Item 1:

- The need for a minimum percentage of registered staff for intensive & high dependency care and special care
- Sufficient knowledge, experience, and training to offer safe and effective care to babies and their families
- DBS checks across NHS Wales
- Workforce challenges, including retaining staff and progression opportunities
- Number of available beds in Neonatal Units

- Funding
- The group members expressed an interest in understanding more about neonatal services in North Wales and RCN Wales staff agreed to ensure this information was provided within the briefing.
