Cwestiynau i'r Gweinidog dros Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol **Questions to the Minister for Health and Social Services**

Ymchwil i Iechyd a Gofal Cymdeithasol **Research into Health and Social Care**

C1 Elin Jones: A wnaiff y Gweinidog ddatganiad byr ar ei blaenoriaethau o ran ymchwil i iechyd a gofal cymdeithasol? (OAQ11897)

The Minister for Health and Social Services (Jane Hutt): Research priorities for the NHS and social services are set out in circular WHC (2000) 25 on the Joint NHS and Social Services Planning and Priorities Guidance: 2000/01–2003/04. For health, the priorities are primary care, coronary heart disease and cancer. For social care, the priorities are promoting independent living, supporting families and carers, and protecting vulnerable people. At the interface between both services, the priorities are children, mental health, reducing health inequalities, equality of opportunity and substance misuse.

Q1 Elin Jones: Will the Minister make a brief statement on her priorities for research into health and social care? (OAQ11897)

Y Gweinidog dros Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol (Jane Hutt): Gosodir y blaenoriaethau ymchwil ar gyfer yr NHS a'r gwasanaethau cymdeithasol yng nghylchlythyr WHC (2000) 25 ar y Joint NHS and Social Services Planning and Priorities Guidance: 2000/01–2003/04. Y blaenoriaethau iechyd yw gofal sylfaenol, afiechyd coronaidd y galon a chanser. Y blaenoriaethau gofal cymdeithasol yw hyrwyddo byw'n annibynnol, cefnogi teuluoedd a gofalwyr, a diogelu pobl ddiamddifffyn. Y blaenoriaethau o ran y cysylltiad rhwng y ddau wasanaeth yw plant, iechyd meddwl, lleihau anghydraddoldebau

iechyd, cyfle cyfartal a chamddefnyddio sylweddau.

Elin Jones: Yr wyf yn croesawu'r gwaith ymchwil blaengar a wneir yn y maes hwn yng Nghymru, ond pa gynnlluniau sydd gan y Gweinidog i ychwanegu at y gwaith ymchwil a'r arian ymchwil a ddaw i Gymru o'r sector cyhoeddus a sectorau eraill?

Jane Hutt: We have developed a programme of research and development for health and social care and health impact assessments in Wales, through the Wales Office of Research and Development and the Health Promotion Division. We also know that health trusts and health organisations throughout Wales, as well as our universities, attract external funding. We are making great progress in many areas of research.

David Melding: Does the Minister agree that, during national carers week, we should emphasise the need for good data on how many carers' assessments are completed in Wales, and whether statutory agencies are informing carers at the appropriate time that they have a right to such an assessment?

Jane Hutt: That is an appropriate comment to make during national carers week. I will certainly monitor the situation carefully with local authorities, to ensure that carers are aware of carers' assessments and that take-up is monitored.

Mick Bates: This week we have seen the publication of figures regarding the number of suicides in rural areas, and the increased number of calls for help to stress lines. Are you satisfied that we have adequate investment and research into the causes of this stress and that it is being dealt with effectively?

Jane Hutt: I am aware of those issues, and I was recently asked to approve the commissioning of a research programme into health and wellbeing issues in rural Wales. That will be an 18-month work programme, including a rural perspective on health issues for the National Assembly. It will commence in 2001. I am also aware of the good work

Elin Jones: I welcome the innovative research work being undertaken in this field in Wales, but what plans does the Minister have to add to the research work and the finance for research that comes to Wales from the public sector and other sectors?

Jane Hutt: Yr ydym wedi datblygu rhaglen ymchwil a datblygu ar gyfer iechyd a gofal cymdeithasol ac asesiadau o effaith iechyd yng Nghymru, drwy Swyddfa Ymchwil a Datblygu Cymru a'r Adran Hybu Iechyd. Gwyddom hefyd fod ymddiriedolaethau iechyd a sefydliadau iechyd ledled Cymru, yn ogystal â'n prifysgolion, yn denu arian o'r tu allan. Yr ydym yn datblygu'n sylweddol mewn sawl maes ymchwil.

David Melding: A gytuna'r Gweinidog y dylem, yn ystod wythnos genedlaethol y gofalwyr, bwysleisio'r angen am wybodaeth dda ar sawl asesiad gofalwyr a gaiff eu gwblhau yng Nghymru, ac a yw asiantaethau statudol yn hysbysu gofalwyr, ar yr adeg briodol, fod ganddynt hawl i gael asesiad o'r fath?

Jane Hutt: Mae hynny yn sylw priodol i'w wneud yn ystod wythnos genedlaethol y gofalwyr. Byddaf yn sicr yn monitro'r sefyllfa yn ofalus gydag awdurdodau lleol, i sicrhau bod gofalwyr yn ymwybodol o asesiadau gofalwyr ac y caiff y nifer o asesiadau eu monitro.

Mick Bates: Yr wythnos hon, cyhoeddwyd y ffigurau ar gyfer nifer yr achosion o hunanladdiad mewn ardaloedd gwledig, a'r nifer uwch o alwadau am help i linellau cymorth sydd yn delio â straen. A ydych yn fodlon ein bod yn buddsoddi ac yn ymchwilio yn ddigonol i achosion y straen hwn a'i fod yn cael ei drin yn effeithiol?

Jane Hutt: Yr wyf yn ymwybodol o'r materion hynny, a gofynnwyd i mi yn ddiweddar i gymeradwyo comisiynu rhaglen ymchwil i faterion iechyd a lles yng nghefn gwlad Cymru. Bydd honno yn rhaglen waith o 18 mis, gan gynnwys perspectif gwledig ar faterion iechyd ar gyfer y Cynulliad Cenedlaethol. Bydd yn dechrau yn 2001. Yr

Q3 Glyn Davies: What plans does the Minister have to improve the health and physical fitness of Assembly Members? (OAQ11893)

Jane Hutt: Thank you, Glyn. You are, of course, a shining example to us all.

I am concerned that all those connected with the National Assembly for Wales—both Assembly Members and Assembly staff—should be aware of the need to follow the healthy living guidelines relating to smoking, diet and physical fitness. These are available in Welsh and English on the Assembly's website.

Plans are currently being prepared to modernise the Assembly's Occupational Health Service, so that its focus is extended to include the promotion of healthy lifestyles as one of its key components.

Glyn Davies: I welcome your answer, as one of the greatest problems facing modern society is the increasing lack of physical fitness. Do you agree that Assembly Members should set an example, and for that purpose we should have a facility here for honing our torsos and becoming fit? Will you support a call for the inclusion of a facility in this building for that purpose?

Jane Hutt: I endorse your comments on the fitness of Assembly Members. On 3 July, Assembly Members will have an opportunity to test their fitness and health when the coronary heart disease national service framework is launched in the Assembly. The services and facilities provided in the Assembly building are a matter for the House Committee, not for me. The Minister for Finance, Local Government and

C3 Glyn Davies: Pa gynlluniau sydd gan y Gweinidog ar gyfer gwella iechyd a ffitrwydd corfforol Aelodau'r Cynulliad? (OAQ11893)

Jane Hutt: Diolch, Glyn. Yr ydych, wrth gwrs, yn esiampl i bawb ohonom.

Yr wyf yn awyddus y dylai pob un sydd yn gysylltiedig â Chynulliad Cenedlaethol Cymru—yn Aelodau'r Cynulliad a staff y Cynulliad—fod yn ymwybodol o'r angen i ddilyn y canllawiau byw'n iach sydd yn ymwneud ag ysmaygu, deiet a ffitrwydd corfforol. Alun Pugh: Does the Minister accept that the best advice for the unfit and middle-aged is to take moderate exercise such as walking, swimming or cycling? Will she set an example to the Assembly by taking part again in national bike to work day next week?

Jane Hutt: This will be the third year in which I will set off from Cathays Park on a bicycle on national bike to work day on 20 June. I hope that many Members will join me.

Jane Hutt: It is important that the Assembly takes the lead in adopting UK and Welsh corporate health standards. Back problems are a major issue for any employer, particularly in the health service, where people are under strain and stress. I am sure that Assembly Members will ensure that we take the lead on this.

Rhodri Glyn Thomas: Some workforces are less healthy than others, and perhaps this workforce is among those that are less healthy. Do you accept that many staff who work in health organisations within the health service suffer from back problems? Do you intend to create a health service for workforces within the NHS?

The Presiding Officer: Order. This question relates to Assembly Members' fitness, not to Welsh people's backs in general.

Rhodri Glyn Thomas: I will include people who suffer from back problems in this organisation, some of them who have less backbone than others, perhaps.

Jane Hutt: Mae'n bwysig bod y Cynulliad yn cymryd yr awenau wrth fabwysiadu safonau iechyd corfforaethol y DU a Chymru. Q4 Cynog Dafis: What steps can the Minister take to ensure the independence of any new public support and liaison service for the NHS in Wales? (OAQ11916)

Jane Hutt: We are currently consulting the public and other key stakeholders on a range of patient advocacy, support and involvement mechanisms designed to strengthen the voice of patients and the public in the NHS. That consultation includes services that may be independent. I look forward to receiving the outcome of the consultation, which will be considered by the Health and Social Services Committee.

Cynog Dafis: A yw'r Gweinidog yn derbyn ei bod yn bwysig, o ran hygrededd cleifion, fod unrhyw wasanaeth eiriolaeth yn rhydd o ddylanwad buddiannau sectorau proffesiynol o fewn y gwasanaeth iechyd, a bod cleifion yn teimlo y caiff eu pryderon a'u cwynion eu harchwilio'n ddi-duedd, fel y gallant ymddiried yn llwyr yn y canlyniadau?

Jane Hutt: That is one of the main reasons why I sought to, and achieved, the retention of the community health council, as an independent body for patients. The consultations that we are undertaking include proposals for an independent complaints advocacy service, new proposals for front-line help for patients, with patient support officers based in hospitals and in the community, and the possible establishment of public and patient involvement groups. The consultations also include reconsidering strengthening the role of community health councils. We will also consider the recommendations of the Government review of the complaints procedure in Wales.

Alun Cairns: Does the Minister accept that, in order for there to be sufficient confidence in any new public support and liaison service, staff should not be employed directly by the trust?

Jane Hutt: The question of which body should employ patient support officers in hospitals and in the community is being considered as part of the consultation. The community health councils, which are independent, must take the lead in devising the role and remit of complaints officers and monitor their work. The Assembly will also monitor their work. That will be subject to

Cynog Dafis: Does the Minister accept that it is important, in terms of credibility among patients, that any advocacy service is not influenced by the interests of professional sectors within the health service, and that patients feel that their concerns and complaints will be investigated without bias, so that they can have complete confidence in the results?

Jane Hutt: Dyna un o'r prif resymau y ceisiais ac y llwyddais i gadw'r cyngor iechyd cymunedol fel corff annibynnol i gleifion. Mae'r ymgynghoriadau a gynhalawn yn cynnwys argymhellion ar gyfer gwasanaeth eiriolaeth cwynion annibynnol, argymhellion newydd ar gyfer help rheng-flaen i gleifion, gyda swyddogion cymorth i gleifion yn gweithio mewn ysbytai ac yn y gymuned, a'r posiblwydd o sefydlu grwpiau sydd yn cynnwys y cyhoedd a chleifion. Jane Hutt: Caiff mater pa gorff ddylai gyflogi swyddogion cymorth cleifion mewn ysbytai ac yn y gymuned ei ystyried fel rhan o'r ymgynghoriad. Rhaid i'r cynhorau iechyd cymuned, sydd yn annibynnol, gymryd yr awenau wrth ddyfeisio rôl a chylch gwaith swyddogion cwynion a monitro eu gwaith. Bydd y Cynulliad hefyd yn monitro eu gwaith. Bydd hynny yn destun

Polisi Iechyd Cenedlaethol ar gyfer Cymru National Health Policy for Wales

Q5 Janet Ryder: How are regional disparities factored into the development of a national health policy for Wales? (OAQ11896)

Jane Hutt: The report, 'Access and Excellence', identified four health economies in Wales that reflect the natural relationship between hospital services, clinical practices and patient flows. These economies provide a planning focus to develop health services for north Wales, Powys, west Wales and south-east Wales. The 'Improving Health in Wales' implementation group is considering these to reflect healthcare needs at a regional and local level. The strategic direction for tackling health inequalities will be provided by the National Assembly.

Janet Ryder: How do you intend to incorporate regional planning into a national strategy after the abolition of the health authorities?

Jane Hutt: It is important that we consider the results and recommendations of 'Access and Excellence', which identify the regional dimension of the health service and recognise that differences and needs are emerging at a regional level. We are removing a tier of hierarchy in Wales by abolishing the health authorities. We must acknowledge the local and regional differences and needs. That will be done strategically through the Assembly and locally through the local health groups.

Eleanor Burnham: Yn fy etholaeth, sef Gogledd Cymru, nid oes cefnogaeth HIV ar gael. C5 Janet Ryder: Ym mha ffordd y caiff gwahaniaethau rhanbarthol eu hystyried wrth ddatblygu polisi iechyd cenedlaethol ar gyfer Cymru? (OAQ11896)

Jane Hutt: Nododd yr adroddiad 'Mynediad a Rhagoriaeth', bedwar economi iechyd yng Nghymru sydd yn adlewyrchu'r berthynas naturiol rhwng gwasanaethau ysbrytai, arferion clinigol a llif cleifion. Mae'r economiau hyn yn rhoi ffocws cynllunio i ddatblygu gwasanaethau iechyd ar gyfer gogledd Cymru, Powys, gorllewin Cymru a de-ddwyrain Cymru. Mae grŵp gweithredu 'Gwella Iechyd yng Nghymru' yn ystyried bod y rhain yn adlewyrchu anghenion gofal iechyd ar lefel ranbarthol a lleol. Janet Ryder: Sut y bwriadwch ymgorffori cynllunio rhanbarthol i strategaeth genedlaethol ar ôl diddymu'r awdurdodau iechyd?

