Following on from the update under Matters arising KD reminded members that the key issues document has been developed from discussions at the last two cross party group meetings, where members had contributed their views about the key issues facing service users, families, carers and services.

Members agreed that one of the document's strengths was that it represented the shared views of service users, carers, family members, health professionals, academics and third sector representatives.

<ul> <li>BJ updated the group about the contents of the letter from the Health Minister. BJ highlighted that the letter had indicated that the refresh would be completed by early summer.</li> <li>Other members said that they had understood that more recent communications indicated that it would be completed by the end of September.</li> <li>Concerns were raised about the lack of information and awareness of the refresh among service users, carers, families and health professionals.</li> <li>Concerns were raised about the timescales and the lack of service user involvement so far. It was agreed that the group would prefer the refresh to be conducted over a longer time period to ensure that PHW could receive as much evidence and as many views as possible and then consider them carefully before publishing a revised framework.</li> <li>Members agreed that it was important for the refreshed Framework to be age inclusive.</li> <li>Members also emphasised the need for any consultation to be inclusive of the whole of Wales, as different geographical areas may face different challenges and raise different issues.</li> <li>Members also agreed that any consultation should also include relevant sectors beyond health, such as education.</li> </ul>

The document emphasises the need for cross government action and outcomes. Dr Robin Glaze wrote to BJ prior to the meeting to highlight a proposal for a CAMHS ED Specialist (Virtual) Team, which will be submitted as part of a broader BCUHB bid for the newly released CAMHS funding. RG described the proposal as very innovative and said that it includes embedded paediatrics for very low cost - and has the support of the BCUHB CAMHS Service Board and CAMHS ED Network Board. RG also expressed concerns that north Wales remains disadvantaged with respect to specialized ED services for CAMHS patients - but that a proposal such as this could address some of these issues.
