# Summary of issues discussed:

Presentation by **Alun Davies AM the Minister for Natural Resources**. The Minister provided an overview of his perspective of what lay ahead in respect of the challenges facing the rural areas of Wales and the economies within these areas. The Minister invited the Cross Party Group to provide their thoughts and initiate an open and frank debate about the role of the uplands in the future of Wales.

**Dr Emyr Roberts, Chief Executive : National Resources Wales** provided a detailed overview of the approach that NRW would be taking in fulfilling its role and delivering the priorities outlined in its initial remit letter from the Minister.

Dr Jill Venus: School of Business, University of Wales Trinity Saint David Presented 'Assessing Rural Vibrancy – Ideas for the Rural Alliances Project' provided the Group with an insight into the work she and her colleagues in Germany were developing in the context of the EU funded Rural Alliance project which is being led by the Brecon Beacons National Park authority. She emphasised that this was work in progress but that it was already providing some important ideas and outcomes. Followed by a Q&A session.

#### Summary of issues discussed:

#### Annual General Meeting: Election of the Chair and Secretariat

Llyr Gruffydd AM; the current Chair of the Rural Affairs Cross Party Group. As a standard procedure a Chair had to be elected for the coming year. Attendees were therefore invited to propose nominations for the position of Chair. Dr Ruth Williams - Landscape Institute Wales nominated Llyr Gruffydd AM. As there were no further nominations it was unanimously agreed by the attendees that Llyr Gruffydd should continue in his role as Chair of the Group. Llyr also asked for confirmation that Cat Griffith-Williams, CPRW should continue to provide the Secretariat role for the group - attendees agreed. Llyr led discussions on ideas for the future work programme of the Group; these included considerations of forthcoming the Rural Development Plan, Marine Planning including the link between land and sea and the Natural Resource Management Plan were all suggested topics.

Presentation by Carl Sargeant AM: Minister for Housing and Regeneration - Draft Planning Bill: Positive Planning. The Minister opened his presentation by stressing the importance he placed on listening to the thoughts of others on the detail in Draft Planning Bill and its accompanying documents provided. He noted that in his view Planning should be an enabler for the economy of Wales and for society and not seem as an obstacle, hence the title of the consultation document "Positive Planning". His priorities were the provision of adequate homes which is different to the concept of simply a 'house'.

# Presentation by Dr Roisin Willmott, Royal Town Planning Institute.

Dr Wilmott gave the RTPI's perspective on the content of the Planning Bill and indicated which elements they supported and also the elements which they believed were less satisfactory and had expressed concern about.

Professor Terry Marsden indicated how pleased he was to have been invited to Chair this review of designated areas in Wales and noted how important it was that these areas are protected and function in an appropriate policy context. He highlighted the need to develop approaches which reflect the role and relevance of these designated areas as exemplars of Sustainable development. He outlined the two distinct phases of the review with the conclusions of the first Phase being reported to the Minister by the end of January 2015 before the second phase commenced thereafter. It was anticipated that the Panel's work would be completed and its overall conclusions presented to the Minister by the end of July 2015.

# Summary of issues discussed:

AGM - Llyr Huws Gruffydd AM opened the AGM and thanked everyone for attending. He explained that it is a National Assembly for Wales annual requirement to elect a Chair and Secretariat for the group. As current chair, Llyr passed on the procedures to Peter Ogden who proceeded to explain the protocols of operation of a CPG. He asked for proposals for a chair and Llyr Huws Gruffydd AM was re-elected as Chair of the Cross party Group on Rural Affairs. CPRW expressed their contentment to continue for another year as secretariat, Llyr asked for a vote to accept CPRW as secretariat. Attendees voted yes and CPRW will continue as secretariat of the CPG on Rural Affairs.

#### **Invited speakers:**

Joanie Speers, ABC founder/director introduced the work of ABC, the story behind the project, and what ABC hope to achieve by this launch. She explained why the session has been called 'The future of rural Wales: grass roots heritage and affordable homes' as there are two things that can be said with total confidence: There are many derelict vernacular buildings in the Welsh countryside and there is a need for affordable housing in rural Wales.

**Nico Jenkins**, ABC programme development officer shared the key findings of the project.

**David James**, Rural Housing Enabler for Monmouthshire talked about his experience of the need for affordable housing in rural areas.

Joanie reiterated what ABC want to achieve; ABC need the members help to achieve 3 things, very simple: 1)Help get these two issues together on the Assembly's agenda and ensure the Heritage Bill and the Planning Bill support this combined approach. 2) Help ABC recommendations, though ambitious, to be taken seriously. 3) Help ABC show that this can work, and that means endorsement, commitment, and of course financial support.

ABC also requested direct assistance from the CPG with driving their message forward by asking them to consider five potential recommendations, it should also be noted that these were ABC's initial views. Peter Ogden suggested that all participants at the meeting be given an opportunity to consider and respond to ABC's recommendations (details can be found within the minutes on the NAfW's official web site). Once opinions had been collated Peter Ogden would then produce a common agreed set of recommendations for the CPG to consider.