Jane Hutt: Mae'n bwysig ein bod yn ystyried canlyniadau ac argymhellion 'Mynediad a Rhagoriaeth', sydd yn nodi dimensiwn rhanbarthol y gwasanaeth iechyd ac yn cydnabod bod gwahaniaethau ac anghenion yn dod i'r wyneb ar lefel ranbarthol. Yr ydym yn dileu haen o hierarchaeth yng Nghymru drwy ddiddymu'r awdurdodau iechyd. Dylem gydnabod y gwahaniaethau a'r anghenion lleol a rhanbarthol. Gwneir hynny yn strategol drwy'r Cynulliad ac yn lleol drwy'r grwpiau iechyd lleol.

Eleanor Burnham: In my constituency of North Wales, there is no HIV support available. The closest centres are in Chester and Liverpool and the only clinic where people can be tested anonymously is only open for 30 hours a week. Given that, how do you intend to provide the support and facilities that the people of north Wales need and deserve?

Jane Hutt: I am aware of those issues. I have met several times with the chief consultant in north Wales, who is a strong campaigner on this issue. She is the person who won the Welsh Woman of the Year award this year. It is part of our sexual health strategy to consider this, but we are also mapping out our needs for our HIV services in Wales and how we take this issue forward, in terms of HIV and AIDS. North Wales is part of that strategic approach.

Peter Rogers: Do you acknowledge that special factors affect health provision in rural areas of Wales and do you agree that the Townsend committee should bear in mind in its forthcoming report that rurality is a major factor in health resource allocation?

Jane Hutt: The Health and Social Services Committee will shortly receive a report on resource allocation from Professor Peter Townsend, which targets health inequalities and the health needs of populations throughout Wales. Part of the research on that has been to consider urban factors and rural issues. Therefore, rurality factors will be reflected in the report. That report will go out to full consultation during the coming months.

Jane Hutt: Yr wyf yn ymwybodol o'r materion hynny. Yr wyf wedi cyfarfod â'r prif ymgynghorydd yng ngogledd Cymru sawl gwaith, sydd yn ymgrychyd brwd ar y mater hwn. Peter Rogers: A dderbyniwch fod ffactorau arbennig yn effeithio ar ddarpariaeth iechyd mewn ardaloedd gwledig o Gymru ac a gytunwch y dylai pwylgor Townsend gadw mewn cof yn ei adroddiad sydd ar y gweill fod gwledigrwydd yn ffactor amlwg wrth ddyrannu adnoddau iechyd?

Jane Hutt: Cyn bo hir, bydd y Pwyllgor Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol yn derbyn adroddiad ar ddyrannu adnoddau gan yr Athro Peter Townsend, sydd yn targedu anghydraddoldebau iechyd ac angenion iechyd poblogaethau ledled Cymru. Rhan o'r ymchwil hwnnw oedd ystyried ffactorau trefol a materion gwledig. Felly, caiff ffactorau gwledigrwydd eu hadlewyrchu yn yr adroddiad. Datblygiad Gwasanaethau Iechyd Meddwl yng Nghaerdydd Development of Mental Health Services in Wales

Q6 Pauline Jarman: Will the Minister make a brief statement on the development of mental health services in Cardiff? (OAQ11900)

Jane Hutt: The development of mental health services in particular areas is currently a matter for the relevant health authority and partner organisations. On the all-Wales front, the National Assembly is working on the production of two strategies covering mental health services in Wales, final versions of which will be issued this summer. They will help inform local decisions and should lead to greater equity of access across Wales.

C6 Pauline Jarman: A wnaiff y Gweinidog ddatganiad cryno ar ddatblygiad gwasanaethau iechyd meddwl yng Nghaerdydd? (OAQ11900)

Jane Hutt: Ar hyn o bryd mae datblygiad gwasanaethau iechyd meddwl mewn ardaloedd arbennig yn fater i'r awdurdod iechyd perthnasol a sefydliadau partner. O ran sefyllfa Cymru gyfan, mae'r Cynulliad Cenedlaethol yn gweithio ar gynhyrchu dwy strategaeth yn cwmpasu gwasanaethau iechyd meddwl yng Nghymru, a dosberthir fersiynau terfynol ohonynt yr haf hwn. Byddant yn helpu i lywio penderfyniadau lleol a dylent arwain at well mynediad i bawb ar ledled Cymru.

Pauline Jarman: You will, no doubt, be aware that it is extremely important to encourage joined-up working in such areas. How do you intend to ensure that the new flexibility in pooling NHS and social service departments' budgets, as we discussed in Plenary on Tuesday, will be used to improve mental health?

Jane Hutt: Mental health improvement will depend on the health and social care sectors working closely together, and with our partners in the voluntary sector, users and carers. The flexibilities that we are enabling in Wales and the additional grant that we approved on Tuesday will help us break down barriers and move forward with pioneering practice, of which there are already examples in Wales. We will have to monitor that closely and ensure that the NHS and local government work closely together. We believe that we are striving to do that through the new plan, 'Improving Health in Wales'.

Richard Edwards: A conference on dual diagnosis, which was sponsored by the Assembly, was held some three months ago. It linked mental health with alcohol and substance abuse. Will you give a progress report on that?

Jane Hutt: That is an important issue. It was part of the exploration of the adult mental health strategy and is also an issue for the child and adolescent mental health strategy. That will emerge as a policy area that we must address in Wales through the renewal and development of our mental health services. Thank you for making that point. We will follow it up.

William Graham: Will you comment on the demand from organisations such as the Zito Trust, for independent inquiries into murders committed by people with diagnosed mental health problems. One hundred and twenty such investigations have been carried out in England, but not one in Wales.

Ceisiadau am Leoedd Mewn Sefydliadau Addysg Uwch Applications into Higher Education Institutions

Q1 Peter Black: Will the Minister give the latest figures on applications into higher education institutions within Wales for courses starting in September 2001? (OAQ11947)

The Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning (Jane Davidson): The latest figures published by the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service on 1 June 2001 show that, as at 16 May 2001, there were 54,224 students applying to study for full-time and sandwich undergraduate courses at Welsh higher education institutions in 2001-02.

Peter Black: In Scotland, where tuition fees have been abolished, there has been a huge increase in the number of students going to university. Given the publication of the Rees Commission report today, will you welcome its recommendations and make representations to the UK Government to abolish tuition fees in Wales?

Jane Davidson: The number of students applying to go to university in Scotland has increased by 3.4 per cent. It should be noted that the number of students from Wales applying to go to universities throughout the UK has increased by over 1 per cent. We are waiting to hear the outcome of the independent commission, of which the Liberal Democrats seem to suggest that they have prior knowledge. I look forward, as am I sure the entire Assembly does, to attending the press conference at 11 a.m. today and joining with all Assembly Members for the official launch in the Assembly Neuadd at 12.30 p.m.

Y Gweinidog dros Addysg a Dysgu Gydol Oes (Jane Davidson): Dengys y ffigurau diweddaraf a gyhoeddwyd ar 1 Mehefin 2001 gan y Gwasanaeth Mynediad i Brifysgolion a Cholegau y gwnaethpwyd cais, erbyn 16 Mai 2001, gan 54,224 o fyfyrwyr i astudio ar gyrsiau israddedig amser llawn a chyrsiau rhyngosod mewn sefydliadau addysg uwch yng Nghymru yn 2001-02.

Peter Black: Yn yr Alban, lle y diddymwyd ffioedd dysgu, bu cynydd enfawr yn nifer y myfyrwyr sydd yn mynd i brifysgol. Gan ystyried y cyhoeddir adroddiad Comisiwn Rees heddiw, a groesawch ei argymhellion a chyflwyno sylwadau i Lywodraeth y DU i ddiddymu ffioedd dysgu yng Nghymru?

Jane Davidson: Mae nifer y myfyrwyr sydd yn gwneud cais i fynychu prifysgol yn yr Alban wedi cynyddu 3.4 y cant. Dylid nodi bod nifer y myfyrwyr o Gymru sydd yn gwneud cais i fynychu prifysgolion ledled y DU wedi cynyddu o dros 1 y cant. Arhoswn i glywed canlyniad y comisiwn annibynnol, y mae'r Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol yn awgrymu bod ganddynt wybodaeth flaenorol ohono. Jane Davidson: The Assembly agreed the budget for the education service last year. At the meeting of the Education and Lifelong Learning Committee yesterday, I undertook to provide you with information on end of year flexibility. I will do that at the next Committee.

Lorraine Barrett: Do you agree that it is not the case that Scotland has abolished tuition fees, but rather have abolished up-front tuition fees as there is still a graduate endowment tax? We must be clear on that.

Jane Davidson: Those who visited Scotland and Northern Ireland with the Education and Lifelong Learning Committee, heard at first hand that Scotland has not, as Lorraine said, dropped the principle of tuition fees. It has abolished up-front tuition fees and put in place a graduate endowment tax, which applies to all university leavers subject to their income.

In Northern Ireland, the Minister of Education is currently consulting on proposals, not to abandon tuition fees, but to consider introducing bursaries to encourage widening participation among those who suffer the most hardship. I await the independent commission's proposals with interest.

Jonathan Morgan: If the recommendations are, as we expect, that tuition fees should be abolished and maintenance grants should be reintroduced, this will be widely seen as a complete vindication of the policies that the Welsh Conservative Party has pursued for the last two years. Will you, therefore, publicly apologise to Wales's students, who are being hard hit by your Government's policies that are being pursued by the Westminster

Gareth Jones: Should not your Labour and Liberal Democrat colleagues congratulate you for succeeding in depriving the education service of an investment of up to £58 million during the last financial year? Does not this deficit intensify the obvious financial problems of further and higher education and schools in Wales?

Q2 Peter Black: When is the Minister expecting to publish an inquiry into sport in schools? (OAQ11948)

Jane Davidson: I have no plans to publish an inquiry into sport in schools. The physical education and school sport taskforce has produced its report. I am broadly content with its recommendations, and I am issuing the report for consultation this month. The report promotes a common vision for improving standards and provides an agenda for action for all those involved in the provision of PE and school sport activities. I have made £500,000 available this year to take forward several recommendations, which will include appointing a national PE and school sport co-ordinator to support the development and implementation of the recommendations.

Jane Davidson: As I have already said, it was an independent report. We have made £500,000 available this year to take forward

I have just mentioned that £500,000 has been made available to take forward the three key issues—appointing a national co-ordinator, developing the pilot centres as proposed in the report, and developing programmes and the continuing professional development of all teachers. That £500,000 is there now.

The Leader of the Welsh Conservatives (Nick Bourne): I have a question for Mrs Motivator Minister, in her role as a former PE teacher. I am sure that you agree that the provision of playing fields is vital. There is a proposal to take away a playing field in Fishguard to build a new primary school that is being displaced by a supermarket. I express due concern about that. Could we meet to discuss that situation? I realise that it is a crosscutting issue, but I am sure that you would agree that, in principle, playing fields are important. I wish to discuss this particular situation with you.

Q3 Glyn Davies: What plans does the Minister have to increase the proportion of each school's budget given directly to schools rather than through local education authorities? (OAQ11889)

Jane Davidson: Under the Financing of Maintained Schools Regulations 1999, a local education authority can retain funding for strategic management, access, school improvement, and specialised provision. The remainder of its schools budget must be allocated to schools. The key issue is not the level of delegation, it is whether authorities set appropriate levels of funding for schools' delegated budgets and for centrally provided services. Whether local authorities are responsive to the needs of their schools and provide high quality services for them is also an issue.

C3 Glyn Davies: Pa gynlluniau sydd gan y Gweinidog i gynyddu'r gyfran honno o gyllideb pob ysgol a roddir yn uniongyrchol i'r ysgolion, yn hytrach na thrwy awdurdodau addysg lleol? (OAQ11889)

Jane Davidson: O dan Reoliadau Ariannu Ysgolion a Gynhelir 1999, gall awdurdod addysg lleol gadw arian ar gyfer rheolaeth strategol, mynediad, gwella ysgolion, a darpariaeth arbenigol. Rhaid i weddill ei gyllideb i ysgolion gael ei ddyrannu i ysgolion. Nid lefel y dirprwyo yw'r mater allweddol, ond a yw'r awdurdodau yn pennu lefelau priodol o arian ar gyfer cyllidebau a ddirprwyir i ysgolion ac ar gyfer gwasanaethau a ddarperir yn ganolog. Mae pa un a yw'r awdurdodau lleol yn ymatebol i anghenion eu hysgolion ac yn darparu gwasanaethau o ansawdd uchel iddynt hefyd yn fater i'w drafod.

Glyn Davies: I worry about the effect that this has on staff morale. Do you accept the view recently put to me by a mid-Wales headteacher, that the current perceived disadvantages to schools in rural Wales—as compared with England and Scotland because of different arrangements—are going to lead to the haemorrhaging of ambitious young teachers from Wales? Do you not think that you should address this matter before too much damage is done?

Glyn Davies: Yr wyf yn poeni am yr effaith a gaiff hynny ar forâl y staff. Jane Davidson: No, I do not agree with that viewpoint. We must make the situation clear. We have demonstrated to the Education and Lifelong Learning Committee repeatedly,

Jane Davidson: Na, ni chytunaf â'r farm honno. Rhaid inni egluro'r sefyllfa. Yr ydym wedi ddangos i'r pwylgor Addysg a Dysgu Gydol Oes droeon, er bod ein dulliau ar gyfer

that although our mechanisms for funding are different, the overall spend matches up well with eight out of 10 English regions. That is a positive story. All of the extra money that has been provided by this Labour Government has been passed on to schools in Wales. It is important that we continue to work with our local education authorities to ensure that we provide high quality environments, which is why we are focusing on school buildings, as well as providing the teachers and the central support, which is essential. That is necessary particularly in rural areas such as Powys, where high transport costs are run through the local education authority.

Tom Middlehurst: Do you agree that headteachers in Wales highly value the professional and educational support services that local education authorities provide? Would you also acknowledge that it is important that LEAs retain the capacity to respond to local pressures and needs, as they should determine them within their county areas? In fact, in such areas as special education, transport, and so on, it is crucial that the LEA has the capacity and the ability to assess those needs and to meet those requirements.

Jane Davidson: I agree that there are several essential functions that cannot readily be delegated to schools. Specialist support for special educational needs is of great interest to the Assembly. I have already referred to major spending on school buildings and to school transport. Monitoring school performance, providing support to individual schools and drawing up education strategic plans, making provision for excluded pupils and those with behavioural difficulties are all issues that would be difficult to address at the individual level. The overall strategic responsibility is needed, but you also need local authorities to be accountable to their electorate for how much is spent on education and what is done with the money.

