- b) Housing
- c) Health promotion and Family Health Services

## **Amendment 4 - Jocelyn Davies (South Wales East)**

Calls for greater transparency in the way funding for frontline services in health and education is recorded in the budget.

## **Amendment 5 - Jocelyn Davies (South Wales East)**

Affirms the need to review the Barnett Formula to fully reflect the needs of Wales, given that the impact of the current formula means that increases in the Welsh block fail to match corresponding increases in England.
