Yn wyneb y dystiolaeth o ddiffyg sylw cyfredol i'r agweddau hyn o hanes mewn llawer o ysgolion, mae'n briodol eich bod wedi penodi Dr Charlotte Williams i arwain gweithgor a fydd yn rhoi cyngor ac argymhellion ynghylch themâu sy'n ymwneud â chymunedau a phrofiadau pobl dduon, Asiaidd a lleiafrifoedd ethnig.

Re Ymgyrch Hanes Cymru

Thank you sharing with us a copy of your letter to the Minister for Education, Kirsty Williams MS regarding the campaign for Welsh history in schools dated the 10 November 2020.

The Committee shares your interest in, and passion for this area of public policy. As you are aware the Committee undertook an extensive inquiry in this area during 2019 following a poll of the public held in 2018. Over 2,500 people took part in the poll, reflecting the significant public interest in this topic, and which has been further reaffirmed by the petition and the debate on 4 November, which you reference in your letter.

Since March the Committee's work has been largely focused on the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on areas within its remit. The impact of the pandemic has been widespread and has meant that the Committee has had to balance and re-prioritise its work programme. This situation is likely to continue into the Spring 2021 term, and while it is difficult to be too definitive at this stage, we are hopeful that we will be able to at least seek an update from the Welsh Government on its progress in implementing the Committee's recommendations on teaching Welsh history as part of the Committee's general scrutiny work.

As things stand, Senedd elections will also take place in May 2021 and therefore Senedd committees are beginning to think now about Legacy work. While no firm decisions have yet been made there may also be opportunities to consider these issues as part of our Legacy work.