Welsh-medium Education in Further Education Colleges

C4 Gareth Jones: Pa gamau y mae'r Gweinidog wedi eu cymryd i fynd i'r afael â'r pryderon ynghylch darpariaeth addysg drwy gyfrwng y Gymraeg mewn colegau addysg bellach yng Nghymru? (OAQ11953)

Jane Davidson: Within the remit letter of the National Council for Education and Training for Wales, ELWa, I reflected the breadth and complexity of the work that the Assembly expects the national council to perform. That remit letter expressed that the council must develop a strategy for the provision of post-16 Welsh medium learning in response to need. I expect this to be taken forward as part of the development of the council's corporate plan. Within further education, a 40 per cent premium has been added for funding of courses delivered through the medium of Welsh, specifically to increase Welsh-medium provision. The national council will be reviewing the effectiveness of the arrangement and taking account of the results when developing its strategy.

Gareth Jones: Yr wyf yn falch o glywed am y buddsoddiad ychwanegol. Fel y gwyddoch, pwysleisiodd Prif Arolgydd Ysgolion Ei Mawrhydi yn ei hadroddiad blynyddol nad yw'r holl golegau addysg bellach a darparwyr hyfforddiant yn cynnig darpariaeth ddigonol ar gyfer disgyblion o ysgolion Cymraeg neu ddwyieithog. A yw datrys y broblem hon yn flaenoriaeth gan ELWa neu a yw hyn eto i'w ddehongli fel barn oddrychol ac i'w ddiddymu yn unol â'ch penderfyniad chi a'ch cyd-aelodau Llafur a Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol yn y Pwyllgor Addysg a Dysgu Gydol Oes ddoe?

Jane Davidson: Part of ELWa's remit is to reflect the Assembly's priorities for Welsh-medium provision in its statutory Welsh language scheme and corporate and business plans. ELWa will be developing strategies to encourage more people to take up learning through the medium of Welsh. In the meantime, ELWa is funding the Further Education Development Agency to translate and disseminate learning materials free of charge via the Wales Digital College website.

Q4 Gareth Jones: What measures has the Minister taken to address concerns surrounding the provision of Welsh-medium education in FE colleges in Wales? (OAQ11953)

Jane Davidson: O fewn cylch gwaith Cyngor Cenedlaethol Cymru dros Addysg a Hyfforddiant, ELWa, adlewyrchais ehangder a chymhlethdod y gwaith y mae'r Cynulliad yn disgwyli i'r cyngor cenedlaethol ymgymryd ag ef. Datganodd y llythyr cylch gwaith hwnnw fod yn rhaid i'r cyngor ddatblygu strategaeth ar gyfer darparu dysgu drwy gyfrwng y Gymraeg 6l-16 mewn ymateb i'r angen. Disgwyliaf i hyn gael ei weithredu fel rhan o ddatblygiad cynllun corfforaethol y cyngor. O fewn addysg bellach, ychwanegwyd premiwm o 40 y cant ar gyfer ariannu cyrsiau a gyflwynir drwy gyfrwng y Gymraeg, yn benodol i gynyddu'r ddarpariaeth drwy gyfrwng y Gymraeg. Bydd y cyngor cenedlaethol yn cynnal adolygiad ar effeithiolrwydd y trefniant ac yn ystyried y canlyniadau wrth ddatblygu ei strategaeth.

Gareth Jones: I am pleased to hear of that additional investment. As you know, Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Schools emphasised in her annual report that not all further education colleges and training providers offer sufficient provision for pupils from Welsh medium or bilingual schools. Is solving this problem a priority for ELWa or is this again to be interpreted as a subjective view to be dismissed in accordance with the decision taken by you and your Labour and Liberal Democrat colleagues in the Education and Lifelong Learning Committee yesterday?

Jane Davidson: Rhan o gylch gwaith ELWa yw adlewyrchu blaenoriaethau'r Cynulliad ar gyfer darpariaeth drwy gyfrwng y Gymraeg o fewn ei gynllun iaith Gymraeg statudol a chynlluniau corfforaethol a busnes. FORUM has also proposed the setting up of a bilingual post-16 learning centre to help institutions develop their bilingual provision and to produce and disseminate new teaching material. Therefore, I am confident that, by working closely with ELWa and with the colleges, we can improve the provision currently available.

Eleanor Burnham: Pa gamau a gymerir gennych i annog myfyrwyr i ddilyn cyrsiau drwy gyfrwng y Gymraeg mewn colegau addysg bellach yng Nghymru?

Jane Davidson: As I said in the initial response to the question, Eleanor, in its remit letter, we asked ELWa to ensure that there is a provision for post-16 Welsh-medium learning in response to need. In 1999, the former Further Education Funding Council for Wales commissioned Canolfan Bedwyr to undertake a study of Welsh-medium provision and the factors affecting it. The Education and Lifelong Learning Committee will be considering the findings of that study as part of its educational review of Welsh-medium education. The study discovered that the reluctance of Welsh speaking students to continue with their studies in Welsh was due to a number of reasons: peer pressure; eagerness to sever connections with school tradition; a perception that Welsh courses involved more work due to lack of course materials; examinations set in England and the perception that Welsh courses were too difficult. Clearly, as a body that wants to produce evidence-based policy, the Assembly needs to take the survey's findings into account. That survey contributed towards the remit given to ELWa to ensure that it enhances Welsh-medium provision.

Q1 Christine Chapman: Will you make a statement of progress on the use of debit cards for transactions in the Assembly canteen and shop? (OAQ11922)

The Deputy Presiding Officer (John Marek): As far as I am aware, the House Committee has not been asked to consider the matter and, therefore, no progress has been made.

Christine Chapman: I hope that we can make progress on this matter, as it seems draconian that, for whatever reason, the Assembly does not allow this kind of transaction. It is surprising to constituents and visitors, especially those from abroad. A group of visitors from Patagonia, who visited the Assembly last month, was surprised that it could not purchase any products by debit card. This situation could be mitigated by the installation of a cash point machine nearby.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: I note your comments. We are currently in the process of trying to set up a post office where cheques could be cashed, and I hope that that plan will come to fruition. Eurest does accept payment by cheque. However, the installation of a card machine would cost the Assembly money. I will refer your request for Eurest to be able to accept payment by debit card to the catering sub-committee. If it can, it should do so.

Alun Cairns: What discussions has the Deputy Presiding Officer had with banks, regarding establishing a cash point or similar machine in the National Assembly? If they can be established in petrol forecourts and Spar shops, there is no reason why we cannot have one in the Assembly.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: In response to the House Committee's previous request to provide a cash point or a facility to cash cheques in the Assembly building, the feasibility of providing a cash-back facility in

Lle Parcio i Staff y Cynulliad Car Parking Provision for Assembly Staff

Q2 Brian Hancock: What is the latest situation with regard to car parking provision for staff working at the Assembly, Cardiff Bay? (OAQ11943)

The Deputy Presiding Officer: In granting our landlord, Grosvenor Waterside, planning permission to develop a park and ride site at the Queensgate roundabout, the planning inspector included the condition that the landlord close the temporary car parks on its land. This provision appears to include the Assembly's car park, but that is not certain, therefore the precise legal situation is currently being checked.

Brian Hancock: Do you agree that a desperate situation exists for Assembly staff, bearing in mind that there are little or no plans to develop the light railway or provide sufficient parking, despite the extensive development of offices and other buildings in the area?

The Deputy Presiding Officer: The House Committee, thankfully, has no responsibilities for offices, light railways or any other public service provision in the surrounding area. It does, however, have a duty to ensure that its staff can get to work. The Executive is currently conducting a green transport questionnaire on the formulation of a green transport plan. That is in progress. The intention is that members of staff who need to use their car because of unsocial hours or for whatever reason should be able to bring their car to the National Assembly. However, where possible, if Members or staff can use other forms of public transport, they should be encouraged to do so. You will have to wait to see how the

Brian Gibbons: Will you explore the possibility of making Cardiff city car parking cards available in the Assembly shop, so that people can park in public parking facilities closer to the Assembly?

The Deputy Presiding Officer: We will give that consideration.

Alun Pugh: Do you believe that we should encourage alternatives to travelling to work by car, by ensuring that the shuttle service always stops at Cardiff central station en route?

The Deputy Presiding Officer: Yes. As I said to Brian, we should encourage members of staff and Assembly Members to use other forms of transport if they can. One possibility, if there is demand for it, is to set up a good bus service—with a bus leaving every five minutes in peak periods—between Cardiff Central and Queen Street train stations and the Assembly. However, there is no point in providing that service unless there is demand for it. We have the postcode addresses of all Assembly staff and an exercise is currently being undertaken to see whether the introduction of such a service would be useful and cost-efficient for the Assembly.

Nick Bourne: Support staff are having genuine problems parking. It is easy for Assembly Members, who do not have problems. Will the House Committee consider this matter urgently? It is causing concern, and staff are having to arrive at work very early, before normal working hours, to find a parking space.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: I agree with everything you have said. We are looking at this. However, Members must realise that one of the under-used areas of parking is the building's basement where they have allocated parking spaces. The House Committee has suggested that Members make those places available to their support staff when they are not using them. Therefore, I urge Members to take that suggestion seriously so that those places can be used by staff. However, I agree that there

Q3 Richard Edwards: What arrangements are in place to provide Assembly building security passes for constituency based support staff? (OAQ11926)

C3 Richard Edwards: Pa drefniadau a sefydlwyd i ddarparu cardiau adnabod i staff cymorth sydd yn gweithio yn yr etholaethau fel y gallant ddod i mewn i adeilad y Cynulliad? (OAQ11926)

The Deputy Presiding Officer: The House Committee agreed on 14 February 2001 that Assembly Members could allocate up to three building passes to their support staff including constituency staff. A list of current pass holders for the building is maintained by the Members' helpdesk. No Member has allocated more than three at the moment, and we are not aware of any further demand. Temporary day passes for the building are also available.

Y Dirprwy Lywydd: Cytunodd Pwyllgor y Tŷ ar 14 Chwefror 2001 y gallai Aelodau'r Cynulliad ddyrannu hyd at dri cherdyn adnabod i'w staff cymorth, gan gynnwys staff yr etholaethau. Caiff rhestr o ddeiliaid cardiau adnabod presennol ar gyfer yr adeilad ei gadw gan ddesg gymorth yr Aelodau. Ni ddyrannwyd mwy na thri i unrhyw Aelod ar hyn o bryd, ac nid ydym yn ymwybodol o unrhyw alw pellach. Mae cardiau adnabod dyddiol dros dro ar gyfer yr adeilad hefyd ar gael.

Richard Edwards: My understanding is that until around three months ago, there was no problem with constituency-based support staff gaining permanent security passes. However, there has been a problem recently, and they now have to undergo the extremely laborious vetting procedures that all visitors to the Assembly must endure.

the Welsh Affairs Select Committee in Westminster. We will be offering passes to the newly-elected MPs for Wales and those who have an interest in Wales. In return, we were led to believe that there would be a relaxation in Westminster on issuing passes to AMs. That has proved not to be the case. The relevant committee at Westminster has said that if AMs want a pass, they must take advantage of the existing methods of obtaining one by asking an existing MP to see the Serjeant at Arms so that a pass may be awarded. I do not think that that is good enough, so I will write to the Chair of the Welsh Affairs Select Committee when he or she is appointed. I do no know when that will be. It could be by the end of July, but it is not unknown for Select Committees in the House of Commons to be delayed by around six months before members are appointed.

Q4 Karen Sinclair: Will the Committee give a brief update on progress towards British sign language provision in the National Assembly for Wales? (OAQ11939)

The Deputy Presiding Officer: The Presiding Office has been considering the options of providing British sign language on the Assembly's broadcast feed for some time. The costs involved would be significant. However, the recent proposal by the all-party group on deaf issues for the more limited option of providing BSL services to visitors to this building is helpful. In response to that, the Presiding Office now hopes to extend the current provision of deaf awareness training to all its staff who have direct contact with the public. It also hopes to provide more advanced awareness training and some British Sign Language training for a more limited number of staff. The Presiding Office is also looking into the costs and feasibility of providing BSL interpretation for visitors on demand. A full report will be made to the next meeting of the House Committee.

Karen Sinclair: Do you agree that, if we are committed to inclusion, the provision of BSL in this building is imperative, not only for the access to this institution, but also for the message that it gives to other institutions and businesses?

The Deputy Presiding Officer: I agree, but the difficulty is exactly what is meant by ‘the provision of BSL in this building’. It would be prohibitive to have people who are efficient in BSL always available. It is a question of satisfying a demand and doing it in a cost-effective way. As a result of the last report from the deaf awareness group, I think that we can make progress and that the costs are manageable. I hope to be able to provide a positive response to the House Committee within a month.

Helen Mary Jones: To what extent are these plans being discussed with hearing impaired people themselves as well as with groups and organisations representing them? Are there any plans to install mini-com facilities in the National Assembly to assist hearing impaired people to access our proceedings?

The Deputy Presiding Officer: Yes. Hearing loops and so on are available. However, I am told that for profoundly deaf people—there are only 4,000 such people in Wales—the situation is entirely different to those who are only partially hearing impaired.

Lorraine Barrett: Are information leaflets available in Braille? If not, are there any plans to provide them, at the information desk for instance?

The Deputy Presiding Officer: I am not sure whether information leaflets are available in Braille. However, we have Braille notices in the lifts and other places so that blind people who need to use Braille to get around the building are able to do so. I

Q5 Alun Cairns: Will the Deputy Presiding Officer make a statement on access to the National Assembly building? (OAQ11938)

The Deputy Presiding Officer: Access to the Assembly building is based on the principle of open and accessible government, while maintaining security of the building and all its occupants. Visitors to the building are required to be scanned and can then gain access to the public areas of the building. Visitors to other areas of the building must be escorted by a building pass holder.

Alun Cairns: A number of chief executives and senior appointees within local authorities have expressed concern that, although they are regular users of the building through attending meetings, they find it extremely difficult to gain access to the building although they know where they are going. Are there any plans to extend access to the building to such people?

The Deputy Presiding Officer: Certain conditions of security are waived for very important visitors. Alun, if you think that council leaders and chief executives are very important visitors, I invite you to make a submission to the House Committee and it will be given full consideration.

