#### Introductions, apologies, substitutions and declarations of interest 1

1.1 The Chair welcomed Members to the meeting. There were no apologies.

#### Code of Conduct review: Consultation responses 2

2.1 The Committee considered the responses to the consultation on the Code of Conduct review.

- 4.3 The committee noted that under the National Assembly for Wales Commissioner for Standards Measure 2009, the decision to vary the terms of appointment of the Acting Standards Commissioner requires the approval of the Senedd.
