## SUMMARY OF THE OUTCOME OF CONSULTATION ON A DRAFT PROCEDURE FOR COMPLAINTS AGAINST MEMBERS

The paper was circulated on 16<sup>th</sup> December 1999; Members were given until 24<sup>th</sup> January 2000 to submit their comments to the Table Office.

There were 20 responses in all; 16 of which were from 1 party.

16 respondents confirmed that they were content with the draft procedure; 3 respondents offered suggestions for improvement/ requested clarification.

## Comments

- The procedure should include provision for Members who have had complaints made against them to be informed at the earliest opportunity.
- In the description of stage 2, replace "filter out" with "triage".
- There is a need to clarify whether the Member will have the right to be accompanied by a friend and if so will there be any limitations (eg could it be a lawyer)?
- Will there be a time limit for proceedings?

And on the addition to stage 3, commissioned by the Committee at its last meeting but (by agreement) not reviewed by the Committee prior to the consultation with Members:

 How easy will it be to define "minor nature" in practice? What sorts of "offences" would fall into this category?