Rod Richards: Does the Dirprwy Lywydd agree that access to various parts of the building would be facilitated by accurate floor plans? Is he aware that the existing floor plans are inverted both laterally and vertically, which means that one has to stand on one's head looking into a mirror to make sense of them? While this is not a problem for the Liberal Democrats, the rest of us would appreciate accurate floor plans.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: I am aware that Members look at situations in all sorts of ways. The answer is that we must have these floor plans in various situs and orientations to

Q6 Glyn Davies: Has the Committee discussed the need for a speaker's podium in the new Assembly Chamber? (OAQ11923)

The Deputy Presiding Officer: All Assembly Members were consulted by survey for their views on a podium as part of the process of preparing a detailed design specification for the new Chamber. The policy steering group responded to the questions raised by Members over the arrangement of the front of the new Chamber by asking the architects to prepare alternative options for the layout of the Cabinet's and Presiding Officer's desks. Once these options have been finalised, they will be made available for further comment by Members.

Glyn Davies: I think that I welcome that, but I am not absolutely certain, as is the case with many of your clever answers, which I appreciate. However, do you agree that Members who wish to enliven the Chamber with oratory, or who, as David Melding and Rhodri Glyn often do, speak with a dash of flamboyance, require a podium at the front to perform fully?

The Deputy Presiding Officer: That question must be decided according to the wishes of individual Members. Certainly, the House Committee will be consulted. The decision will be undertaken by the Executive, which is managing the organisation and construction of the new building. Its care will be handed over to the Presiding Office and the House Committee once it is built. However, Glyn, you have my assurance that there will be time for comment. Any decision taken on this matter will be as a result of Assembly Members' wishes.

The Minister for Culture, Sport and the Welsh Language (Jenny Randerson): I am grateful for the opportunity to make a

statement, under Standing Order No. 19.20, about a further guarantee that I have given to the National Eisteddfod. The guarantee is worth £200,000. That is a notifiable transaction for the purpose of Standing Order No. 19.16. This is a further guarantee following the original guarantee worth £150,000 covered by my statement of 8 May. This statement also gives me the opportunity to keep the Assembly up to date on the current position. As a result of the guarantee originally made to the eisteddfod, it has been able to forge ahead with its arrangements for this year. Interest in the eisteddfod is gathering pace as the weeks go on. The organisers have dealt with inquiries about its location and dates this year from as far afield as Canada and Australia and, in some cases, from visitors who wish to time their visits to Wales to coincide with the dates.

The eisteddfod organisers have kept in close touch with officials in Cardiff and have had a number of consultations with National Assembly veterinary staff in north Wales, both onsite and offsite, to ensure that they are putting into place every safety measure possible in the context of the foot and mouth disease outbreak.

The tourism industry in the area is anxious for the eisteddfod to proceed. That is hardly surprising. Last year's eisteddfod in Llanelli attracted over 160,000 visitors and drew some £6 million into the local economy. A successful event in Denbigh would do a great deal to boost tourism in that area in this difficult year.

I met representatives from the eisteddfod to assess how the situation has progressed. Since the original guarantee, much progress has been made, contracts have been signed and considerable sums of money have been committed. They asked the Assembly to consider a further guarantee against some of the losses they would face if they had to cancel the festival at a very late stage. Even with the guarantee already given, the entire future of the eisteddfod would be in severe

doubt were a late cancellation to be forced. The money to back up the further guarantee is in the 2001-02 reserve. Powers contained in section 32 of the Government of Wales Act 1998 enable the Assembly to take appropriate action to support culture and the Welsh language. Those powers have been delegated to me as Minister for Culture, Sport and the Welsh Language.

In making this further sum available to the eisteddfod, I have attached two conditions, on which I have asked for assurances to be made. The first is that is that there is a fallback plan in place for an alternative event to be held, should the full eisteddfod be cancelled. The eisteddfod has given me assurances that it would at least be able to hold a number of musical events. That would fulfil two objectives. First, the eisteddfod would be able to recoup some of its expenditure. Secondly, an event would take place, albeit in a reduced form. The second condition is that, from now on, the eisteddfod must bear the risk of carrying on with the arrangements above the £350,000 that we have already committed. The guarantees offered by the Assembly have enabled the eisteddfod to continue with its arrangements at a time when there were considerable worries about the extent of the foot and mouth disease outbreak. We have reached a point now when the eisteddfod should and can decide whether to continue with its arrangements. I will be meeting with eisteddfod officials in the next few weeks to discuss that fully. In a normal year, the main worry is whether August will be even wetter than usual. This has not been a normal year. I am glad that the Assembly has been able to offer some underpinning to the eisteddfod in these difficult circumstances. Let us all hope now that the eisteddfod will proceed as planned. If all goes well up to and including the first week of August, I am sure that a few showers will be no problem.

I am talking about it all the time at the moment. Its circumstances are the same as those of the National Eisteddfod. I hope, following our scheduled meeting, that you will offer the same help to this prestigious event.

Jenny Randerson: I have made clear in the past that the circumstances are not the same. There are two ways in which they differ. First, the International Eisteddfod decided to go ahead and face the financial risk whereas the National Eisteddfod decided that it could not do so without financial underpinning from the Assembly. Secondly, the International Eisteddfod is held on a different type of site that is far less prone to the problems of foot and mouth disease because it is largely hard standing. The International Eisteddfod is not subject to as great a risk as the National Eisteddfod. However, I hear what you say, Karen. As you know, I have arranged to meet you and International Eisteddfod representatives in the near future. The International Eisteddfod is already talking to the Arts Council of Wales and the Denbighshire County Council about its future. I hope that we will have constructive talks when we meet. I think that that will be next week; it may be the following one.

Jonathan Morgan: On behalf of the Welsh

I press you on one point. In your statement, you outlined the reasons for the additional £200,000, but it is not clear how that decision came about. Those reasons would have existed when you originally allocated the first guarantee of £150,000. What has changed between 8 May and today? The justification that you gave indicates that that money should have been made available in May perhaps, when you made the original announcement. How did we reach this decision this morning? However, with that small caveat, I welcome the statement and say how much we look forward to this event.

Jenny Randerson: I am happy to give you further details on the reasons. When the eisteddfod's representatives first came to see me in April, they indicated that they had to make decisions at the beginning of May that would mean that, if they had to cancel during May, they would lose over £150,000. Therefore, we gave the first guarantee. We agreed at that meeting that we would meet again. We then saw the progress made after the first guarantee. The decisions that they had to make at the beginning of June incurred £200,000 of additional risk. Thereafter, as you go on, as on a graph, the risk increases steeply. However, we made decisions against the background of the progress of foot and mouth disease, taking into account the risk of an outbreak in that area.

Ann Jones: While I welcome this statement to safeguard the National Eisteddfod in Denbigh this year, I want to pick up on what you said about the Llangollen International Musical Eisteddfod. That is of major importance to my constituency. Many people were pleased when the International Eisteddfod did not stop to think, but was decisive, and took the bold decision to carry on and stage that event. Will you assure me

We will consider not only the situation this year, but also the International Eisteddfod's long-term future and will examine the issues raised by its current financial position. I am fully aware of the international importance of the International Eisteddfod to Wales and to our image abroad.

Janet Ryder: I have two points, again about the Llangollen International Musical Eisteddfod. You talked about Wales's image abroad, and the Llangollen eisteddfod sells Wales abroad. However, some of the teams from abroad now have doubts about attending because of the image that has been painted over the last months about foot and mouth disease. Will you give me an assurance that you will do your best to sort out visa problems of visiting groups, and encourage them to come and make the Llangollen eisteddfod a success?

I welcome the announcement for Denbighshire and the National Eisteddfod at Denbigh. It is a real sign of hope for people in that area to see the tents now being erected and the fields being prepared. It looks positive for this summer. I welcome what you said at the end of your statement. We experience some rain sometimes in August, and eisteddfods have been known to be slightly wet, but in your statement you seemed to give us a guarantee that you will solve that, Minister. Eleanor Burnham: While I welcome your statement about the National Eisteddfod, which is of great importance, as a former prize-winner at the Llangollen International Musical Eisteddfod, I am extremely concerned about that eisteddfod. It has suffered many problems over the years, for example, a lack of finance and backing from the Arts Council of Wales. I sincerely urge you to ensure that Llangollen receives equal priority.

Ieuan Wyn Jones: Point of order. I raise this under Standing Order No. 8.17 on motions in Committees.

I am sure that you are by now aware of the resolution passed at the Education and Lifelong Learning Committee meeting yesterday, by a majority of six to four, to disregard a piece of written evidence presented to the Committee by Dafydd Glyn Jones as part of the higher education review. Dafydd Glyn Jones is one of the most prominent academics in his field.

According to those who spoke for the motion, they did so because some of Dafydd Glyn Jones's comments were objectionable. This resolution leads us to a serious and far-reaching situation, and is equivalent to censorship. It is an attempt to stifle opinions because they are unacceptable. Whether we

There is no firm guidance on dealing with evidence, and perhaps Cynog Dafis can confirm that.

agree with the comments is irrelevant here. The issue is an individual's right to express his or her views.

No Assembly Member, nor anyone else, should try to stifle an unacceptable opinion lightly or on a whim. Freedom of expression is one of our basic rights. What chiefly concerns me is the unfortunate and dangerous precedent that was set yesterday in making a resolution that could be binding on every Assembly Member. Although it was a Committee resolution, the public perception is that it binds every Assembly Member. Neither I, nor anyone else who was not at the Committee meeting, was part of the resolution.

As the current guidelines are silent on this matter, will you consider amending them? We must ask under which circumstances we should remove all or part of the evidence of a witness who appears before a Committee, whether that be oral or written evidence.

During my time as a member of Westminster parliamentary committees, I do not recall any censorship of the sort that we witnessed yesterday. Contentious views were heard, which others would consider objectionable, but the right of people to express and present those views was staunchly defended. In the revised guidelines that I hope we will consider, we should decide who will have the right to consider—under exceptional circumstances—the need to reject evidence. That right should not be given to a committee. Given the seriousness of such a decision, it would need to be made by the whole Assembly. Will you consider the appropriateness of revising the guidelines?

We heard around 600 pieces of evidence during this particular higher education review. It sets a bad precedent to start passing motions on particular items of evidence in the middle of a review. We should be attempting to evaluate that evidence at the end of the review. The information that we had from Dafydd Glyn Jones was so end-of-the-pier that it can be discounted for what was in the documentation. However, yesterday's motion demonstrates the need to firm-up the guidance and procedures that we use because it would be a dangerous precedent for Committees to attempt to evaluate each piece of evidence half way through a review before they had even reached the evaluation stage and the point at which a report could be written. Therefore, while I do not want to draw any conclusions about the report's content, the motion yesterday sets a difficult precedent for this Assembly to follow.

Huw Lewis: Further to that point of order, Plaid Cymru's comments are remarkable, and I am disappointed by Jonathan's remarks. A motion was passed in the Committee for Education and Lifelong Learning that was not ruled out of order by the Chair. It was allowed and discussed properly according to the Standing Orders and, in the Committee's view, the motion related to breaches of Standing Orders, in terms of discriminatory and offensive language used in the document. A majority of Committee members agreed that those remarks were discriminatory and offensive in terms of sections of the Welsh population.

That motion was passed and it simply states the opinion of the majority of the Committee—and now the Committee as a whole—that we disagree with the idea that we should handle, process and consider seriously comments that exclude portions of the Welsh population on the basis of their nationality or ethnic origin. There would have been no problem in passing this motion if the paper referred to the exclusion of black people, but because it refers to the exclusion of English people for some reason the motion is no longer valid and there is some kind of procedural problem with our Standing Orders. I repeat that the motion was not ruled out of order by the Chair; it was discussed

What Huw Lewis has succeeded in doing through yesterday's motion—and this is the important issue—is to ensure that when a subjective opinion with which he disagrees arises, he and his colleagues can now say, 'forget it, remove it', which is extremely dangerous.

The Presiding Officer: I do not wish us to repeat the arguments of the Education and Lifelong Learning Committee meeting yesterday.

It would be a serious decision to pass such a resolution.

Pressure was exerted on me to allow votes on more extreme motions without them being submitted to Committee beforehand. I withstood that pressure, and I believe that I acted properly in withstanding that pressure, although it was suggested yesterday that I had not acted appropriately. My point is that it would be of great assistance to Chairs such as myself if clear guidance was available on how to act in such circumstances, and under which circumstances a resolution such as that which was passed in Committee by a small majority yesterday would be justified.

The Presiding Officer: I am grateful to everyone who has spoken on this point of order. I state clearly that Committees have the right through motions and resolutions to decide their future activities, as long as they comply with the conditions of the Government of Wales Act 1998, which sets out our constitution, our Standing Orders, and any guidelines that have been drawn up in this regard. No guidelines have been prepared to deal with these circumstances, because I did not believe, from my parliamentary experience, that such a situation could arise. I have made that clear to every Member who has tried to discuss this matter with me. Having said that, nothing that occurred in the Committee yesterday was out of order, as far as I can see. the resolution is still subject to Standing Order No. 17.1, namely the right of the public to have access to documents, and, if a member of the public wished to see any document, under Standing Order No. 17.1, I would certainly consider it to be in order. Therefore, I am not clear what the effect of the resolution that was made in Committee yesterday is.

It is a serious step, as Members have said, for any Assembly Committee to try to exclude evidence through a resolution of the kind that was made yesterday. It is contrary to the parliamentary traditions which I profess. I speak as a former member of a Select Committee in two houses of Parliament. I am concerned about the message that this sends out to members of the public and to those who will wish to give evidence to our Committees in future. We could be seen as—

The Presiding Officer: On that point, I did not say that the evidence presented to the Committee had been censored. I referred to outside perception. I must have regard to the public standing of this Assembly and to remarks made in the Welsh media by leading academics in Wales on this matter. I must have regard to the perception of the Assembly in any situation of this kind.

My interpretation of 'offensive' may be different to yours, but the decision to vote on this motion yesterday was not taken lightly by anyone in the Committee. I am amazed that we are taking so much time to discuss this issue.

The Presiding Officer: I am not concerned with the content of any remarks made in evidence. My only concern—and the Standing Orders apply to this—is for what is offensive in this Chamber in relation to Members. Our Standing Orders do not

is a body that co-ordinates the work of Committee Chairs. The Committee Chairs operate within the Assembly's Standing Orders, which are based on the Government of Wales Act 1998. That is the constitutional position.

