WORK PROGRAMME 2002-03

Purpose

- 1. To invite the Committee to agree:
 - a strategic work programme for 2002-03;
 - o a detailed work programme for the summer term.

Background

2. SO 9.9 requires subject committees to maintain a rolling programme of work covering periods of at least 12 months, and to report to plenary from time to time on progress. The Panel of Chairs has agreed that subject committees' annual progress reports and forward work programmes will be laid before plenary in May, but will not be debated.

Strategic Work Programme

- 3. The Committee agreed a draft strategic work programme for 2002-03 via correspondence in January and invited comments from other subject committees and the Cabinet. No comments were received from other subject committees. The Cabinet was content with the draft work programme. A final draft **strategic programme** is attached at **Annex A**.
 - The Committee is invited to agree the final draft strategic work programme attached.

Detailed Work Programme

4. A suggested **detailed programme** for the summer term is attached at **Annex B**. Committee time is provisionally given over to following up the Nantygwyddon investigation and policy review of public transport, consideration of major Ministerial policy and legislative developments on which the Committee has asked to be consulted, scrutiny of sponsored bodies, and consideration of budget priorities. This leaves limited formal meeting time for policy review activities, however there are two informal meeting slots this term.

- 5. The Committee has indicated that it proposes to review (a) topic(s) from the following policy areas: biodiversity, radioactive waste (and possibly hazardous waste generally), and incineration of waste. Members are invited to express their preferences for the next topic to be considered.
 - The Committee is invited to agree the topic of its next policy review.
- 6. Given the pressure on Committee time this term, Members are invited to indicate how they wish to proceed with the review:
 - free up space this term by limiting the time devoted to Ministerial policy and legislative developments (i.e. identify those areas they do not wish to consider); or
 - agree terms of reference this term, call for evidence over the summer recess, and dedicate most of the sessions in the autumn term to the review.
 - The Committee is invited to agree the timing for the next policy review.
 - The Committee is invited to agree a detailed work programme for the summer term.

Recommendation

7. The Committee is invited to agree the attached strategic and detailed work programmes, and finalise the topic and timing of its next policy review.

[FINAL DRAFT] STRATEGIC FORWARD WORK PROGRAMME

May 2002 to May 2003

Introduction

1. This work programme sets out our strategic priorities between May 2002 and the next Assembly elections in May 2003. A detailed work programme for the period May to July 2002 is attached.

Remit and responsibilities

- 2. Our remit is based on the portfolio of the Minister for Environment, Sue Essex, which embraces: environmental protection; countryside issues; planning; transport; sustainable development; and ancient monuments, listed and historic buildings.
- 3. The responsibilities of subject committees are set out in SO 9.

Aims

4. We aim to champion: the sustainable management of the environment; development that respects the environment and sustains local communities; a sustainable integrated transport system; and Welsh heritage.

Priorities

- 5. With such a broad remit, we have developed a strategic approach to our work. Priorities for the coming year are as follows:
 - Policy development (SO 9.7(i)) we will focus on those areas of policy development where we can make the greatest impact, and will seek to complement, rather than duplicate policies being developed by the Minister. In the coming year we propose to review topics from the following policy areas:
 - Biodiversity
 - Radioactive waste (and possibly hazardous waste generally)
 - Incineration of waste
 - Scrutiny of the Minister (SO 9.7(ii)) the Minister for Environment will report to us regularly on current developments within the portfolio. Once a year we will scrutinise the Minister on performance against targets, but may also undertake thematic scrutiny sessions from time to time. We also intend to scrutinise the delivery of the Sustainable Development Action Plan.
 - Scrutiny of sponsored bodies (SO 9.7 (iii)) we will hold an annual session in the summer term to scrutinise the work of the Countryside Council for Wales, Environment Agency and Welsh National Parks and comment on their future work programmes. Cadw: Welsh Historic Monuments will also be scrutinised annually in the spring term, when we will also comment on Cadw's draft Corporate Plan. We will continue to advise on the quinquennial reviews of the sponsored bodies and Cadw at the relevant times.
 - Other items (SO 9.8) we will consider the following items as they arise:
 - proposed legislation affecting Wales (SO 9.8(i) and 22) each term the Minister will outline

forthcoming secondary legislation to enable us to identify areas where we wish to be consulted. Following the National Assembly's consideration of the Queen's speech, we will consider any draft primary legislation remitted to us by plenary. We will also consider draft secondary legislation referred to us by the Business Committee, as appropriate;

- proposals for the Assembly's budget (SO 9.8(ii)) we will indicate our budget priorities in the summer term and comment on the draft budget in the autumn term;
- complaints (SO 9.8(iii) and 21) we will consider any complaints referred to us;
- public appointments (SO 9.8(iv) and 20) our two public appointment nominees will take part
 in the process of appointments to public bodies as vacancies arise;
- other matters referred by the Assembly (SO 9.8 (v)) we will consider other matters referred
 to us by the National Assembly, but would ask Assembly Members to consult the Committee
 Chair before tabling motions inviting plenary to remit work to the Committee.
