available throughout Wales? This is an important scheme that enables young people to move into their own accommodation for the first time.

Edwina Hart: The aim of the bond board scheme is to speed up the letting process by enabling prospective tenants to lodge an amount for bond prior to finding accommodation. In light of your supplementary question, I will make further inquiries about the implementation of these schemes across Wales.

C1 Janet Davies: Beth sydd yn cael ei wneud i ddiofalu hawliau tenantiaid yn y sector rhentu preifat? (OAQ10146)

Y Gweinidog dros Gyllid, Llywodraeth Leol a Chymunedau (Edwina Hart): Mae'r Cynulliad yn ymrwymedig i gyflwyno cynllun trwyddedu gorfodol cenedlaethol ar gyfer tai amlbreswyliaeth, a fydd yn gwella amodau a diogelwch cartrefi ar gyfer tenantiaid. Ystyriwn hefyd y trefniadau mwyaf addas i drwyddedu cartrefi eraill yn y sector rhentu preifat yn ddewisol. Cyn gynted ag y bydd deddfwriaeth sylfaenol ar gael yn y sector preifat, caiff codiadau rhent eu capio ar lefel a gyfrifir o dan Orchymyn Deddfau Rhenti (Uchafswm Rhent Teg) 1999 ar gyfer tenantiaid sydd â thenantiaeth a reoleiddir ac y cofrestrwyd rhent teg ar yr eiddo gan y swyddog rhenti. Ystyria'r Cynulliad hefyd gynnig gan Fwrdd Bond Caerdydd i roi grant i ariannu'r gwaith o ddatblygu cynllun gwarchod bondiau lle y cytuna landlordiaid a thenantiaid i roi blaendal yn annibynnol yng ngofal y bwrdd cyn dod o hyd i lety.

Janet Davies: Faint o amser a gymera nes bod y cynllun bondiau ar gael ledled Cymru? Mae hwn yn gynllun pwysig sydd yn galluogi pobl ifanc i symud i mewn i'w llety eu hunain am y tro cyntaf.

Edwina Hart: Nod y cynllun bwrdd bondiau yw cyflymu'r broses osod drwy alluogi darpar denantiaid i roi arian am fond yn ei ofal cyn dod o hyd i lety. Yng ngoleuni eich cwestiwn atodol, ymchwiliad ymhellach i'r ffordd o weithredu'r cynlluniau hyn ledled Cymru.

Peter Black: Given the current UK Labour Government's commitment to introduce the private licensing scheme, which has not yet been met, have you had discussions with UK Ministers on how soon that scheme can be introduced?

Edwina Hart: That is a priority for me because it is essential that this scheme be up and running. I have regular meetings with UK Ministers on many subjects, but I emphasise the need to prioritise communications with them on this subject, as I will at my next meeting with them.

David Melding: The safety of central heating equipment continues to be a major concern for people in all accommodation, but particularly in the private rented sector and for those who live in houses of multiple occupation. Will you ensure that local authorities fulfil their responsibilities to inspect the safety of such equipment?

Edwina Hart: There have been so many tragic cases resulting from unsafe heating, particularly in the private rented sector and in houses of multiple occupation, that this matter is close to our hearts. In my regular meetings with the Welsh Local Government Association, I will state that we must ensure that safety checks are completed properly.

Alun Pugh: The activities of a small number of slum landlords cause huge difficulties in areas like Colwyn Bay and Pensarn. Conwy County Borough Council has prepared a special registration scheme for your approval. Will that approval be forthcoming because it is a much-needed scheme on the north Wales coast?

Edwina Hart: I consider every scheme on the basis of its merits, and in principle, I would like to accommodate anything from a local authority on this matter.

Gwasanaeth Hawliau Lles (Awdurdodau Lleol) Welfare Rights Service (Local Authorities)

Q2 Helen Mary Jones: How can the Minister ensure that all local authorities in Wales provide an effective welfare rights service? (OAQ10168)

Peter Black: O ystyried ymrwymiad Llywodraeth Lafur bresennol y DU i gyflwyno'r cynllun trwyddedu preifat, na chafodd ei fodloni eto, a drafodasoch gyda Gweinidogion y DU pa mor fuan y gellir cyflwyno'r cynllun hwnnw?

Edwina Hart: Dyna un o'm blaenoriaethau gan ei bod yn hanfodol sefydlu'r cynllun hwn. Caf gyfarfodydd rheolaidd gyda Gweinidogion y DU i drafod llawer o bynciau, ond pwysleisiaf yr angen i flaenoriaethu cysylltu â hwy ar y pwnc hwn, fel y gwnaf yn fy nghyfarfod nesaf â hwy.

David Melding: Parha diogelwch offer gwres canolog i fod yn bryder mawr i bobl ym mhob math o lety, ond yn enwedig yn y sector rhentu preifat a'r rheini sydd yn byw mewn tai amlbreswyliaeth. A sicrhewch fod awdurdodau lleol yn cyflawni eu cyfrifoldebau i arolygu diogelwch offer o'r fath?

Edwina Hart: Bu cymaint o achosion trist o ganlyniad i wresogi peryglus, yn enwedig yn y sector rhentu preifat ac mewn tai amlbreswyliaeth, fel y bo'r mater hwn yn agos at ein calonnau. Yn fy nghyfarfodydd rheolaidd â Chymdeithas Llywodraeth Leol Cymru, dyweddaf fod yn rhaid inni sicrhau y cwblheir archwiliadau diogelwch yn briodol.

Alun Pugh: Achosa gweithgareddau nifer fach o landlodiaid slymiau anawsterau enfawr mewn ardaloedd fel Bae Colwyn a Phensarn. Paratôdd Cyngor Bwrdeistref Sirol Conwy gynllun cofrestru arbennig ichi ei gymeradwyo. A gymeradwywch y cynllun gan fod angen dybryd amdano ar arfordir gogledd Cymru?

Edwina Hart: Ystyriaf bob cynllun yn ôl ei rinweddau, ac, mewn egwyddor, hoffwn ystyried unrhyw gynllun gan awdurdod lleol ar y mater hwn.

C2 Helen Mary Jones: Sut all y Gweinidog sicrhau fod pob awdurdod lleol yng Nghymru yn darparu gwasanaeth hawliau lles effeithiol? (OAQ10168)

Edwina Hart: The provision of services to its residents is a matter for individual local authorities. However, I would expect them to have an increasing awareness of the need to provide a welfare rights service. The Assembly is currently in the second year of funding a Welfare Rights and Money Advice Officer in Wrexham County Borough Council. The project is managed by the local authority, within the Social Services Department, and is delivered in the Southsea and Brynteg community, which is a needy community in that area. Weekly sessions are held at the housing office, which involve mentoring people in poverty to understand debt implications and so on. I have been impressed by the development of this project and am considering what lessons can be learnt to see how it could be expanded.

Helen Mary Jones: Do you agree that effective welfare rights services can have great economic and social benefits in our poorest communities? Do you share my concern that coverage across Wales is currently patchy? Learning lessons from the project that you described, would you consider the idea of the Assembly sponsoring a national welfare rights uptake project for Wales, in partnership with the voluntary sector?

Edwina Hart: I agree with you that tackling unclaimed benefits is imperative and any measures to deal with that are welcome. Welfare rights advice can have a major effect on an area's economy. People's additional spending power in local shops and in using public transport is beneficial. Jane Hutt and I are considering innovative solutions in welfare rights, which we hope to announce in the next few weeks.

William Graham: Do you agree that one way of ensuring that all the local authorities in Wales provide effective welfare services is by ring-fencing money to go to schools and hospitals as directly as possible?

Edwina Hart: No. I do not agree with hypothecation. There will be no hypothecation on the local government

Edwina Hart: Mater i awdurdodau lleol unigol yw darparu gwasanaethau ar gyfer ei drigolion. Fodd bynnag, disgwyliwn i'w hymwybyddiaeth o'r angen i ddarparu gwasanaeth hawliau lles gynyddu. Mae'r Cynulliad ar hyn o bryd yn yr ail flwyddyn o ariannu Swyddog Cyngori Hawliau Lles ac Arian yng Nghyngor Bwrdeistref Sirol Wrecsam. Rheolir y prosiect gan yr awdurdod lleol, o fewn yr Adran Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol, ac fe'i cyflwynir yng nghymuned Southsea a Brynteg, sef cymuned anghennus yn yr ardal honno. Cynhelir sesiynau wythnosol yn y swyddfa dai, sydd yn cynnwys mentora pobl sydd yn byw mewn tlodi i ddeall goblygiadau dyled ac ati. Creodd y gwaith o ddatblygu'r prosiect hwn argraff arnaf ac ystyriaf pa wersi y gellir eu dysgu i weld ym mha ffordd y gellid ei ehangu.

Helen Mary Jones: A gytunwch y gall gwasanaethau hawliau lles effeithiol gael manteision economaidd a chymdeithasol sylweddol ar gyfer ein cymunedau tlataf? A rennwch fy mhryder bod y ddarpariaeth ledled Cymru yn anghyson ar hyn o bryd? Gan ddysgu gwarsi o'r prosiect a ddisgrifiasoch, a ystyriech y syniad bod y Cynulliad yn noddi prosiect derbyn hawliau lles cenedlaethol i Gymru, mewn partneriaeth â'r sector gwirfoddol?

Edwina Hart: Cytunaf â chi fod yn rhaid mynd i'r afael â budd-daliadau nas hawliwyd a chroesawir unrhyw fesurau i ddelio â hwy. Gall cyngor hawliau lles gael effaith sylweddol ar economi ardal. Mae pŵer gwario ychwanegol pobl mewn siopau lleol ac wrth ddefnyddio trafnidiaeth gyhoeddus yn fuddiol. Mae Jane Hutt a minnau yn ystyried atebion arloesol o ran hawliau lles, y gobeithiwn eu cyhoeddi yn yr ychydig wythnosau nesaf.

William Graham: A gytunwch mai un ffordd o sicrhau bod pob awdurdod lleol yng Nghymru yn darparu gwasanaethau lles effeithiol yw drwy neilltuo arian i fynd i i ysgolion ac ysbytai mor uniongyrchol â phosibl?

Edwina Hart: Nac ydwyt. Ni chytunaf ag adneuo. Nid adneuir ar y setliad llywodraeth leol am mai ymwneud â gwneud

Anghenion Menywod (Polisiau Cynghorau Lleol) Women's Needs (Local Councils' Policies)

Q3 Glyn Davies: How will the Minister ensure that local councils' policies fully reflect the needs of women? (OAQ10184)

C3 Glyn Davies: Sut bydd y Gweinidog yn sierhau fod polisiau'r cynghorau lleol yn llwyr adlewyrchu anghenion menywod? (OAQ10184)

Edwina Hart: What an excellent question. The Welsh Local Government Association has been working with Syniad, the statutory equality bodies—including the Equal Opportunities Commission—and the Assembly to develop a generic equality standard for adoption by all Welsh local authorities. That will give local authorities a benchmark for good equal opportunities practice in all aspects of their work, not only in gender issues. I will consider what support the Assembly might offer to allow the creation of a local government equalities unit to help authorities reach and maintain this standard.

Edwina Hart: Dyna gwestiwn ardderchog. Bu Cymdeithas Llywodraeth Leol Cymru yn cydweithio â Syniad, y cyrff cydraddoldeb statudol—gan gynnwys y Comisiwn Cyfle Cyfartal—a'r Cynulliad i ddatblygu safon cydraddoldeb gyffredinol y gall pob awdurdod lleol yng Nghymru ei mabwysiadu. Rhydd hynny feincnod i awdurdodau lleol ar gyfer arfer cyfle cyfartal da ym mhob agwedd ar eu gwaith, nid yn unig o ran materion rhyw. Ystyriaf pa gymorth y gallai'r Cynulliad ei gynnig er mwyn creu uned cydraddoldeb llywodraeth leol i helpu awdurdodau i gyrraedd y safon hon a'i chynnal.

Glyn Davies: Thank you for your commitment on this issue. However, in your discussions with local government, will you emphasise the need to encourage more women to participate in sport? Today, on International Women's Day, will you join me in registering our dissatisfaction that participation by women in sport still lags some 12 per cent behind that of men?

Glyn Davies: Diolch am eich ymrwymid ar y mater hwn. Fodd bynnag, yn eich trafodaethau â llywodraeth leol, a bwysleisiwch yr angen i annog mwy o ferched i gymryd rhan mewn chwaraeon? Heddiw, ar Ddiwrnod Rhwngwladol y Merched, a ymunwch â mi i gofnodi ein hanfodlonrwydd bod cyfranogiad merched mewn chwaraeon tua 12 y cant yn llai na chyfranogiad dynion o hyd?

Edwina Hart: I am sure that my colleague, Jenny Randerson, who has responsibility for sport, agrees with you about the need to encourage active participation by women in sport, and also for sporting bodies in Wales to recognise the importance of women in sport. I had the opportunity to meet a representative of the women's Welsh Rugby Union to discuss their difficulties in being represented in that area. I hope that the sporting bodies will also recognise the importance of sport.

Edwina Hart: Yr wyf yn siŵr y cytuna fy nghyd-Aelod, Jenny Randerson, sydd â chyfrifoldeb dros chwaraeon, â chi am yr angen i annog merched i gymryd rhan frwd mewn chwaraeon, a hefyd yr angen i gyrrff chwaraeon yng Nghymru gydnabod pwysigrwydd merched mewn chwaraeon. Cefais gyfle i gwrdd â chynrychiolydd o Undeb Rygbi merched Cymru i drafod eu hanawsterau i gael eu cynrychioli yn y maes hwnnw. Gobeithiaf y bydd y cyrff chwaraeon hefyd yn cydnabod pwysigrwydd chwaraeon.

Rosemary Butler: I thank Glyn for raising this question, particularly on International Women's Day. I am sure that you agree, Edwina, that Communities First policies will help make life for women in Wales much better than it is at present. However, we should think of women throughout the world today, who live in non-democratic countries, where they suffer continual physical and mental abuse, and where drugs are not available for mothers to help save their babies' lives. I hope that everyone here will take five minutes to think about what is happening in the rest of the world. I would be delighted if your Communities First programme eradicated child poverty in Wales in the next generation.

Edwina Hart: There is a series of events to mark International Women's Day in this country and to celebrate the role of women. We worry about women and children who live in poverty. I know that you are hosting an event today, Rosemary, for a few hundred women on this issue. It is incumbent on us all to remember that, while we live in a thriving democracy, many women are suffering across the world. A situation almost exists where girls are murdered at birth because they are not required for economic reasons. When you consider the legacy across the globe, we have much to be thankful for in Wales.

Elin Jones: A gredwch fod angen canllawiau clir ar gynghorau i geisio denu menywod i gynnig eu henwau i'w hethol fel cynghorwyr, er mwyn osgoi sefyllfa fel un Cyngor Sir Ceredigion, lle mai pedair yn unig o'r 44 cynghorydd sydd yn fenywod, a lle mae'r grŵp annibynnol yn gwrrthod sefydlu meithrinfa na chynnal cyfarfodydd ar adegau cyfleus? Byddai hynny'n gyfraniad cadarnhaol i ddenu mwy o fenywod i gymryd rhan yn y broses ddemocrataidd.

Edwina Hart: I do not wish to comment on individual local authorities or the democratic processes that allow for a certain electoral balance in councils. However, by considering the generic equality standard, which considers comprehensive equality policies,

Rosemary Butler: Diolchaf i Glyn am godi'r cwestiwn hwn, yn enwedig ar Ddiwrnod Rhyngwladol y Merched. Yr wyf yn siŵr y cytunwch, Edwina, y bydd polisiau Rhoi Cymunedau'n Gyntaf yn helpu i wneud bywyd i ferched yng Nghymru yn llawer gwell nag y mae ar hyn o bryd. Fodd bynnag, dylem feddwl am ferched ledled y byd heddiw, sydd yn byw mewn gwledydd annemocraidd, lle y cānt eu cam-drin yn gorfforol ac yn feddyliol yn barhaus, a lle nad oes cyffuriau ar gael i famau eu defnyddio i helpu i achub bywydau eu babanod. Gobeithiaf y gwnaiff pawb sydd yma feddwl am ychydig funudau am yr hyn sydd yn digwydd yng ngweddill y byd. Byddwn wrth fy modd pe bai eich rhaglen Rhoi Cymunedau'n Gyntaf yn dileu tlodi plant yng Nghymru yn y genhedlaeth nesaf.

Edwina Hart: Cynhelir cyfres o ddigwyddiadau i nodi Diwrnod Rhyngwladol y Merched yn y wlad hon ac i ddathlu rôl merched. Pryderwn am ferched a phlant sydd yn byw mewn tlodi. Gwn eich bod yn cynnal digwyddiad heddiw, Rosemary, ar gyfer rhai cannoedd o ferched ar y mater hwn. Mae'n ddyletswydd ar bob un ohonom gofio, tra ein bod yn byw mewn democratiaeth ffyniannus, bod llawer o ferched yn dioddef ledled y byd. Ceir y sefyllfa bron lle caiff merched eu llofruddio ar eu genedigaeth gan nad oes eu hangen am resymau economaidd. Pan ystyriwch y sefyllfa fydd-eang, mae llawer gennym i fod yn ddiolchgar amdano yng Nghymru.

Elin Jones: Do you believe that councils need clear guidelines to try to attract women to put their names forward for election as councillors, in order to avoid a situation such as that of Ceredigion County Council, where only four of the 44 councillors are women, where the independent group refuses to establish a crèche and hold meetings at convenient times? This would have been a positive contribution to attract more women to take part in the democratic process.

Edwina Hart: Nid wyf am roi unrhyw sylwadau ar awdurdodau lleol unigol na'r prosesau democraidd sydd yn caniatáu rhywfaint o gydbwysedd etholiadol mewn cynghorau. Fodd bynnag, drwy ystyried y safon cydraddoldeb cyffredinol, sydd yn

setting objectives and targets, monitoring systems, measuring progress to targets, and achieving a review in outcomes, we will see a difference. Your point about the representation of women in local government is well made. It is a matter of concern for political parties, and for the people of Wales, that local government needs to be more representative of Wales's population. That is why it is essential in my review of councils' allowances, when I consider the wider issues of remunerating individuals and, perhaps, employers, that basic equality measures click in and, on that basis, perhaps a new allowance system will also click in.

Y Dreth Gyngor Council Tax

Q7 Jonathan Morgan: Would the Minister make a statement on the expected level of council tax across Wales? (OAQ10109)

C7 Jonathan Morgan: A wnaiff y Gweinidog ddatganiad ar lefel ddisgwylledig treth y cyngor ledled Cymru? (OAQ10109)

Edwina Hart: Council tax increases are primarily a matter for local authorities, who have until the end of this week to set their budgets. They will do so on the basis of a revenue settlement, which is acknowledged to be the best for many years.

Edwina Hart: Mae codiadau'r dreth gyngor yn fater i awdurdodau lleol yn bennaf, ac mae ganddynt tan ddiwedd yr wythnos hon i bennu eu cyllidebau. Gwnânt hyn ar sail setliad refeniw, a chydubyddir mai hwn yw'r un gorau ers blynnyddoedd lawer.

Jonathan Morgan: Your party claims to be a party of public services. However, when you consider the state of local authorities across Wales—many of whom have increased their council tax quite significantly, yet are not providing adequate, or even improved levels of local services—how can you claim to be a party of local public services when so many of your local authorities are letting you down?

Jonathan Morgan: Mae'ch plaid yn honni bod yn blaidd gwasanaethau cyhoeddus. Fodd bynnag, pan ystyriwch gyflwr awdurdodau lleol ledled Cymru—gyda llawer ohonynt wedi codi eu treth gyngor yn eithaf sylweddol, ond eto'n methu â darparu lefelau gwasanaethau lleol digonol neu hyd yn oed yn well—sut y gallwch honni bod yn blaidd gwasanaethau cyhoeddus lleol pan fo cymaint o'ch awdurdodau lleol yn eich siomi?

Edwina Hart: I refer to them as our local authorities, because we all live in areas that are represented by local government. How local government looks at its services is a matter of prioritisation for local government. It is only because of this year's generous settlement that it is able to look properly at

Edwina Hart: Cyfeiriaf atynt fel ein hawdurdodau lleol, gan fod pob un ohonom yn byw mewn ardaloedd a gynrychiolir gan llywodraeth leol. Mae'r ffordd yr edrycha llywodraeth leol ar ei gwasanaethau yn fater o flaenoriaethu ar gyfer llywodraeth leol. Dim ond oherwydd setliad hael eleni y gall

services. The hash that your party made of local government reorganisation, because it was not adequately funded, caused the difficulties that local authorities now face. Only with this new settlement, and with the settlement in years two and three, will they be fully able to develop their potential and get back to where they were. Therefore, that question has a hint of hypocrisy.

Brian Hancock: About a year ago in this Chamber, and before the Labour/Liberal Democrat pact, Michael German accused some councils of being greedy and self-serving. Do you agree that Caerphilly County Borough Council in my constituency, is not one of those? Will you also join me in congratulating that council for a council tax rise of only 2.9 per cent, Gwynedd Council for a rise of 2.8 per cent and Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council for a rise of 4.8 per cent, which were decisions unanimously made by those councils?

Edwina Hart: Perhaps what you should do is congratulate the Labour/Liberal Democrat administration for introducing the new formula, with the agreement of the Welsh Local Government Association, which allowed Plaid Cymru to make capital in local government by having the lowest council tax rises. I am grateful to accept that praise.

A gytunwch nad yw Cyngor Bwrdeistref Sirol Caerffili yn fy etholaeth i yn un ohonynt? Diwygio Llywodraeth Leol yng Nghymru Local Government Reform in Wales

Q8 David Melding: Would the Minister make a statement on the reform of local government in Wales? (OAQ10161)

Edwina Hart: Since April 2000, all local authorities have been under the duty of Best Value, which is an integral process of local government reform. The policy agreements are aimed at reforming the relationship between local government and the National Assembly. Draught guidance has been issued on community strategies, which are a key feature of local governments' community leadership role. Consultation on new political structures is nearly complete and I am consulting on a new ethical framework.