Rhodri Glyn Thomas: On the point of order and the perception of those outside the Assembly, particularly those who wish to present evidence to Committees, you will be aware that the Culture Committee is currently undertaking a review of the position of the Welsh language. In the context of that review, I very much hope that evidence will be presented at times that will be unacceptable to me as Chair and to different members of the Committee. If that did not happen, it would not be a complete review of the situation. If, in evidence-taking sessions, the Committee had a verbatim record, the situation would be much better. When you read the minutes of any of the meetings, they are general. What people say is not included. Their comments are not clear and are not on record for the public for the future. Sometimes, you feel so strongly about an issue that you want your comments recorded exactly. At present, there is no provision for that. Evidence-taking sessions in Parliament are, I believe, transcribed verbatim. You mentioned looking at the tape. You may look at the tape, but we would find it difficult to get that tape. Members of the public would have to pay a considerable sum of money per hour to access that tape. Therefore, the way that we record Committee meetings should be seriously considered.

The Presiding Officer: I am grateful for that. There would be resource implications were we to make our digital record available. With the future development of technology, it is likely that members of the public could

I will attempt to supply draft guidelines according to that principle, bearing in mind that freedom of opinion is one of the most important traditions of all democratic bodies.

The National Assembly for Wales and the Food Standards Agency are committed to achieving the highest possible standards of hygiene in meat production. The Meat (Enhanced Enforcement Powers) (Wales) Regulations 2001 amend meat hygiene legislation relating to fresh meat, poultry, game, minced meat, meat products and their preparation, to provide a range of new powers aimed at strengthening the enforcement of meat hygiene and food safety controls. They also correct some under-implementation of European Union requirements.

These regulations are not about increasing the burden of regulations on the meat industry by introducing new requirements and controls. Rather, they give enforcement authorities greater powers to enforce effectively the controls that already exist. The regulations will have virtually no impact on responsible meat plants that comply fully with statutory requirements.

I will explain briefly the background to these regulations. As part of a review of meat hygiene legislation commissioned in 1997,

Mae Cynulliad Cenedlaethol Cymru a'r Asiantaeth Safonau Bwyd yn ymrwymedig i gyflawni'r safonau uchaf posibl o hylendid wrth gynhyrchu cig. Mae Rheoliadau Cig (Pwerau Gorfodi Ehangach) (Cymru) 2001 yn diwygio deddfwriaeth hylendid cig sydd yn ymwneud â chig ffres, dofednod, helgig, briwgig, cynhyrchion cig a'r ffordd y cânt eu paratoi, i ddarparu ystod o bwerau newydd â'r nod o gryfhau'r gwaith o orfodi hylendid cig a rheolaethau diogelwch bwyd. Cywirant hefyd rai achosion o beidio â gweithredu gofynion yr Undeb Ewropeidd yn llawn.

Nid yw'r rheoliadau hyn yn ymwneud â chynyddu baich y rheoliadau ar y diwydiant cig drwy gyflwyno gofynion a rheolaethau newydd. The original proposals were the subject of a consultation exercise in 1999 and were amended as a result of comments received. The Food Standards Agency carried out further consultation in Wales on the instrument as drafted this year. The instrument will extend the powers available to enforcement authorities to require operators to reduce or cease the rate of an operation or the use of a particular piece of equipment in order to safeguard hygiene requirements. In extreme cases, enforcement authorities will also be able to suspend the licence or approval of a non-compliant plant with immediate effect, effectively preventing further operation. Currently, meat plant licences cannot be revoked because of structural deficiencies. However, all statutory requirements that apply to meat plants, including those relating to structural standards, are designed to facilitate the hygienic production of meat. This legislation will permit licence revocation on structural grounds. The instrument will require that persons otherwise exempt from statutory requirements should not possess or offer for sale any meat not produced in accordance with statutory requirements. It will also provide stronger powers to require the disposal of meat produced in breach of meat hygiene regulation and give local authority enforcement officers new enforcement powers with regard to fresh meat and poultry produced outside licensed premises enforced by the Meat Hygiene Service.

Other changes include the removal of inconsistencies in the level of penalties for offences; the reduction of the time limit in which an operator may appeal against licence revocation; a requirement that all meat plant owners notify the enforcement authority of their identity; and making official veterinary surgeons responsible for inspecting operators records in licensing plants. This wide-ranging package of measures will increase the effectiveness of current enforcement measures and sets out clearly where enforcement responsibilities lie, without imposing new burdens on law-abiding operators. I urge the Assembly to approve the principle of the regulations and the

Mick Bates: I join Rhodri in welcoming the broad outline of these regulations. Public health is a paramount concern to the meat industry. However, I remain concerned—and I have raised this issue many times before—about the amount of red tape introduced by amendments to such regulations as this. The full report on red tape does not apply to Wales. Ministers should introduce a review of red tape in Wales so that we can see through the regulatory appraisal of these regulations and perceive the full impact on meat processors. I would like to hear from the Minister what are the true costs of this particular regulation.

We all like to see meat produced in Wales, and I will include this final positive note. I hope that these regulations will ensure that Welsh meat is labelled and sold as a top quality product. That is something that I am sure the Minister will support.

Peter Rogers: The Welsh Conservatives welcome anything that will improve the Welsh meat industry and place it at the top of the league. We must consider what the other two parties said on the regulations' administration costs under a single agency and the burden of bureaucracy and red tape, particularly in the slaughterhouse industry.

Rhodri Glyn Thomas: I welcome these regulations. It is important to ensure the highest possible standards in meat inspection. What concerns me, and I have raised this point previously with the Minister, is that the meat industry's inspection system involves a number of different agencies. Is there not room to consider a structure that would ensure that only one agency would ultimately be responsible for meat industry standards? Would that not clarify the standards for the public and ensure consistency? Will the Minister discuss this with her Westminster colleagues to explore whether it is possible to develop a clearer and more straightforward system?

The other serious problem is the amount of meat entering the country. I would like to see the standards that are employed in our slaughterhouses to ensure that they are the best, enforced in other parts of Europe. Meat should not enter this country unless it complies with our standards. Anything that gives the meat industry a lead is welcome, so long as it is not overburdened with red tape and that the Government deals with the costs in the right way.

The Minister for Health and Social Services (Jane Hutt): As I mentioned at the start, Rhodri Glyn, this wide-ranging package of measures will increase the effectiveness of current enforcement measures. That is the important point. It sets out clearly where responsibilities lie, Mick, without imposing any new burdens on law-abiding operators. Concerning your points on the issue of enforcement costs, we have identified those costs and they are being made available to local authorities as part of their revenue support grant in terms of the additional resources for food law enforcement in Wales. Obviously, the Meat Hygiene Service is responsible for licensing. Local authorities are responsible for enforcement. However, this is about ensuring that our enforcement measures are properly implemented. We have consulted and this resulted in support from the Farmers' Union in Wales and a local authority that contacted us on this issue.

It is clear that these regulations do not increase the regulatory burden, a point made by all speakers today. They do not introduce new regulatory controls for meat production. However, they strengthen the powers available to authorities to enforce existing statutory controls. It should not be, and will not be a burden. Meat hygiene is critically important to consumer confidence in our meat industry. Labelling is an issue we must consider in terms of Welsh produce and I support the need to promote the meat industry. As I previously responded to you, Peter, we are ensuring that we enforce controls on imports, illegal or otherwise.

It gives me great pleasure to have the

hollbwysig hon. Mae'n briodol ein bod yn trafod y mater hwn, o ystyried y dioddefaint a achoswyd gan glwy'r traed a'r genau yn ardaloedd gwledig Cymru dros y misoedd diwethaf.

Cafodd y cynllun ar gyfer y cyfnod 2000-06 ei gymeradwyo gan y Comisiwn Ewropeaidd fis Hydref diwethaf. Cynllun Cymru oedd y cyntaf o gynnlluniau'r Deyrnas Unedig i gael ei gymeradwyo. Mae'n cynnwys gwariant o tua £450 miliwn dros saith mlynedd. Cyflwynwyd y cynllun o dan Reoliad Datblygu Gwledig y Comisiwn Ewropeaidd, sydd yn disodli naw rheoliad blaenorol ac sydd yn hybu datblygu gwledig integredig.

Yn sylfaenol, mae £12.6 miliwn y flwyddyn ar gael i Gymru. Yr ydym wedi ychwanegu at y swm hwnnw drwy gyflwyno modiwlleiddio a darparu arian cyfatebol ar gyfer y cyllid a ddaw o hynny. Mae llawer mwy o arian o fewn y cynllun nag oedd yn angenrheidiol o dan reoliadau'r Comisiwn Ewropeaidd.

Rhodri Glyn Thomas: A yw'r cynllun datblygu gwledig yn union yr un peth ag yr oedd yn Nhachwedd 2000, pan gafodd ei fabwysiadu gan y Pwyllgor Amaethyddiaeth a Datblygu Gwledig? Yn ei gyflwyniad, soniodd Carwyn am bwysigrwydd ymateb i effaith clwy'r traed a'r genau ar gefn gwlad a'r economi wledig. Onid oes dadl gref dros ychwanegu at y cynllun a'i gryfhau drwy ystyried Tir Gofal, cynnrych organig a marchnata a hyrwyddo cynnrych o Gymru? Pam na wnaethpwyd hynny wrth gyflwyno'r cynllun i'r Siambwr, yn sgil clwy'r traed a'r genau?

Carwyn Jones: Mae'r bartneriaeth wledig yn ystyried hynny ar hyn o bryd ac yn datblygu cynllun gweithredu ar gyfer y cyfnod wedi clwy'r traed a'r genau. Ar hyn o bryd, yr ydym yn ystyried sut y mae'r cynllun datblygu gwledig wedi datblygu hyd yn hyn. Mae gennyd gyfarfod â'r bartneriaeth wledig y prynhawn yma, felly os ydyw eisiau trafod unrhyw fater â mi, gallwn ailystyried y cynllun i weld a oes angen ychwanegu ato neu ei newid.

Mae'r Cynulliad wedi cytuno i weithredu saith o'r naw mesur o dan Reoliad Datblygu Gwledig y CE. Mae'r rhain yn cynnwys

opportunity to open this crucial debate. It is appropriate for us to discuss this issue, given the suffering caused by foot and mouth disease in rural Wales over the past months.

The plan, which covers the period 2000-06, was approved by the European Commission last October. The Welsh plan was the first of the United Kingdom plans to be approved. It covers expenditure of about £450 million over seven years. The plan was submitted under the EC's Rural Development Regulation, which replaces nine former regulations and which promotes integrated rural development.

Essentially, £12.6 million a year is available for Wales. We have added to that figure by introducing modulation and by providing match funding for the money that is provided in that way. There is much more money within the plan than was necessary under EC regulations.

Rhodri Glyn Thomas: Is the rural development plan exactly the same as it was in November 2000, when it was adopted by the Agriculture and Rural Development Committee? In his introduction, Carwyn referred to the importance of responding to the effects of foot and mouth disease on rural areas and the rural economy. Is there not a strong case for adding to and strengthening the plan by considering Tir Gofal, organic produce and marketing and promoting Welsh produce? Why was that not done when the plan was introduced in the Chamber, as a result of the foot and mouth outbreak?

Carwyn Jones: The rural partnership is currently considering that and is developing an action plan for the post-foot and mouth period. We are currently considering how the rural development plan has developed to date. I have a meeting with the rural partnership this afternoon, so if it wants to discuss any issues with me, we can reconsider the plan to see whether it needs to be added to or amended.

The Assembly has agreed to implement seven of the nine measures under the EC's Rural Development Regulation. These include

Fodd bynnag, yn bwysig, bydd rhagor o arian hefyd ar gael i ffermwyr sydd yn mabwysiadu dulliau ffermio sydd yn dda i'r amgylchedd. Soniwyd hefyd am gynllun Tir Gofal, sef cynllun amaeth-amgylcheddol y Cynulliad. Fe'i hystyrir yn un o'r cynlluniau gorau yn Ewrop. Hefyd mae gennym gynllun ffermio organig. Mae'r ddau gynllun hyn yn mynd yn dda, er y bu clwy'r traed a'r genau yn broblem oherwydd na ellid ymweld â ffermydd am amser hir.

Mae 500 o ffermydd wedi ymuno â chynllun Tir Gofal yn ei flwyddyn gyntaf, ac ar hyn o bryd mae 50,000 hectar o dir dan y cynllun. Erbyn hyn mae'n dwyn effaith go iawn. Wrth ddweud hynny, mae'n rhaid inni gofio bod modd gwella Tir Gofal a dyna pam y dechreuwyd adolygiad ohono a fydd yn rhan o'r ddadl yn y Pwyllgor Amaethyddiaeth a Datblygu Gwledig fis nesaf. Bu sôn y byddai'n rhaid gwneud llawer o newidiadau i'r cynllun ac fe fydd dadl ar hynny.

measures on less favoured areas, agri-environmental schemes, afforestation and other forestry measures, processing and marketing, training—as part of Farming Connect—and many other initiatives on wider rural development under article 33 of the regulation.

We have already seen great successes under the plan. For example, in spring 2000, farmers in less favoured areas received hill livestock compensatory allowance payments on the traditional basis. However, the system had to be changed to a new basis for 2001. The result is Tir Mynydd—the Assembly's scheme to support those who farm on the hills and mountains and who are moving from headage payments to area-based payments. However, importantly, more money will also be available to farmers who adopt environment-friendly farming methods. Several other aspects under Element 2 give farmers the opportunity to receive more funding in addition to Element 1 money, including area-based payments. So far this year, payments worth £41.8 million have been made.

The Tir Gofal scheme, the Assembly's agri-environmental scheme, has also been mentioned. It is considered one of the best schemes in Europe. We also have an organic farming scheme. These two schemes are going well, although foot and mouth disease was a problem because, for a long time, it was not possible to visit farms.

In its first year 500 farms have joined the Tir Gofal scheme, and at present there are 50,000 hectares of land under the scheme. It is now making a genuine impact. In saying that, we must remember that Tir Gofal could be improved and that is why the review was implemented, which will form part of the debate next month in the Agriculture and Rural Development Committee. It has been mentioned that many changes will have to be made to the scheme, and that will be a matter for debate.

