# 6. Forthcoming Business

#### **Responses to Requests**

- 6.1 The Committee noted the Business Minister's responses to requests for items of business:
  - A debate on "Design to Deliver" was scheduled for Wednesday 18 October.
  - There was currently no intention of scheduling a debate on job losses in the manufacturing industry in Wales, as a debate on this issue had been held on the 17 May. In view of the pressure on the plenary programme the Business Minister was not inclined to schedule a second debate this year.
  - A debate on the Welsh Assembly Government's proposals for the Tourism Industry in Wales would be scheduled for early in the new year.
  - There was currently no intention of scheduling a statement on RSA Grants. In view of the pressure on plenary business, it was felt that it was more appropriate to discuss the issue in the Enterprise, Innovation and Networks Committee.
  - The Minister for Enterprise, Innovation and Networks had answered an urgent question on a reported 100 job losses at the Duracell factory in Wrexham, in Plenary on 19 September.
  - The Minister for Environment, Planning and Countryside had issued a written statement on the Milk Industry on 22 September.
  - The issue of the Welsh Assembly Government's press office budget had been covered during the debate on the Government's Forward Work Programme, which had taken place on 20 September.

11.1 The Chair said that, according to the Government of Wales Act 2006, the Government was required to bring forward a statutory instrument to set the date of the first meeting. 11.2 The Chair said that the Assembly had agreed that the Easter Recess dates for 2007 would be 26 March to 15 April. The Business Minister said that there had been some initial consultation on this and it had been suggested that the date of the recess could be put back. The Committee agreed to return to this issue in its next meeting.