C8 David Melding: A wnaiff y Gweinidog ddatganiad ar y broses o ddiwygio llywodraeth leol yng Nghymru? (OAQ10161)

Edwina Hart: Ers Ebrill 2000, bu pob awdurdod lleol o dan ddyletswydd Gwerth Gorau, sydd yn broses annatod o waith diwygio llywodraeth leol. Nod y cytundebau polisi yw diwygio'r berthynas rhwng llywodraeth leol a'r Cynulliad Cenedlaethol. Cyhoeddwyd arweiniad drafft ar strategaethau cymunedol, sydd yn nodwedd allweddol o rôl arweinyddiaeth gymunedol llywodraeth leol. Mae'r gwaith ymgynghori ar strwythurau gwleidyddol newydd bron wedi'i offfen ac ymgynghoraf ar fframwaith

Legislation in these last two areas will be brought before the Assembly so that all essential Orders will come into effect by 28 July.

Local government reform, in terms of the number of local authorities, is not on the agenda.

David Melding: Given that most secondary legislation relating to the Local Government Act 2000 has been published, are you still committed to requiring councils to follow the example of this Assembly and have the Chairs of scrutiny committees allocated on a party balance?

Edwina Hart: It is essential that we consider this issue. You could say that people feel secure when there is a majority group, but want opposition parties to be in charge of the scrutiny committees. I will consider this matter during the consultation and the discussions I am holding. It is important that the public's perception on this is clear. When we talk about ethical standards, we want people to see what is going on.

Q9 Peter Black: What can local councils do already to combat the impact of second homes on rural communities? (OAQ10122) [R]

C9 Peter Black: Beth all cyngorau lleol ei wneud i frwydro yn erbyn effaith ail gartrefi ar gymunedau gwledig? (OAQ10122) [R]

Edwina Hart: Second homes are an enormous issue. Some local authorities have been able to commission registered social landlords to provide affordable rented housing in rural areas and to help people buy property using our home equity purchase scheme. To make the scheme more accessible, I have increased the maximum equity loan in rural areas from 30 to 50 per cent and have made an additional £1.5 million available for 2001-02. I am also consulting authorities and registered social landlords on the obstacles that block the provision of more affordable rented housing in rural areas. I am also considering planning applications for new developments. Authorities can set targets for sites and

Edwina Hart: Mae mater ail gartrefi yn un enfawr. Do you agree that they only wish to draw attention to language, which may be in a racist context, for purposes of internal party democracy?

Edwina Hart: I understand how you have drawn those conclusions about certain areas in Wales. However, the issue has been taken out of context. Local authorities have powers and they should use them. I also need to know what the Assembly's powers are. I have discussed with my officials and others what further work I can undertake in this area. Language is relevant to communities and what happens to them. We must recognise that in that context.

Cynlluniau Datblygu Unedol a Chynllunio Trefol Unitary Development Plans and Urban Planning

Q1 Jonathan Morgan: Will the Minister for Environment make a statement on local government unitary development plans and the Assembly's role in urban planning? (OAQ10127)

The Minister for Environment (Sue Essex): All local planning authorities are required to produce a unitary development plan for their areas. The Assembly is committed to the statutory-plan-led system of development. The planning guidance document 'Unitary Development Plans Wales' stresses the need for unitary development plans to be prepared as soon as possible.

Consultation is currently underway on planning policies for urban development in the draft 'Planning Policy Wales'. That document was put out to consultation last week. Those policies are intended to form a framework to support sustainable change in our towns and cities. We recognise the strengths of urban communities and the advantages that urban living can offer. We want to encourage social, economic and environmental regeneration to make them attractive places in which to live.

Jonathan Morgan: The Minister will be aware that Cardiff City and County Council's draft plan contains the proposal to build 4,000 new houses between Pontprennau and Lisvane in Cardiff North. These plans propose building housing on greenfield sites. That flies in the face of the policy proposals that we have pursued here of encouraging the use of brownfield sites. Will the Minister raise this with Cardiff council, as this is an

Cynlluniau Datblygu Unedol a Chynllunio Trefol Unitary Development Plans and Urban Planning

C1 Jonathan Morgan: A wnaiff y Gweinidog dros yr Amgylchedd ddatganiad ar gynlluniau datblygu unedol llywodraeth leol a rôl y Cynulliad mewn cynllunio trefol? (OAQ10127)

Y Gweinidog dros yr Amgylchedd (Sue Essex): Mae'n ddyletswydd ar bob awdurdod cynllunio lleol gynhyrchu cynllun datblygu unedol ar gyfer eu hardaloedd. Mae'r Cynulliad yn ymrwymedig i'r system datblygu a arweinir gan gynllun statudol. Mae'r ddogfen ganllaw cynllunio 'Cynlluniau Datblygu Unedol Cymru' yn pwysleisio'r angen i baratoi cynlluniau datblygu unedol cyn gynted â phosibl.

Mae ymgynghoriad ar waith ar hyn o bryd ar gynllunio polisiau ar gyfer datblygu trefol yn y ddogfen ddrafft 'Polisi Cynllunio Cymru'. Ymgynghorwyd ar y ddogfen honno yr wythnos diwethaf. Bwriedir i'r polisiau hynny ffurfio fframwaith i gynorthwyo newid cynaliadwy yn ein trefi a dinasoedd. Cydnabyddwn gryfderau cymunedau trefol a'r manteision y gall bywyd trefol ei gynnig. Yr ydym am annog adfywiad cymdeithasol, economaidd ac amgylcheddol i'w gwneud yn lleoedd deniadol i fyw ynddynt.

Jonathan Morgan: Bydd y Gweinidog yn ymwybodol bod cynllun drafat Cyngor Dinas a Sir Caerdydd yn cynnwys y cynnig i godi 4,000 o dai newydd rhwng Pontprennau a Llys-faen yng Ngogledd Caerdydd. Mae'r cynlluniau hyn yn cynnig adeiladu tai ar dir glas. Mae hynny'n gwrth-ddweud y cynigion polisi rydym wedi mynd ar eu trywydd yma o annog defnyddio tir llwyd. A fydd y Gweinidog yn codi'r mater hwn gyda

urgent matter, and convey our wish to see its draft plan altered?

Sue Essex: Cardiff North, of course, is my constituency, but I will try to answer that question in the light of my ministerial responsibilities.

The planning guidance—both the original and the draft—emphasises the sequential use of brownfield land. If you consider the development of Cardiff, and the development taking place around this Assembly building, you will see that a considerable amount of housing is being built on brownfield land. Residential properties are being built along Lloyd George Avenue, for example. We have been fortunate in Cardiff in that we have been able to use brownfield sites.

Also—I think for the first time—we are seeing new housing being built in the city centre, with major apartment blocks being constructed around the former Automobile Association building. There has been an emphasis on bringing residential accommodation back into the city centre. However hard we try to develop brownfield land in Cardiff, demand will inevitably outstrip supply. That is why the local authority has had to consider developing greenfield sites. I will comment on that as Member for Cardiff North, taking into consideration the need to restrict the development of greenfield sites to the minimum, and the need to build homes.

Helen Mary Jones: Will you ensure that the new draft planning guidance encourages urban development that focuses on public transport, walking and cycling, with the long-term aim of making these the main modes of transport in our city centres?

Sue Essex: That is a good point because that meets our sustainability objectives. It also addresses quality of life in urban areas. As we discussed in Committee yesterday, the quality of life in urban areas improves when air pollution is bad because it discourages people from coming through. We have enormous opportunities to encourage walking and cycling, towards which some money in the transport grant initiative has been

Y Ffordd Ddosbarthu Ddeheuol ar gyfer Casnewydd The Southern Distributor Road for Newport

Q2 William Graham: Will the Minister make a statement on the southern distributor road for Newport? (OAQ10154)

Sue Essex: The Newport southern distributor road is a private finance scheme promoted by Newport County Borough Council which will provide a dual carriageway route around the southern periphery of the urban area of Newport and a new crossing over the River Usk. The scheme preparation has been supported by Assembly transport grant funding. A public inquiry for the scheme was held in June 2000 and the publication of the inspector's report is anticipated in the near future. I am informed that the contract procedures are in hand and that Newport council, subject to a satisfactory inspector's report, hopes to enter into an agreement with the successful contractor in the summer of this year. That will enable work to commence on site sometime during the autumn.

William Graham: Will you bring forward further consultation on the M4 relief road, bearing in mind the large number of accidents that have occurred between junctions 24 and 28 in the past year?

Sue Essex: Research work into alternatives to the M4 relief road is ongoing. This was discussed in the former Local Government and Environment Committee some time ago. Until the research work has been completed, there is no point in going out to further consultation.

John Griffiths: As you know, the long-suffering residents of Corporation Road in Newport have put up with traffic congestion over a protracted period of time. I pass on their thanks to you. They are grateful that work on the southern distributor road will begin in the near future, subject to the requirements mentioned earlier being met.

C2 William Graham: A wnaiff y Gweinidog ddatganiad ar y ffordd ddosbarthu ddeheuol ar gyfer Casnewydd? (OAQ10154)

Sue Essex: Mae ffordd ddosbarthu ddeheuol Casnewydd yn gynllun arian preifat a hyrwyddir gan Gyngor Bwrdeistref Sirol Casnewydd i ddarparu llwybr ffordd ddeuol o amgylch cyrion deheuol ardal drefol Casnewydd a phont newydd dros afon Wysg. Cefnogwyd y gwaith o baratoi'r cynllun gan arian grant trafnidiaeth y Cynulliad. Cynhaliwyd ymchwiliad cyhoeddus ar gyfer y cynllun ym Mehefin 2000 a rhagwelir y caiff adroddiad yr arolygydd ei gyhoeddi yn y dyfodol agos. Fe'm hysbysir bod gweithdrefnau'r contract ar waith a bod cyngor Casnewydd, yn ddibynnol ar adroddiad boddhaol gan yr arolygydd, yn gobeithio dod i gytundeb â'r contractwr llwyddiannus yn ystod yr haf eleni. Bydd hynny'n galluogi i waith ddechrau ar y safle rywbryd yn ystod yr hydref.

William Graham: A fyddwch yn trefnu ymgynghoriad pellach ar ffordd liniaru'r M4, o ystyried y nifer fawr o ddamweiniau a ddigwyddodd rhwng cyffordd 24 a 28 yn ystod y flwyddyn ddiwethaf?

Sue Essex: Mae gwaith ymchwil yn mynd yn ei flaen ar ddewisiadau amgen i ffordd liniaru'r M4. Trafodwyd hyn yn yr hen Bwyllgor Llywodraeth Leol a'r Amgylchedd beth amser yn ôl. Hyd nes y bydd y gwaith ymchwil wedi'i gwblhau, nid oes unrhyw bwynt ymgynghori ymhellach arno.

John Griffiths: Fel y gwyddoch, mae preswylwyr goddefgar Corporation Road yng Nghasnewydd wedi dioddef tagfeydd traffig dros gyfnod maith o amser. Trosglwyddaf eu diolch i chi. Maent yn ddiolchgar y bydd gwaith ar y ffordd ddosbarthu ddeheuol yn cychwyn yn y dyfodol agos, os bydd y gofynion a grybwylwyd yn gynharach yn

cael eu bodloni.

Sue Essex: For Members' information, the total scheme costs approximately £58 million. As John rightly said, we must wait until the democratic process of the inspector's report has been completed. However, subject to a satisfactory inspector's report, work can progress. As John said, it is significant that this will give great relief to residents and occupants in southern Newport and will also open up much brownfield land for beneficial use, as was discussed in the previous question.

Amddiffynfeydd rhag Llifogydd ym Mro Morgannwg Flood Defences in the Vale of Glamorgan

Q3 David Melding: What representations has the Minister received to improve flood defences in the Vale of Glamorgan? (OAQ10130)

Sue Essex: I have received a large number of representations concerning the improvement of flood defences at several locations in the Vale of Glamorgan.

David Melding: You will know that there are particular problems at Boerton, Cowbridge and Llanblethian. There is frustration among residents that the current system lacks transparency. Will you review flood defence committees and consider giving county councils direct responsibility in relation to the Environment Agency and the Assembly, rather than a tangential approach via these committees?

Sue Essex: There are problems in Boerton and we are considering ways of supporting the residents and progressing work on flood defence. I have met residents there and these problems are distressing for those affected. David will remember that we were working on the operation of flood defence committees prior to the awful floods in the autumn. I put forward a review to consider decision-making on funding, design, planning guidance and a range of other issues. That is one of my main concerns. The current system is difficult to describe to people, and that raises questions about accountability. People need to see how the money is spent.

Sue Essex: Derbyniais nifer fawr o sylwadau ynghylch gwella amddiffynfeydd rhag llifogydd mewn sawl lleoliad ym Mro Morgannwg.

David Melding: Gwyddoch fod problemau arbennig yn Boerton, y Bont-faen a Llanfleiddan. Mae'r trigolion yn rhwystredig am nad yw'r system gyfredol yn ddigon tryloyw. A wnewch adolygu pwylgorau amddiffynfeydd rhag llifogydd ac ystyried rhoi cyfrifoldeb uniongyrchol i gynghorau sir mewn perthynas ag Asiantaeth yr Amgylchedd a'r Cynulliad, yn hytrach nag ymagwedd ymylol drwy'r pwylgorau hyn?

Sue Essex: Mae problemau yn Boerton ac yr ydym yn ystyried ffyrdd o gynorthwyo'r trigolion a datblygu'r gwaith ar yr amddiffynfeydd rhag llifogydd. Cyfarfum â'r trigolion yno ac mae'r problemau hyn yn peri gofid i'r rhai yr effeithir arnynt. Sue Essex: It is probably not for me to give the approval at the end of the day. It would be given through the mechanisms that we have already mentioned. You are right about Ruthin's needs. I visited the town and have recently received letters from residents. You are concerned to see a scheme progress. However, it is important to have a design. We cannot progress any scheme until the design work has been completed. Edwina and I have collaborated to provide for a considerable injection of money to assist in emergency situations and to bring forward new schemes. I urge those responsible to come forward as quickly as possible with the design. The foot and mouth disease restrictions have caused a problem in allowing people to take measurements outside. We must take that into account. However, as soon as a scheme is received it will be considered. I hope that one is presented soon.

Janet Davies: Do you agree that while we must improve flood defences, in the longer term, we need a strategy for managed retreats to ensure that we do not build on flood plains? Will you consider cost-effective techniques of avoiding flooding and undertaking more research into drainage basins?

Sue Essex: That is an interesting point. There are coastal defences and when you say 'managed retreats', you might be referring to coastal areas as well as riverine areas. We have a great opportunity to consider new methods of catchment area control rather than to simply accept that water flows off the land, down the river, and is someone else's problem at the end. We have learnt that we

Q4 Phil Williams: What progress has been made on the national spatial planning framework for Wales? (OAQ10200)

Sue Essex: Work on preparing the national spatial planning framework—it does not trip off the tongue easily—is underway. I mentioned previously that a seminar was held in December last year, which considered key questions on that framework. That was a useful seminar, because it raised the stakes and made us think about the key points that needed to be addressed. A research exercise has been completed. That analysis will lead us to find a way of perhaps looking at scenarios for Wales. That will then be sent out as part of the consultation on the draft outline framework.

Phil Williams: I know that you agree that spatial planning is a crucial element in economic development, especially in the development of renewable energy, but also in the co-ordination of sites for new manufacturing units and a co-ordinated public transport system to provide convenient travel to work. How close is the day-to-day co-ordination between the work on the national spatial planning framework and work on the national economic development strategy, which may include regional employment targets and the encouragement of sector clustering? Are there any plans for joint meetings of the Environment, Transport

and Planning Committee and the Economic Development Committee to enhance that co-ordination?

Sue Essex: You will remember that I spoke at the Economic Development Committee about this. I am sure that we are both in accord. We need those elements to be married together. We also need to meet our sustainable development commitments. What is interesting is whether we can move or incorporate the regional dimension in this outline plan. That will then allow us to identify strategic areas of growth in which we can incorporate energy opportunities and various other measures. We are considering how we can do that with our partners in local government and the WDA, perhaps by marrying the regional economic fora and the planning forum. If we can consider that, I will then discuss with the Committee Chairs, Val Feld and Richard Edwards, how we can co-ordinate the Committees. It is not for me but for you as Members to make that judgment, because the Committees are your responsibility.

David Davies: Is it not the case that in spite of the valiant efforts of my colleague, Jonathan Morgan, Cardiff City and County Council is able to build on greenfield sites, because, unlike your counterpart in England, you will not produce a target for the development of brownfield sites? No matter how much you may huff and puff and say that councils should not build on greenfield sites, the reality is that they will continue to do so until you bring in those targets and the destruction of our environment will continue unabated.

Sue Essex: I have never been known to huff and puff. I might be accused of many things, but huffing and puffing is not one of them. If we look around this room, I wonder how many of you live in a house that was built on a greenfield site. I do not know your personal circumstances, David, but where I live was a greenfield site 100 years ago. With growth, towns, cities and villages expand and they are built on fields. [*Interruption.*] I do not know whether you want to hear this answer, David. What I have been told by the Land Use

Their advice was not to have set a brownfield target because brownfield capacity needs to be understood. Each local authority needs to work in its own area to ascertain its brownfield capacity before moving forward. It is important that we support local government in dealing with contamination, through the WDA, to allow as much brownfield development as possible.

Sue Essex: I am aware of the research report, and I have asked for further advice. It is a useful point. Telecommunication masts are being considered through the planning guidance consultation and regulations, but we will certainly consider the report and pylons.

Glyn Davies: Will you state publicly that you see recycling as the preferred method of dealing with waste, and that incineration should not be seen as reducing the urgent need for recycling strategies? Local authorities considering proposals for new incinerators should adopt the same principle in reaching their decisions.

Sue Essex: The UK waste strategy includes the 'reduce, re-use, recycle' mantra, and I am sure that this will also be followed in the Welsh strategy. It is a matter of reducing waste as well as recycling it. We will work with local authorities again to produce recycling targets. We have EU requirements to meet. That is where we can work with local government on how it can deliver on recycling.

Elin Jones: Is the Minister aware of the research published this week which draws attention to the health risks of pollution by electricity pylons, as well as the possible risks posed by telecommunication masts? Is she willing to work with the Minister for Health and Social Services to consider how to safeguard the public from these possible risks?

The Minister for Finance, Local Government and Communities (Edwina Hart): The Millennium Stadium plc and

Cardiff City and County Council have asked for financial support in relation to the major footballing events which have been secured for Wales over the next three years or so.

These events, particularly the FA Cup Final, provide opportunities to raise the international and UK profile of Wales and to promote Wales as a place to visit, work and invest. They also promote the Millennium Stadium and Cardiff, the capital city, as an important gateway to wider Wales, as a venue for sporting and other events, and provide wider benefits for the profile of sport, and football in particular, in Wales.

The Assembly's Cabinet, recognising the benefits and opportunities for Wales, has decided to provide £250,000 in grant aid to the Millennium Stadium plc and £250,000 in grant aid to the Cardiff council. Both payments will be made in the current financial year. Support for these events will be reviewed in the autumn.

9:45 a.m.

The support to Millennium Stadium plc is a contribution to the extraordinary costs associated with the staging of the package of events and the grant will go some way to minimising the financial risk. The grant payment to Millennium Stadium plc will be routed through the Sports Council for Wales. The Sports Council, under the Physical Training and Recreations Act 1937, will be given additional grant aid for the purpose. Millennium Stadium plc will provide the Assembly with an overall financial breakdown of income and expenditure associated with the package of events. Clawback provisions will be included in the grant offer and, if necessary, implemented. The payment to the Council will be a direct grant payment from the Assembly under sections 126 to 128 of the Housing Grants, Construction and Regeneration Act 1996.

Mae hefyd yn hyrwyddo Stadiwm y Mileniwm a Chaerdydd, y brifddinas, fel porth pwysig i Gymru yn ehangach, fel lleoliad ar gyfer digwyddiadau chwaraeon a digwyddiadau eraill, a darparu buddiannau ehangach ar gyfer proffil chwaraeon, a phêl-droed yn arbennig, yng Nghymru.

Mae Cabinet y Cynulliad, wrth gydnabod y buddiannau a'r cyfleoedd i Gymru, wedi penderfynu darparu £250,000 mewn cymorth grant i Stadiwm y Mileniwm ccc a £250,000 mewn cymorth grant i gyngor Caerdydd. Gwneir y ddau taliad yn y flwyddyn ariannol gyfredol. Adolygir cymorth ar gyfer y digwyddiadau hyn yn yr hydref.

Mae'r cymorth i Stadiwm y Mileniwm ccc yn gyfraniad i'r costau eithriadol a gysylltir â llwyfannu'r pecyn o ddigwyddiadau a bydd y grant hefyd yn cyfrannu at leihau'r risg ariannol. Bydd y taliad grant i Stadiwm y Mileniwm ccc yn cael ei wneud drwy Gyngor Chwaraeon Cymru. Rhoddir cymorth grant ychwanegol i'r Cyngor Chwaraeon, o dan Ddeddf Hyfforddiant Corfforol ac Adloniant 1937, i'r diben hwn. Bydd Stadiwm y Mileniwm ccc yn rhoi dadansoddiad ariannol cyffredinol o incwm a gwariant sydd yn gysylltiedig â'r pecyn o ddigwyddiadau i'r Cynulliad. Caiff darpariaethau adfachu eu cynnwys yn y cynnig grant a'u gweithredu, os bydd angen. Bydd y taliad i'r Cyngor yn daliad grant uniongyrchol gan y Cynulliad o dan adrannau 126 i 128 Deddf Grantiau Tai, Adeiladu ac Adfywio 1996.

Owen John Thomas: The success of football events staged at the Millennium Stadium is important. The stadium is an iconic building of which the people of Wales are proud. Plaid Cymru supports initiatives

Edwina Hart: The negotiations were undertaken by Millennium Stadium plc, the Football Association and the Football League. The Assembly was not part of the negotiations but I understand that they were difficult and protracted. Millennium Stadium plc believes that it secured the best deal possible. We understand that the company will face significant financial risk associated with staging such events. However, I have said from the outset that there will be an open-book policy so that we can see what appears as a result of this year's events. There is a clawback arrangement in respect of the stadium if there are excessive profits. We must recognise that the fact that the image of Cardiff and Wales being projected across the world is important. That is why we have decided to make this payment. Not only

that strengthen and enhance Wales's international image and is willing, therefore, to support such events financially, if necessary.

However, many are surprised that the contracts for football events have not secured significant profits for Millennium Stadium plc. One would expect Cardiff City and County Council to gain financially from these events rather than Assembly coffers paying for them. I would, therefore, welcome an explanation of why part of the huge profits generated by such events does not ensure that Cardiff City and County Council does not have to pay and that Millennium Stadium plc does not face debts. I do not understand that.

