

- We're the face of ITV in Wales, producing four hours of news, sport and weather plus 90-minutes of non-news programmes every week, mostly scheduled in peak time.
- We're part of the UK's most popular free-to-air commercial broadcaster home to some of the biggest shows on television at a time when people are watching more TV than ever before.
- We employ nearly 100 people across News, Programmes and Operations.
- In June 2014 we're moving from our current HQ at Culverhouse Cross, Cardiff, to a modern new building at 3 Assembly Square in Cardiff Bay next to the Welsh Assembly.
- We also have an office in Colwyn Bay in North Wales. We've got reporters based in key locations around Wales.
- There are now more people watching news about Wales from ITV than were doing so a decade ago - and we continue to close the gap on BBC Wales News.
- Our digital news service continues to grow in popularity at a rapid pace and is increasing our reach for news about Wales among smartphone and tablet users.
- In autumn 2013 we launched a new weekly news programme called Newsweek Wales for Sunday mornings and a new factual series Coast & Country – a celebration of the "great outdoors". Both have proved to be popular with audiences.
- We provide coverage of Wales' major festivals and events such as the Royal Welsh Show and the National Eisteddfod.
- We provide extensive coverage of Welsh politics both in Westminster and the Welsh Assembly – in our daily news programmes and in our weekly politics show Sharp End.
- Our flagship current affairs strand Wales This Week has just returned for a new run, starting with a programme commemorating the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the 1984 miners' strike.
- We have a successful commercial relationship with Welsh language broadcaster S4C, producing current affairs (Y Byd Ar Bedwar, Hacio), rural affairs (Cefn Gwlad) and entertainment shows (Sion a

- *Sian*). We're now making more programmes for the channel than we have done at any point in the past three years.
- In February this year Ofcom confirmed the renewal of ITV's regional licences for a further 10 years from 2015. For the first time, there will be a stand-alone licence for Wales.