As regards the organic scheme, there is sufficient funding to ensure that all the applications for 2000-01 are funded. Since

A key element of the rural development plan is Farming Connect. Specific elements of that initiative will provide free business plans, training, specialist advice, demonstration farms and centres of excellence to ensure that our industry is kept fully informed of the latest developments. The plan also provides capital grants for farm improvement and diversification, which will be accessed through Farming Connect. We have worked closely with other organisations such as the Wales Tourist Board and the Forestry Commission on the options for providing capital grants to farmers to help them secure alternative sources of income. We will be able to provide a suite of grant schemes under the umbrella of Farming Connect.

As Members know, there has been a delay in launching Farming Connect because of foot and mouth disease, but we believe that it will be up and running in September.

Processing and marketing grants are now available—

Ron Davies: Regarding Farming Connect, will you tell us more about the gateway arrangements? Will there be one single point of contact for farmers?

Carwyn Jones: It is envisaged that there will be one telephone number and a number of facilitators. From that one phone number,

December 2000, 211 applications have been received. At the moment 122 offers have been made to farmers, and 96 of those have been agreed. About £3.1 million has been spent on this scheme in the last financial year. Applications are being processed at present and I hope that many more farmers will join the scheme in the next months.

As regards forestry, the woodland grant scheme and the farm woodland premium scheme are currently available. These will be reviewed this year to see how they fit in with our vision for the forestry strategy in Wales. The strategy will be launched jointly by me in the National Assembly and by the Forestry Commission at the beginning of next month.

farmers will be able to access farm business reviews at the outset, and then they will be able to take their plans further to consider capital grants. The final package will be put together in September. It is designed to be as easy as possible for farmers to access the grants available.

As I mentioned, processing and marketing grants are available and are proving to be a great success. We have not made the progress that we had hoped to make because of foot and mouth disease. No one could have predicted the outbreak of the disease and the scale of the problem during the spring. Combating foot and mouth disease has been our first priority, but this has not meant that the rural development measures that we had in mind have been put on the backburner. Work has continued on the raft of schemes that comprise the rural development plan. All schemes will be fully operational to the benefit of Welsh farming and rural communities by the autumn.

I turn to the amendments. We reject amendment 1 because the Government's view is that the plan can be considered as having the National Assembly's approval and is one that has worked well. The same argument applies to amendment 2. Amendment 3 trespasses on the work of the sub-group of the rural partnership and its preparation of the rural recovery plan. It is a matter for the sub-group to bring before us because that is the work it has been asked to carry out. It is difficult to understand why amendment 4 has been tabled because it does not recognise the difficulties resulting from foot and mouth disease for farming and the whole rural economy, which all farmers will recognise. Amendment 5 again trespasses on the work of the rural partnership, and the rural recovery plan will consider the matters raised in the amendment. The question of foreign food imports raised in amendment 6 is not a matter for the Assembly or for the new Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, but a matter for the Food Standards Agency. Foreign food imports is not part of the rural development plan. We are prepared to support amendment 7 as it merely notes the report made to the Agriculture and Rural Development Committee. Amendment 8 also goes against

I declare an interest as a farmer. My fear is that, considering its record on waiting lists and Objective 1, delivery is not the Executive’s watchword. That is why I am concerned about the coalition’s ability to make this plan succeed. I listened carefully to what Carwyn said about the progress made on Farming Connect. Progress is not being made. Carwyn mentioned that they had not made the progress that they had hoped to make because of foot and mouth disease. However, before the outbreak, I visited two or three agencies to try to chase up this matter and there were no plans in place. Therefore, no progress had been made prior to the foot and mouth disease outbreak. Carwyn is now saying that the service will

It is not necessarily a problem of staff. You have buried your head in the sand. You must accept that farming is on its knees. No farmer will be able to benefit from a rural development plan until you act on some of the immediate problems facing farms. You have neglected farmers under Form D restrictions, rightly called the forgotten farmers. I asked you to make them a priority. There are over 2,000 farmers across Wales under Form D restrictions. The majority of them do not have any source of income. They have over borrowed, are over stocked and have a shortage of fodder. Furthermore, they had limited opportunities to participate in the welfare cull scheme because under that scheme, the slaughter had

Those farmers are in dire need. They now live on limited savings or on charity from the Royal Agricultural Benevolent Institution. We appreciate the donations given to that institution and the support that it gives to farmers.

A farmer in my constituency had stock slaughtered on 28 February. Since then he has not had any income and has not received a cheque for compensation. However, worst of all, Minister, no-one has contacted him to say why he has not received the payment. His business is not operating. It seems, Minister, that either you give no information or you give misinformation. You said that blood testing on farms under Form D restrictions in Builth Wells had been carried out in that circular. However, when I challenged you about that in the Agriculture and Rural Development Committee, I discovered that blood tests were being carried out in the Builth Wells area the following Saturday and Sunday. What does that tell you? I put it to you that some of those farms have been placed under continued Form D restrictions through incompetence. We must ensure that we are supporting this industry and those farmers now. They will not benefit from a rural development plan because they do not have sufficient finances.

I am glad that you mentioned timber. We must ensure that we have a policy on that. We import around 80 per cent of our timber. Given that a construction forum is being established, why can we not ensure that our public bodies: the WDA, the Environment Agency and so on, have a policy to support Welsh timber—

I want to see foreign competitors meeting our own high standards. I do not want a ban on competition; I want fair competition. It is time that you woke up and started to help those desperate farmers. Only then can you start talking about the way forward.

It is a pleasure to be here to propose the amendments in the name of Jocelyn Davies. I refer first of all to the motion itself, which is, in my opinion, untidy, and I am sorry that the Minister for Assembly Business is not here to hear my comments.

The motion refers to progress, but there is no reference to a progress report in the motion, although some sort of update report was presented to the Agriculture and Rural Development Committee last week. There is no reference to that in the motion.

According to the rural development plan, it is the monitoring committee's responsibility to review progress. Although I was invited to sit on a monitoring committee some six months ago, it has never convened. Amendments 2 and 7 in the name of Plaid Cymru are an attempt to polish the motion.

The timing of this debate also causes confusion. Two potentially important elements of the rural development plan are the young farmers' new entrants scheme, and Tir Gofal. I believe that a stocktake of Tir Gofal—to which the Minister referred earlier—will be presented to the next Agriculture and Rural Development Committee, and also a paper by the Minister on young farmers.

In my opinion, it is unfortunate that we are having this debate before having an opportunity to see those two important reports. Until Plaid Cymru sees better ideas from the Government, it will continue to press for a young farmers' entrants scheme.

Such schemes are implemented in the majority of EU countries as a boost to the confidence and future of the industry, and not as 'an obscene waste of money', as some members of the Labour party described it in the Chamber.

It may be an untidy motion, and the timing may be deficient, but what surprises me most is that the Government has the cheek to hold a debate today—as Rhodri Glyn Thomas has already stated—on a plan that was approved by the EU last October. It was fully debated in the National Assembly at the end of January, and is now being implemented fairly easily and leisurely on the whole.

While we have been waiting for a package and for measures to revive agriculture and the rural economy in the wake of the foot and mouth crisis, more than 100 days have elapsed since foot and mouth disease took hold in this country. We are still waiting to hear how the coalition Government intends to tackle the far-reaching effects of the disease. We have seen nothing since the announcement of £12 million for local government and marketing funds for the WDA.

The rural development plan was devised before the foot and mouth crisis, but, as a financial package, it was insufficient to deal with the rural depression that existed then. The Government has rehashed its plans for us today. I hope that its intention was not to fool rural communities into believing that a new rural plan is being presented. Although plans can sometimes be improved through being rehashed, the plans presented today have not changed at all.

I call on you, Minister, to tackle this urgently. You referred to a meeting of your sub-committee, but you must take urgent steps in the weeks remaining before the summer recess to introduce a package of measures to the Assembly to revive the rural economy. That package must be fully funded by the Treasury in recognition of the unique nature of the foot and mouth disease crisis.

continue, the deeper the effects on our rural economy and the agriculture industry will be.

The Minister knows that I have repeatedly asked for many weeks when he intends to reintroduce into the agriculture system the right to trade through licence. That would be of help, even if that were only for trading within the disease-free areas, such as Dyfed, initially. This kind of system is being implemented in the north of Scotland. As far as I can see, the Minister has made no attempt to secure this in Wales.

On Tuesday night, in Llandovery, as we all know, local auctioneers attempted to reintroduce trading. According to those who were present and to whom I spoke, this was an innovative and professional attempt to respond sensibly to the closure of the livestock markets.

The Minister has stated that trading of this kind is illegal and that it endangers the reintroduction of exporting. Why, then, is that not the case in Scotland? Do the movement restriction measures in Britain have to continue until we are allowed to begin exporting again? The present system of restrictions is ridiculous. No movement of animals for trade purposes is permitted at all, unless the animals are starving. If your animals are starving, you can sell them, but if they are healthy you are not permitted to sell them.

I refer back to the Tories' amendments. We support amendments 1 and 4. We will abstain on amendment 5 because there is no reference to the Barnett block. We will also abstain on amendment 6 because this is not a matter for the National Assembly.

In concluding, I apologise to the Minister for not being in Ceredigion yesterday to welcome him at the opening of the important food centre in Horeb, as I was attending a meeting of the Committee of the Regions in Brussels. Therefore, I can assure the Minister that I, as a Member, am not responsible for wobbly chairs in my constituency.

Mick Bates: I declare an interest as a farmer.

When this plan was first debated over a year ago, I tabled an amendment that the plan should deal with the increasing levels of rural stress. Thankfully, that amendment was carried and funds were found for helplines and extra support. During the foot and mouth disease crisis, the lives of three Montgomeryshire farmers were tragically lost. The inquests are being held today. A House of Lords report states that suicide is one of the most likely causes of death among older farmers. In a recent report, the Institute of Rural Health in Montgomeryshire recorded a 400 per cent increase in pleas for help from rural dwellers. This morning, I received yet another call about increased stress as a result of the rumours about a mass cull of livestock in Powys. This rumour is killing hope for those people who want to carry on farming. Will the Minister put on record today that there are no plans for a mass cull of livestock in Powys? That would help to reduce stress levels and give some hope to the farmers of Powys. Furthermore, will the Minister consider holding a press conference with vets to further dispel, in public, these rumours?

The need for an integrated rural development plan has never been greater. The need to bring hope to rural Wales has never been greater and the need to create a sustainable rural economy is a goal that we all share. The future of rural Wales will not be sustained by protectionism or by looking back to a bygone age. The world has changed and we are part of a global market in which all nations have a right to trade. We are part of a European Union in which the Liberal Democrats are determined to see less public intervention and more decentralisation. We are equally determined to preserve the discipline of a European Union common policy, in which the interests of producers and consumers, in urban and rural life, are balanced.

The demand for high quality food, good animal welfare and greater environmental awareness leads our agricultural policies through this rural development plan and will

This rural development plan does not contain an integrated vision such as the long-term vision contained in 'Rural Scotland: A New Approach'. Wales needs a similar statement that outlines rural opportunities for young people, the development of housing and transport services and the sustaining of our natural and cultural heritage. We need a document that links and pronounces our commitment to every aspect of policy that affects rural Wales. This rural development plan is part of that process. However, Minister, we need a single, integrated vision similar to that of Scotland.

Our plan recognises the need to correct the market weaknesses for agriculture and forestry. Priority 1 wants to increase competitiveness, as does priority 2. Priority 3 aims to protect our environmental schemes and rural heritage. In addition, the plan urges support for the regeneration of rural communities, which are essential to our commitment to sustainable development. Farming Connect will, I hope, deliver fundamental changes, because it is the empowerment of local people to deliver local solutions that will create sustainable rural economies.

My deepest desire is to see, during the lifetime of this plan, the maximum amount of aid going to the people who need it most—the people of rural Wales. However, I doubt whether that aspiration will be reached. I am not convinced that this plan will be implemented equally throughout rural east Wales. For example, will the article 33 measures on the promotion and adaptation of development apply to all of rural east Wales? Although Powys was desperately hit by foot and mouth disease, I believe that it will miss

Mick Bates: The plan will provide finance and grant support. There is work to be done through Finance Wales to find support for young people. The structures must be sensitive so that they can adapt. There is no single answer to rebuilding rural Wales. However, our plans will not succeed without effective community participation, the integration of economic, environmental and social interests, and increased ownership by farmers and rural people, not only of the ideas but of the companies that will generate wealth for rural Wales. Remember that our future is not a gift, but a reward for what we do now.

Glyn Davies: I declare an interest as a partner in a farming business.

When the rural development plan was prepared, the rural economy was in a very different condition to that which it is in today. It was not buoyant then. Since early 1996, the announcement of a possible link between BSE and new variant CJD had already hit agriculture, and weakening European currencies were already having a negative effect on the three main pillars of the rural economy, namely agriculture, tourism and manufacturing. We are discussing the rural development plan in a very different economic climate today.

The foot and mouth disease outbreak has had a devastating effect on tourism and agriculture, and continues to do so. The outbreak, together with the public and media attention that it has received, has fundamentally changed the attitude of many farmers and, even more so, the people who do not farm but who pay the taxes that underpin the common agricultural policy that supports the industry.

As politicians, our job is to recognise this change and respond to it. The time is right to

strengthen the Assembly's commitment to what are usually termed 'decoupling' and 'modulation'. I have always supported the concept of decoupling. That view is driven by my interest in biodiversity. However, the industry has always been suspicious of that principle and has resisted it. Inevitably, politicians respond to the industry's view, although a significant move towards decoupling has already taken place in some support regimes.

The next big change in financial support to the farming industry is in the reform of the sheep annual premium, where it seems that the negative attitude towards the principle of decoupling means that the new scheme will almost certainly be based on animal numbers. I know about the problem as it affects Wales, and it is probably too late to do anything about it, but it is important that we acknowledge the benefits of the principle of decoupling so that it leads opinion in the future.

In my view, there is a case for raising the level of modulation within the rural development plan for the future. Perhaps that is a controversial view. It is important that we catch the mood that has arisen from the foot and mouth disease outbreak. Farmers do not want to restock to the same intensive level. The non-farming public is now more engaged in the industry and wants to see a change in the way that British farming is organised. Since the first time—some 10 years ago—I discussed a potential new scheme, which eventually came to be known as Tir Cymen, I believed that agri-environmental schemes would eventually become the principal means of support for the farming industry.

