3. Previous group meetings since last AGM

Meeting 1

Date: 16/02/2023

Speakers: Marg McNiel (See Around Britian), Lesley Clarke (DWP), Matthew Innes (DWP), Andrea Gordon (Guide Dogs Cymru), Cath Lewis (Guide Dogs Cymru), Sarah Hughes (SENCOM and Chair of Welsh Association of Vision Impairment Educators), Branwen Jones (Guide Dogs Cymru).

Summary of issues discussed: The group initially got updates on the ongoing work to promote See Around Britian. Lesley Clarke then gave a presentation on the work of the Disability Services Advocacy Team, whose overarching aim is to underpin the government's aspiration to support disabled people into work and to retain work. This was then followed by a Q&A session with both Lesley Clarke and Matthew Innes. Finally, Sarah Hughes, Branwen Jones, Andrea Gordon and Cath Lewis gave a presentation on habilitation services for visually impaired children and the current situation for habilitation services in Wales.

Meeting 2

Date: 08/06/2023

Speakers: Marg McNeill (See Around Britain), Cari Jones, David Rowlands (Tai Pawb), Ross Thomas (Tai Pawb), Shaun Bendle (Equal Power Equal Voice).

Summary of issues discussed: The group received another update on activity to promote the work of See Around Britian. David Rowlands gave a presentation to the group on the right to adequate housing, followed by a presentation from Ross Thomas of the legislative progress of the campaign. The resulting green paper was open until mid-September. Cari Jones presented next on the Scrap Care Charges campaign in England and proposed a similar campaign in Wales. Finally, Shaun Bendle presented on the Equal Power Equal Voice mentorship programme. For any other business, Mark Isherwood MS highlighted his work as Chair of the Public Accounts and Public Administration

Committee's enquiry into public appointments. He had also led a Senedd debate on a BSL Bill but needs to win the ballot to bring forward a Private Members Bill.

Meeting 3:

Date: 21/09/2023

Speakers: Marg McNiel (See Around Britian), Gary Simpson, Ian

Stanton, Zoe King (Diverse Cymru).

Summary of issues discussed: The group received an update on the work to promote See Around Britian. Following this Gary Simpson presented on his experiences with public transport in Wales. Particularly, the issues with the inaccessibility of trains and railway stations in Wales and how difficult it is to apply for a bus pass. Ian Stanton then presented on the closure of Lloyds bank branches, how the loss of these services impacts him and that there is little to no consultation with residents before bank closures. In any other business, Zoe King promotes that Diverse Cymru are now Taith Champions, a Welsh Government-funded international learning exchange programme. The next call for funding opened on the 5th October.

Meeting 4:

Date: 07/12/2023

Speakers: Joel Weston (DWP)

Summary of issues discussed: AGM was held, with Mark Isherwood MS and Megan Thomas being re-elected as Chair and Secretary of the group respectively. Following this there was a presentation from Joel Weston on the response from the DWP to the cost-of-living crisis. Joel highlighted that they had a limited time to respond to the crisis but pushed the cost-of-living support payments that were made available, this was followed by a Q&A with other attendees that particularly highlighted problems with the existing system to access Personal Independent Payments, Universal Credit and Workplace Capability Assessments. Finally, Mark Isherwood led a discussion on a potential to

have a Welsh Disability Summit in 2024, inspired by the Scottish Disability Summit held last November.
