The First Minister (Carwyn Jones): Animal health and welfare programmes under our animal health and welfare strategy for farm and companion animals is continuing across Wales.

The First Minister: Some 30,000 buildings across Wales have been protected through listing by Cadw as nationally important buildings of special architectural or historical interest. Of these, 493 are listed as grade I.

Spending on the NHS

15. Nick Ramsay: *Will the First Minister provide an update on the current level of spending on the NHS in Wales? OAQ(4)1143(FM)*

The First Minister: The Welsh Government has allocated a total of £6.2 billion of capital and revenue expenditure for the delivery of health services in 2013-14. This includes £5.2 billion allocated directly to the local health boards and a further £76 million to the Public Health Wales NHS trust in the current financial year. The balance of funding is provided for various health programmes managed directly by the Welsh Government.
