**Lesley Griffiths:** Prevention and control of healthcare associated infections (HCAI) remains high on the Welsh Government's public health agenda. My commitment to zero tolerance of preventable HCAIs to save lives, prevent unnecessary suffering and reduce costs was reinforced in the framework of actions for healthcare organisations in Wales published in December 2011. This set out specific actions that need to be taken within the overarching message that infection prevention is everyone's business—healthcare staff, patients and visitors—and we must all therefore play our part.
