The Minister for Health and Social Services (Mark Drakeford): Health boards work within the national service framework for diabetes and have made progress in delivering against the standards set out in it. However, the recent national diabetes in-patient audit shows that there is more work to do. In September, I will publish our delivery plan, 'Together Against Diabetes', which will set out further actions to secure progress in this important area.

The Deputy Minister for Social Services (Gwenda Thomas): The number of adoptions, year on year, remains consistent; 245 children were adopted as of 31 March 2012. The establishment of a national adoption service in 2014 will focus on promoting excellence and driving continued improvement. Key objectives include increasing the numbers of potential adopters, leading to an increase in adoption numbers.

Mark Drakeford: The Welsh health specialised services committee operates the all-Wales policy and procedure for the handling of individual patient funding requests for specialist services not routinely available within NHS Wales. The IPFR guidance and policy was adopted by WHSSC and all seven health boards in October 2011.
