Mark Isherwood asked about other examples of support that could be enacted other than financial support. Nick Jackson highlighted that being exempt from lockdowns, as covid-safe attractions with benefits to well-being, was essential. Speakers asked MS' to make the case to allow zoo licence holders to continue to welcome visitors even if other forms of restrictions or lockdowns came into effect.
Across the discussion it was noted that the Minister responsible for Zoos, Lesley Griffiths, had not met with the zoo industry and that this should rectified.