I will make a few comments about our current flagship scheme, namely Tir Gofal. As it is currently arranged, I do not believe that it will be a success. It will not deliver what we want it to do. The scheme is too elitist and applies only to those farms that are already a long way down the road to recognising the importance of biodiversity. It requires too great a commitment from farmers who do not want the whole farm

Ron Davies: I hesitate to interrupt Glyn's thoughtful speech. However, in his criticism of Tir Gofal he implied that it was those farms that were some way down the road to having a better environmental approach that are now involved in the Tir Gofal scheme. Does he accept that it was inevitable that those farms that were most likely to benefit from the scheme and had a higher quality of biodiversity would be the first to apply and the first to be included in the Tir Gofal scheme?

Glyn Davies: Yes, I accept that point. However, I want to move on.

It is crucial that we start bringing the industry onside now. Our discussions with the industry have concerned how this principle can be taken further and how the industry would like to see that done. A greater diversification in the rural economy is also necessary. That will produce the greater degree of prosperity that we want to see and tourism is crucial to that. There are two issues that I want to refer to specifically. One is the Montgomeryshire canal. That is a hugely important project and will eventually be linked to the national canal network. However, even now, the Assembly is considering new road schemes that do not allow for the canal's re-opening in a few

The other important point is the relationship between farmers and national parks. National park designation is crucial to attract large numbers of visitors to an area. There has always been, in my view, an argument for a Cambrian Mountains National Park. That cannot happen until national parks recognise that they must be well regarded by all those who live and work within their boundaries. That is not the case at present. Over the years I have witnessed warfare between the Brecon Beacons National Park and those who live and work within it. That has been hugely damaging, not only to national parks, but to the whole principle of developing rural Wales's economy. Whereas diversification is important to the rural economy, national parks are a magnet to the area and it is vital that the relationship between parks and those who live and work in them becomes an issue of importance to the Assembly, and that we demand that the relationship improve. What we generally think of as rural development has always been regarded with suspicion by the agricultural community. However, it is our job as politicians to make everybody understand why it is so important.

It is good to be able to welcome what has been achieved but that needs to be placed in the context of the huge problems that exist. Given the current situation, it would not be appreciated if we were to congratulate ourselves excessively.

I take this opportunity to refer to three or four matters that I have mentioned previously. First, on Tir Gofal, I was pleased to hear the Minister mention the current review. Tir Gofal needs to be revamped. At present some farmers are refusing the opportunity to join it as it would mean a financial loss. There are other farmers—the Penpont project in the Llanfair Caereinion area is an example of this—who do excellent work according to the principles of sustainability, strengthening the environment of their farms but who are rejected because they have failed to accrue sufficient points in terms of environmental value. Unusually, I will disagree with what Ron Davies said on this issue.

We have been informed that the review is underway and when the results will be available. Is the Minister willing to consider whether the Countryside Council for Wales is the appropriate body to administer the Tir Gofal scheme, and does that need to be reconsidered?

Concerning Tir Gofal, I raise again a point that I made in a debate on 23 January regarding the additionality of the European Union's contribution to Tir Gofal and some other schemes, such as Tir Mynydd and the new entrants' scheme if we were to have one. Does he accept that the European money is not additional at present, and can he assure us that he and the administration are pressing hard for additionality? That would mean a significant increase, particularly in Objective 1 areas. When Ireland had Objective 1 status it spent £20 million on its agri-environmental scheme and an additional £60 million was spent from European funding. That is a total of £80 million for Ireland's agri-environmental scheme.

Secondly, I refer to payments for energy crops. Wales's interests were not represented effectively in the discussions on Agenda 2000. As a result, arable area payments can be converted into payments of equal value for energy crops, such as short-rotation willow, but not into grassland payments. That has been of great disadvantage to Wales in an important growth sector. Can we have an assurance that the Minister will tackle this and will insist that the relevant parts of the

David Davies: I am grateful for the opportunity to contribute to the debate, as Monmouth was one of the areas worst affected by the foot and mouth disease crisis. The rural development plan plays a vital part in the strategy to return stability to those rural areas. However, it does not go far enough. I will, therefore, support the amendments.

Amendment 3 discusses the need for additional resources to ameliorate the impact

common agriculture policy be amended, when the opportunity next arises? How does he intend to do that?

Thirdly, I am pleased that the farm woodland premium scheme is now fully operational. However, there is a basic weakness in this plan, as seen in the Penpont project in Llanfair Caereinion. Sheep premium payments are higher for uplands than for lowlands, for obvious reasons. However, woodland payments are lower for uplands than for lowlands. Although there could be some logic to that, it is nonsense. It is a disincentive for farmers to do what the Penpont project aims to achieve. That scheme is innovative, enlightened and efficient. It would be of great benefit to the economy of rural areas, particularly in the hills. If that kind of activity could be expanded upon the profitability of agriculture would improve, and the natural environment would benefit. Again, European regulations would have to be amended, and that is not an easy task. However, will the Minister assure us that he will press hard for this through the UK Government and directly with the European Commission?

My fourth point relates to the woodlands strategy. Some people are criticising that strategy because it is unspecific. In terms of growing hardwood and so on, it does not state how many changes will be made or when they will be made. Can we have an assurance that a debate on the woodlands strategy will be held in Plenary, and not just in Committee? It is a fundamental and crucial issue for the environment, for agriculture and for the wider economy. I therefore hope that we will receive that assurance.

As a result, Monmouthshire—which was one of the worst affected areas in Wales and one of only three areas where there were significant outbreaks of foot and mouth disease—received just over £600,000. Does the Minister think that it is acceptable that an area that was so badly affected should receive only a tiny fraction of the tiny amount available? Much is made today of allocating money to local authorities according to their need. That did not happen when allocating money to provide rate relief to businesses affected by the foot and mouth disease outbreak.

Does the Minister think that it is right that the Government, without any warning, abandoned its payments to farmers whose animals were culled under the livestock welfare disposal scheme, hiding it behind the decision to rescue a photogenic calf, which was much-trumpeted in the press? Finally, does the Minister agree with the Conservative group and all those affected firsthand, that this crisis was handled abysmally and with woeful incompetence? If the rural development plan is implemented in the same way as all other schemes to help those affected by this crisis, we in the countryside should not hold our breath and wait for things to get better.

The Minister for Rural Affairs (Carwyn Jones): Several points have arisen, and I will try to answer them all. On Farming Connect, it is inevitable that it will be delayed from the original launch date. The last thing that we want to do is to encourage people to visit farms and to travel around them when foot and mouth disease is still present. Let us not

Nevertheless, as I have already mentioned to the National Assembly, those who have lost animals as a result of the foot and mouth cull will be able to receive farm business reviews so that they can decide whether to restock, to restock to the original numbers of livestock, or to consider another option. Therefore, that delay is quite understandable in light of foot and mouth disease.

I listened with interest to what Peter Rogers had to say. Much of it basically rehashed several matters that he has mentioned before in the Chamber, as well as in Committee. I welcome his conversion to the idea that we should consider using Welsh products. For 18 years, local authorities and other public bodies were not able to source Welsh products because they were forced under compulsory competitive tendering to buy the cheapest products. I welcome the Conservative Party's apparent conversion to the idea that we should buy and use products that are produced locally rather than those that are produced a long way away because they are cheaper.

I now turn to several of the other points made. I have already mentioned that the Rural Partnership will meet this afternoon. It will bring forward a rural recovery plan. Today's debate on the rural development plan is not intended to suggest that, suddenly, a new plan has been produced, because we all know, and it has been quite well publicised, that the recovery plan will be brought forward by the Rural Partnership sub-group. The purpose of this debate is to monitor and listen to Members' views on the existing rural development plan that was approved in October.

I turn to two points made by Members. First, on marketing and trading, in order for us to get our export market back, we need to go through a blood testing programme. In order for that blood testing programme to be

successful, it is important that a sample of animals be tested for us to understand the results. If animals are being moved around, the results of those samples will be compromised. If the results are compromised, we will not export for years. That is what will happen if we return to trading now. My views on the video auction have been well documented. We are not yet in a position, either to open marts or to trade via video auction. It might suit cattle farmers, but sheep farmers will suffer, because it will not be possible to reopen the export market for some years if the European Commission feels that trading resumed too early. That is, unfortunately, the reality.

On the mass cull, I think that the words that I used last week in Committee about the rumours of a mass cull were 'preposterous nonsense'. I do not know how much further I can go to quash the rumours of a mass cull without having my voice bleeped out by the BBC. It was claimed last week that the mass cull was supposed to start today and that secret holes had been dug around Wales. I was told yesterday that there was a boat full of railway sleepers in Pembroke Dock, that police leave had been cancelled and any number of rumours. Rumours will build on rumours. People are people; that is the way that it is. There is no mass cull. There are no holes being dug in the middle of Wales. Wales is not Australia. It is not possible to dig holes in the middle of Wales without somebody noticing—you know that curtains will be twitching. Such a suggestion is ridiculous. Therefore, I say yet again, that there is no mass cull. The election is over. There is no mass cull, regardless of the General Election having taken place. That is the end of the story.

Peter Rogers rose—

Carwyn Jones: Cynog Dafis asked several questions. I have already mentioned the

Peter Black: David Lloyd, David Melding and Alison Halford have asked if they can speak at the end of my speech. In preparing for this debate, what became immediately apparent in relation to the drug issue is that

there is not a lack of statistics. However, other than to use some of those statistics to underline my argument, I do not want this speech to turn into a procession of facts and figures. There is a comprehensive strategy on tackling substance misuse in Wales. I know that, in addition to money allocated to this strategy in the Welsh budget, money is also coming from the Home Office to tackle drug related crime. A Barnett share of around £11 to £12 million should be available for drug and alcohol action teams over the next three years as a result of an initiative to tackle drugs and related crime. I was grateful for the assurance, when this was raised in Committee, that this money could be used for education and prevention as well as measures to tackle crime. If we are serious about tackling the drug issue and reducing drug related crime, we must invest in education and rehabilitation, cutting off the demand as well as dealing with those who supply and deal in drugs.

The National Assembly provides over £2.6 million a year in direct funding for drug and alcohol initiatives, which has been topped up by the current budget round by £0.6 million this year, an extra £1 million next year and £1.5 million in 2003-04. In 1994, £3 million was repatriated to health authority budgets to support activity and combating drug and alcohol misuse, but these resources were not ringfenced. Although health authorities are expected to spend at least 0.4 per cent of their discretionary revenue allocations on substance misuse treatment and prevention, some are failing to do this, although others are spending in excess of this amount. That needs to be tackled, as treatment prevention and rehabilitation still remain the most effective way of tackling dependency on drugs. That is why the Assembly must adopt a much higher profile on drugs policy and ensure that resources are feeding into these measures at a national and local level.

Every £1 spent on drug treatment in the United Kingdom saves £3 on criminal justice

costs, and yet over half of government money allocated to fight drugs in this country is spent on enforcement. We need to get value for money and reap the savings in terms of resources and human lives that proper planned and co-ordinated investment in treatment can give us. However, when I talk to drug and alcohol agencies, they tell me that they do not see the full benefit of our investments and that they need more resources to invest in outreach work, treatment and rehabilitation. That also applies to social service departments. One local council told me last year that of the extra money being put into drug and alcohol abuse by the Assembly, once the various administrative costs had been teased out of the global figure for budget increases, each local action team could only expect to receive an extra £30,000 to spend on frontline services. That translates to one or two frontline workers in an area of service where demand already outstrips supply and is increasing rapidly.

When David Blunkett was made Secretary of State for the Home Department, I was interested that he made it clear that he considered the war on drugs to be integral to the fight against crime. Research by the new English and Welsh arrestee drug abuse monitoring project found that 69 per cent of arrestees tested positive for at least one drug, of which 29 per cent tested positive for opiates and 20 per cent positive for crack cocaine. In addition, the research found that one in 10 offenders commit 240 offences per year on average to fund their drug habits. Half of all property crime is committed by drug addicts.

The link between drugs and crime is well-established, which is why the Assembly cannot ignore that in dealing with this issue. A proper joined-up approach will ensure that those responsible for tackling crime and disorder in the Assembly also have

We cannot deal with the criminal element of drugs without also considering the social context in which this crime is committed. The Assembly's substance misuse strategy sums it up well in stating that:

'The misuse of substances can propel individuals into damaging situations including unhealthy lifestyles, marginality from education or the labour market, homelessness and involvement in crime. At the same time, substance misuse is more prevalent in these situations because people do not have the opportunity to lead fulfilling lives.'

It is a vicious circle. Deprivation can lead to drug use, which in turn can lead to unemployment, homelessness and crime. We must not forget that much recreational drug use is out of choice, often by well-educated, middle-class people. Homeless people and clubbers are statistically the two groups most likely to use drugs.

Drugs policy also affects other areas of policy. Research shows that two in five children will have tried a drug by the time they leave school. The substance misuse strategy reports that in 1998, 42 per cent of 15 and 16-year-olds reported having used some kind of illicit drug and that between 1990 and 1996, the number of 15 and 16-year-olds who reported using an illicit drug in the last month more than doubled from 11 per cent to 25 per cent. In 1996, young people under the age of 21 made up 55 per cent of those cautioned for or found guilty by the court of drug offences in Wales.

We need to invest in effective education to try to discourage young people from using drugs in the first place. That often means using premises outside school where young people do not feel patronised and can therefore enter into discussion on an equal basis. That is why the Assembly's Education and Lifelong Learning Committee and the Local Government Partnership Council also need to be involved in the substance misuse strategy so that they can also have ownership of it and offer guidance and support to such education programmes.

My interest in drug policy stems from my work on homelessness. A huge number of homeless people have problems with drugs and alcohol. It is important that proper treatment and support is available if they are to be re-housed effectively and in a sustainable way. I have visited a number of agencies and rehabilitation and counselling centres in the last few years and have never failed to be impressed with the commitment and dedication of the people running them. I have also visited one of the wet houses run by Wallich Clifford in Cardiff and talked to many housing professionals working in the voluntary sector on how they deal with drug and alcohol abuse among their clients and the facilities and services they can draw on to help them with their task.

