The supply teachers teach a cross-section of classes (it depends on which permanent member of the Department is absent). When a supply teacher is looking after pupils it is not possible to do practical work (supply teachers, without exception, do not specialize in science). Neither is it possible to ensure the quality of science teaching - work/tasks which do not require scientific expertise has to

be set. This has implications for guaranteeing the quality of learning and teaching.

If you believe there are problems in this area, how do you think they could be resolved?

A simple solution but difficult to put into practice: ensure an adequate supply of qualified teachers. Learning cannot be postponed! Permanent teachers in the Department often change their timetables to teach absent teachers' examination classes (KS4/5) while the supply teacher looks after their KS3 classes. As a result some children are being deprived of high quality learning.