In her statement Edwina mentioned that she is willing to have a 'financial breakdown of income and expenditure'. However, it is likely that she already knows how much profit this event is likely to generate for everybody associated with this event, including the Football Association. Therefore, she can tell everybody in Wales associated with the event why they have not obtained a better agreement. I am pleased that this event will be held in Wales and of the attention that it will generate. However, the public does not understand why the huge profits generated by this event does not ensure that Assembly coffers do not have to be opened to pay for this.

Edwina Hart: Stadiwm y Mileniwm ccc, y Gymdeithas Bêl-droed a'r Gynghrair Bêl-droed a wnaeth y negodiadau. Nid oedd y Cynulliad yn rhan o'r negodiadau ond deallaf eu bod yn anodd ac yn hirfaith. Jonathan Morgan: The Welsh Conservative group supports this announcement. We are pleased that money is being made available for this tremendous event. The Millennium Stadium in Cardiff is an enormous asset that benefits not only Cardiff, but also Wales. Cardiff is a relatively small capital city and Wales is a small nation. To secure such a sporting event—the fourth largest sporting event in the world—is a tremendous opportunity for Cardiff and Wales to put ourselves on the map not only as a place to visit, do business and engage in major sporting events, but somewhere to enjoy the economic benefits that we will hopefully gain. I am not sceptical like some Members in this Chamber. It has been a long process, but we have made the right decision. I am sure that, unlike Anne Robinson, thousands of visitors are looking forward to coming to Cardiff and enjoying this event.

Edwina Hart: In anticipation of discussions on this issue, I asked my officials to look at television coverage of the FA Cup final. Estimates of viewing figures vary, but there may 2 billion people in 110 countries or 3 billion people in 200 countries watching. I have made grants available to Cardiff. When you consider the numbers of viewers who will be watching the event in places such as Rio de Janeiro and Japan, this can only benefit the image of Wales and Cardiff and it will attract investment and jobs.

Delyth Evans: I welcome the Minister's support for this event. It is a tribute to the way this administration is supporting sport in Wales and helping to raise the profile of Wales abroad. I listened to the Radio Five Live coverage of the Worthington Cup Final, which was held at the Millennium Stadium, and was a great advertisement for Wales. Sports journalists from all over the UK and Europe said that the stadium, the atmosphere and Wales was terrific. It is right that we should support this important sporting venture in Wales.

Edwina Hart: I am sure that everybody will concur with those comments. Sue Essex and I will discuss the transport problems, because there are significant issues involved. On the second point, because of the Wembley Stadium redevelopment debacle there is an opportunity for future FA Cup finals and other football events to come to the Millennium Stadium. The stadium is a first-class venue, and I take on board that the FA's lawyers are sharp.

Alun Pugh: Many Liverpool fans living in north Wales will have enjoyed the Worthington Cup Final in Cardiff. Will you ask the television companies to include perhaps a 30-second clip of Wales and Cardiff in their coverage of the FA Cup final for the world-wide audience?

Edwina Hart: I would be delighted for my colleague, Jenny Randerson, as part of her responsibilities, to raise this matter, but I am not sure whether she would be successful. I am delighted that so many Liverpool fans enjoyed their trip to south Wales, and I hope that we did good missionary work as a result.

Peter Black: I also welcome the news that the FA Cup Final is coming to Cardiff and that we are able to support the event. I have a number of questions. The statement is short on detail as to how the money will be channelled to Cardiff City and County Council. Will you explain what the money

Edwina Hart: This is about benefitting the whole of Wales and ensuring that the stadium's image is a lasting one that will represent Cardiff and Wales throughout the world. When we hosted the Rugby Union World Cup, the Millennium Stadium was the image of Wales that was seen worldwide. It was the positive image of a well-run tournament. We must build on that. The benefits must flow from the capital city. The positive benefit will be that people will have a taste of Wales when they visit Cardiff. We will have done a good job if only a small percentage of football supporters are encouraged to spend some holiday time here, perhaps a short break or a holiday in rural Wales to explore Wales further. The Wales Tourist Board must market this series of events.

Y Llywydd: Oherwydd cyflwr llais y Gweinidog dros Faterion Gwledig a'i annwyd trwm, yr wyf wedi caniatáu iddo beidio â darllen ei ddatganiad, gan symud yn syth i ateb cwestiynau. Anfonwyd y datganiad i'r Aelodau drwy e-bost.

Y datganiad a anfonwyd at yr Aelodau:
The statement sent to Members:

Three confirmed cases of the disease in Wales remain at Gaerwen on Anglesey and at Felindre and Painscastle in Powys. In addition, 16 suspected cases are under investigation. Twelve of these are on Anglesey, around Gaerwen. The remainder are in Powys, Newport and Monmouthshire. It should not be assumed that suspect cases will necessarily be confirmed. Laboratory tests cleared two previous suspect cases earlier this week. I remain hopeful that some of the remaining suspects will be cleared.

It is still too early to predict how widely the disease will spread, or how long it will last. The incubation period in sheep can be as long as 21 days. There is room to hope, however, that the stringent control measures are limiting the geographical spread of the disease.

Arrangements were put in place over the weekend by the National Assembly and the Ministry for Agriculture, Fisheries and Food to allow animals to be moved directly from farms to abattoirs, to ensure that home-produced meat continues to enter the food supply chain. Strict procedures are in place to ensure that these movements are controlled and do not risk spreading the disease. The Meat Hygiene Service has

approved a wide range of abattoirs, large and small, across Wales to operate under the scheme. The trading standards departments of local authorities are issuing licences to farmers to permit animals to be moved. The first movement of animals under the scheme took place on Monday and, so far, the arrangements appear to be working satisfactorily. I am extremely grateful for the prompt way in which local authorities have implemented the scheme. So far, only direct movements from individual farms to abattoirs have been licensed, but in the light of discussions with the industry, it is planned to introduce carefully controlled livestock collection centres, which will be welcomed by farmers.

The restriction on livestock movements is undoubtedly causing farmers major practical problems. I am acutely aware of the animal welfare problems that some farmers now face. I discussed these with the farming unions when I met them on Monday. We are pursuing a twin track approach. First, arrangements are being thrashed out with MAFF to allow farmers to move livestock around parts of their holding within a local area, where that is necessary to avoid animal welfare problems. Such movements would be subject to specific authorisation and random checks. I hope that it will be possible to announce and implement these arrangements quickly: the problems that farmers face are pressing. The National Assembly cannot act on its own in this matter, however, as the Movement Restriction Order is made by MAFF for England and Wales, as the power is not devolved.

The second track we are pursuing concerns the problem of animals which have been over-wintering 'on tack' in lowland areas, which in the ordinary course of events would now be returning to the Welsh uplands. The farming unions agree that it would be too dangerous to contemplate a general return of such animals: many of them are in parts of England which have had confirmed cases of the disease. Discussions are continuing with the industry and MAFF on whether it is possible to define circumstances in which

animals might return from tack, and on what practical steps might be taken to alleviate animal welfare problems for those animals that cannot return.

Last week, the UK Government announced that the Treasury would release funding to permit the payment of the optional elements of agri-monetary compensation for the dairy, beef and sheep sectors. This is worth £156 million for the UK as a whole, and over £20 million to farmers in Wales. I welcome this, as I have pressed for it, but I am clear in my view that it is compensation for the value of sterling relative to the euro, rather than for the effects of foot and mouth disease. I shall be arguing this strongly when I meet Nick Brown next week.

The trauma and anxiety that the current crisis is causing in the farming community cannot be underestimated. In addition to the action that I have been taking to ensure that farmers are kept informed, I am pleased that the Rural Stress Helpline is now operational throughout Wales and is being publicised.

I am also very conscious of the damaging economic impact that the measures to control the disease are having not only on the food-processing sector, but also on the tourist industry. The need for restrictions to access to the countryside will be kept under review. Last week, it was impossible to know where the next outbreak would be. This week, a geographic pattern has emerged. If this pattern remains stable, I hope that it will be possible to offer guidance to local authorities that would enable access to the countryside to be restored in areas that are clearly unaffected.

Carwyn Jones: Thank you for the concession of allowing me not to read the statement. I add one piece of information to the distributed statement, namely that there is now a fourth confirmed case of foot and mouth in Wales at Llanddaniel-fab on Anglesey. That information came through about five minutes ago and it has confirmed that the disease is present in cattle. Agriculture spokespeople of all parties have been informed.

Elin Jones: We are disappointed to hear of another confirmed case of foot and mouth disease in the Gaerwen area.

I welcome the fact that healthy Welsh meat is starting to reach the food chain once again, but I am disappointed that the prices that some farmers receive for their produce is substantially lower than they would have expected, even though the prices in the shops are likely to remain the same. Does the Minister have any information to explain why this is happening?

As for the movement of animals from farm to farm, we are aware that significant areas in Wales have not been affected by the disease so far. There is a real need to move animals in order to provide better grazing. I welcome the fact that you are discussing this matter with the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and that there is a possibility of setting up a scheme that would allow the movement animals.

Animals on tack also need to be returned so that they can lamb and calve on the farm under the care of the farmer, for the animals' welfare. I understand the arguments and the possible risks associated with this, but is it possible to consider having a licensing system for the movement of sheep and livestock on tack within a certain radius of the farm or within local authority areas or cluster of local authorities such as the old county of Dyfed, where there are no cases of the disease so far? Would it be possible to move animals within specific areas under a licensing system?

The implications of the disease affect several sectors and institutions and bring significant losses. I am particularly concerned about an institution in my constituency. You will have read reports about the closure of Urdd Gobaith Cymru centres, leading to losses of about £40,000 a week for the Urdd voluntary movement in Wales. It cannot cope with such losses. Will you hold discussions with the Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning and the Minister for Culture, Sport and the Welsh Language, to see whether it is possible for the Government to offer support to organisations such as the Urdd and other

I welcome the reference in your statement to making a distinction between the agri-monetary payments and the compensation for foot and mouth disease. I hope that you will convey the message to Nick Brown and Gordon Brown that Welsh farmers do not welcome or appreciate the attempt to con the public with this money. Farmers are entitled to that money as well as to separate compensation payments for foot and mouth disease. Will you convey the message to the Treasury, therefore, that Welsh farmers expect compensation for the losses incurred as a result of foot and mouth disease?

Carwyn Jones: There were a number of questions in that contribution. I will answer the question about prices first. Nick Brown said yesterday, or the day before, that he wants to see fair play in the market and that people should not endeavour to profiteer from this situation. I am happy to reiterate those words in the Assembly. There should be fair play in the market and no-one should be making greater profits than they would under normal circumstances.

As regards the movement of animals, I hope that, by tomorrow, farmers will be able to move animals within a relatively restricted area. We are considering the possibility of moving animals on farms that have fields on either side of a road. I hope that a system will be in place by tomorrow to allow us to do that.

The main problem with tack is that many animals graze far away from their home farms. Some animals from farms in Wales are on tack in areas where cases of the disease have been confirmed. We cannot allow the movement of animals over great distances, nor would farmers wish for that to happen at present. We are considering what could be done with animals on tack, especially those that are far from their farms. Some animals from Welsh farms are on tack in Dorset. MAFF and Assembly officials are considering how to assist farmers in such circumstances. In terms of moving animals

The Leader of the Welsh Conservatives (Nick Bourne): I apologise, once again, on behalf of Peter Rogers, for his absence. The bad news from Anglesey vindicates Peter's understandable insistence on not risking leaving his farm.

I support the Minister's continued action. We support measures to allow the slaughter of animals under controlled conditions. That makes sense. I am concerned about the price being obtained by farmers for meat compared with the price that it is fetching in supermarkets. There has been no drop in the price to the consumer but farmers are getting much lower prices. Farmers throughout Wales have expressed that concern to us. We are supportive of restricted localised

over shorter distances, we hope to put arrangements in place tomorrow.

I understand Urdd Gobaith Cymru's situation. However, it is not my place to spend the budget of another Assembly Minister. I am happy to discuss this with my colleagues in the Cabinet to see whether we can assist this organisation. This is, therefore, a matter for them also.

I have explained the purpose of agri-monetary compensation. Members will know that I have asked Nick Brown on several occasions to press the Treasury for this money. I did so again last Tuesday, and the money was assured. I would not like to claim that the money was committed as a result of what happened in the Assembly. However, it was committed, after I, and others in the Assembly, put pressure on Nick Brown. As soon as the crisis comes to an end, we will have to discuss how to help and rebuild the agriculture industry and the countryside, as well as discussing the way forward. From my point of view, it is essential to consider in great detail what rural areas need in order to assist them to withstand this crisis. I look forward to discussing that issue with my colleagues throughout the United Kingdom.

We strongly agree that agri-monetary compensation is not related to compensation for foot and mouth disease. We support any measures that are forthcoming following your representations to Nick Brown and the Treasury that additional assistance is needed. That is the case. Will the Minister comment on the position of people, other than farmers, who have been affected? Attention has focused, rightly, on farmers but there are concerns for abattoir workers and hauliers, who have been badly affected by this outbreak. I appreciate that it is outside your portfolio, but this has had a massive effect on the numbers of people visiting unaffected—or uninfected, I should say—areas of Wales, such as Aberystwyth, Cardiff, Swansea and Llandrindod Wells. I am sure that all Members are receiving representations from constituents about the loss, and projected loss, of income from tourism. Are we to expect a statement from the Deputy First Minister and Minister for Economic Development? He is indicating that perhaps we are. When will that be forthcoming, because we need to know the economic impact and the action proposed to deal with it? The implications extend beyond the immediate concerns of farmers. That is rightly our primary concern, but this has a much wider ripple effect than perhaps Carwyn is able to address. However, the Minister has our continued support for his actions.

Carwyn Jones: Peter Rogers's actions should be applauded. I heard yesterday that I might be questioned as to why I had not visited farms on Anglesey to see the situation for myself. That is like asking why I have not personally spread the virus from one farm to another. I reiterate that I will not visit farms

that have suspected or confirmed cases until the situation is over. That must be emphasised.

With regard to prices, I told Elin that Nick Brown does not want to see profiteering. I am happy to echo his stance. At the moment, when there is a price squeeze, it is the farmers who are squeezed. That shows the importance of getting the structures right, in terms of sellers groups and so on, to ensure that it does not happen again. However, that is a matter to be dealt with after the situation has improved.

The precautionary principle must apply to the movement of animals on farms that have suspected but unconfirmed cases. We are looking at the movement of animals outside infected areas or areas where there are suspected cases. We must be sensible and treat a suspected case as being a case where the virus is present unless it is shown to be otherwise. That is a sensible application of the precautionary principle.

With regard to compensation, over the past fortnight members of the media have been trying to get me to concede that compensation is payable. I have made the point that the Assembly does not have the money to pay compensation but, nevertheless, all matters will need to be considered when the situation has improved. On the effects on other people, that raises many difficult questions. How far do you take the question of compensation and how much do you compensate? If you compensate for this situation, would you compensate the tourist industry for a wet summer and so forth? There are many difficult questions that must be addressed and there are no easy answers. However, we are aware of the problem. Many Members have been approached by people who run industries or enterprises that are dependent on tourism.

At present, the situation with regard to the closure of land remains the same. We have given advice to local authorities, and I reiterate that golf clubs and sport pitches where animals graze should not be open. If

any such areas are open at present, I strongly urge that they be closed. However, we are keeping the situation under constant review. If the disease is confined to the two areas that it appears confined to at present, we will review again the necessity to close areas of land in other parts of Wales. It is too early to say yet whether the disease has been confined, but we will keep the situation under review. I assure those people who are involved in the tourist industry that the restrictions in place at the moment will not be kept in place for a moment longer than necessary.

Mick Bates: I declare an interest as a farmer. I join others in expressing my disappointment that there is another outbreak on Anglesey, and also in expressing my sympathy to the farmers directly involved. I record the Liberal Democrats' thanks to the Minister for his efforts during this outbreak, and to his staff. We are well aware of the pressure on the department, given a possible lack of resources. I also thank the State Veterinary Service for its remarkable performance under great pressure.

On a third positive note, I welcome agri-monetary compensation. However, I would like to hear from the Minister about prompt payment for other schemes, such as suckler cow payments and Tir Mynydd. We heard last week that 87 per cent of the suckler cow payments had been made. What proportion has been paid now? It is important, at this time of crisis, that farms have some cashflow. I am disappointed that we do not, currently, have a welfare licence up and running to assist farmers to cross roads, for example, or to move livestock short distances within their own holdings. I look forward to that being announced soon, to alleviate pressure on welfare grounds in many farms.

I also draw your attention to the need for collection points at livestock markets. I would like to know when they will be set up because there are many small producers who have a few lambs left, or perhaps one animal to sell in the fat cattle class, who cannot afford to transport animals over great

distances. A collection centre, therefore, is important so that they can take animals to a local mart to be collected for transportation to abattoirs further afield. I also make a plea that in infected areas, where there are abattoirs, that producers are allowed to sell their stock under licence. As you know, some of the infected areas, for example, Montgomeryshire, are extremely large because trunk roads are used to police these areas and Montgomeryshire has few such roads.

I would also like to hear what will happen about the cause of the outbreak. It was almost certainly caused by imported food. Last week, on television, we saw customs officers on the continent searching baggage and throwing away any food found. For years we have asked our Government to implement stringent measures to protect our industry, yet your statement made no mention of the customs checks needed to keep this disease out of Britain. Your statement referred to the trauma and anxiety caused to the industry. The rural development plan was amended to include provision to assist rural stress, but a Welsh rural stress helpline has not yet been established. When will it be established?

I also urge that the knock-on effect of this is considered and that you meet—as the Leader of the Welsh Conservatives suggested—with the Deputy First Minister and Minister for Economic Development to ensure that advice and assistance can be given to all other industries affected by this terrible crisis. Finally, on prices, I find it unbelievable that producers receive less now than before the outbreak. The role of the supermarkets in controlling prices is well known. In fact, the Prime Minister himself said that supermarkets have farming in an armlock. Do you agree, Minister, that supermarkets have hold of farming by another part of the anatomy and are squeezing hard? When will the Government ensure some justice for the producer?

Carwyn Jones: I have often said that the only sure way that farmers can take on the supermarkets in the long term is by forming themselves into large groups. Where there are large buyers and a large number of small sellers, we can see where the squeeze will come. This is not the case in other parts of the world, and we seek to encourage that here.

If I remember correctly, the rollout of the stress helpline is due in the summer, but I will have to check on that.

Last week the figure given for suckler cow payments was that 87.4 per cent of payments had been made. I do not know what the situation is by today, but it will be more than 87.4 per cent. I welcome the efforts that staff have made to increase the frequency of payments over the past few weeks. I was glad to announce that Tir Mynydd Element 1 payments have been processed extremely quickly, and that £22 million had been released at the beginning of this week. It was emphasised to my officials how important it was that this money went out as soon as possible, given the current situation. I welcome their work in releasing that money.

I repeat that we are looking at putting a system of welfare licensing in place by tomorrow, so that farmers will be able to move animals on welfare grounds.

The issue of collection centres is being looked at. The licensing of collection centres is likely to be considered next week. At the moment we are dealing with the welfare licensing system, and the question of tack. However, I know that discussions have taken place between my officials and officials from MAFF on collection centres.

It is not possible to say yet where this outbreak began. It is guessed that infected feed was given to pigs in Northumberland. That is a matter for the State Veterinary Service to investigate. It is impossible to check every person coming to the UK, so you must rely on people being honest and keeping to the guidelines. However, we will have to examine how the outbreak arrived in the UK,

Dafydd Wigley: I thank Carwyn for the way he is dealing with this catastrophe. There is unanimous support for the measures that he is taking. Bearing in mind the sad occurrence of an additional case in Anglesey, will he confirm that its source is the same as the other cases, as far as we know? Up to now every confirmed case has come from the same original source, and it is important that people know if this is true in Anglesey's case.

Will he inform us of the situation regarding the request of the Welsh shepherds for guidelines to be given to local authorities to deal with stray sheep, because of the danger that they are spreading the disease? Could he give us any indication of how long a period would have to elapse after the last suspected case has been cleared up before we could expect the restrictions to be lifted?

Alun Pugh: I am glad that Carwyn accepts that this crisis has demonstrated the huge contribution made by walkers, climbers and mountain bikers to the rural economy. There have been some irresponsible walkers and one or two irresponsible farmers. However, will you join me in congratulating the Ramblers' Association and the British Mountaineering Council for the leadership and positive advice that they have given to their members? Will you give an assurance that restrictions on access will be dropped the second it is safe to do so?

Carwyn Jones: I echo those comments. I was impressed that rambling and mountaineering groups stated almost immediately that they would not walk or mountaineer and that was certainly the case in my constituency. I welcome the responsibility shown by organised groups. Unfortunately, some individual walkers did not observe the guidelines. However, Alun rightly said that this has illustrated the sheer amount of money that walkers and mountaineers bring into rural areas. That is

where the disease occurred, the time that it takes the disease to go from one farm to another and the soil type on the farm. It is not possible to say that it will be clear after three weeks or a month. I am being advised by veterinary surgeons, and their opinion is that it is not possible to give a specific time as to when the situation will be clear.

Local authorities have powers to ensure that sheep wandering on roads and which are not in fields are placed in a pound. If it is not possible to find out who owns them, local authorities have the power to cull them. You have written to me regarding the problem with sheep.

As I said, the new case of the disease on Anglesey was found in cattle. That is new, as the disease was previously found in sheep. At present, veterinary surgeons cannot find a link between the farm and the abattoir in Gaerwen. That does not mean that there is no link, only that there is no obvious link at the moment. The veterinary surgeons are investigating this in detail to discover whether there is a link.

Croesawaf yr agwedd gyfrifol a ddangoswyd gan grwpiau a drefnwyd. Yn anffodus, ni lynnodd rhai cerddwyr unigol at y canllawiau. As I mentioned, it is to be expected that there will be confirmed cases in those areas. However, it would be of great concern if a case were confirmed outside those areas. As it is too early to say what has happened with regard to the disease and where it is, the restrictions must remain for the time being. The restrictions will be lifted when veterinary advice states that it is safe to do so. However, that time has not yet come.

Janet Ryder: On the second outbreak confirmed on Anglesey, how far is it from the abattoir and is it traceable back to the original outbreak or is it a secondary one? Your statement mentions the effect on tourism and many have mentioned that today. You have said before that it is difficult to think about compensation for bed and breakfast proprietors and small hoteliers. However, are you, with the Wales Tourist Board and your Cabinet colleagues, planning an advertising campaign when this outbreak is finished to boost the tourist industry and put it back on its feet again?

