A very extensive area of north Wales benefits from tier 1 assisted area status, and the Assembly Government has an office in Colwyn Bay to promote inward and home-grown investment.

Commitments made in 'Plan for Wales 2001'

Q14 Rhodri Glyn Thomas: Will the First Minister make a statement on the progress towards fulfilling commitments made in the 'Plan for Wales 2001' strategic document? (OAQ17270)

The First Minister: We are making good progress toward fulfilling the commitments contained in 'Plan for Wales 2001'. I will report again formally in my annual report in October.

Long Term Prosperity for the Rhondda

Q15 Geraint Davies: How does the First Minister co-ordinate Assembly policies to ensure long-term prosperity for the Rhondda? (OAQ17249)

The First Minister: The Welsh Assembly Government monitors and evaluates the impacts of all its programmes to ensure that they are having the targeted effect in improving services and conditions for all the people of Wales, including those in the Rhondda.

For example, the findings of the People in Communities programme were fed into the development of the programmes for the 100 Communities First areas, 17 of which are in Rhondda Cynon Taff, and a monitoring and evaluation strategy is currently being developed.
