Background

These Regulations are proposed to be made by the UK Government pursuant to section 8(1) of, and paragraph 21 of Schedule 7 to, the European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018.

Summary

The purpose of this instrument is to protect biosecurity and support trade by ensuring that effective phytosanitary controls continue to operate within GB and between GB and the EU at the end of the Transition Period on 31 December 2020.

The Plant Health (Phytosanitary Conditions) (Amendment) (EU Exit) Regulations 2020 make operability changes and other consequential amendments to Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/2072 establishing uniform conditions for the implantation of Regulation (EU) 2016/2031 on protective measures against pests of plants to ensure the continued functioning of plant health phytosanitary controls within GB and between GB and the EU at the end of the Transition Period.