I know that the Homelessness Commission considers proper and effective treatment of substance misuse to be a key part in eradicating the need to sleep rough in Wales. However, the other overriding impression that I take away from many of these visits and conversations is the feeling that more can and should be done to deal with this problem. I am not sure whether this is because inadequate resources are going into the substance misuse strategy or because it is not being properly directed and targeted. The Assembly needs to have a much higher profile on this issue and be seen to be taking the lead more in the crusade against drugs.

In line with my party's policy, I believe that there should be a Royal Commission to investigate and evaluate the effectiveness of drug policy across the whole range of service provision in the UK, to ensure that money is being spent properly and is being targeted at the greatest problem. In the meantime, I urge the First Minister and the Assembly Cabinet to review this whole area of policy. It is a health issue, but it also ties into education, crime and disorder, community regeneration and many other policy areas. Maybe we would have a higher profile in tackling drugs if responsibility lay with those dealing with community regeneration and with crime and disorder. A Cabinet Minister, or even a civil servant, should perhaps be designated the Welsh drug tsar to raise the profile of the issue and to ensure that we get results in partnership with the health authorities, local councils, the voluntary sector and the police. This must be a partnership but it also must be high profile. If a Welsh drug tsar could achieve that, so be it.

David Lloyd: I thank Peter for allowing me this opportunity to speak. I declare an interest as a general practitioner and a county councillor in the City and County of Swansea. Drugs are a huge issue and I am grateful to Peter for his comprehensive overview of the situation. Intervention with individuals is often a complex process, but the involvement of family members is often beneficial. More support for families is needed in preventing drug abuse in the first place, and also more support for families in tackling the problem once it has been established. I ask the Deputy Minister to state in reply to this debate what the Labour/Liberal Democrat administration is doing to assist such family-based schemes to flourish.

David Melding: I thank Peter for his speech. During his 10 minutes he covered a great deal of ground and it was a lucid contribution. I did not disagree with anything in his speech, but I ask the Executive to consider the

Mae angen mwy o gefnogaeth ar deuluoedd wrth atal camddefnyddio cyffuriau yn y lle cyntaf, a hefyd mwy o gefnogaeth i deuluoedd wrth fynd i'r afael â'r broblem pan fydd wedi'i chadarnhau. Gofynnaf i'r Dirprwy Weinidog nodi yn ei ateb i'r ddadl hon beth mae'r weinyddiaeth Lafur/Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol yn ei wneud i gynorthwyo cynlluniau o'r fath i ffynnu.

David Melding: Diolchaf i Peter am ei arraith. Yn ystod ei 10 munud cwmpasodd lawer o faterion ac yr oedd yn gyfraniad huawdl. Nid oeddwn yn anghytuno ag unrhyw beth yn ei arraith, ond gofynnaf i'r

advisability of separating out drug and alcohol strategies. Drugs are illicit. You cannot purchase drugs legally in this country. The approach for drugs is different from the approach we need for alcohol. I accept that there is dual diagnosis often, in that people will abuse both substances. Alcohol is a legal substance. It is usually purchased lawfully, although there is under-age drinking. However, much of our alcohol problem is among adults who are not committing crimes but are purchasing and consuming an inappropriate amount of alcohol. We need a different strategy for that sector of the population from the ones who are using substances and who are often also committing crimes. That is a huge issue as Peter pointed out.

Alison Halford: Peter Black's contribution was timely. I find it depressing that so little has been achieved over the years, despite the fact that government and also now the Assembly have put so much money into the problem. We need radical thinking. As a police officer in 1968, I remember young drug-takers in the Crypt in London playing with their syringes and the walls were spattered with blood. In 1974 I was sent to Baltimore as a chief inspector to find out if police had any role to play in the education of children. In Baltimore I looked at a range of projects, such as programmes to give methadone to addicts and those that attempted to scare potential users to death. Millions of dollars were spent on projects. What have we achieved in 27 years? Enforcement does not work. Early education seems to be the only way of doing it in America. The message must be to start educating children as young as three, four or five years old. Assembly Members should start considering what is available in monitoring rehabilitation centres. We must put in progress plans where treatment can be given early. I will find out whether there are any waiting lists or log jams in my constituency and consider what we can do to ensure that the treatment is available if enforcement has not worked. Congratulations, Peter, on raising this issue. The Assembly can, and must, do more.

Mae'r ymagwedd tuag at gyffuriau yn wahanol i'r ymagwedd sydd ei hangen arnom ar gyfer alcohol. Derbyniaf fod diagnosis deublyg yn aml, ac y bydd pobl yn camddefnyddio'r ddau sylwedd. Mae alcohol yn sylwedd cyfreithlon. Fel arfer, caiff ei brynu yn gyfreithlon, er bod llawer o blant dan oed yn ei yfed. Fodd bynnag, mae llawer o'n problemau alcohol ymhlih oedolion nad ydynt yn troseddu ond sydd yn prynu ac yn yfed swm amhriodol o alcohol. Mae angen strategaeth ar gyfer y sector hwnnw o'r boblogaeth sydd yn wahanol i'r rheini sydd yn defnyddio sylweddau a'r rheini sydd hefyd yn aml yn troseddu. Mae hwnnw'n bwnc enfawr fel yr eglurodd Peter.

Alison Halford: Yr oedd cyfraniad Peter Black yn un amserol. Yr wyf yn ddigalon iawn fod cyn lleied wedi'i gyflawni dros y blynnyddoedd, er gwaetha'r ffaith fod y llywodraeth a'r Cynulliad hefyd bellach wedi cyfrannu cymaint o arian at ddatrys y broblem. Mae angen inni feddwl yn radical. Fel swyddog heddlu yn 1968, cofiaf bobl ifanc a oedd yn cymryd cyffuriau yn y Crypt yn Llundain yn chwarae gyda'u chwistrellau a'r waliau wedi'u hysgeintio gan waed. Yn 1974 fe'm hanfonwyd i Baltimore fel prif arolygydd i ganfod a oedd gan swyddogion yr heddlu rôl i'w chwarae mewn addysgu plant. Yn Baltimore ystyriaus ar amrywiaeth o brosiectau, megis prosiectau i roi methadon i bobl a oedd yn gaeth i gyffuriau a'r rheini a oedd yn ceisio codi ofn ar y rheini a oedd â'r potensial i ddefnyddio cyffuriau. Gwariwyd miliynau o ddoleri ar brosiectau. Beth yr ydym wedi'i gyflawni mewn 27 mlynedd? Nid yw gorfodaeth yn gweithio. Ymddengys mai addysg gynnar yw'r unig ffordd o lwyddo yn America. Y neges yw bod yn rhaid dechrau addysgu plant mor ifanc â thair, pedair neu bum mlwydd oed. Dylai Aelodau'r Cynulliad ddechrau ystyried beth sydd ar gael yn ein canolfannau monitro ailsefydlu. Rhaid inni roi cynlluniau ar waith lle y gellir darparu triniaeth yn gynnar. Canfyddaf a oes rhestrau aros neu dagfeydd cofrestru yn fy etholaeth ac ystyried beth y gallwn ei wneud i sicrhau bod triniaeth ar gael os nad yw gorfodaeth wedi gweithio.

Llongyfarchiadau, Peter, am godi'r mater hwn. Gall y Cynulliad wneud rhagor, a rhaid iddo wneud rhagor.

The Deputy Minister for Health (Brian Gibbons): I thank Peter for raising this important issue. All parts of Wales are affected by the joint problem of drug and alcohol abuse, but it is fair to say that the problem is worst in socially and economically deprived communities. Statistics show that between 35 and 45 young men died in Wales every year during the last decade or so directly from drug problems. However, that is only the tip of the iceberg. In my community alone, four or five young men have died from drug-related problems in the last few of years, and many more were killed indirectly as a result of this enormous problem.

In this context, I am not sure that we can make as narrow a definition of drugs and alcohol as David Melding asked us to do. While there are specific problems and specific therapeutic approaches for both, many of the worst problems are related to the dual abuse of drugs and alcohol. That causes the suffering not only of these young people but of the community in which they live. That has created ravages in terms of youth disaffection, crime and social disorder.

As Peter said, the emphasis on prevention is important. It is to nobody's advantage to have to pick up the pieces when terrible havoc, misery and hardship is created. I was surprised at his statement that every £1 spent on drug prevention services saves £3 on criminal justice costs. My impression is—and I have not looked at the statistics—that the potential savings are considerably more when one considers damage to property and so on. That is a woeful underestimate of what can be achieved if we are successful in conveying the message of prevention.

Peter alluded to our Welsh substance abuse strategy, which was launched in May 2000. It

Y Dirprwy Weinidog dros Iechyd (Brian Gibbons): Diolchaf i Peter am godi'r mater pwysig hwn. Mae pob rhan o Gymru wedi'i heffeithio gan broblem ddeublyg camddefnyddio cyffuriau ac alcohol, ond mae'n deg dweud bod y broblem yn waeth mewn cymunedau cymdeithasol ac economaidd ddifreintiedig. Dengys ystadegau bod rhwng 35 a 45 o ddynion ifanc wedi marw yng Nghymru bob blwyddyn yn ystod y degawd diwethaf yn uniongyrchol yn sgil problemau cyffuriau. Fodd bynnag, dim ond megis dechrau yw hynny. Yn y cyd-destun hwn, nid wyf yn sicr a allwn greu diffiniad mor gul o gyffuriau ac alcohol ag y gofynnodd David Melding inni ei wneud. Er bod problemau penodol a thriniaethau therapiwtig penodol ar gyfer y ddau, mae nifer o'r problemau gwaethaf yn gysylltiedig â chamddefnydd deublyg o gyffuriau ac alcohol. Mae hynny'n peri dioddefaint nid yn unig i'r bobl ifanc hyn ond hefyd i'r gymuned y maent yn byw yn ddi. Creodd hynny ddifrod o ran ymddieithrio ymhlið pobl ifanc, troseddu ac anhrefn cymdeithasol.

Fel y dywedodd Peter, mae'r pwyslais ar atal yn bwysig. Nid yw o fudd i unrhyw un orfod casglu'r darnau yngyd ar ôl anhrefn, gofid a chaledi dybryd. Yr oeddwn yn synnu at ei ddatganiad fod pob £1 a gaiff ei wario ar wasanaethau atal cyffuriau yn arbed £3 ar gostau cyflawnder troseddol. Yr argraff a gaf fi—ac nid edrychais ar yr ystadegau—yw bod yr arbedion posibl yn sylweddol uwch wrth ystyried difrod i eiddo ac ati. Mae hwnnw'n amcangyfrif llawer yn rhy isel o'r hyn y gellir ei gyflawni os byddwn yn llwyddiannus wrth drosglwyddo'r neges o atal cyffuriau.

Cyfeiriodd Peter at ein strategaeth camddefnyddio sylweddau yng Nghymru a

notes four key aims, which are worth highlighting. The first is prevention and helping children, young people and adults to resist substance abuse and so achieve their full potential in society. It also involves promoting healthy, sensible drinking within the overall context of a healthy lifestyle. It is significant that the strategy's first aim is to deal with this issue. The second aim is to help families and communities to protect themselves against drug-related anti-social and criminal behaviour. The third aim is to provide treatment and help to all those involved in substance abuse, to overcome their addiction. The fourth aim is to stifle the general availability of drugs. The lifetime use of illicit drugs by 15 to 16-year-olds more or less doubled between 1990 and 1996. That amply demonstrates the ease of access to drugs. However, encouragingly, there was a slight decrease in those figures in 1998. That may be evidence that successful preventive work is taking place. However, this is not only a preventive strategy based on the narrow personal model, it addresses social, educational and economic factors, which are important determinants of the likelihood of substance abuse among individuals and in their communities.

Those four aims relate to the broader perspective. As Peter correctly said, substance abuse is not only a health issue, it is a law and order, education and housing issue. The points about homelessness were well made. Substance abuse is also a problem in terms of social and economic renewal and regeneration. Unless we tackle all those areas and bring all of the issues together, we will not be in a position to deal effectively with this problem.

Prevention is the priority. Working with young people is central to that, particularly with those under the age of 25. To support

this, we have a strategic prevention action plan for drugs and alcohol in Wales, which outlines a range of prevention activities. Education has an important role to play. The Assembly is in the process of revising its guidance to schools on substance abuse.

Alongside the prevention work, we must realise that the provision of treatment is also important. As well as dealing with immediate problems, treatment is a way of preventing future problems. Evidence shows that treatment can work for individuals, and it can also benefit their families and communities. Equally, we realise that living in healthy, stable families in thriving communities is therapeutic for people with drug and substance abuse problems. This is why initiatives such as Communities First are so important in dealing with this problem at the source.

Spending on drug-related problems in Wales has increased. Peter provided a considerable amount of information on that. In terms of the crime prevention aspect of the problem, you will remember that, during the last Parliament, the Government brought forward the Proceeds of Crime Bill. This Bill is intended to establish a criminal assets recovery agency, the purpose of which is to deprive criminals of their ill-gotten gains. As Peter said, David Blunkett, in his new post at the Home Office, has issued tough statements on crime and drug abuse. We will follow with interest what happens in that area. There is nothing more galling or frustrating to those of us who live in communities where drug abuse is a problem than seeing people drive by dressed up to the nines in four-by-four vehicles to dish out death and destruction to so many young people.

Peter Black has highlighted his active interest in this area. It is important to emphasise what is being done in the Swansea area, such as the school-based prevention programme called Avoiding Drugs: Solutions. Members will also know that, in Neath Port Talbot, there is

10-week training programme for youth leaders on various aspects of prevention work in health issues, including substance abuse. David Lloyd will know of the work of the primary substance abuse liaison team in the Neath Port Talbot, Swansea and Bridgend areas. It is an innovative, primary care and community-based drug treatment service. There is also the secondary tier service provision in Swansea, provided by Dr Lyn Jones. There is a framework of active response in our communities, but more resources need to be invested. I hope that, as the money allocated to health increases, this area will benefit.

A recent article in *The Observer* quoted a heroin addict as saying that

‘Where there’s no hope . . . there’s always dope’.

That is a paraphrase of a slogan that appeared after the 1984 miners’ strike on a wall in Caerau, which is in Janice Gregory’s constituency and just over the mountain from my village. The original slogan read

‘There is no hope, smoke dope’.

If we are to challenge drug addiction, we must be tough on its causes as well as respond to the problem itself.
