Transport difficulties along A465 and around Hereford;

Difficulties when dealing with two governments over cross border transport issues;

Seven Bridge/Crossing tolls issues on the wider Monmouthshire/Gloucestershire etc region;

Links/dialogue with Transport for the North and NW England generally;

Powys cross border road links – approx. 35 of which 50% are Highways England roads, 50% Local Authority roads;

AMs present encouraged attendees to contact them when cross border issues arise.
