3 New petitions

3.1 P-06-1341 Accessible guidance for parents and schools to help develop plans to support children with additional learning needs

The Committee considered the petition and noted that the

Children, Young People and Education Committee are currently undertaking a detailed inquiry into equal access to education and childcare.

In light of this Members agreed to write the Chair of the Children, Young People and Education Committee to ask if they would consider taking evidence from the petitioner as part of their detailed inquiry.

3.2 P-06-1353 Devolve responsibilities and budgets for trunk roads in North Wales to North Wales

Jack Sargeant MS declared the following relevant interest under Standing Order 17.24A: The petitioner is one of his constituents.

The Committee considered the petition and agreed to write back to the Deputy Minister to seek answers to some of the questions raised by the petitioner which have not already been addressed.

3.3 P-06-1357 Draw up a new Microplastics Action Plan for Wales

The Committee considered the petition and agreed to write back to the Minister to ask whether the Welsh Government plan to work with relevant organisations and experts to draw up a Microplastics Action Plan, as described by the petitioners.