Carwyn Jones: The confirmation of the fourth case came through as I was sitting in my chair in the Chamber. The farm is at Llanddaniel Fab—those who know the geography of Anglesey better than I will know how far that is from Gaerwen. As I mentioned to Dafydd, a link with Gaerwen is not obvious at this stage. That does not mean that there is not or that there is a link, but that a link has not yet been established. However, this is the first confirmed case in cattle in Wales. That is a cause for concern. Veterinarians are working hard at the farm at the moment to establish whether there is a link to Gaerwen. If there is, that is better than

These regulations further amend schedule 2 of the National Health Service (General Medical Services) Regulations 1992, which regulate the terms of service of general practitioners. These regulations will allow GPs to maintain all, or part, of their patient medical records on a computer system, if they so wish. They will also allow and require the health authority to authorise all requests from GPs to maintain electronic records and require electronic records to be maintained on the most up-to-date GP clinical systems to ensure appropriate standards of security, probity and confidentiality and to maintain the existing rights of health authorities to request patient medical records. The regulations create a new right of access to the audit trail associated with such records. A primary-care-led integrated service is part of the National Assembly for Wales's vision of the health service. Modernising the NHS has been crucial to that objective.

the basis for lifelong core clinical information and, eventually, the electronic transfer of patients' records between GPs and hospitals. They will also be provided with good practice guidance on electronic record keeping that will ensure that GPs are working to and maintaining the same standards. There are no additional financial implications for the Assembly, as any costs arising from these regulations will be accommodated in the overall budget for health and social services.

The revised legislation came into force in England on 1 October 2000 to deliver the commitment to health information, and to remove the contractual requirements for GPs to retain paper records. This is an essential step if we are to move to electronic patient health records and I therefore ask you to support this motion.

David Lloyd: I declare an interest as a GP. As a party we are happy to support this important Order. I will emphasise three points. First, the health authorities have a key role in this, but what will happen after they are abolished? The second point is the importance of what the Minister said about the computer audit trail and the fact that records cannot be changed or deleted without that being obvious. That is important to ensure that a correct record of the consultation was taken at the time. Thirdly, with the increasing emphasis on computer records, people are naturally worried that a variety of organisations can access the records. There is a danger that confidentiality will be undermined and that, of course, is the foundation of the patient-doctor relationship. The strength and success of family medicine arises from this confidentiality, namely the close relationship between the patient and the doctor and the total trust between them. At times, sensitive information is given to doctors, which is vital in order to learn about the background and make a full diagnosis. Would this sensitive information be shared if the patient believed that it could go beyond the four walls of the doctor's office? It is vital that confidentiality of information is safeguarded.

We need to do more to ensure that the

David Melding: The Welsh Conservative Party also welcomes the Order before us this morning. Can you clarify your position on the access patients have to their notes? Kirsty Williams: The Liberal Democrats also welcome the Order. Dai's point about compatibility of computer systems in the NHS is important. The Health and Social Services Committee is committed to developing an information and communications technology strategy for the NHS. However, we are aware that some trusts and health authorities are proceeding to buy information technology equipment and, more importantly, systems. That may preclude them in later years from communicating with other systems in Wales. That has major consequences for patients who move across Wales and medical staff who may be trained to use a particular computer programming system only to move to another trust or health authority and find that they need to retrain. While we welcome these regulations we must ensure that GPs surgeries and hospitals receive the necessary capital investment to implement them.

Jane Hutt: I thank Members for their positive points. Dai mentioned correct information. It will be vital to keep paper as well as electronic copies of patient records. Staff training and support for GPs will be needed. It is a permissive, not a mandatory

computer systems of different medical practices and hospitals communicate with one another. We want to see things running smoothly, but at the moment, a number of different systems are in use and they are not communicating with one other.

We welcome this Order, but assurance is needed on confidentiality.

change, so there will be time for training and work with local health groups to prepare for it. Some local health groups are already doing that as they are keen to move to electronic patient medical records quickly.

In terms of the changes announced in 'Improving Health in Wales', the NHS plan for Wales, its commitments will be met. This must be part of the information and communications technology strategy, Kirsty, in which we are investing in Wales. GPs' connectivity to the Cymruweb and the Assembly's and health authorities' support to progress primary care and the link to secondary and tertiary care must be part of our overall ICT strategy. We now expect health authorities and trusts to spend more on that this year and the Health and Social Services Committee must monitor that carefully.

On confidentiality, which David, Dai and Kirsty mentioned, all computers that hold records must have security systems to control access. Computer security is often covered in guidance on good practice. It will be difficult to change practices and procedures that involve staff vigilance. It is a sensitive issue, as Dai said, because it concerns family medicine. Patients are worried about where this will lead and who will be able to access information held on computers. GPs' staff are used to upholding the confidentiality of paper records. We must ensure that that is maintained after the introduction of electronic records. It may be less difficult to do that in healthcare than in other sectors. Work is ongoing and must be monitored.

On preparation and training and ensuring a national strategy exists that takes those issues into account, these regulations are important. On patient access, David asked whether patients would have difficulty accessing their records. As our health centres are increasingly computerised patients will be

Yr Adroddiad Blynnyddol ar Gynhwysiant Cymdeithasol
The Annual Report on Social Inclusion

The Presiding Officer: I have selected amendment 1 in the name of Jocelyn Davies.

The Minister for Finance, Local Government and Communities (Edwina Hart): I propose that

the National Assembly receives and notes the contents of the National Assembly for Wales's first annual report on social inclusion distributed to Assembly Members by e-mail and laid in the Table Office on 1 March 2001.

I am pleased to open today's debate on the first annual report on social inclusion. The National Assembly is uniquely placed to take an overview of the problems that we face in Wales on this issue. We should be able to see how education, housing and health are inter-related and tackle the problems concertedely and coherently. This is what should make the Assembly distinctive and show that it is working.

This report is a good start to an important, long-term process to tackle poverty and disadvantage. This is a new approach, which devolution has made possible. However, when I discussed the report with the Local Government and Housing Committee last week, we felt that it could be improved further. Clear targets need to be set so that we can evaluate our progress. We need to improve the development and gathering of relevant statistics and related data. It is also time that Assembly reports start developing a house style, which is distinctive and of its own making. Delay, however, is not an option. Whatever imperfections there may be, the way forward is to use this report and to improve and develop it. I shall, therefore, supplement this report later in the year with targets, so by the time that the next report is due, we will have something against which to measure the Assembly's progress. I intend to amend paragraph 3 of the foreword to reflect this.

This is such an important report that I intend to make two versions available to the public. The first is this one, which will be available on the internet on request. We need to get people in touch with what the Assembly is doing on these policies, and demonstrate how our policies are designed to help. The broad thrust of the report is fine. It sets the scene, explains why we need to work, and explains the size of the problem. The report also covers many of the initiatives that the National Assembly has put in place to combat poverty. That is useful. These initiatives do not exist in a vacuum. This report brings them together in one volume. The report is comprehensive. I cannot hope to be comprehensive in this opening speech, unfortunately. However, I will select a few examples from it to demonstrate how social exclusion is being tackled from many different directions, but with a single purpose.

The Communities First programme is essential to our approach. There will be a grant of £83 million over the first three years to get the programme moving. I also want other mainstream funding to support the programme. As I have previously made clear in the Chamber, Communities First is a generational programme. This first three years' funding is the beginning of our ongoing commitment to communities. We must monitor closely our progress in phase 1 of Communities First and report back. I referred earlier to evaluation, which is a key element in this programme. We propose that the programme should be measured by benchmarking against a set of 30 measures. These cover economic activity, education, training, environment, health, active community and community safety. These measures should be validated externally. I look forward to receiving the responses to our proposals. We are keen to get the programme moving.

Assembly are designed to boost enterprise and wealth creation in low-income communities, which is why we actively support the credit union movement in Wales. There are 47 credit unions in Wales with over 500 credit union volunteers, serving a membership of 12,000. We want to treble the membership of credit unions in the next three years. Community enterprise and co-operatives have a key role to play in tackling social disadvantage. They can, and do, contribute towards economic growth in Wales, particularly in our poorer communities. There will be some 500 community enterprises in Wales, with an estimated annual turnover of £30 million, creating 5,000 jobs. That is not unsubstantial when you consider the Welsh economy. Many co-operatives and community businesses do not have the capital to back them up. The Assembly needs to address this through the community loan fund for Wales, which is a partnership between Finance Wales and HSBC Bank, using European regional development fund money.

The Assembly is also providing funding to Community Enterprise Wales, which represents the interests of community businesses and encourages their development by fostering communication among individual enterprises and between business and support agencies. Finance Wales will also establish a fund to support co-operative buy-outs when proprietors of small firms wish to retire and have no successors to whom to pass on the business, which is quite common in Wales. We have seen successful family businesses where the children have not wanted to take on the business but the employees know how to run it. It is essential that we encourage this type of development. Local government also has a central role to play in tackling poverty and deprivation, and has been given an enhanced community leadership role under the Local Government Act 2000. Local authorities will have a general power to promote social, economic and environmental wellbeing in their areas. They will also have a duty to prepare community strategies setting out how they intend to promote the wellbeing of their communities.

Bydd Cyllid Cymru yn sefydlu cronfa i gefnogi pryniadau cydweithredol pan fydd perchnogion cwmniâu bach yn dymuno ymddeol heb fod ganddynt unrhyw olynwyr y gallant drosglwyddo'r busnes iddynt, sydd yn eithaf cyffredin yng Nghymru. Mae gan lywodraeth leol rôl ganolog i'w chwarae hefyd wrth fynd i'r afael â thlodi ac amddifadedd, a chafodd well rôl o ran arwain cymunedau o dan Ddeddf Llywodraeth Leol 2000. Bydd gan awdurdodau lleol bŵer cyffredinol i hyrwyddo lles cymdeithasol, economaidd ac amgylcheddol yn eu hardaloedd. Bydd ganddynt ddyletswydd hefyd i baratoi strategaethau cymunedol yn nodi sut y bwriadant hyrwyddo lles eu cymunedau.

The Assembly has undertaken to ask all its sponsored public bodies and the NHS in Wales to play their full part in these strategies. Members will be pleased that we have identified post offices as vital social institutions, particularly in rural areas and some deprived urban areas. People should have easy access to post offices, which are important to quality of life in a community. This report shows how social and economic circumstances affect people's health. A new inequalities in health fund has been established to support local action to address inequalities in health. Access to basic health services is an issue. The fund, which has £4 million available in 2001-02, will help to develop the health improvement component of Communities First. The fund will support action in deprived communities and work with the vulnerable and disadvantaged groups. Its priority in the first year is coronary heart disease and its causes. The Assembly, which has discussed coronary heart disease on many occasions, regards this as a priority.

Domestic violence is also a concern. We have joined with the Home Office in publicity campaigns and we are committed to funding Welsh Women's Aid and women's refuges in Wales. As the report notes, the impact of social disadvantage on young people is acute and can trigger a lifetime of disengagement and exclusion from society. 'Extending Entitlement' has been widely welcomed in Wales and represents a distinctive, made-in-Wales approach designed to make the most effective use of resources provided by a variety of agencies and organisations to support young people. We hope to bring forward draft subordinate legislation for consultation later in the year.

The budget for the coming year already contains significant additional resources to permit improvements in existing youth services. Priority areas include the provision of full-time youth workers, the refurbishment of youth facilities and the development of

You will be aware that from April 2001 the newly established National Council for Education and Training for Wales will have an important role in responding to the 'Betterwales.com' targets for lifelong learning. The work of the council will be vital to underpin the evolving national economic development strategy in Wales. We are also creating Careers Wales, which is an impartial and enhanced all-age advice and guidance service.

The Government's welfare to work programme is an important element of our strategy. The achievements of the New Deal are there for all to see. Over 28,000 people have left the programme to enter new jobs: 17,800 young people, 3,700 long-term unemployed, 5,400 single parents and, via a pilot scheme in south Wales, 900 disabled people.

There is much in the report that I could discuss, if I had the time to do so. It is comprehensive, but should be even more detailed. Local Government and Housing Committee members share that view and I will work with them over the next months to develop aspects of the report. I ask Members to receive it as it is today. They should consider, in depth, the format of further reports according to size, distribution and distinctiveness of style. I commend this motion to you.

Deciding where to begin must have been a problem. I think that we must start with a definition of social inclusion because it can mean different things to different people. It is important that we start from common ground, and that there is a clear definition that is accepted by everyone. Most people can appreciate what social exclusion is and what its causes are, namely poverty, poor homes and health and poor access to services. We therefore assume that social inclusion must be the opposite, where those needs have been met. If you find a way of tackling social exclusion, then presumably you have created social inclusion. However, no matter which way you approach this, there must be clarity.

Starting from an agreed definition, we should be better able to map the current situation. That is acknowledged in the report. It states that we started with a social exclusion action plan, drafted in February 2000, which outlined clear objectives with delivery dates. One action mentioned in that plan was a mapping exercise to establish a baseline of Assembly policies that would impact on social exclusion. In my view, this report does little more than elaborate on that mapping exercise. It gives a good description of all the policies in each Assembly portfolio. However, it does not progress any of the programmes, nor does it show what we hope to achieve by next year.

It is one of the most important reports that the Assembly must provide. Perhaps we should consider it to be a 'state of the nation' annual report. It could provide the platform on which the Assembly could illustrate annually how it is improving all aspects of life in Wales. As was mentioned, much work has been done on assessing the current situation. We have the index of multiple deprivation and 'Mapping Social Exclusion in Wales'. However, that was published in 1999. When will the next such report be published? Perhaps we should consider publishing a similar report annually to accompany the social disadvantage report.

One group that suffers from social exclusion is women. Given that today is International Women's Day, let us consider them. The University of Bangor estimates that 245,000 women in Wales live on or close to the poverty line. Women, on average, have lower paid jobs than men, and according to the Equal Opportunities Commission Wales, they represent the most significant group of socially excluded members of society. As Edwina said, women who experience domestic violence particularly suffer from social exclusion.

In rural communities, social exclusion can be acute. The crisis in agriculture and its disastrous effects on farm incomes has had a knock-on effect on the entire rural economy. In rural Wales, benefit take-up is low, information access is poor, and there is a perceived stigma about collecting welfare payments, which can be heightened in a small community. As Edwina said, the closure of village shops, pubs and post offices has robbed many smaller communities of vital services and a community focus. Social exclusion in rural areas can be hidden and can exist alongside affluent areas. There are pockets of exclusion in relatively affluent areas. One way in which we measure affluence is through car ownership, for example. However, in a rural area, not having access to a car is not an option. You must have a car to be able to get around. The Select Committee on Welsh Affairs, in its recently published report on social exclusion, touched on many of these points. Plaid Cymru's amendment alludes to the report's recommendations, which were put forward for this Assembly to follow up. We want to know where the Government stands on those recommendations, which ones will be accepted and, if they are accepted, how and when they will be implemented.

Government's overarching strategies. Communities First is an obvious example. Plaid Cymru will support that, but it would rather see community action zones being developed, drawing together all the agencies for health, education, housing and community safety into one coherent, strategic approach. We could then develop an overall plan with communities and encourage them to develop their own projects and streamline, and rationalise the funding, as Edwina said, by channelling it through the strategic plan and delivering it through identified partnerships. The Minister made a comment in Committee in November that community groups can directly access funding through Communities First. What are the mechanisms for doing that?

The Minister highlighted the fact that there are a few of weaknesses in this report. It does not give a clear outline of the Government's intentions for next year. It does not set out an action plan with aims and objectives. We would like to see reference made to community development work, which is fundamental to nearly all the policies. For example, what kind of standards will be set and how will we develop community capacity? The report does not show the input from the voluntary sector and other agencies in tackling social inclusion. Having said that, drawing everything together has been quite an undertaking.

We must recognise that this is the first report. It is a starting point. By next year, we would like the report to be published in a totally different format with, perhaps, quarterly reports being sent to Committees. We accept this report, but we look forward to next year's report with great anticipation.

Christine Chapman: I welcome the update on social inclusion. It is good to know that the Assembly is keeping to its commitment to tackle this issue strategically and practically. I welcome that. However, I want to concentrate on one aspect, namely the role of Objective 1 and, particularly, the need for partnership.

The reinvigoration of the economy in Wales's poorest areas is a major if not determining factor in our efforts to successfully tackle the deprivation and exclusion faced by many of our communities. However, to put matters into context, thanks to the Labour Government, the economy is getting stronger. There are more people in work, and in work they are able to benefit from the minimum wage. That is good news. Some of them might also benefit from other initiatives, such as the working families tax credit. However, there is still much to be done to deal with the structural problems that lead to unemployment and social exclusion. No-one denies that.

The good news on Objective 1 is that despite its earlier difficulties as a new programme, it is now starting to deliver. There has understandably been some cynicism, because, to be fair, people do not believe that change will happen until they see it happening for themselves. In Objective 1 areas, projects worth over £100 million have been approved. Every week, we hear about projects that will start to address the structural problems in our communities. That will mean much to the people whom we represent. For example, it means that the barriers to learning are being broken down. We are talking about people who, under the last Government, saw their life chances destroyed. As someone who serves a Valley community, I can testify to that. Those same people are now being invited to take an active role in society once again. That is what I want for the people whom I represent.

This is about keeping our talent and innovation in Wales. Wales will be seen as a new and confident nation, able to hold its head up in the new, global economy. I hope that Anne Robinson is listening today, because we did not appreciate her comments. This is about future generations benefiting from the legacy that we will create.

Helen Mary Jones: I agree with your comments about the potential for Objective 1 to deliver for our communities. However, do you not agree that it is a pity—given the amount of money that Gordon Brown could have given away yesterday—that he did not choose to give the Assembly additional funds to provide match funding for Objective 1 projects? If he had, the Assembly would not need to take that money out of core budgets for hospitals and schools.

Christine Chapman: You know that Gordon Brown gave £100 million to the Assembly, and that he gave us extra money last July over and above the Barnett formula.

It is no coincidence that countries like Sweden have been successful. It is because of their consensual approach. We could follow that example in Wales. When we talk about building the economy to tackle social exclusion, we must have partnership. That partnership must include the public, voluntary and, more importantly, the private sectors. It must work in ways in which these partners have never worked before. No one sector has all the answers, but, by working together, we can come up with solutions.

I turn to the business sector. We recently heard criticism from some business organisations in Wales regarding their level of influence and engagement with the Assembly. We must address that. As Chair of the Objective 1 Programme Monitoring Committee, I have recently picked up vibes about frustrations in the private sector. I refer to issues such as time, resources and the perceived over-complexity of Objective 1 processes. These are real issues, which we

The fact that people in the public, private and voluntary sectors snipe at each other is not helpful. Successful economies are underpinned by social relationships, which help people to collaborate. We see such relationships between banks and businesses in Japan and Germany, the co-operative relationships between craft producers in northern Italy and the social networks that thread through Silicon Valley in California. We know that good, social relationships create social capital.

The Presiding Officer: Order. I know that today's session has been extended, but you have had over six minutes. Please conclude your speech.

Christine Chapman: Over many years, I have worked closely with business and my impressions are that the most successful businesses are those that engage with communities, such as Tower colliery, for example. If we are to tackle social exclusion, we must stop bickering and get on with the task of making Wales prosperous.

David Melding: A debate on the social inclusion report provides us with a useful means to analyse a wide range of policy areas. However, I will address my remarks to the implications for health, social care and public and community involvement.

I want to emphasise a few areas concerning health. The provision of modern, primary care in the poorest areas is something that must be stressed and delivered in a targeted way. I am particularly concerned about the control and treatment of chronic diseases. In this respect, the standard mortality rate of people under 65 should be targeted. At the moment, we look at mortality under 75. That misses out a lot of premature deaths in many of our poorest areas such as the Valleys. I hope that we can use that measure and gather the data locally within local health groups.

The capital stock of primary care needs to be modernised. This must be targeted, particularly in the Valleys, where there are some poor buildings. We must have innovative and modern primary health care. You cannot have that in old buildings where you have to use the front room of what was once a residential dwelling. We must have buildings that are fit for their purpose, designed in a modern, efficient way. The number of GPs in the Valleys must also be increased, because there may be problems with a higher rate of retirement in the next few years.

My second point relates to substance misuse. We must re-examine some of our strategies. It is time for the Assembly to look at an alcohol action plan, because alcohol has a big impact on crime, child protection, health and premature death. It always amazes me that we do not emphasise how much alcohol is involved in cardiac disease, for instance. It is not emphasised enough. It causes premature death at a rate not far short of that caused by tobacco, yet this is not a public health message that is commonly disseminated. I also question whether alcohol should be in the same strategy as drugs. Drugs are illicit and alcohol is obviously legal. Therefore, combining these two is not always advisable. Finally, the treatment of those who are dependent on substances must be improved in a community and residential context. The need for acute, residential de-toxification treatment is often great. Patients can currently wait for over a year after presenting for help and treatment. That is not the best level of response for people in that sorry state.

Children's health deserves more attention and specialist analysis. There are a few issues with which we could start. Improving the level of nutrition and exercise among young people would go a long way to preventing disease in later life. There is increasing evidence that reducing the level of saturated

fat and, more positively, increasing the consumption of fresh fruit and vegetables in a person's diet can have a dramatic impact on wellbeing. If the level of exercise that people adopt when they are young becomes a habit and is sustained in adulthood, it can give them a healthy lifestyle. If you do not acquire these habits when you are young, it may be more difficult to acquire them later in life.

We all acknowledge that prevention of accidents is an important policy, but we have found it difficult to advance and achieve meaningful targets. Accidental death is the second most common cause of death among children and young people. We must address it as an urgent problem. I am concerned that the number of deaths caused by motor vehicles continues to rise among children, while the overall rate for the population declines. We must tackle that. One way would be to have a more comprehensive speed control programme in urban areas where it would be illegal to drive cars at over 20 mph. If you collide with a child at 20 mph, the chances are that the child will survive. If you collide at 30 mph, the chances are the child will die. If you collide at 40 mph, it is almost certain the child will die. We must take some action. We know what needs to be done, so why are we not doing it?

It is important that children have safe areas in which to play, because that impacts on socially deprived communities. We need safe play areas that are protected from crime, where there are safe equipment and facilities. Many injuries are caused by hard surfaces and inappropriate apparatus. We need to challenge this quickly.

On social care, I welcome the emphasis on youth inclusion programmes. Like Aristotle, I am convinced that people do not choose to be bad, but that it happens through a complicated series of circumstances. People then acquire a habit or attitude in adult life

Key factors among those who used to be called social delinquents—I do not like that phrase—are their level of social skills and ability to talk meaningfully to other people, their shyness and difficulty in forming personal relationships and their lack of literacy and numeracy. These factors are dramatically higher among those who have some contact with the youth justice system. That needs a targeted approach.

