Questions from the Legislation, Justice and Constitution Committee

Question 1: You told us that you received a letter from the Minister of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, the Rt Hon Lord Benyon, asking for the Welsh Ministers' consent to these Regulations. Can you confirm when Lord Benyon wrote to you. In your letter to us on 2 December 2022, you committed to include the date of correspondence with UK Ministers in letters to Senedd Committees.

Question 2: Please can you share with us the relevant correspondence with Lord Benyon. Again, in your letter to us on 2 December 2022, you said you would aim to provide copies of correspondence with the UK Government to the appropriate Senedd Committees.

Response:

The Minister of State for Biosecurity, Marine and Rural Affairs, the Rt Hon Lord Benyon, wrote to the Minister for Rural Affairs and North Wales, and Trefnydd on 23 May 2023, to request the Welsh Ministers consent to the draft Windsor Framework (Retail Movement Scheme: Public Health, Marketing and Organic Product Standards and Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations 2023.

Enclosed is a copy of the aforementioned letter and the response regarding this specific instrument.

Question 3: You told us that the Regulations intersect with devolved policy. Have you made an assessment of the devolved/reserved split? If so please can you provide details of that assessment?

Question 4: Did you consider bringing forward your own Regulations to deal with matters within devolved competence?

Response.

It is considered appropriate for this UK Government statutory instrument to apply to Wales as the instrument delivers on international obligations which are fixed as agreed in the Windsor Framework. Agreement was reached by the UK and the EU and announced on 27 February 2023. It was verified in Decision no. 1/2023 of the Joint Committee established by the Agreement on the Withdrawal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland from the European Union and the European Atomic Energy Community. It is appropriate for the regulations to be made by the UK Government to ensure a coherent and consistent statute book.

Whilst this instrument concerns subject matter that is devolved in relation to Wales (including food standards, and plant health standards), Part 2 relates to the amendment of GB-wide legislation and Part 3 of this instrument specifically concerns the application of law in Northern Ireland. It is the view of the Welsh Government that the Welsh Ministers do not have sufficient powers to make this instrument separately in relation to Wales.

It is possible that amendments to GB-wide legislation in Part 2 of this instrument, insofar as they make provisions applying in relation to Wales, could have been implemented separately in relation to Wales. Although the Welsh Government's general principle is that the law relating to devolved matters should be made and amended in Wales, on this occasion, it is considered appropriate for this instrument to apply on a UK-wide basis as there is no policy divergence between the Welsh and other UK governments in this matter. This ensures a coherent and consistent statute book with the amendments to the GB-wide legislation being accessible in a single instrument. I consider that legislating separately for Wales would be neither the most appropriate way to give effect to the necessary changes nor a prudent use of Welsh Government resources given other important priorities.

Question 5: Can you confirm that the development of these Regulations was taken through the relevant common framework processes.

Response:

Officials have utilised the Plant Health Common Framework to work jointly with UK Government on this amendment. In addition, policy officials are in discussion with DEFRA over the governance arrangements to ensure Welsh interests and views on the Retail Movement Scheme are considered and addressed. A proposed Memorandum of Understanding will set out how the agreement process will operate for any future possible changes to the Scheme. Welsh Government officials, along with officials from the Scottish Government, Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs in Northern Ireland and the Food Standards Agency, are members of the Defra-chaired Programme and Project Control Board and the overarching Northern Ireland Programme Board which oversee the implementation of the Windsor Framework.

The 2023 Regulations have been prepared and are subject to on-going discussions between UK and Welsh Government officials. Draft Statutory Instruments and associated documents in relation to these regulations have been shared or are the process of being shared. There has been a long history of joint working within this area, and this has been reflected in the drafting of this instrument.

Question 6: Has the UK Government written to you about the four other sets of Regulations referred to as NID/011, NID/012, NID/013, and NID/015 in the Scottish Government's letter?

- b. If the UK Government has not written to you about the other Regulations, what action will you now take?
- c. If the UK Government has written to you about the other Regulations, why does your letter of 30 June only refer to the Windsor Framework (Retail Movement Scheme: Public Health, Marketing and Organic Product Standards and Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations 2023 (NID/014)?
- d. Were you aware of the timings regarding the Regulations which are the subject of your letter?
- e. Were you aware that the 2023 Act would result in the Regulations which are the subject of your letter no longer being subject to the affirmative procedure?

Response:

The letter from the Rt Hon Lord Benyon Minister for Biosecurity, Marine and Rural Affairs is enclosed. This instrument (the Windsor Framework (Retail Movement Scheme: Public Health, Marketing and Organic Product Standards and Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations 2023 - NID/014) is one of five, which will ensure that green lane goods can legally enter the NI market while complying with GB standards on public health, marketing, and organics (where EU standards are being disapplied under Article 1(2) and Annex I of the EU's draft legal text) and will include the necessary enforcement and sanction measures to ensure compliance.

The Welsh Governments aim was to ensure the Committee had sufficient time to consider each instrument, once drafts had become available and had undergone an in-depth review prior to being considered by Welsh Ministers. As the instruments are to be introduced under varying timetables, the DEFRA drafting is at variable stages. It was considered appropriate and helpful to the Committee to make the instruments available to you, as soon as they were in a position, where they could be approved by Welsh Ministers.

To this end, at the time of writing to the Committee, NID014 was still scheduled to be introduced under the affirmative procedure. It was subsequently converted to the negative procedure given that the passage of the Retained EU Law Bill had removed the affirmative trigger following its Royal Assent.

The remaining instruments will be shared with the Committee as soon as they undergo the same process.

Question 7: Are you aware of further implementing legislation being prepared to implement the Windsor Framework and as described by the Framework's accompanying documents? If so, please can you provide details, including timings.

The table below contains each of the instruments under preparation and the current timings we have been provided with (if any further legislation emerges, we will endeavour to inform the Committee accordingly). Please note the laying dates have been subject to change:
