### 1 Introduction, apologies and substitutions

The Chair welcomed everyone to the Committee. There were no apologies.

# 3 P-04-471 Mandatory Welsh legislation to ensure Defibrillators in all public places

The Committee discussed the evidence session that took place on 29 April and agreed to prepare a report on the petition so that the issues raised can be debated more fully by the Assembly in Plenary.

### 4.1 P-04-494 Robotic assisted laparoscopic prostatectomy must be made available to men in Wales now

The Committee considered correspondence on the petition and agreed to write:

- again to Abertawe Bro Morgannwg University (ABMU) Local Health Board asking for a response to earlier correspondence; and
- to the Minister asking for his comments on the petitioner's further comments and drawing his attention to the failure of ABMU to respond to correspondence.

### 4.2P-04-527 Campaign for a Special Cancer Drug Fund in Wales

The Committee considered correspondence on the petition and agreed to:

- write to the All Wales Medicines Strategy Group on its processes for evaluating cancer drugs of the sort the petition is concerned about;
- seek further comments from the petitioner to ask whether the Minister's written statement meets any of his concerns; and
- seek the outstanding response from ABMU Health Board which has not responded to the Committee's original letter.

### 4.3P-04-459 A direct rail connection from Cardiff Airport to Cardiff central and west Wales

The Committee considered correspondence on the petition and agreed to await a further update from the Minister in June once the Metro Implementation Group has announced their proposals in relation to the South East Wales Metro.

### 4.4P-04-506 Free bus pass / concessionary travel for benefit claimants , students and under 18s

The Committee considered correspondence on the petition and agreed to close the petition given that there seems little likelihood of a change in Government policy.

### 4.5P-04-510 Public inquiry into the Breckman case in Carmarthenshire

The Committee considered the legal briefing on the petition and agreed to close the petition.

### 5.1 P-04-550 Planning Powers

The Committee considered the petition for the first time and agreed to:

- copy the Chair of the Environment and Sustainability Committee and Vaughan Gething AM to the letter to the Minister.

#### P-04-551 Basic First Aid To Be Taught In Schools

The Committee considered the petition for the first time and agreed to write to the Minister for Education and Skills seeking his views on the petition taking account of the consideration given to a previous petition which was considered by the Committee on a similar matter.

#### 5.3P-04-552 Child Protection

seeking their views on the petition.

seeking their views on the petition and, in the case of OFCOM, to see if they knew of any recent research into this matter.

The Committee considered the petition for the first time and agreed to write to the Petitioner seeking further clarification on any specific concerns that form the background to the petition.

## 5.6P-04-555 Stop the unethical and draconian proposed compulsory microchipping of dogs

The Committee considered the petition for the first time and agreed to write to the Petitioner seeking further clarification on any specific concerns that form the background to the petition.

#### 5.7P-04-556 No to Junction 41 closure

  been identified for possible closure; and
- Neath Port Talbot Council for their views on the matter.
