**Inquiry into Supply Teaching** 

Evidence from: City and County of Swansea

## Consultation questions

**Question 1** – What are your views on whether there is a prevalence in the use of supply teachers on a planned and unplanned basis?

There is a prevalence on a planned basis.

If you believe that this results in problems (for example, for schools, pupils or teachers), how do you think they could be resolved?

For schools with problems, they arise if there is no clear guidance to supply teachers on expectations, behaviour codes and routines within the school.

Welsh-medium difficulties:

Both secondary and primary schools have less choice to draw supply cover from. As a consequence, staff are deployed inappropriately by agencies e.g. secondary supply teacher deployed to work in Foundation Phase.

There should be a minimum expectation that a supply teacher's tenure in a school can only be sanctioned in writing by a person with QTS/leadership role within a school, so long as they are fully informed of the supply teacher's competencies and specialism/ experience.