I had hoped to comment on public involvement, but I will not get that far, and I have already had the Presiding Officer's indulgence—

The Presiding Officer: Only because you quoted Aristotle.

David Melding: I should not have mentioned your indulgence, my luck was already running out.

We are all committed to improving the educational attainment of care leavers. We must set targets for that. I remind you that the majority of street prostitutes have been in the care system, which they leave for prostitution. That is a disgrace, and we must sort it out.

Peter Law: I warmly welcome the Minister's social disadvantage report today. It is a move in the right direction and I thank her for presenting it. It is important to all of us in Wales, particularly to those of us who live in socially deprived areas. I am touched that any Conservatives are present this morning. Half of them are here, the other half are being paid to attend the Tory party conference in Swansea, which started this morning, therefore we are subsidising them. However, I was surprised that any turned up. There is no point in them returning because after yesterday's budget proposals, they are facing the political black velvet. I wanted to remind them of that.

Yr ydym oll yn ymrwymedig i wella cyrhaeddiad addysgol y rhai sydd yn gadael gofal. Rhaid inni bennu targedau ar gyfer hynny. Fe'ch atgoffaf fod y mwyafrif o buteiniaid y stryd wedi bod yn y system gofal, a adawant ar gyfer bywyd o buteindra. Mae hynny'n warthus, a rhaid inni ddatrys y broblem.

Peter Law: Croesawaf adroddiad y Gweinidog ar anfantais gymdeithasol heddiw yn gynnes. Mae'n gam i'r cyfeiriad iawn a diolchaf iddi am ei gyflwyno. Mae'n bwysig i bob un ohonom yng Nghymru, yn arbennig y rheini ohonom sydd yn byw mewn ardaloedd cymdeithasol-ddifreintiedig. Mae'n braf gweld bod Ceidwadwyr yma y bore yma. Mae eu hanner yma, a'r hanner arall yn cael eu talu i fynychu cynhadledd y blaid Doriadd yn Abertawe, a ddechreuodd y bore yma, felly yr ydym yn eu cynnal hwy. Many of the problems that this report addresses were created by past Tory Governments. It is important to me that we remember that, because I live in a socially disadvantaged area and witness such problems daily. What is social disadvantage? If we do not live in it, how many of us appreciate what it is? Do you live in it by choice, or do you have no choice? In many cases, there is no choice. People are born into it, and they have no opportunity to move away from it. That is why it is so important to develop Communities First, as outlined in the report, to undertake positive work on the local health alliances, to develop healthy living centres and give people the opportunity to utilise them as well as to develop credit unions through the community development fund.

People are tackling the lack of literacy, and I agree with David Melding's personal concerns on that. In fairness to him, for a Tory, he has a spark of decency. He is right about the lack of literacy, but we will not ask why there is such a problem because it would probably reflect badly on the Government during 19 years or so before Labour returned to Government. However, it is a big problem that must be addressed. Local government needs to implement community strategies, if it is to make a difference in these poor communities that concern us.

Post offices also have a part to play. They must demonstrate a social conscience, which we have not yet seen. That needs to happen because post offices are important to small communities. The private sector also has a role. In Blaenau Gwent, 64 per cent of household incomes are less than £10,000 per year. Think about that. There is no such thing as a passenger rail service, which others take for granted. There are no corporate restaurants—few could afford to eat in them. However, if you wanted a meal somewhere—apart from nice public houses and small cafes, which people do well to run—there are no Beefeaters or Harvesters. There are no Travelodges or three-star hotels or private leisure facilities that others take for granted, such as bowling alleys or cinemas. The only

Dafydd Wigley: I welcome the report, but I believe that the debate and its result would be more positive if the Plaid Cymru amendment were adopted. It calls for a detailed statement on how the Government intends to achieve the recommendations set out in the Welsh Affairs Select Committee's report. These recommendations are listed in the report in a way that makes it easy to identify and acknowledge those that are the Assembly's responsibility. Thirty-seven of the report's recommendations have been specifically referred to the Assembly's attention. As the Select Committee is a cross-party Committee, the report is supported by every party. We should take these points seriously.

There are several points that we should consider. For example, how to support children leaving care, the need for a strategy for those who suffer from domestic violence, the need to commission research into the extent and nature of disability in Wales, the need for welfare rights and benefits services across Wales and the need for action on rural poverty.

I would like to concentrate on one point that arises from paragraph 122 of the Select Committee's report. It calls on the Assembly to tackle housing problems in Wales. I emphasise this because it does not receive enough attention in our report. The problems

related to the condition of housing in Wales contribute substantially to social deprivation. I have listened to the Minister's opening comments but I assume that she still opposes conducting a detailed review of housing need in Wales on the basis of national guidelines, namely a housing needs audit. That is needed. Although local authorities have a responsibility to monitor the situation, there are no strict guidelines to define what are the yardsticks for measuring housing need. We need consistent statistics across Wales.

In paragraph 2.3 of the report before us today, we see that the housing problem is acknowledged as something that causes social deprivation. However, if we mean what is said in that paragraph, we should act to ensure that we have the necessary statistics.

It is important to note, in the light of Gordon Brown's budget statement yesterday, that income tax has hit people on low incomes increasingly hard over the past 20 years. That has contributed to the problems of those who have been excluded. During those 20 years, the proportion of income paid in taxes by the 20 per cent with the highest incomes in society has fallen from 37 per cent to 35 per cent. During the same period, the taxes paid by the 20 per cent with the lowest income in society has increased from 31 per cent to 38 per cent. That reflects the fact that the policies of successive governments have failed to deal with the real problems of poverty. Whatever steps the Assembly must take to deal with social disadvantage, they will have to be taken within the context of the Treasury's general policies. It concerns me, therefore, that there is an insufficient number of radical and far-reaching measures available to try to overcome poverty as a fundamental part of the Treasury's policies.

In referring to poverty, I also refer to rural poverty, to which the Minister alluded in opening the debate. We must acknowledge this poverty, along with the poverty in our industrial areas. It is unacceptable, in this day and age, that 37 per cent of children in Wales live in poverty.

Finally, I will mention disability. I learnt another definition of that word in Sweden, namely that

'Handicap is a relationship between a disabled person and his or her environment, be that the physical environment, the social environment or the psychological environment.'

We may or may not be able to do something about the disability, but we almost always can do something about the degree to which the disability becomes a handicap. Therefore, all of us who can influence the physical, social or psychological environment have a responsibility to do so. The responsibility must be taken in the context of the report we are discussing today. The extent of disability in Wales is greater than in other parts of these islands. We need the relevant statistics, as the Select Committee indicated. There is a considerable amount of work to be done on the disability agenda, and I hope that today's report stimulates action in that direction.

In the family centre on the estate, parenting classes are attended by young mums, and also by young dads. That is another welcome move. The estate now holds a summer fete. Bush and Park Estate is now functioning properly and as it was intended to function—not as a place for the council to put people, but as a community where people look after each other. Geraint Davies: I am sorry Brian, I do not have time to take an intervention.

The Valleys suffer some of the worst social problems, not just unemployment, but problems with transport, health, education and childcare. Lack of access to transport is a major cause of social exclusion because the public transport infrastructure in our communities is often poor. We have a high percentage of households without access to a car. Merthyr Tydfil, Blaenau Gwent and Rhondda Cynon Taff are at the top of the league table, with around 40 per cent of households not owning a car. The areas may be densely populated, but many households are isolated, often situated high up on the valley sides, which again increases social exclusion. Poor health is another major cause of social exclusion. Again, Merthyr Tydfil, Blaenau Gwent and Rhondda Cynon Taff are at the top of the league tables, with the highest percentage—more than 20 per cent—of the population with limiting, long-term illness in Wales, many of whom are examiners who still await their compensation.

I raise a point about the need for better primary care facilities, which are often diabolical. We are unable to tackle this problem at the moment because low rental levels make the schemes unviable. A scheme exists in England to make these facilities available but that is not happening in Wales. We are still waiting for a report from the Department of Health. We are also still waiting for a replacement hospital for Llwynypia.

As for education, far too many primary schools have classes with over 30 pupils, and far too many pupils qualify for free school meals. The proportion of pupils in primary and secondary schools who are entitled to

Unwaith eto, mae Merthyr Tudful, Blaenau Gwent a Rhondda Cynon Taf ar frig tablau'r gynghrair, gyda'r canran uchaf—mwy nag 20 y cant—o'r boblogaeth â salwch cyfyngol, tymor hir yng Nghymru, llawer ohonynt yn gyn-lowyr sydd yn aros o hyd am eu hiawndal.

Codaf bwynt am yr angen am gyfleusterau gofal sylfaenol, sydd yn aml yn gythreulig o wael. Ni allwn fynd i'r afael â'r broblem hon ar hyn o bryd gan fod lefelau rhentu isel yn gwneud y cynlluniau'n anymarferol. Bodola cynllun yn Lloegr sydd yn sicrhau bod y cyfleusterau hyn ar gael ond nid yw hyn yn digwydd yng Nghymru. Yr ydym yn aros o hyd am adroddiad gan yr Adran Iechyd. Yr ydym yn aros o hyd hefyd am ysbtyt newydd i Llwynypia.

O ran addysg, mae gan lawer gormod o ysgolion cynradd ddosbarthiadau gyda mwy na 30 o ddisgyblion, ac mae llawer gormod o'r disgyblion yn gymwys i gael prydau bwyd ysgol am ddim. Mae cyfran y

free school meals places Merthyr Tydfil, Blaenau Gwent and Rhondda Cynon Taff among the top four deprived areas. The education system, for many reasons, has failed a huge proportion of our residents. One in three of the population in these areas is defined as innumerate, and one in three is defined as illiterate. Being unable to read, write or count is total exclusion.

Finally, in order to make the Valleys more attractive, it is essential to see the connections between all these factors. The Valleys have suffered deprivation and exclusion for far too long. It is now time to develop a cross-cutting strategy, across economic development, education and training, the environment, health, planning and transport. That is overdue. We need it immediately to deal with the problems faced by my constituents daily.

The Presiding Officer: Before I call Peter Black to speak, I draw Members' attention to the fact that there are five more speakers listed for this debate and four listed for the debate on school class sizes that follows. The Deputy Presiding Officer and myself need to protect the time of the minority party debate and the short debate. I therefore appeal for brevity. That is not directed at Peter Black in particular; he just happens to be next in sequence.

Peter Black: We all know how many communities across Wales suffer from unemployment, poverty, unfit housing, poor health, inadequate transport provision, lack of skills and poor educational attainment. Those are just some of the problems that we must tackle in this social exclusion debate. We know that all those factors contribute to social exclusion and if we do not tackle them in a cross-cutting way and provide the right funding streams, this problem will continue.

The problem of social exclusion cannot be solved by throwing money at it. Although there is clearly a need to invest in public services in Wales—in training, education,

Mae ei hangen arnom ar unwaith i ddelio â'r problemau a wynebir gan fy etholwyr yn ddyddiol.

Y Llywydd: Cyn imi alw ar Peter Black i siarad, tynnaf sylw'r Aelodau at y ffaith fod pum siaradwr arall wedi eu rhestru ar gyfer y ddadl hon a phedwar wedi eu rhestru ar gyfer y ddadl a fydd yn dilyn ar faint dosbarthiadau ysgol. Mae angen i'r Dirprwy Lywydd a minnau sicrhau amser dadl y blaid leiafrifol a'r ddadl fer. Felly apeliaf arnoch i fod yn fyr a chryno. Ni chyfeirir hyn at Peter Black yn arbennig; ond ef yw'r nesaf yn ôl y drefn.

Peter Black: Gŵyr pob un ohonom faint o gymunedau sydd yn dioddef ledled Cymru o ddiweithdra, tlodi, tai anaddas, iechyd gwael, darpariaeth annigonol o ran trafnidiaeth, prinder sgiliau a chyrhaeddiad addysgiadol gwael. Rhai o'r problemau y mae'n rhaid inni fynd i'r afael â hwy yn y ddadl hon ar allgáu cymdeithasol ydynt yn unig. Gwyddom fod yr holl ffactorau hynny'n cyfrannu at allgáu cymdeithasol ac os nad awn i'r afael â hwy mewn ffordd drawsbynciol gan ddarparu'r ffrydiau ariannu cywir, bydd y broblem hon yn parhau.

Ni ellir datrys problem allgáu cymdeithasol drwy daflu arian ati. Er ei bod yn amlwg bod angen buddsoddi mewn gwasanaethau cyhoeddus yng Nghymru—mewn

business support and so on—we can only help socially excluded communities by targeting resources in the most effective way and allowing them to find their own solutions with our guidance and help. That is not an easy option for government, as it means relinquishing control to the community. Neither is it an easy option for the communities, as it means they have to confront their problems and work in partnership with others to overcome them. Ultimately, however, regeneration only works if it comes from within the community. To make it work, it is important that the right local people come forward to drive it and that expectations are managed. It is also important that investment and solutions are long-term, have the community's support and provide the jobs, social support and environmental changes to allow the community to regain its self-confidence.

Last Friday, I attended the opening of the Phoenix centre in Townhill, Swansea. Townhill is a success in many ways. The Phoenix centre and the surrounding sports facilities are the kind of development that every deprived community needs. The business starter units are fully subscribed and the community facilities in the centre and the nearby community centre are second to none. The huge investment in Townhill and Mayhill has started to transform the community's environment.

The community has lifted itself from being the third most deprived ward in Wales to being eighth or ninth on the list. Enormous effort and resources were needed to achieve that improvement. In this community, expectations were not managed at the beginning, mistakes were made and partnerships were forged out of arguments and recrimination. That it has got this far is a tribute to the tenacity of all those involved. However, there are important lessons to be learned for other communities in Wales. We should all pay tribute to the work of Ian Spratling, who died last week. His commitment and dedication helped to turn the Townhill project around.

Nid yw'n opsiwn hawdd ychwaith i'r cymunedau, gan ei fod yn golygu bod yn rhaid iddynt wynebu eu problemau a gweithio mewn partneriaeth ag eraill i'w goresgyn. Yn y pen draw, fodd bynnag, dim ond os daw o'r tu mewn i'r gymuned y bydd adfywio yn gweithio. Er mwyn gwneud iddo weithio, mae'n bwysig bod y bobl leol iawn yn dod ymlaen i'w hybu ac y rheolir y disgwyliadau. Mae'n bwysig hefyd bod buddsoddiad ac atebion yn rhai tymor hir, bod cefnogaeth y gymuned ganddynt ac y darperir y swyddi, y gefnogaeth gymdeithasol a'r newidiadau amgylcheddol i alluogi'r gymuned i adennill ei hunanhyder.

Ddydd Gwener diwethaf, mynchais agoriad canolfan Phoenix yn Townhill, Abertawe. Mae Townhill yn llwyddiant mewn sawl ffordd. Canolfan Phoenix a'r cyfleusterau chwaraeon sydd o'i hamgylch yw'r math o ddatblygiad sydd ei angen ar bob cymuned ddifreintiedig. Mae'r unedau dechrau busnes wedi eu llenwi ac mae'r cyfleusterau cymunedol yn y ganolfan a'r ganolfan gymunedol gyfagos yn rhagorol. Mae'r buddsoddiad enfawr yn Townhill a Mayhill wedi dechrau trawsnewid amgylchedd y gymuned.

Arferai'r gymuned fod yn drydydd ar restr y wardiau mwyaf difreintiedig yng Nghymru ond mae wedi gwella ei hun a bellach hi yw'r wythfed neu'r nawfed ar y rhestr. Yr oedd angen ymdrech ac adnoddau enfawr i gyflawni'r gwelliant hwnnw. Yn y gymuned hon, ni reolwyd disgwyliadau ar y cychwyn, gwnaethpwyd camgymeriadau a lluniwyd partneriaethau o ddadleuon ac edliwiadau. Mae'r ffaith iddi lwyddo fel hyn yn deyrnged i ddycnwch pawb a oedd yn gysylltiedig â hyn. Fodd bynnag, mae gwersi pwysig i'w dysgu ar gyfer cymunedau eraill yng Nghymru. Dylem oll dalu teyrnged i waith Ian Spratling, a fu farw yr wythnos diwethaf. Bu ei ymrwymiad a'i ymroddiad ef o

gymorth i drawsnewid prosiect Townhill.

I was impressed earlier this year when I visited the community of Knowle West in south Bristol. This large council estate has suffered for many years from high levels of unemployment, drug problems, dereliction and many other problems. Local mothers of addicts formed an action group in 1994 following an outbreak of heroin abuse on the estate. They forced the authorities to listen to them and, two years ago, opened a centre on the estate funded by government money, locally-raised money and a donation from John Paul Getty. The centre looks after drug users and is home to outreach workers, a needle exchange scheme and counselling services. They have also encouraged the growth of community-based businesses, leading to the transformation of a derelict street of shops into a thriving shopping centre employing local people. In addition, a security business and a building company have been set up. Both employ local people, use New Deal employees and specialise in helping people with a criminal record back into work. The building company recently bought an old council house on the estate, did it up and sold it for a profit. Local people have also taken over an old school and turned it into a community resource. There is a community development trust on the estate. One sign of the success of these initiatives is that unemployment has fallen and there is an increased awareness of the drug problem.

That initiative took place despite the council, rather than with its assistance. However, it highlights what can be done if we can identify the right people and encourage them to build from within the community. Wales can learn distinct lessons from such communities. In Communities First, we are starting to put together the strategies that will enable us to replicate that across communities in Wales. This report on social disadvantage paints a bleak picture of communities across Wales. However, it also sets out what is being done to address these problems. I hope that by the time future reports are published, our task will be easier and the situation less severe.

Mae'r ystad tai cyngor fawr hon wedi dioddef ers blynnyddoedd lawer o lefelau uchel o ddiweithdra, problemau cyffuriau, cyflwr adfeiliadig yr ystad a llawer o broblemau eraill. Ffurfiodd mamau lleol y rhai a oedd yn gaeth i gyffuriau grŵp gweithredu yn 1994 yn dilyn achosion helaeth o gamddefnyddio heroin ar yr ystad. Gorfodasant yr awdurdodau i wrando arnynt a, dwy flynedd yn ôl, agorwyd canolfan ar yr ystad wedi ei hariannu gan arian y llywodraeth, arian a godwyd yn lleol a rhodd gan John Paul Getty. Mae'r ganolfan yn gofalu am ddefnyddwyr cyffuriau ac mae'n gartref i weithwyr allgyrch, cynllun cyfnewid nodwyddau a gwasanaethau cynggori. Maent hefyd wedi annog twf busnesau yn y gymuned, gan arwain at drawsffurfio stryd adfeiliadig o siopau yn ganolfan siopa lewyrchus sydd yn cyflogi pobl leol. Yn ogystal, sefydlwyd busnes diogelwch a chwmni adeiladu. Mae'r ddau yn cyflogi pobl leol, yn defnyddio cyflogigion y Fargen Newydd ac yn arbenigo mewn helpu pobl â record droseddol i ddychwelyd i'r waith. Yn ddiweddar, prynodd y cwmni adeiladu hen dŷ cyngor ar yr ystad, ei adnewyddu a'i werthu am elw. Mae pobl leol hefyd wedi meddiannu hen ysgol a'i throi yn adnodd cymunedol. Mae ymddiriedolaeth datblygu cymunedol ar yr ystad. Un arwydd o lwyddiant y mentrau hyn yw bod diweithdra wedi gostwng a bod ymwybyddiaeth gynyddol o'r broblem gyffuriau.

Cyflawnwyd y fenter honno er gwaethaf y cyngor, yn hytrach na chyda'i gymorth. Fodd bynnag, amliga'r hyn y gellir ei wneud os gallwn ddod o hyd i'r bobl iawn a'u hannog i adeiladu o'r tu mewn i'r gymuned. Gall Cymru ddysgu gwersi penodol o gymunedau o'r fath. Val Feld: I warmly welcome this report, and our progress in tackling these problems. It is clear from the commitment that has been shown by all Cabinet Ministers and by the Assembly, that there is a determination to tackle these problems. I was pleased to hear Edwina say that she saw this as the beginning, or at least a stage, of a process. We have a great deal of work to do.

The document demonstrates the importance of partnership, not only within Wales, but also between the Assembly and central Government. Central Government policies are enormously important, as the Welsh Affairs Select Committee report demonstrates.

I will make a couple of political points to Dafydd and Geraint. They need new researchers because whoever told them that Labour's policies on poverty were not having an impact failed to take account of a report published two weeks ago by the Child Poverty Action Group, which said that Gordon Brown's policies were projected to halve child poverty in five years. Central Government's policies are enormously important in terms of our ability to deliver.

I take up the question of how this work is developed. I ask Edwina, having clearly focused on places where poverty and deprivation are high, to ensure that there is a clear focus on the people who experience poverty and deprivation. I felt from reading the document that that focus is not there now. An analysis and understanding of the circumstances of those people must inform any programme. The brunt of poverty is overwhelmingly borne by women—young women who are single parents, and elderly women who are pensioners and who have not accrued occupational pensions.

Poverty and exclusion is overwhelmingly found among disabled people, who represent one in six of our population—about which I agree with Dafydd Wigley—and among our

Val Feld: Croesawaf yr adroddiad hwn yn gynnes, a'n cynnydd wrth fynd i'r afael â'r problemau hyn. Mae'n amlwg o'r ymrwymiad a ddangoswyd gan holl Aelodau'r Cabinet a chan y Cynulliad, bod penderfyniad i fynd i'r afael â'r problemau hyn. black and ethnic minority communities. We must tailor policies for them. One objective in the document is to give children from disadvantaged backgrounds a better start through family literacy schemes. If those schemes are aimed at single parents who may be working, there are questions about how and when they are developed. In the Hafod area of my constituency where there are many illiterate Bangladeshi women, the way in which those programmes are developed will be critical. I welcome our progress, but ask Edwina whether, in the next stages, she could move the focus on to the people in those communities, and to those communities that we have not identified as high priority due to poverty, but which also need help.

The Minister for Finance, Local Government and Communities (Edwina Hart): We live in a society of have and have-nots. As politicians, we have a moral, social and economic responsibility to tackle the issue of poverty and self-worth by ensuring that our policies are properly focused. This means engaging with people, a point to which Val referred. This report is the beginning not the end of a task that requires a unity of purpose on the part of all Assembly Members and Committees on areas such as health, education or local government. It will also require partnership with central Government.

