Item 1

Continuing the Regeneration of Cardiff Bay

1.1 The Auditor General for Wales gave a report on developments since the last Audit Committee meeting on 18 July 2002. The Committee was told that an agreement had been reached with Cardiff City Council for National Audit Office Wales staff to attend regular meetings with the Cardiff Harbour Authority. Attendance at those meetings had begun and gave the Auditor General for Wales access to all the books and records necessary for him to report in accordance with the section 165 agreement between the Assembly and Cardiff County Council. The Auditor General for Wales confirmed that he was satisfied with these arrangements.

Item 2

Evidence taking session - Sale of Talgarth Hospital

2.1 The committee took evidence from Ann Lloyd, Director of NHS Wales, Neil Jones, Principal Estates Surveyor, Estates Division, and Nigel Towns, Acting Chief Executive of Dyfed Powys Health Authority, in connection with the report by the National Audit Office on behalf of the Auditor General for Wales on *The Disposal of the Mid Wales Hospital*, published on 16 October.

2.2 A verbatim transcript of this item will be attached as Annex A to these minutes.

Action point

- It was agreed that the committee would be provided with a note to confirm how Powys NHS Trust had disposed of NHS-owned plant and equipment at Talgarth hospital.
- The Auditor General for Wales agreed that he would give further consideration to matters which arose in the committee's hearing and would provide a further memorandum to the committee if appropriate.

Item 3

Programme of Value for Money Examinations

Paper: AC-07-02(p2)

- 3.1 The Auditor General for Wales introduced a paper outlining the value for money examinations planned or underway for financial year 2002-2003 and a timetable of proposed value for money examinations for financial years 2003-2004, 2004-2005 and beyond.
- 3.2 The committee endorsed the planned value for money examinations, but hoped that certain examinations proposed beyond the 2003-2004 financial year might be given a higher priority in the timetable, while recognising that the final decision was one for the Auditor General for Wales. By category the examinations to be re-considered were:
- Health and Social Services: greater priority to violence in the NHS; access to dentists; mental health services. Some members suggested that these could be accommodated by giving a lower priority to NHS waiting lists and procurement, although this was not unanimous.
- o Environment, Planning and Transport: quality of Welsh beaches; road safety campaigns.
- Education and Training: Teaching as a career in Wales: to include an examination of the available expertise and standard of teaching of Welsh in schools; capital funding for schools; Estyn – procurement of registered inspectors.
- Economic Development: Follow up on EU Structural Funds. It was also proposed that 3 pieces of work related to small businesses might be combined under one theme, such as an examination of the 'business support network'.
- Agriculture and Rural Development: Rural Recovery Plan; review of the Sheep Annual Premium Scheme. It was noted that examining the Rural Recovery Plan earlier might mean delaying examination of compensation payments for tuberculosis.
- o Culture, Sport and the Welsh Language: follow up to examination of the Arts Council.

Action points

- The Auditor General for Wales would consider the points raised and inform the committee of any proposals for re-prioritisation of examinations within the timetable and resources at his disposal.
- The Auditor General for Wales would inform the committee whether a future examination of NHS prescription exemptions was within his remit.
- The Auditor General for Wales would give the committee a note on what investigations had been conducted on hospital catering.

Item 4

Draft Estimate of the Income and Expenses of the Auditor General for Wales

Paper: AC-07-02(p3)

- 4.1 The committee was presented with the Auditor General for Wales's draft estimate of the income and expenses of his office for the financial year ending 31 March 2004, to carry out the forward programme of work presented to the committee.
- 4.2 The estimate was presented in both net resource and net cash terms, to reflect non-cash resources that were currently at his disposal and required for his work, such as the office in the Pier Head building.
- 4.3 The final net cash requirement included a sum of £100,000 for additional Assembly work requested by ministers and senior officials outside the value for money programme, for example in relation to NHS restructuring.
- 4.4 Having noted the potential savings of £40 million identified as a result of the Auditor General for Wales's examinations, the committee agreed to endorse his estimate for 2003-4.

Item 5

Appointment of the auditor for the Auditor General for Wales

- 5.1 The current auditors, Owens Thomas & Co, had completed their 3-year contract with the Assembly and the committee considered the extension of that contract by a further two years, which was at the option of the Assembly.
- 5.2 The Chair reported that he had met with Laurie Pavelin, Head of Financial Accountability Division, and with an accountant at Owens Thomas & Co, and it was felt that they had been efficient and thorough in their work. The Committee discussed the reappointment, noting that there was value in retaining an auditor that had built up a body of knowledge about the work, while also acknowledging that the appointment needed to be kept under review to satisfy issues of propriety.

Action Point

• It was agreed that the committee would recommend that the Assembly extend the contract for a further two years, on the understanding that the appointment would be reviewed towards the end of the 5-year contract.
