England; and

d) 54.2 per cent of red ambulance calls don't arrive within eight minutes.

4. Calls on the Welsh Government to:

a) begin the phasing out of outdated NHS technologies;

b) bring forward a substantial workforce plan with a tuition fee refund for

healthcare workers that stay in Wales for five years after their studies;

c) ensure the full Barnett consequential arising from NHS spending by the UK

Government is made available for the health service in Wales; and

d) work with the UK Government to understand best practice in cutting NHS

waiting lists.