Much has been said about Gordon Brown's budget, but he is a Chancellor who understands the morality of poverty and deprivation issues. When you look at some of the systems that have been introduced, it is obvious that he is determined to tackle those issues. We should commend with conviction any politician who wants to tackle such issues that affect society. I feel strongly and passionately about that.

I thank Janet Ryder for her helpful comments. It is important that we work across Committees to develop these policy areas. I will work with the Local Government and Housing Committee and there is a role for the Education and Lifelong Learning and Health and Social Services Committees to play in this report. It is essential that we map

social exclusion properly and consider what type of interim reporting arrangements we need to ensure that all the policies are joined-up across those policy areas.

On health, I am in favour of combining drug and alcohol issues. Jane has positive examples of how this has worked across Wales. The other areas that you identify are key in terms of this agenda. Other areas that concern people are children's health and nutrition and exercise. We are beginning to tackle those issues within the Assembly. Members referred to accidents and the issue of children's play, which is linked to that. We have allocated money to ensure children's safety at play. We must recognise the breadth and depth of the issues that we must tackle.

I anticipated Peter Law's contribution. He made relevant points. Given where we live, some of us do not recognise poverty unless we go out of our way to find out about it. Let us be honest—the majority of us probably live in areas where we see an element of it, but not much. We must be honest that in our previous and current jobs we are not confronted with poverty on a daily basis. If I want to go shopping in Swansea, I take it for granted that it is only a matter of a 10-minute ride in the car. For many people, the notion of having a car and being able to go into town is not real.

On Dafydd Wigley's point on the Plaid Cymru amendment, I am not unhappy with the report of the Welsh Affairs Select Committee. I would be delighted to talk about it but I do not want to discuss it in the context of today's debate, which is about our report on social disadvantage. In the future we may discuss a Select Committee report but I would like to keep that separate from discussions of our reports. I assure Dafydd that the Committee on Equality of Opportunity has been asked to look at the issues arising from the 'Social Exclusion in Wales' report and invite the Chair of the Select Committee to attend. The Local Government and Housing Committee may

Rhagwelais gyfraniad Peter Law. Gwnaeth bwyntiau perthnasol. O ystyried ble yr ydym yn byw, nid yw rhai ohonom yn adnabod tlodi onid awn allan o'n ffordd i ddod i wybod amdano. Gadewch inni fod yn onest—mae'n debyg bod y mwyafrif ohonom yn byw mewn ardaloedd lle y mae elfen o dodi, ond nid llawer. Rhaid inni fod yn onest a dweud nad ydym, yn ein swyddi blaenorol a phresennol yn wynebu tlodi yn ddyddiol. Os wyf am fynd i siopa yn Abertawe, fe'i cymeraf yn ganiataol mai dim ond taith o 10 munud yn y car y mae hynny'n ei olygu. I lawer o bobl, nid yw'r syniad o gael car ac o allu mynd i'r dref yn real.

Ar bwynt Dafydd Wigley ar welliant Plaid Cymru, nid wyf yn anfodlon ar adroddiad y Pwyllgor Dethol ar Faterion Cymreig. Byddwn yn falch o siarad amdano ond nid wyf am ei drafod yng nghyd-destun dadl heddiw, sydd yn ymwnaed â'n hadroddiad ar anfantais gymdeithasol. Yn y dyfodol, efallai y trafodwn adroddiad Pwyllgor Dethol, ond hoffwn gadw hynny ar wahân i'n trafodaethau ar ein hadroddiadau ni. Rhoddaf sicrwydd i Dafydd fod y Pwyllgor Cyfle Cyfartal wedi cael cais i ymchwilio i'r materion sydd yn codi o'r adroddiad 'Social Exclusion in Wales' a gwahodd Cadeirydd y Pwyllgor Dethol i fod yn bresennol. Efallai yr hoffai'r Pwyllgor Llywodraeth Leol a Thai

like to consider what aspects of the report it would like to discuss in detail to advise me in the context of a fuller report. I oppose the amendment on that basis. Some of the work on how to develop the issues that arise would be more usefully done through Committee.

Geraint was good on facts and figures, but he did not offer any solutions. That was in marked contrast to Peter Black who talked about solutions and how communities have dealt with issues. I was pleased that Peter mentioned Ian Spratling—that has nothing to do with party politics. He was prominent in business and was committed to the process of devolution. He will be missed across the board. I used to see him on Saturday mornings at the butcher's where we would chat about current issues. More matters of state were discussed there sometimes than in the Cabinet offices on the fifth floor of this building.

It is useful to note that this is the start of a process in terms of the report. I make no bones about the fact that the report does not fulfil all my requirements. This is a developmental process. In our heart of hearts, all of us agree on the need to tackle poverty and social exclusion. We might differ on the mechanisms or the sums of money involved but we should support the report, undertake all the necessary work in Committee and try to work together across parties to tackle Wales's problems and not use any elements of the report to divide us.

**Cymeradwyo Adroddiad Grant Arbennig Maint Dosbarthiadau
 mewn Ysgolion Iau**
Approval of the Junior School Class Sizes Special Grant Report

The Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning (Jane Davidson): I propose that

the National Assembly, under section 88B of the Local Government Finance Act 1988, and in accordance with Standing Order No. 19.8, approves the Additional Revenue Funding for Local Authority Education Services Special Grant Report (No.4) (Wales) 2001, which was distributed to Assembly Members by e-mail and laid in the Table Office on 1 March 2001.

I am pleased to bring forward this special grant report for approval by the Assembly. It distributes an additional £26 million to local education authorities in Wales for school improvement. Of this, £20 million was set aside in our approved budget for 2001-02. We want authorities to use this significant amount of money to build on existing good work and to drive up standards in schools through a variety of approaches.

The first approach is the reduction of class sizes in primary schools. We have already come a long way on this. Three years ago, 30 per cent of reception and infant pupils in Wales were in classes of over 30 and there were more than 100 classes with over 35 pupils. Since 1998, we have phased in a statutory limit of 30 pupils per qualified teacher and we have provided over £31 million to recruit additional teachers and to build classrooms. Nearly 550 teachers have been taken on and over 70 classrooms provided.

Mae'n bleser gennyf gyflwyno'r adroddiad grant arbennig hwn i'w gymeradwyo gan y Cynulliad. Dyranna £26 miliwn ychwaengol i awdurdodau addysg lleol yng Nghymru er mwyn gwella ysgolion. Neilltuwyd £20 miliwn o'r swm hwnnw yn ein cyllideb a gymeradwywyd ar gyfer 2001-02. Yr ydym eisiau i awdurdodau ddefnyddio'r swm sylwedol hwn o arian i adeiladu ar y gwaith da a wneir eisoes ac i godi safonau mewn ysgolion drwy amryw ymagweddau.

Yr ymagwedd gyntaf yw lleihau maint dosbarthiadau mewn ysgolion cynradd. Yr ydym eisoes wedi gwneud cynnydd sylwedol ar hyn. Dair blynedd yn ôl, yr oedd 30 y cant o ddisgyblion dosbarthiadau derbyn a babanod yng Nghymru mewn dosbarthiadau o fwy na 30 ac yr oedd mwy na 100 o ddisbarthiadau gyda thros 35 o ddisgyblion. Ers 1998, yr ydym wedi cyflwyno uchafswm statudol o 30 o ddisgyblion fesul athro cymwys, a darparwyd dros £31 miliwn gennym i reciwtio athrawon ychwanegol ac i adeiladu ystafelloed dosbarth. Cyflogwyd bron i 550 o athrawon a darparwyd dros 70 o ystafelloedd dosbarth.

As a result, by September 2000, only 4.5 per cent of infant pupils in Wales were in classes of over 30 pupils. Only two classes contained over 35 pupils. The statutory limit will be fully implemented this September. Funding will continue to be provided at a rate of £13.6 million each year through the revenue settlement to ensure that authorities can maintain these smaller infant class sizes.

Now we want to build on this and tackle junior class sizes. In September 2000, 29 per cent of junior pupils were in classes of over 30 pupils. I want to see that figure cut significantly by next September. This special grant will enable local education authorities to direct extra funding to schools that need more junior class teachers or extra classrooms in order to reduce key stage 2 class sizes.

The second purpose for which we want authorities to use this grant is to improve standards at key stage 3, which involves pupils aged 11 to 14. Although all but two of the targets set for key stage 3 were achieved in 2000—they were missed in the English and Science tests—it is widely recognised that pupil performance loses pace and direction in these years of schooling. Authorities need to work with their secondary schools to find ways of building on the foundations laid in primary schools. This funding will help to support improvement at key stage 3.

I am also concerned about underperforming schools. We want all schools to perform to a high standard so that all our children receive the best possible education. Most authorities now have consistent arrangements for identifying and supporting underperforming schools. This funding will help make those arrangements more effective.

Yr ydym yn awr am adeiladu ar hyn a mynd i'r afael â maint dosbarthiadau disgyblion iau. Yn Medi 2000, yr oedd 29 y cant o ddisgyblion iau mewn dosbarthiadau â thros 30 o ddisgyblion. Hoffwn weld gostyngiad sylweddol yn y ffigur hwnnw erbyn mis Medi nesaf. Bydd y grant arbennig hwn yn galluogi awdurdodau addysg lleol i gyfeirio arian ychwanegol i'r ysgolion hynny sydd angen mwy o athrawon dosbarthiadau iau neu ystafelloedd dosbarth ychwanegol er mwyn lleihau maint ystafelloedd dosbarth cyfnod allweddol 2.

Er y cyflawnwyd pob un ond dau o'r targedau a osodwyd ar gyfer cyfnod allweddol 3 yn 2000—ni chawsant eu cyrraedd yn y profion Saesneg a Mathemateg—cydnabyddir yn gyffredinol fod perfformiad disgyblion yn arafu ac yn colli cyfeiriad yn ystod y blynnyddoedd addysgu hyn. Mae angen i awdurdodau weithio gyda'u hysgolion uwchradd i ganfod ffyrdd o adeiladu ar y sylfeini a osodwyd yn yr ysgolion cynradd cyntaf. Yr wyf hefyd yn pryderu am ysgolion sydd yn tanberfformio. Hoffem weld pob ysgol yn perfformio i safon uchel fel y gall pob un o'n plant dderbyn yr addysg orau bosibl. Mae gan y rhan fwyaf o awdurdodau drefniadau cyson erbyn hyn i nodi a chefnogi ysgolion sydd yn tanberfformio. Bydd yr arian hwn yn helpu i sicrhau bydd y trefniadau hynny yn fwy effeithiol.

The report specifies that £20 million of the grant is to be spent for the purposes that I have outlined, namely junior class sizes, key stage 3 and underperforming schools. The report gives authorities discretion to target this funding where they believe it will have most effect. As announced by the Minister for Finance, Local Government and Communities on 2 February, £6 million in funding is also being given and included in the special grant report to alleviate pressures on education budgets arising from the 2001 pay settlement for teachers. It can be used for any purpose, within the local school's budget, that contributes to improving school standards. That may include teachers or support staff, books, equipment and premises. However, there is a link with funding the costs of teachers passing through the threshold to the upper pay spine.

The Assembly has given a commitment to fully fund threshold costs. The sum of £26.5 million is already included in the local government revenue settlement for 2001-02, but the pay settlement will increase those costs, and the extra £6 million helps to provide for that. Any authority wishing to make a case for additional funding for the threshold payments will have to demonstrate that its costs are in excess of its share of the £26.5 million plus its share of the £2.5 million of the additional £6 million.

We will be monitoring the use of the funding. Authorities must report to us by the end of June on how they have used or plan to use the money. We will check for improved outcomes through the September primary class size count and results at the end of key stage 3 and to see if there is a reduction in the numbers of schools causing concern. I commend this report to Members.

Pauline Jarman: Plaid Cymru, in general, welcomes the additional funding in this report. However, it bears witness to the fact that the core funding for education is not what it should be. Otherwise, why would we need a special grant to remedy the situation?

Cymeradwyaf yr adroddiad hwn i'r Aelodau.

Pauline Jarman: Mae Plaid Cymru, yn gyffredinol, yn croesawu'r arian ychwanegol yn yr adroddiad hwn. Fodd bynnag, mae'n dyst i'r ffaith nad yw'r arian craidd ar gyfer addysg yn ddigonol. Fel arall, pam y byddai angen grant arbennig arnom i unioni'r

Many of the problems are longstanding. I share the Minister's concerns that there are more than 30 pupils in 29 per cent of junior school classes. I also endorse her remarks about the outcomes and how they will be monitored. What sanctions would be available to the Minister if she found that the expectation of the special grant is not being met?

I am, once again, perturbed by the fact that a school in Wrexham has this week been named and shamed as a failing school. To what extent, therefore, will the financial support in this grant repair the shattered morale in such schools?

Peter Black: I welcome this report. It is important that, while progress has been made since 1997 in reducing infant class sizes, junior class sizes have, effectively, stayed static, despite a slight reduction in the number of junior classes with more than 30 pupils. The latest figures show that, in September 2000, 23.4 per cent of key stage 2 classes in Wales had more than 30 pupils, and that 28.9 per cent of junior school pupils in Wales were being taught in classes of over 30 pupils. It is important, therefore, that we start to tackle this problem, now that we have got to grips with infant class sizes. I welcome the fact that a commitment to deal with this issue was included in the partnership agreement, and because it was a Liberal Democrat manifesto commitment during the Assembly election. If we are to deal with educational underachievement, we must reduce class sizes. The fact that we can direct money at this problem—money that will, hopefully, be incorporated in the revenue support grant once the problem has been resolved—is a way of dealing with it. Pauline Jarman's comments on how this grant is to be directed shows a clear misunderstanding of why it is being provided and why we must tackle the problem in this way.

Jonathan Morgan: While welcoming this initiative, I have a few points of interest and of concern. When the special grant report for infant class size reduction was introduced, we

Dengys y ffigurau diweddaraf, yn mis Medi 2000, bod mwy na 30 o ddisgyblion mewn 23.4 y cant o ddosbarthiadau cyfnod allweddol 2 yng Nghymru, a bod 28.9 y cant o ddisgyblion ysgolion iau yng Nghymru'n cael eu dysgu mewn dosbarthiadau â thros 30 o ddisgyblion. Mae'n bwysig, felly, ein bod yn dechrau mynd i'r afael â'r broblem hon, gan ein bod bellach wedi ymdrin â'r broblem o ran maint dosbarthiadau babanod. Jonathan Morgan: Er y croesawaf y fenter hon, mae gennyl rai pwyntiau o ddiddordeb a phryder. Pan gyflwynwyd yr adroddiad grant arbennig ar gyfer lleihau maint dosbarthiadau

had hoped that a similar scheme would be introduced almost immediately to reduce junior class sizes. The reason for that is simple: infants will move up to junior classes and the same pressures will exist in the junior section. It would have been easier had we introduced this initiative some months ago alongside the infant class size reduction scheme. Alleviating the pressure at one point of a child's educational development is all very well, but we must ensure that the same measures and the same level of resources are available at the next stage of educational development. Having said that, we welcome this initiative, albeit that it is rather late.

While looking at the list of targets, particularly reducing class sizes at key stage 2, improving attainment levels at key stage 3 and supporting underperforming schools, I am concerned that, in spending between £20 million and £26 million, we are perhaps attempting to spend it too broadly. Our preference would have been to target that money solely at the primary sector in reducing class sizes for key stage 2, and perhaps in employing classroom assistants. When I visit schools—I am sure that other Members find similar circumstances—primary school headteachers are crying out for classroom assistants. Teachers can do much with an extra person in the classroom. Often, they must rely on the goodwill of parents to come in and spend time with the children, or on members of the governing body. If this money were targeted not only at reducing class sizes, but also at employing classroom assistants, we would have a great opportunity to improve attainment levels at key stage 2 and provide some of the necessary improvements to combat the literacy and numeracy deficiencies that Geraint Davies mentioned earlier.

My other concern is that the report specifies that £20 million must be spent in these areas, when the actual allocation is £26 million. I would be concerned if £6 million does not reach schools. I hope that that money will get through in some form. I hope that as much of

The Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning (Jane Davidson): I welcome the qualified welcome that Members have given this report, because this is an important Assembly initiative. I will respond briefly to the points made.

Pauline, to some extent I was surprised by your point about core funding because we have the best settlement ever for local government. It is up to local government to consider how it will deliver the budget in its area. We have a 5.9 per cent increase in local government budgets, which shows our substantial support for core funding. However, there will be areas of policy where we will want to be directive. Local government has welcomed the fact that we are entering into dialogue with it about what those areas are. We want to be more directive, so we are focusing on three areas that need immediate action. That is why those three areas are contained in this special grant report.

You also asked what kind of sanctions can we take for the future. We have allocated £25 million for next year and £32 million for the following year. Local government's job is to demonstrate, in its education strategic plans, which must come back to us by 30 June, that it has used this money effectively, that it went to the schools and tackled the issues that we have identified. If it has not, we may need to be more directive on special grant funding in the future.

The point about under-achieving schools is particularly important. Estyn has a duty under primary legislation to publish reports on all

We have schools in poor areas of Wales that have 80 per cent good or very good work.

The Assembly therefore needs to work closely with our local education authorities to ensure that every school is excellent in every community in Wales.

Kirsty Williams: Do you acknowledge that schools, particularly in Powys, that do well at key stage 3 feel slightly aggrieved at the fact that this grant for key stage 3 will be solely based on key stage 3 targets, rather than the work that they have done in maintaining the developments in key stages 2 and 3? Secondary schools in Brecon and Radnorshire will lose out. We want all schools to be excellent but if we are not funding secondary schools in Powys at a level comparable to everywhere else, we are in danger of dragging excellence down to the lowest common denominator.

Jane Davidson: I reject that absolutely because the funding for local government determines funding at the local level. This grant is about opportunities for the local authority, such as Powys, to identify where it wants to direct the investment, from these categories that we need to address across Wales. The real importance is that we can consider targeted opportunities. We also need to consider ways of disseminating best practice in these areas across Wales. We have three years' worth of money, starting this year. I commend the motion to the Assembly.

Pauline Jarman: Before we vote, I declare an interest as a member of Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council and as a

Cynog Dafis: I propose that

the National Assembly for Wales registers its profound concern at the financial settlement for education following the UK Government's comprehensive spending review.

I am grateful for the opportunity to open this debate on a pressing issue of the utmost importance, and to urge the whole Assembly to express its grave concern about the financial settlement for education for the next three years. In doing so, we are only expressing the general strong feeling among almost everyone in the education sector.

Something strange seems to be happening. On the one hand, the United Kingdom Government talks about its commitment to education, education, education, and the Assembly Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning is fulsome in her praise of the increase in expenditure on education. On the other hand, people at the coal face—local authorities, schools, higher education, and so on—talk about financial squeeze, cuts and unfairness. It is not possible that both sides are correct. One of the purposes of today's debate is to get to the crux of the matter.

The last time that I spoke on this subject, on 24 January, I referred to the pattern of expenditure on schools over the 1990s. The pattern to which I referred is confirmed by the Assembly's statistical directorate, which shows that expenditure peaked in 1992-93, then decreased, then increased somewhat, and decreased again in 1996-98. According to one analysis, the per capita expenditure in the primary sector in 1996-97, was £71 per capita lower than in England, and £121 per capita lower in the secondary sector. That would mean a difference of £121,000 in a secondary school with 1,000 children. Think what a school could do with such a sum.

The statistical directorate gives figures for 1999-2000 that show that there is a smaller gap than that in terms of local authorities'

school budgets. However, everyone agrees that Wales lags behind. The Higher Education Funding Council for Wales has stated clearly that the resource unit in Wales lags behind to such an extent as to cause problems in terms of competitiveness. According to Higher Education Wales, the difference was as much as £162 in 1997-98. The Minister insists that we are gradually catching up. However, the concern remains, and has considerably increased since David Blunkett's announcement in November that he will increase expenditure by 10 per cent in England in real terms over the next three years, for modernisation, enlargement, pay increases, and so on, according to the Bett report requirements. No similar announcement has been made in Wales.

We spend less on education and training compared to England at the exact time when we should, in the name of reason, be spending more. Economic performance—certainly compared to England—has worsened, and everyone agrees by now that investment in education and training is essential for economic regeneration. Poverty and deprivation have worsened comparatively in Wales, which increases the cost of provision, for example special needs provision, which is a costly item. Historically, it could be argued that costs are higher in Wales anyway, because of the scattered nature of our communities, the small size of our establishments, as well as other factors.

I turn to the comprehensive spending review. This was the panacea that was supposed to cure all our ills.

It is true that public expenditure will increase sharply over the next three years. We welcome this, but it will rise from an irresponsibly low level. It is still low as a proportion of national wealth. By 2003, public expenditure will only be 4.5 per cent as a proportion of GDP, which is at the same level as the lowest year in John Major's Government. Yesterday's statements do not make much difference to this situation. It shows that New Labour—

Huw Lewis: I cannot let you get away with this one. Plaid Cymru—The Party of Wales always does this. You say that a certain proportion of GDP is handed over to public expenditure, but this is the GDP of the United Kingdom, which is enormous compared to the GDP of a self-governing Wales. You cannot have it both ways. What is the level of GDP that a self-governing Wales would set?

Cynog Dafis: I can certainly have it both ways. Huw Lewis wants us to inhabit briefly a kind of parallel universe in which Wales is independent. Is that what you want to discuss?

Huw Lewis: You wanted to discuss it.

Cynog Dafis: No, I did not, because Wales is not independent. Wales will not be independent next year, and I am pretty sure that it will not be independent in five years' time. For that reason, we must consider the deal that Wales currently receives within the United Kingdom. That is what I am discussing. Let us get our priorities right. Let us serve the interests of Wales in the real world and not in Huw Lewis's parallel universe, which is an imaginary world. Let us proceed with business in Welsh.

That sort of attitude is harmful to Wales in general. However, I want to draw attention to the effect this attitude will have on the education budget over the next three years. I will use per capita figures according to the whole population. That includes every kind of education from the cradle to the grave.

It is possible to calculate the figures by adding together the total for the education and training main expenditure group and the proportion of the standard spending assessment for schools in England and Wales. In Wales, per capita expenditure will rise from £760 in 2000-01 to £900 in 2003-04. In England, expenditure will rise from £775 to £985 per capita. This means that per capita expenditure in England is 2.3 per cent higher than in Wales this year and will increase to 9.7 per cent in 2003-04.

Incidentally, expenditure on special schools is not included in England's total but is included in Wales's total. Therefore, the difference is even greater.

In cash terms, this means that there will be £600 million less available for education in Wales than if expenditure was at the same per capita level as England. I have already argued that our expenditure should be higher than in England, and that our funding should enable us to do that.

