SL(5)002 - The Higher Education (Fee and Access Plans) (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2016

Procedure: Negative

These Regulations correct a minor typographical error in the Higher Education (Fee and Access Plans) (Notices and Directions) (Wales) Regulations 2015.

SL(5)004 - The Food Information (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2016

Procedure: Negative

EU Regulation 828/2014 makes provision requiring information to be provided to consumers on the absence of gluten in food.

The Food Information (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2016 provide for the enforcement of the EU Regulation requirements in Wales. For example, where an enforcement authority in Wales suspects that a person is failing to comply with the requirements of the EU Regulation, then the enforcement authority can either issue an improvement notice or go straight to prosecution (whichever is deemed appropriate).