The consequences of this gap will be serious. Higher education will find it more difficult to compete in an increasingly challenging and unfavourable situation. Elin Jones will discuss this.

Our schools will fall behind in their ability to invest, at a time when new equipment is vital. Consider, for example, the need to invest in information and communications technology, which is included in Neil Harries's report to the Education and Lifelong Learning Committee. We will discuss that report next week.

Consider the need to provide extensively for pre-school education. We discussed that on Tuesday. What about the opportunity to expand Welsh medium education to attain our strategic aim of creating a bilingual Wales? What about the dire need to improve wages and working conditions in further education? What about funding for the higher education sector to contribute to the knowledge economy or to expand training to deal with the disastrous situation in manufacturing, steel and agriculture? I could go on and refer to the professional development of teachers, financial support for students and buildings. Every field is short of resources and will be comparatively more so in relation to England over the next three years. In all these areas, Wales will be less able to move forward than England. It will lag further behind the rest of Britain.

The headteacher of Hafren School in Newtown phoned my office this morning to inform me that his school, with 300 children, will receive £100,000 less per year in three years' time than a similar school over the

border in England, some six miles away. That is the comparison that highlights the truth: two similar schools on either side of the border.

This is happening because the financial settlement for Wales is unjust. The Barnett formula is years out of date and is inappropriate. Joel Barnett, the author of the formula, recognises that. A needs based formula would give more expenditure to education in Wales than in England. However, we are receiving much less. We call for a review and the Assembly Member for Caerphilly agrees with us, and if anybody understands this issue, he does.

We have warned many times about the European funding. We must deliver the full European programme with only part of the European funds to which we are entitled and without a penny of the public match funding that the Treasury should be providing to the Assembly. How much of a loss is this? Phil Williams has worked out the sum. What is the deficit? Through a very striking coincidence, there is a deficit of £600 million, which is the exact sum that we are short of in education. In other words, our European funding has been stolen and education is paying the price. I am tempted to say that Edwina Hart has taken the money from Jane Davidson's handbag and given it to Mike German. It is no wonder that we want the Assembly to state our grave concerns about the financial settlement for education. I would expect every party to support us but that will not happen, unfortunately.

In terms of reviewing Barnett, the First Minister is worried about Scotland. Therefore, he is similar to Scotland's First Minister, who is also worried about Scotland. It would be worthwhile for Rhodri Morgan to study the figures for expenditure on education in Scotland, from school to university. It would cause his hair to stand on end, and that would be quite a sight. Worse than that, Andrew Davies's amendment 1 goes as far as to welcome the financial settlement for education. He is willing to welcome a settlement that leaves Wales with a level of expenditure of almost 10 per cent less per capita than England by 2004.

The concerns about the disparity between spending in England and Wales are real. We prefer to believe independent observations by individuals such as Professor David Reynolds who have outlined the differences in expenditure on education between England and Wales. I prefer to believe his interpretation than the Government's. For example, if we leave one large city like London out of the equation, we could start leaving other cities out. Manipulating the statistics does not address people's grave concerns about funding for education.

Brian Gibbons: Do you agree that regional comparisons are legitimate? Would you prefer to compare the allocations on a regional rather than national basis? Regional comparisons are commonly used in all areas of funding allocations, such as in economic development and so on.

Jonathan Morgan: We could spend the entire session discussing regional and local education authority comparisons. However, it is a well-known fact that there is a marked difference between primary and secondary schools in England and those in Wales. We should address that, and I will discuss it later because a key announcement in the budget yesterday will impact on England, but will probably have zero impact in Wales.

Amendment 2 would give effect to one of the administration's proposals as outlined in a consultation paper on local government

However, as well as taking account of my view, you may want to consider that of the Audit Commission, which has enthusiastically endorsed such a proposal in its comprehensive report 'Money Matters'. Therefore, in asking you to support amendment 2, I also ask you to support amendment 3, which is far-reaching, radical, and offers solutions to how funding is delivered to schools. However, although this proposal was originally included in the consultation paper, it now seems to have been mysteriously jettisoned. I do not know why. It had merit, and I ask the Minister to consider why it has disappeared and whether or not it will be a key proposal in months ahead?

We must be sure about this matter. Will we spend the next few years and beyond sending money to local authorities and expecting them to know the priorities for education? Do we expect town councillors and bureaucrats to be educational specialists and deliverers of public services as well as education? Will we start to trust headteachers and teachers who know how to deliver educational services? They are the ones in the know. Will we trust them to do the job or will we continue attempting to trust local councils who are letting students down? I ask you to support amendments 2 and 3. I also ask you to support amendment 4, which refers to delegation targets. In England, around 84 per cent of budgets are delegated to schools and in Wales, around 81 per cent. I would like us to delegate more of that money to schools and not allow it to sit in local authority bank accounts.

withdraw amendment 6 in light of the Chancellor's budget statement yesterday, not because the amendment was not valid, but because the figures mentioned were clearly too low. Following the Chancellor's budget statement, English secondary schools will get between £68,000 and £115,000 in the next financial year. However, schools in Wales will not see anything like that funding. Perhaps my amendment 6 should be re-tabled to include higher figures because schools in Wales will not receive the same amount of financial support as those in England. The Minister will have to explain what additional financial allocations are anticipated in the years ahead.

It is time for this Assembly to show that it cares more about schools, teachers and headteachers, parents and governors than about clapped out local councils. They know how to run the education service. People sitting in town halls and council chambers across Wales are not educational experts. It is time to give teachers the chance that they deserve to do their job.

Pauline Jarman: I declare an interest as a member of Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council and a school governor. I continue where Cynog ended and remind Members about the administrative process of education funding in Wales. There has been widespread concern regarding not only the amount of money spent on education in Wales but also problems in distributing the money. I disagree with the Conservatives' view on how money should be spent on education in Wales and by whom. I am confident that local government will do a first class job, given the new partnership arrangements in which it is engaged with the Assembly.

The final settlement to local authorities, which spend over 60 per cent of the education budget in Wales, was delayed, thus causing difficulties for the local education authorities in allocating the delegated budgets to schools, to enable them to plan with confidence well in advance of the start of the new financial year.

Pauline Jarman: Datganaf fuddiant fel aelod o Gyngor Bwrdeistref Sirol Rhondda Cynon Taf ac fel llywodraethwr ysgol. Yr wyf am barhau lle gorffennodd Cynog ac atgoffaf yr Aelodau o'r broses weinyddol o ariannu addysg yng Nghymru. Bu pryder eang nid yn unig mewn perthynas â'r swm o arian a werir ar addysg yng Nghymru ond hefyd am y problemau o ddosbarthu'r arian. Anghytunaf â safbwyt y Ceidwadwyr ar sut y dylid gwario arian ar addysg yng Nghymru a phwy ddylai wneud hynny. Hyderaf y bydd llywodraeth leol yn gwneud gwaith gwych, o ystyried y trefniadau partneriaeth newydd a luniwyd gyda'r Cynulliad.

The announcements of extra money raised hopes but then local authorities and schools were kept hanging on for the details. The fact that announcements are regularly forthcoming is an indication that core funding is insufficient, which is why I commented on the grant regime. The apportionment of money to individual local authorities is slow. This makes forward planning difficult.

Did we witness the removal of hypothecation this year, as has been claimed? There is a contradiction there because the National Assembly is holding back an unprecedented level of funding as specific grants that restricts spending decisions by local authorities. This is set to grow, by the Finance Minister's own admission this morning, year on year.

I turn to grants for education support and training. I question the way in which they are administered. The sustainability of some of the programmes that have been highlighted is commendable. The way in which GEST is distributed does not give an opportunity for many of the long-term and structural problems to be remedied in three years, which is a short period. The Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning is well aware of this view and I hope that she will indicate that this serious issue will be considered soon.

I return to the famous quote on London weighting. Jane Davidson said on 25 January that if London is taken out of the equation, more money is spent per pupil in Wales than in England. She said:

'In 2000-01, our LEA funding has delivered an average of £2,870 per pupil, which is higher than in eight of the 10 English regions and higher than the average funding in England, excluding London's £2,840. There is no disadvantage in funding levels in Wales compared with England, as the Plaid Cymru amendment contends.'

Plaid Cymru continues to contend that that quotation will return to haunt the Minister, because these figures, as Cynog indicated, are not comparable. They do not provide for the

Labour wants to take London out of the equation because it suits it. We do not disregard London when considering other aspects of public spending. Around half the money for the London weighting is for wages and the rest is for deprivation.

Brian Gibbons rose—

Pauline Jarman: It is ridiculous to exclude London from any comparison between Wales and England when we have such widespread deprivation in Wales. There has been a drop in the overall capital funding for schools in Wales this year of some £12 million. The National Assembly has significant unallocated reserves in this year's budget and has further provided even greater unallocated reserves in the budget for 2002-03. There are opportunities to close the gap in education funding between England and Wales as we speak. What is needed is an admission that the gap is real and unacceptable and the political will for these unallocated reserves be dedicated to education in Wales as a priority and released immediately. We should also seek additional funding from the Chancellor relative to need.

I have deep doubts about the recent conversion of the allegedly family-friendly Chancellor. We all recall that, for the first three years of his administration, he kept his expenditure to Tory spending plans, and the misery that that created for education and children. The level of child poverty in Wales is a national disgrace. Poverty manifests itself in many ways, not least educational disadvantage. We want to provide the next generation of adults in Wales with good life chances. Investing in educating our children to the maximum is the cornerstone of that aim.

Peter Black: I declare an interest as a member of the Swansea City and County Council and a school governor. We must recognise that the budget settlement brings spending in Wales to record levels. For education and training, our provision for 2001-02 rises from the original plans of £867 million to £932 million. We are clearly raising the level of money spent on education and training. By 2003-04, we intend to spend over £1 billion on education and training.

We cannot compare spending on education in Wales with the figures for the Department for Education and Employment, as Plaid Cymru did. It alleged a £600 million shortfall between England and Wales, using figures that are not comparable. For example, these figures include DfEE's administration costs. They also include money for Sure Start in England, whereas that money comes from the health and social services budget in Wales. We must recognise that we cannot keep looking across the border to guide our funding, when the Assembly is clearly working for Wales and delivering services for it in a distinctive way. I would have hoped that Plaid Cymru, with its own agenda, would recognise that more than anyone would. It clearly does not.

It would be interesting to know how Plaid Cymru can predict how much local authorities in Wales are planning to spend, as this has not yet been decided—

Peter Black: I will not give way as I have little time.

Local councils in Wales do not have to set their budgets until 11 March and do not have to set their education funding until 31 March. Therefore, were Plaid Cymru's figures dreamed up somewhere, or has it just decided that it would speculate on the basis of incomplete information?

We do not have any clear evidence that average funding per pupil in Wales is less than in England. We have discussed taking

London out of the equation. There are other Assembly spending levels where we can make comparisons when London is taken out of the equation, Pauline, such as social housing grant. We have substantially increased local government support grant so that local authorities in Wales can continue to fund school education at a higher average spend per pupil than all but two English regions. That is significant. However, I accept that we need better transparency in the funding information that reaches schools. We must deal with that in future and I am sure that it will be addressed in due course.

The Education and Lifelong Learning Committee, chaired by Cynog Dafis, did not disagree with the education and training budget proposals when they were discussed. It asked for earlier funding for early years provision and school buildings, both of which were dealt with in the budget approved in December. There was a record level of funding for school buildings of £293 million over three years. Therefore, why criticise now when this is an open and transparent budget process? We need to know what Plaid Cymru will do for Wales and, more importantly, where it will find the money to do it.

This partnership Government has delivered a rise in the Assembly budget from £7 billion to over £10 billion, a 37 per cent increase in NHS funding over four years, the best settlement for local government in years and a 20 per cent overall increase in police funding. Those are substantial spending issues on which we should be congratulated.

Plaid Cymru is living in a fantasyland in which it conjures figures out of thin air and calls for spending without saying how it will finance it. The Liberal Democrats agree that the Barnett formula should be reformed and that Wales needs more money. However, we are not fighting a general election campaign in the Assembly; we must work in the real world. Plaid Cymru may say that we want more money from the UK Government but, in the independent state it so desires, we would not have that lifeline, but rather a £5

Elin Jones: I intend to concentrate on higher education. Since the establishment of the Assembly, many fine words have been spoken by politicians in this Chamber regarding the importance of the universities of Wales in terms of their contribution to economic development, creating a lifelong learning society, expanding opportunities for all and creating a better Wales. However, the reality of university and student funding in Wales could lead someone to believe that a number of those contributions are empty rhetoric.

The higher education sector is competitive across the United Kingdom, in terms of attracting academics, research contracts and students. Higher Education Wales's recent evidence shows that Welsh institutions are in a situation of competitive disadvantage in the UK-wide market because of the per capita funding system in Wales, which is 5 per cent worse than in England and 25 per cent worse than in Scotland. We have already heard that education in Wales will have a £600 million deficit during the next four years. We welcome yesterday's budget announcement on education spending, but it will not help to reduce the comparative deficit that already exists. Cynog gave an example of that deficiency, namely David Blunkett's announcement in November 2000 that £330 million would be available in England to implement some of the recommendations of the Bett report on the development and improvement of the conditions of service of university staff. No such provision has been made in Wales, which could lead to a situation that will encourage many academics in Wales to seek employment over the border.

Therefore, we must ask the Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning whether a proportion of this £330 million came to Wales through the Barnett formula and, if so, to what was it allocated? What was given a

higher priority than the conditions of service of university staff? If this money was used to compensate for the deficiency in Objective 1 match funding, it is ironic and sad that Objective 1 emphasises the role of universities in creating economic growth on the one hand, while, on the other, it takes comparative money away from universities due to the Treasury's deficiency in contributing to Objective 1.

Universities create education and training opportunities for people, and for young people in particular. We all know that the percentage of university students from underprivileged backgrounds is extremely low. People from the Valleys, for example, are three times less likely to attend university than the national average. That must be rectified. The introduction tuition fees and student loans has not helped the situation. We could have considered using the money lost from education in Wales to increase access funds for the most underprivileged, or to press for tuition fees to be abolished as in Scotland. That would cost about £12 million per annum. However, along with a fair system of grants for underprivileged students, it would ensure equal access to higher education.

I represent a constituency which includes two universities and which is, therefore, dependant upon higher education. The University of Wales, Lampeter is buckling under the strain of financial pressure and lack of recruitment, in a town that has recently seen Dewhirst, its second largest employer, close its doors. When the universities' managers, trade unions and student unions complain to me about the higher education settlement, I tell them, fairly and squarely, to blame Wales's inadequate funding formula and the Treasury's failure to secure a full additional Objective 1 funding package for Wales.

To answer Peter Black's question, that is what Plaid Cymru would wish to see to secure equitable funding for Wales. I also tell those who ask me about the higher education settlement about the First Minister's inability to lead a campaign to reform the Barnett

In virtually every other area of social and economic policy, we look at the regional dimension and we compare the region of Wales with the regions in England, and we measure Wales's performance comparably. If we were doing as well in all other sectors as we are in education, on a regional basis, Wales would be achieving a considerable programme.

The Welsh budget brings spending in Wales to record levels—£2 billion extra over three years. The Assembly decides how that is divided, and it has done so. In this year's budget £1.4 billion will be spent on education and training in Wales, if you include the money for schools. We continually say that it is not possible to look at budget announcements in England and make simplistic comparisons with Wales. Wales does things differently, that is why we are all here. It does not make sense to compare figures that are unrelated, either. Sure Start, for example, is funded in England through the Department of Education and Employment. In Wales we fund Sure Start through Health and Social Services. Special schools are included in our figures. Look at the money that we discussed earlier, which is going into the educational components of Communities First. We do things differently in Wales and you must disentangle these figures.

In terms of figures coming back to haunt me, Pauline, on the contrary, I am extremely

We have commitments that are broadly supported by everybody in this Chamber, which have gone through Committee, with its support. We intend to make Wales a learning country, where we provide education and training that is second-to-none, putting the learner first. We want Wales to be a country where learning outcomes are continuously improving, a country recognised as an outstanding place in which to teach and learn. We are making progress, and I urge the Assembly to recognise that progress. We have policies to achieve this vision. We have policies, programmes and planned investment that were not seriously challenged when the budget was considered. One of the few areas to be challenged was the small reduction in schools capital funding for next year. We agreed that we will examine that. However, I would like the local authorities that are not spending their capital spending at the moment to spend that better first, and then we will look at the issue of capital funding.

There will be £27.3 million invested in our basic skills strategy. Again we are acting differently by considering early years education, family and adult literacy. From April onwards, the age limit on modern apprenticeship programmes will be removed. This will be unique to Wales. We are also introducing a new programme called ‘The Modern Skills Diploma for Adults’ where £10 million will be invested. Along with the skills development fund we are investing to offer many more opportunities for modern apprenticeships.

The accusations are accurate over the issue of funding for higher education. However, since the Assembly was established, we have narrowed that gap in higher education funding between England and Wales, from £162 per student in 1998 to £18 per student in 2000. It is disingenuous to suggest that we are underfunding higher education, at this time, when we have invested extra money. We are conducting a review of higher education in Wales and Edwina Hart, the Minister for Finance, Local Government and Communities and myself have made it clear that we will look at funding as a result.

It is important to point out that we have a transparent budget process. Committees look at matters in July, and there is plenty of opportunity for Members to consider the issues throughout the process. If David Blunkett were to make an announcement outside the budget process timetable, we would not have the capacity to respond immediately, because we work with Assembly Members to determine our priorities. However, Edwina Hart, as Minister for Finance, Local Government and Communities, and I have made a commitment to consider higher education based on the outcome of that review. I am pleased that this debate follows the one on social inclusion because Edwina and I demonstrate the importance of joined-up thinking. The work of ELWa will be crucial to the development of the national economic development strategy. That is how we deal with joined-up thinking in Wales.

I will explain why I cannot support William Graham's amendments 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6. The Local Government and Housing Committee and the Education and Lifelong Learning Committee have had detailed debates on the proposals in the document on the consultation on simplifying the system. I regret, Jonathan, that you were unable to attend the Education and Lifelong Learning Committee yesterday because we had a substantial debate. The Committee rejected the proposals to identify standard spending assessments on the basis that they are a formula. The Committee wanted to focus on the development of outcomes. Both Committees agreed that there was a need for greater transparency and we will be working with the Welsh Local Government Association to achieve it.

Let us take the once-in-a-lifetime opportunity that the £421 million in structural funds, in addition to our core money, offers, to ensure that Wales gets the excellent education system it deserves.

Phil Williams: I declare an interest as a part-time professor in the University of Wales.

We cannot support the amendments proposed. The Labour amendments fly in the face of the facts. The Tory amendments are largely about the different topic, to which Jane referred, of the relationship with local government. That clouds the issue. I have said before, and will no doubt say again, that numbers are inflexible and unforgiving. That is why accountants rule industry, the Treasury rules Whitehall, and Queen Edwina rules in Cardiff Bay. Sums are the basis of this debate, so I will explain the basis of our calculations. block grant, was announced in the comprehensive spending review, I welcomed it but pointed out that it fell far short of the likely expenditure on European grants and that there was no money for match funding. You can do the sums yourselves. The shortfall in European grants and additional match funding will total £600 million over the four years. That is the figure to which we have committed ourselves, and recent evidence from the Welsh European Funding Office and, above all, the recent letter from the Assembly to the Treasury, suggests that those predictions were correct.

I have been accused of whingeing. I do not mind that. I am actually guilty of something much worse: I have always been the school swot. When I was a kid, I shouldered the heavy burden that, as hard as I tried, I could never manage to get less than 100 per cent in arithmetic. It may be obnoxious and politically unacceptable to say so, but it seems that my sums are right. The consequence of topping up the budget for European programmes from our core budget became clear when Edwina announced the budget for the next three years.

After years of Tory restraint, there is more money. There has always been more money every year. I am old enough to remember when, in 1955, Macmillan made the fatuous statement that there were more television sets in 1955 than in 1951. I was on Waun Pound to hear Aneurin Bevan say that it would be very funny if there were fewer. Of course the budget has increased. However, what matters is from where we start and how quickly spending on education in Wales will increase in comparison to that in the rest of the UK.

When you consider the sums—and I appreciate that they are all clearly in the public domain and congratulate Edwina on their transparency—it is clear that if you compare the rate of increase in spending in Wales to that in the rest of UK, education was the main victim. We support the right of local government to allocate its budgets in

That is a huge difference, and it will increase year on year, so that by the end of this comprehensive spending review, it will be 10 per cent.

To begin with our starting position, I welcome the audacity of the suggestion that London should be excluded from the figures. We could exclude Cardiff, with its high spending on higher education, and rural areas because of the sparsity factor that does not apply in places like London. That would be ridiculous. However, there is a purpose to look at regional spending. Plaid Cymru has commissioned a report by an independent academic expert. The draft that I have seen shows that many regions in England also suffer due to the huge transfer of public resources into the London area. A representative from south Yorkshire, to whom I was talking recently, congratulated us on fighting a battle for Wales because, incidentally, we are also fighting for some of the English regions. There are differences at present but the gap will increase.

Numbers are unforgiving. You mentioned outcomes. Four weeks ago, with many reservations and a heavy heart, I found it impossible to endorse the draft national economic development strategy. I admired many things in it. As a professor, I welcomed with enthusiasm the emphasis on education, especially higher education and research. If you are looking for outcomes, that is how to

Dadl Fer Short Debate

Iawndal i Hemoffiligion a Heintiwyd gan Hepatitis C Compensation for Haemophiliacs Infected with Hepatitis C

David Lloyd: Datganaf fuddiant fel meddyg teulu. Caniataf i William Graham a Kirsty Williams wneud cyfraniad yn ystod y ddadl.

Y mae'n bleser cael cyfle i drafod y pwnc pwysig hwn ar yr angen i ddigolledu hemoffiligion a heintiwyd gan hepatitis C o ganlyniad i'w triniaeth. Derbyniodd nifer ohonom wybodaeth oddi wrth Gymdeithas Hemoffilia De Cymru ynghylch y mater hwn

David Lloyd: I declare an interest as a general practitioner. I have allowed William Graham and Kirsty Williams to contribute to the debate.

It is a pleasure to have the opportunity to discuss this important subject on the need to compensate haemophiliacs who have been infected with hepatitis C as a result of their treatment. Many of us received information from the South Wales Haemophilia Society

Throughout the UK, more than 4,800 people with haemophilia are estimated to have been infected with the hepatitis C virus through the use of contaminated blood clotting concentrates given as part of their NHS treatment. Over 1,200 of those are also co-infected with HIV. Almost all haemophiliacs who received treatment before 1986, when viral inactivation procedures were introduced, have been affected. In other words, every patient over the age of 14 may have contracted hepatitis C and/or HIV.

Imported blood products from the United States have caused the problems. US blood products tend to be sourced from prisons. Furthermore, people are paid for donating blood in the US, and therefore high-risk groups, such as drug addicts, tend to take part. No UK Government has been self-sufficient in terms of blood products. That goal was first promised in 1945, but we still have not achieved it. Hepatitis C is a significant condition and should not be dismissed as a minor infection. It can attack the liver, and is potentially life threatening. Up to 80 per cent of those infected can develop chronic liver disease, up to 25 per cent, according to certain studies, can develop cirrhosis of the liver, and up to 5 per cent have a risk of developing liver cancer.

Sufferers have been telling us, and we heard some speak in the presentation, about the effects of hepatitis C on their lives as haemophiliacs. They have a reduced income through having to cut down on working hours, or giving up work altogether. They have increased costs due to special dietary

on this matter and were present at a powerful presentation given by the society in the Assembly on 14 February. The presentation described the terrible effects of hepatitis C on those who were already suffering from haemophilia and a similar disease, Von Willibrands Disease.

They caught the disease as a result of treatment for their haemophilia, and there are 149 haemophiliacs in Wales who are suffering in this way.

Amcangyfrifir bod mwy na 4,800 o bobl drwy'r DU wedi eu heintio â'r firws hepatitis C drwy ddefnyddio tewychwyr ceulo gwaed heintiedig a roddwyd fel rhan o'u triniaeth NHS. Cynhyrchion gwaed a fewnforiwyd o'r Unol Daleithiau sydd wedi achosi'r problemau. Tuedda cynhyrchion gwaed yr Unol Daleithiau ddod o garchardai. At hyn, caiff pobl eu talu am gyfrannu gwaed yn yr Unol Daleithiau, ac felly mae grwpiau perygl uchel, megis rhai sydd yn gaeth i gyffuriau, yn tueddu i gymryd rhan. Ni fu unrhyw un o Lywodraethau'r DU yn hunan-gynhaliol o ran cynhyrchion gwaed. Addewidwyd y nod hwnnw gyntaf yn 1945, ond nid ydym wedi ei gyflawni o hyd. Mae Hepatitis C yn gyflwr arwyddocâol ac ni ddylid ei ddiystyr fel mân haint. Gall ymosod ar yr iau, a gallai fygwth bywyd. Gall hyd at 80 y cant o'r sawl a heintiwyd ddatblygu afiechyd iau croniog, gall hyd at 25 y cant, yn ôl rhai astudiaethau, ddatblygu sirosis yr iau, ac mae perygl y gall hyd at 5 y cant ddatblygu canser yr iau.

Dyweddodd dioddefwyr wrthym am effeithiau hepatitis C ar eu bywydau fel hemoffiliion, a chlywsom rai ohonynt yn siarad yn y cyflwyniad. Mae ganddynt lai o incwm gan eu bod wedi gorfol cwtogi eu horiau gwaith, neu roi'r gorau i'w gwaith yn gyfangwbl. Rhaid iddynt wario mwy o arian oherwydd

requirements and medicine charges. They face discrimination and being ostracised at work. They fear for their future health and are afraid of dying and leaving dependants without financial support. We have all heard these stories and tales of the inadequate support services for managing hepatitis C and the lack of counselling support.

The same applies further afield. We do not have a national UK strategy to deal with hepatitis C or national UK guidelines on the management and treatment of those infected. In some areas of the UK, patients have to wait for months or years to see a hepatologist or a hepatitis C specialist and there are few counselling or support services. On treatment, interferon and ribavirin combination therapy was licensed last year. Certain studies have shown that it can clear the virus in about 30 per cent of cases. However, many health authorities have problems financing that treatment.

In 1987 the UK Government accepted the moral responsibility to recompense all haemophiliacs infected with HIV through blood products, and established the Macfarlane Trust in 1988 to fulfil this role. Haemophiliacs with hepatitis C were infected in the same way and at the same time as those infected with HIV and experience many of the same problems. Therefore, on moral grounds, they should be offered similar financial help. The Haemophilia Society would like the remit of the Macfarlane Trust to be widened to include haemophiliacs with hepatitis C. At present the trust can assist those with HIV and hepatitis C co-infection—but they cannot help those infected with hepatitis C alone.

Canada has held a large scale four-year investigation into the issue of haemophiliacs with hepatitis C and the Canadian Red Cross has set aside between \$70 million and \$100 million to provide compensation to those infected. In Ireland, compensation has been provided to those infected with hepatitis C and a detailed investigation into the safety of

Heintiwyd hemoffiligion â hepatitis C yn yr un modd ac ar yr un pryd â'r rhai a heintiwyd â HIV ac maent yn cael llawer o'r un problemau. Felly, ar sail foesol, dylent gael cynnig cymorth ariannol tebyg. Hoffai'r Gymdeithas Hemoffilia ledaenu cylch gwaith Ymddiriedolaeth Macfarlane i gynnwys hemoffiligion â hepatitis C. Ar hyn o bryd gall yr ymddiriedolaeth gynorthwyo'r sawl a heintiwyd â HIV a hepatitis C—ond ni allant gynorthwyo'r sawl a heintiwyd â hepatitis C yn unig.

Mae Canada wedi cynnal ymchwiliad pedair blynedd ar raddfa eang i fater hemoffiligion â hepatitis C ac mae Croes Goch Canada wedi neilltuo rhwng \$70 miliwn a \$100 miliwn i ddarparu iawndal i'r sawl a heintiwyd. Yn Iwerddon, darparwyd iawndal i'r sawl a heintiwyd â hepatitis C ac mae ymchwiliad manwl i ddiogelwch cyflenwad gwaed

the Irish blood supply is being held. Similar investigations have been made in France, Japan and Switzerland.

These events relate to before 1986. For many years, the Haemophilia Society has called for a public inquiry in the UK into the safety of blood products and the infection of haemophiliacs with HIV and hepatitis C. To date, the Department of Health in Westminster has refused to hold a public inquiry. As that is a matter for the UK Government, we asked the Haemophilia Society, after its presentation, what we, as Members of the National Assembly for Wales, could do. We have 149 haemophiliacs infected with hepatitis C in Wales.

I would like a full Health and Social Services Committee investigation into the issues discussed and I have already written to Kirsty, as the Committee Chair, about this. These sufferers—some of whom are here today in the public gallery—are Welsh people. As the National Assembly we have a duty of care and a responsibility towards them. The needs of sufferers have to be taken into account and we must consider, as an Assembly, how we can meet them. The Scottish Executive recently announced the results of an inquiry into how this occurred in Scotland. A full Committee investigation would show that the National Assembly and the Government of Wales has not abandoned haemophiliacs in Wales infected with hepatitis C.

Kirsty Williams: The Liberal Democrat position on this matter was clearly stated in a statement of opinion tabled by my colleagues, Peter Black and Jenny Randerson, and myself in February last year. We are grateful to the other Members who subscribed to that statement of opinion. We believe that compensation should be granted to haemophiliacs who have been infected with Hepatitis C and the HIV virus.

However, to date, the compensation scheme that exists for those infected with HIV has not been extended to those with hepatitis C. The Government's no-fault policy should be extended to cover those infected with

Gan mai mater i Lywodraeth y DU yw hynny, gofynasom i'r Gymdeithas Hemoffilia, ar ôl ei chyflwyniad, beth y gallem ni, fel Aelodau Cynulliad Cenedlaethol Cymru, ei wneud. Mae 149 o hemoffiligion wedi eu heintio â hepatitis C yng Nghymru.

Hoffwn i'r Pwyllgor Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol gynnal ymchwiliad llawn i'r materion a drafodwyd ac yr wyf eisoes wedi ysgrifennu at Kirsty, fel Cadeirydd y Pwyllgor, ynglŷn â hyn. Mae'r dioddefwyr hyn—y mae nifer ohonynt yma heddiw yn yr oriel gyhoeddus—yn Gymry. Fel Cynulliad Cenedlaethol mae gennym ddyletswydd i ofalu amdanyst a chyfrifoldeb tuag atynt. Rhaid ystyried anghenion dioddefwyr a rhaid inni ystyried sut y gallwn eu diwallu, fel Cynulliad. Yn ddiweddar, cyhoeddodd Gweithrediaeth yr Alban ganlyniadau ymchwiliad i'r ffordd y digwyddodd hyn yn yr Alban. Byddai ymchwiliad llawn gan y Pwyllgor yn dangos nad yw'r Cynulliad Cenedlaethol a Llywodraeth Cymru wedi cefnu ar hemoffiligion yng Nghymru a heintiwyd â hepatitis C.

Kirsty Williams: Nodwyd safbwyt y Democrataid Rhyddfrydol ar y mater hwn yn eglur mewn datganiad barn a gyflwynwyd gan fy nghyd-Aelodau, Peter Black a Jenny Randerson, a minnau ym mis Chwefror y llynedd. Yr ydym yn ddiolchgar i'r Aelodau eraill a gytunodd â'r datganiad barn hwnnw. Credwn y dylid rhoi iawndal i hemoffiligion a heintiwyd â Hepatitis C a'r firws HIV.

Fodd bynnag, hyd yma, nid yw'r cynllun iawndal sydd yn bodoli ar gyfer y sawl a heintiwyd â HIV wedi ei ymestyn i'r sawl sydd â hepatitis C. Dylid ymestyn polisi dim bai y Llywodraeth i gwmpasu'r sawl a

hepatitis C. Nobody is saying that NHS workers set out to inflict this disease on haemophiliacs and nobody can doubt the sincerity of those who provide the services for hepatitis C. As a student in the United States, I remember the weekly trip some of my colleagues would make to the blood bank to finance that night out. It is easy to see how contaminated blood products were shipped into this country and used inadvertently by the NHS. This is not about apportioning blame, it is about rectifying a situation that has gone horribly wrong for—let us face it—a small number of people. This affects 149 people in Wales and the numbers decrease monthly because people are dying before they receive the help that they deserve.

I hope that the Government will consider ways of helping these sufferers through direct compensation. It should ensure that dual treatment therapy, which the National Institute for Clinical Excellence has recommended as effective, should be issued and financed in Wales. It should also ensure that people receive counselling and support services, which do not exist in the principality at present.

William Graham: On behalf of the Welsh Conservatives I support further investigation into this matter. I am hopeful that this matter will receive cross-party support in the Assembly and that the Minister for Health and Social Services and the Chair of the Health and Social Services Committee will find the time and resources to make this debate relevant, so that those who suffer from this will have hope and certainty that action will be taken.

Looking through the information provided to me by the Library, I regret that I can only find one hope: it has been agreed that recombinant factor eight will be made available to children under 16 and to new patients. There is no other information available about compensation or compensation offers. That is poor and I am grateful to Dai Lloyd and to the members of the Haemophilia Society for their presentation some weeks ago. I attended with

Dylai hefyd sicrhau bod pobl yn derbyn gwasanaethau cyngor a chymorth, nad ydynt yn bodoli yma ar hyn o bryd.

William Graham: Ar ran Ceidwadwyr Cymru cefnogaf ymchwiliad pellach i'r mater hwn. Yr wyf yn obeithiol y caiff y mater gefnogaeth draws-bleidiol yn y Cynulliad ac y caiff y Gweinidog dros Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol a Chadeirydd y Pwyllgor Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol yr amser a'r adnoddau i wneud y ddadl hon yn un berthnasol, fel y gall y sawl sydd yn dioddef gael gobaith a sicrwydd y caiff camau eu cymryd.

Wrth edrych ar y wybodaeth a ddarparwyd i mi gan y Llyfrgell, gresynnaf na allaf ond canfod un gobaith: cytunwyd y bydd ffactor ailgyfuno wyth yn cael ei gynnig i blant dan 16 oed ac i gleifion newydd. Nid oes unrhyw wybodaeth arall ar gael am iawndal na chynigion am iawndal. Mae hynny'n wael ac yr wyf yn ddiolchgar i Dai Lloyd ac i aelodau'r Gymdeithas Hemophilia am eu cyflwyniad rai wythnosau'n ôl. Mynychais y cyfarfod gyda'm cyd-Aelodau a chafodd

my colleagues and everyone was moved by the plight of what is an unprovoked problem. I would not say ‘an unavoidable problem’ because one can understand how this came about. It is incumbent upon us as Assembly Members to find a way forward to offer these people relief. I echo the comments made by the previous speakers.

The Minister for Health and Social Services (Jane Hutt): I express my sympathy to haemophiliacs who have been infected with hepatitis C through their NHS treatment. Before talking about the issue of compensation for haemophiliacs, I reiterate the Assembly’s commitment to learning from patients’ experiences when planning and making provision for health services. We want patients to be well cared for in the NHS and to be involved in the planning of the services on which they and their families rely.

Successful patient and public involvement is not always easy to achieve. It requires time, commitment and a cultural change to overcome the barriers that often exist. However, there is a growing acceptance that patients are the experts on how they feel and on how it is to live or care for someone with a certain illness or condition. I am aware of the powerful presentation given to Assembly Members by the Haemophilia Society a few weeks ago.

In responding to the calls from Dai Lloyd and other Members for compensation for haemophiliacs infected with hepatitis C via NHS treatment, I will trace the history of this issue. When the Labour Government first came into office, before the establishment of the Assembly, Ministers from the Department of Health met with the Haemophilia Society and listened to its arguments for a special payments scheme for people with haemophilia and hepatitis C, similar to that in place for HIV sufferers. After long and careful consideration, they came to the conclusion that a special payments scheme should not be established. When I became Assembly Minister for Health and Social Services, I met with representatives of the South Wales Haemophiliac Group and Birchgrove Wales, for people who are

Y Gweinidog dros Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol (Jane Hutt): Mynegaf fy nghydymdeimlad tuag at hemoffiligion a heintiwyd â hepatitis C drwy’u triniaeth NHS. Cyn trafod mater iawndal i hemoffiligion, ail-adroddaf ymrwymiad y Cynulliad i ddysgu o brofiadau cleifion wrth gynllunio a darparu ar gyfer gwasanaethau iechyd. Yr ydym am i gleifion gael gofal da yn yr NHS a chyfranogi yn y broses o gynllunio’r gwasanaethau y maent hwy a’u teuluoedd yn dibynnau arnynt.

Nid yw cyfranogiad llwyddiannus gan gleifion a’r cyhoedd yn hawdd ei gyflawni bob amser. Mae gofyn amser, ymrwymiad a newid diwylliannol i oresgyn y rhwystrau sydd yn bodoli yn aml. Fodd bynnag, derbynir yn gynyddol mai’r cleifion yw’r arbenigwyr ar y ffordd y maent yn teimlo a sut brofiad yw byw neu ofalu am rywun sydd â salwch neu gyflwr arbennig. Yr wyf yn ymwybodol o’r cyflwyniad grymus a roddwyd i Aelodau’r Cynulliad gan y Gymdeithas Hemoffilia rai wythnosau’n ôl.

Wrth ymateb i alwadau gan Dai Lloyd ac Aelodau eraill am iawndal i’r hemoffiligion a heintiwyd â hepatitis C drwy driniaeth yr NHS, olrheiniaf hanes y mater hwn. Pan ddaeth y Llywodraeth Lafur i rym, cyn sefydlu’r Cynulliad, cyfarfu Gweinidogion o’r Adran Iechyd â’r Gymdeithas Hemoffilia i wrando ar ei dadleuon am gynllun taliadau arbennig ar gyfer pobl â hemoffilia a hepatitis C, cynllun tebyg i’r un a oedd yn bodoli ar gyfer dioddefwyr HIV. Wedi ystyriaeth hir a gofalus, daethant i’r casgliad na ddylid sefydlu cynllun taliadau arbennig. Pan ddeuthum yn Weinidog y Cynulliad dros Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol, cyfarfum â chynrychiolwyr o Grŵp Hemoffilia De Cymru a Birchgrove Cymru, ar gyfer pobl a gaiff eu heffeithio gan hepatitis C. Trafodais y materion hyn â hwy.

affected by hepatitis C. I discussed these issues with them. We discussed similar issues during the presentation for Members a few weeks ago. It was a difficult decision, following the advice and the consideration given by the Department of Health, not to establish a scheme. However, I will explain why Ministers have come to this decision.

Assembly and central Government policy remains that compensation or other financial help to patients is only paid when the NHS or individuals working in it are at fault. The underlying principles are clear-cut and independently established under common law. They apply to personal injury cases in general, not just those arising from health care. In general, there is no 'no fault compensation'. How can we be sure that the NHS was not at fault? The technology to make blood products free from hepatitis C, in sufficient quantities to treat all haemophiliacs in the UK, was not available prior to 1985. I regret that before this many haemophiliacs were inadvertently infected by a treatment designed to improve their quality of life. However, this is not a justification for special payments.

Dai drew comparisons between the decision not to offer special payments to haemophiliacs with hepatitis C and the special payments established in the late 1980s for haemophiliacs with HIV. However, there are significant differences between the two situations. It was felt at the time that HIV was a unique condition in terms of its high mortality rate and the tremendous stigma attached to the disease in the early days. It reflected the widespread public fear at the time, as it was heavily associated with sexual transmission. Haemophiliacs infected with HIV face the prospect of developing AIDS and a consequent short life expectancy, which is not the case with hepatitis C.

There have been many calls for a public inquiry, which we discussed when I met representatives from the Haemophilia Society. I understand that people infected with hepatitis C want to know what happened

Gwnaeth Dai gymariaethau rhwng y penderfyniad i beidio â chynnig taliadau arbennig i hemoffiligion â hepatitis C â'r taliadau arbennig a sefydlwyd ar ddiwedd yr 1980au ar gyfer hemoffiligion â HIV. Fodd bynnag, mae gwahaniaethau arwyddocáol rhwng y ddwy sefyllfa. Teimlwyd ar y pryd bod HIV yn gyflwr unigryw o ran ei gyfradd marwolaeth uchel a'r stigma ofnadwy a oedd yn gysylltiedig â'r afiechyd yn y dyddiau cynnar. and why it could not have been prevented. It is a global problem linked to the development of science and technology. It is not confined to the UK or linked to some local breakdown in blood product development. Therefore, a public inquiry would probably not provide a satisfactory answer.

To follow the route taken in Ireland would probably require primary legislation in Wales. We would also have to consider the costs of following such a route. I understand that they have explored this in Scotland and have faced difficulties in terms of the time when there was potentially infected blood available for a longer period than in England and Wales. They have also concluded that they will not make special grants for compensation in Scotland.

We must move forward. Dai, Kirsty and William discussed how we should enable people with haemophilia and hepatitis C to lead their lives as fully and constructively as possible and how we can help to improve their health and wellbeing. Our aim is to improve health, tackle inequalities, modernise the NHS and provide appropriate social care. We want to ensure that people are not stigmatised because of their ill-health. We want high quality, modern, dependable health and social services and appropriate care. We want people with haemophilia to benefit from improvements in care similar to other patient groups. The new Arthur Bloom Haemophilia Centre based at the University Hospital of Wales is recognised as one of the 23 UK designated comprehensive care centres for haemophilia treatment. We must ensure that that centre is not the only provider of such services in Wales.

I now turn to the issue of drugs for hepatitis C. Until recently the only treatment available for hepatitis C was alpha interferon, which has a limited success rate, of about 20 per cent, in removing the virus and is not suitable for all patients. Several Members today, including Kirsty, have mentioned that the use of alpha interferon in combination with ribavirin appears to be more effective, clearing the virus in around 40 per cent of

Mae Canolfan Hemoffilia newydd Arthur Bloom a leolir yn Ysbyty Athrofaol Cymru wedi ei chydnabod fel un o 23 o ganolfannau gofal cynhwysfawr penodedig ar gyfer trin hemoffilia yn y DU. Rhaid inni sicrhau nad y ganolfan honno yw'r unig un sydd yn darparu gwasanaethau o'r fath yng Nghymru.

Trof yn awr at fater cyffuriau ar gyfer hepatitis C. Hyd yn ddiweddar yr unig driniaeth a oedd ar gael ar gyfer hepatitis C oedd alpha interferon, sydd â chyfradd llwyddiant gyfyngedig, sef tua 20 y cant, o gael gwared ar y feirws ac nid yw'n addas ar gyfer pob claf. those treated. The National Institute for Clinical Excellence has approved that combination. I assure Members that we will fund that treatment in Wales.

Several other therapeutic agents are being developed, which also show great promise. Significant developments and improvements in the treatments available are likely during the next few years. The Assembly has commissioned three pieces of work from the Public Health Laboratory Service at a cost of £62,000. These will measure the prevalence of hepatitis C in a 50 per cent sample of patients who presented for HIV antibody testing in south Wales during 2000; measure the prevalence of hepatitis C in patients investigated for HIV throughout Wales from 1996 to 2000; and determine demographic details and exposure group information for patients investigated for hepatitis infection in south Wales during 2000. These studies will give an indication of the prevalence of the virus in Wales and I will inform Assembly Members of the results.

Therefore, a special payments scheme has not been established on the basis that compensation or financial help is only given when the NHS or individuals working in it have been at fault. Our efforts must concentrate on future care. We must ensure that people with haemophilia and hepatitis C are supported and do not face discrimination and exclusion in their daily lives and that their voices are as strong as other patient groups in Wales. That is one of the most important messages. I am grateful that Dai Lloyd raised this issue today. Members of the Health and Social Services Committee, myself as Minister for Health and Social Services and all Assembly Members must recognise that the needs of this patient group are important.

Brian Hancock: I am concerned about this compensation scheme. I have examined the health and safety issues, particularly in relation to work. Section 6 of the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 refers to research and information regarding products for use at

The NHS could have assumed they were good, but did it do any research to check that the products that they were giving were good? If that consumer protection element has not been considered before now, is it possible to do that, because it could be the basis for considering a compensation scheme?

Jane Hutt: The technology to ensure that blood products are free from hepatitis C, in sufficient quantities to treat all haemophiliacs in the UK, was not available before 1985. Those issues have been considered in relation to the compensation scheme. I hope that answers your question, Brian.

To conclude. It is important that members of the Health and Social Services Committee and myself as Minister consider these issues and ensures that NICE's recommendations are implemented and that the combined therapies are available and used. We must ensure that counselling services and treatment centres in Wales are considered in terms of our priorities. The care of people in Wales with haemophilia and hepatitis must be our main goal and intention. I am grateful that this has come before the Assembly today.
